PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Rookie **RF Aristides Aquino** is the reigning **National League Player of the Week**...from 8/5-8/11 he led the Major Leagues in **slugging percentage** (1.364), tied for the lead in **HR** (6) and led the National League in **hitting** (.500) and **RBI** (11)...he is the first Reds rookie to win a **Player of the Week** award since **RHP Chris Reitsma** in **April 2001** and the first Reds rookie position player since **Hal Morris** in **July 1990**.

PLAYER OF THE MONTH

Since his promotion on **August 1**, rookie **RHP Aristides Aquino** leads the National League in **slugging percentage** (.957) and ranks among the leaders in **HR** (9, 2nd), **RBI** (17, 2nd), **batting average** (.362, T11th), **hits** (17, T12th) and **extra-base hits** (10, T5th).

QUERIES ABOUT SERIES

In their **previous 7 series**, the Reds went 4-1-2 (2-1 at Mil, 2-1 vs Col, 2-1 vs Pit, 2-2 at Atl, 2-0 vs LAA, 2-2 vs Cubs, 0-3 at Wsh)...the **4-0-2 stretch** was the Redlegs' longest **series streak** of the season without a loss.

2ND HALF

Since the All-Star break the Redlegs lead the National League in **batting average** (.289) while ranking second in **slugging percentage** (.498), **on-base percentage** (.351) and **runs scored** (179, 5.42 r/g).

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 2** (1-0) of a 4-game series vs **Michael Whitty's** first-place **Cardinals** and **Game 2** (1-0) of a 7-game homestand that includes an upcoming 3-game series vs the **Padres**...is **Game 11** (5-5) of a stretch in which the Reds are scheduled to play **13 of 16 games** at **Great American Ball Park** (2-0 vs LAA, 2-2 vs Cubs, 0-3 at Wsh, 1-0 vs StL, 3g vs SD)...Reds went 4-2 on their previous homestand (2-0 vs LAA, 2-2 vs Cubs) and are coming off a brief 3-game road trip, all at Wsh (0-3)...was their first **series sweep loss** at **Nationals Park** since **August 2008**.

SERIES NOTES: The Reds are **5-7 vs StL** this season, including **2-3** at **Great American Ball Park**...over the **last 4 seasons**, the Cardinals' **.559 winning percentage** (19-15) is third-best among opponents at **GABP** (Wsh .769, LAD .615)...the Reds are **3-2-2** in their last 7 completed series vs StL, including a **1-1 series split** in April in **Mexico** at **Estadio de Béisbol Monterrey**, home of the **Sultanes de Monterrey** of the **Mexican League**...Cin won **6** of its **last 11 games** at **Busch Stadium**.

REDS vs CARDINALS:

- Joey Votto** has **196 career hits** vs the Cardinals (196-625, .314), the most among active players...in the live ball era, his **career .437 OBP vs StL** ranks second among all players with at least 500 plate apps (**Lefty O'Doul** 1st, .477; **Ralph Kiner** 3rd, .424)...in 91 apps over the last 6 seasons vs StL, **Votto** has produced a **1.034 OPS** (.335ba, .571slg, .463obp)...in his last 60 apps overall vs StL beginning **8/2/16** is hitting .339 (75-221, 16 2b, 1 3b, 9hr, 36rbi, .543slg, .449obp)...in his **last 29 apps** at **Busch** beginning **8/9/16** is hitting .348 (39-112, 10 2b, 5hr, 16rbi, .571slg, .435obp).
- Beginning **8/5/17**, **Eugenio Suárez** has reached base safely in **28** of his **last 29 apps vs StL** (30-104, .288, 5 2b, 9hr, 25rbi, .596slg, .390obp), including a **25-game on-base streak** snapped on **7/19** after he was ejected following a called third strike in the first inning.
- Beginning **7/13/18**, **Jesse Winker** has a **14-game hitting streak vs StL** (21-53, .396, 5 2b, 3hr, 10rbi, .660slg, .484obp)...beginning **9/19/17** has reached base safely in each of his **last 24 apps vs StL** (35-93, .376, 8 2b, 4hr, 16rbi, .591slg, .453obp)...hit safely in 23 of those 24 apps.
- RHP Raisel Iglesias** is **12-for-12** in save opps vs the Cardinals, joining **Bill Landrum** (10-for-10) and **Jeff Brantley** (12-for-12) as the only pitchers, since the save became an official statistic, with a minimum of at least **10 perfect save conversions** vs StL...in his last 23 apps vs StL beginning **8/4/16**, **Raisel Iglesias** has posted a 1.57 ERA (12sv, 28.2ip, 15h, 5er, 19bb, 32k, 1hr)...in that span, **Cardinals batters** are hitting just .152 against him (15-99).

THE PUNISHER: Rookie **Aristides Aquino** produced **9 HR** in his **first 14 career games**, including a **3-homer game** on **Sat vs Cubs** in which he homered in **3 consecutive innings** (2nd, 3rd, 4th)...played 1 game for the Reds last season.

- Is the first player in modern Major League history with **9 HR** in his **first 14 career games**.
- Is the first player in modern Major League history with **8 HR** in his **first 12 career games**.
- Is the **second player** in modern Major League history with **7 HR** in his **first 10 career games** (Col's **Trevor Story**, 2016).
- Is the **second player** in modern Major League history with a **3-homer game** within his **first 10 career games** (**Bobby Estalella**, 10th game, 9/4/1997).
- Is the **first Major League rookie** and **first Reds player** to homer in **3 consecutive innings** (2nd-4th), tying the **Major League record** for HR in consecutive innings in a game...he was the **13th player** to do it, the second this season (Chi's **Kris Bryant**, 5/17 at Wsh, 7th-9th).

GOOD CHANCE FOR A HOMER TONIGHT...: Neither team homered in last night's **2-1 Reds win**...was the **115th homerless game** in the **17-year** history of **Great American Ball Park**, the seventh this season (3/31 vs Pit, 4/1 vs Mil, 4/3 vs Mil, 6/2 vs Wsh, 6/17 vs Hou, 7/4 vs Mil)...only 5 times in the ballpark's **1,355-game history** were there streaks of at least 2 straight games without a home run by either team: **8/6-8/7, 2005 vs Fla (2g), 4/5-4/6, 2011 vs Hou (2g), 9/12/12 vs Pit & 9/21/12 vs LAD (2g), 7/25-7/27, 2014 vs Wsh (3g) and 3/31/19 vs Pit & 4/1/19 vs Mil (2g)**.

SUSPENDED: LHP **Amir Garrett** is **4 games** into an **8-game suspension**...in his absence the Reds are **1-3**, while the **bullpen's ERA** is **6.14** (14.2ip, 10er)...he cannot be replaced on the 25-man roster...**Garrett** was **1 of 9** ejected in the **11-4 loss** on **7/30 vs Pit** and, 2 days later, **1 of 8** suspended by Major League Baseball...also suspended were manager **David Bell** (6g), **RHP Jared Hughes** (3g) and **RF Yasiel Puig** (3g) of the Reds and manager **Clint Hurdle** (2g), **RHP Keone Kela** (10g), **José Osuna** (5g) and **RHP Kyle Crick** (3g) of the Pirates...**Bell** and **Hughes** already served their suspensions.

FIRST WATCH: In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in **runs scored** (99), **HR** (35), **RBI** (96), **batting average** (.310) and **slugging percentage** (.592) while ranking second in the majors in **on-base percentage** (.369)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, **99-66**, and are **29-7** (.806) when leading after the first inning...**6 times** this season scored at **least 4 runs** in the first.

REHABBING: RHP **Tyler Mahle**, on the injured list since **7/22** with a **left hamstring strain**, tonight is scheduled to begin a rehabilitation assignment by throwing **2.0 innings** for Class AAA Louisville vs Rochester...**C Curt Casali**, on the injured list since **7/18** with a **sprained medial collateral ligament** in his **right knee**, made **2 rehab apps** before he was shut down with soreness in his **left hamstring**...in Fri's 3-1 Bats win at Rochester started behind the plate and caught 5 innings (0-3)...in Sat's 6-5 loss in 10 innings at Rochester, he was the Bats' designated hitter (0-2) but left the game with the hamstring injury.

Tonight's Pitcher - #58 Luis Castillo, RHP

RED HOTS

Luis Castillo in his third **Major League** season at just **26 years old**, was the Reds' **Opening Day** starter and is a **2019 National League All-Star**...per *Baseball America*, his **changeup** was voted by managers, scouts and executives the **best in the National League**...in his **last 4 starts vs StL** is **2-0, 1.13**...left Sun's 6-3 loss vs Cubs leading, 3-2, but became the victim of a blown save when **Kris Bryant** hit a 3-run HR off **Michael Lorenzen**...took a 2-hit shutout into the sixth inning...in his **last 29 apps** beginning **9/1/18** is **14-5** and in that span leads all Major League starting pitchers with an ERA of **2.39**...this season ranks among the National League leaders in **wins** (T5th), **ERA** (6th), **strikeouts** (T6th) and **strikeouts per 9 innings** (5th, 10.77)...in his career has allowed **13 HR** in the **first inning**, his highest total in any inning and including **3 HR** in the **first frame** this year...in his 7-4 win on **8/5 vs LAA**, his career-high **13 strikeouts** are the most by a Reds pitcher since **Raisel Iglesias** had 13 strikeouts on **8/23/15 vs Ari**...produced 8 starts in which he threw at least 5.0 innings while allowing 2 hits or fewer and 2 runs or fewer, a single-season franchise record...was the National League's **Pitcher of the Month** for **March/April** (7gs, 3-1, 1.45)...since his **Major League debut** in 2017, leads the Reds' pitching staff in almost every statistical category, including **wins, starts, innings pitched** and **strikeouts**.

- Leads the team with 42 starts at 2B (last, 8/8 vs Cubs)...made 18 starts at SS, second-most on the team behind José Iglesias (102gs) and most recently in 3 straight games from 8/9-8/11 while Iglesias recovered from soreness in his right biceps.
- Made 10 starts in the outfield, including 8 starts in LF (last, 6/14 vs Tex) and 2 starts in CF (6/9 at Phi, 6/22 at Mil).
- On 7/30 vs Pit made the first pitching appearance of his career after Amir Garrett and 5 other players were ejected with 2 outs in the top of the ninth inning...threw 4 pitches and induced Jacob Stallings to F8.
- After Eugenio Suárez was ejected by HP umpire Carlos Torres between the first and second innings on 7/19 vs StL, made his first Major League appearance at 3B...made his second appearance at that position on 7/23 at Mil.

15 NICK SENZEL, cf **2nd Half: 29-103 (.282), 7 2b, 2 3b, 1hr, 10rbi, 2sb**

- Last name is pronounced sen-ZELL.
- His .285 batting average through the game of 8/2 is a season high...in 11 apps since then is hitting .174 (8-46).
- Is the only player in franchise history, and 1 of only 21 players in Major League history, to produce 3 HR in his first 4 Major League apps.
- Went hitless on 6/2 vs Wsh, snapping a 9-game hitting streak (14-41, .341, 5 2b, 1hr, 5rbi, .378obp) and a 20-game on-base streak (26-86, .302, 6 2b, 2 3b, 1hr, 8rbi, 4sb, .358obp)...ties Joey Votto's for the longest on-base streak by a Reds hitter.
- Began the season on Louisville's injured list with a right ankle sprain suffered on 3/25 during a spring training game in Goodyear...came off the IL on 4/23 and in 8 apps for the Bats prior to his 5/3 promotion hit .257 (1 2b, 1hr, 2rbi).
- In the eighth inning of the 12-5 loss on 8/8 vs Cubs, as a part of a double switch made his first Major League appearance at 2B.

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf **2nd Half: 34-116 (.293), 13hr, 22rbi, 1.051ops**

- First name is pronounced AY-you-hay-nee-oh.
- Since the All-Star break ranks among the National League leaders in HR (13, 2nd), slugging (.664, 2nd), RBI (21, T16th) and on-base percentage (.387, T12th).
- In the first inning, leads the Major Leagues with 11 HR, ranks fourth in the majors in RBI (21) and ranks T10th in the National League in batting average (.333).
- In his last 17 apps beginning 7/29 is hitting .311 (19-61, 1 2b, 5hr, 7rbi, .991ops).
- Beginning 6/30, homered in 15 of his last 40 apps (17hr), including a pair of 2-homer games (7/1 vs Mil, 7/22 at Mil).
- Twice this season homered in 3 consecutive plate apps (7/1-7/12, 7/22-7/23).
- Suárez and Tony Pérez are the only third basemen in franchise history with 25 HR in 3 seasons and the only third basemen in club history with 30 HR in 2 seasons.
- Received votes for National League Player of the Month for July after leading the NL in HR (12), slugging percentage (.733) and total bases (66, T1st)...also finished among the July leaders in RBI (23, 3rd), OPS (1.086, 3rd) and extra-base hits (15, 5th)...his 12 HR in July were the most by a Reds batter in that month since Adam Dunn hit 12 HR in July 2008...no Reds batter has hit more than Dunn's 12 HR in July since Frank Robinson hit 13 HR in July 1961.

17 JOSH VANMETER, inf/of **2nd Half: 23-72 (.319), 6 2b, 4hr, 8rbi, .957ops**

- After Joey Votto was scratched with low back tightness, last night made his first start and third appearance at 1B.
- Started each of the last 4 games (2B, 2B, LF, 1B) and hit safely in each (5-16, .313, 1 2b)...the 4-game hitting streak is 1 shy of his season/career high (5g, 7/24-7/29).
- In his fourth stint with the Reds this season, has made 26 apps and 16 starts since he was promoted from Louisville just after the All-Star break...was 1 of 7 roster moves that day (7/18).
- Has made 23 starts (13gs/24g in LF, 6gs/13g at 2B, 2gs/5g at 3B, 1gs/3g at 1B, 1gs at DH)...also made 1 appearance in RF (7/22 at Mil).
- Is 1 of 4 Reds players to make his Major League debut this season (CF Nick Senzel, RHP Jimmy Herget, OF Brian O'Grady).
- His solo HR off RHP Jhoulys Chacín on 7/24 at Mil traveled 463 feet per Statcast, the longest by a Reds batter this season and the second-longest by any player at Miller Park in 2019 (Travis Shaw, 465 feet, 6/23 vs Cin)...was the longest home run by a visiting player at Miller Park since StL's Marcell Ozuna hit a 479-foot HR on 4/3/18.
- Is 1 of 4 Reds players to homer in at least 3 straight games (Derek Dietrich, Eugenio Suárez 3 times, Aristides Aquino 4g).
- Is a 2019 International League All-Star...in 49 apps for the Bats hit .348 (14 2b, 1 3b, 14hr, 43rbi, 8sb, 1.097ops)...started at 1B (10g), 2B (20g), 3B (10g) and LF (3g).
- In April was the organization's Minor League Player of the Month and the International League's Player of the Month...in April hit .358 and led the IL in games (26), hits (34), runs (24), HR (11), RBI (28), total bases (24), slugging percentage (.758) and OPS (1.204)...his 11 HR and 28 RBI are RiverBats/Bats records for April (since 2000).
- In spring training came over from minor league camp to make 10 apps for Reds (1-13).
- Is a native and resident of Ossian (AH-see-in), Indiana, a town of about 3,400 located near Fort Wayne...graduated from Norwell High School.

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b **2nd Half: 31-125 (.248), 8 2b, 4hr, 17rbi, .331obp**

- Was scratched from last night's starting lineup with low back tightness.
- Has a 6-game hitting streak (8-22, .364, 3 2b, 1hr, 3rbi, .636slg, .440obp), 1 game shy of his season high (7g, 5/21-5/31).
- From 5/8-6/4 reached base safely in 20 consecutive games, a season-high that ties Nick Senzel's (5/10-6/1) for the longest by a Reds batter this season...his current on-base streak, beginning 8/1, is at 13 games (.261ba, .386obp).
- Beginning 5/8 made his last 77 starts batting second in the order...made 15 starts this season batting leadoff (last, 5/7 at Oak)...entered this year with 1 career start batting leadoff (6/18/08 vs LAD).
- In his career has hit 64 HR on the first pitch, most recently on 8/9 off Yu Darvish.
- His first-inning double on 8/10 off Chi's Kyle Hendricks was his 865th career hit at Great American Ball Park, the most by any player at GABP (Brandon Phillips, 864).

33 JESSE WINKER, of **2nd Half: 28-86 (.326), 5 2b, 1 3b, 3hr, 12rbi, .943ops**

- Tomorrow will celebrate his 26th birthday...Kyle Farmer turns 29 tomorrow.
- Since the All-Star break ranks among National League leaders in on-base percentage (.431, 7th) and batting average (.326, 8th).
- In his last 16 apps beginning 7/29 is hitting .364 (16-44, 2 2b, 2hr, 5rbi, .996ops).
- In his last 26 apps beginning 7/18 is hitting .342 (25-73, 5 2b, 3hr, 9rbi, .976ops).
- Has 4 career leadoff HR, including 3 this season (6/18 vs Hou off Justin Verlander, 7/31 vs Pit off Dario Agrazal, 8/12 at Wsh off Erick Fedde)...the leadoff HR off Fedde came on the first pitch of the game.
- Has 16 HR, a new single-season career high (7hr, 2017 & 2018)...his career high for RBI in a season is 43 (2018).
- Hit his eighth HR, his new career high, in his 28th appearance and 23rd start.
- Has made 87 starts, including a team-high 59 starts in LF (16gs in CF, 11gs in RF, 1gs at DH).
