Following this homestand, the Mets hit the road for the final time before the All-Star break, heading to Baltimore (three games) and Kansas City (three games).

SUBWAY SERIES: The Mets are 2-2 in the Subway Series this year...They went 4-0 in the Subway Series in 2024...The Amazin's are 68-82 vs. the Yankees all-time during the regular season...The Mets are 116-152-2 vs. the Yankees combined in the regular season, World Series, Spring Training, 2020 Summer Camp, Mayor's Trophy Games, Mayor's Challenge Games and the Big Apple Series

YOU LOOK FAMILIAR: There have been 169 players who have played for both the Mets and Yankees...Carlos Mendoza managed his first game against the Yankees on June 25. 2024...The Mets skipper spent 15 years in the Yankees system...There have been five managers who have guided both teams - Buck Showalter, Casey Stengel, Yogi Berra, Dallas Green and Joe Torre.

IN THE CITI: New York is 32-13 at Citi Field in 2025...The .711 home winning percentage is the best in the majors...New York's 32-13 mark after 45 home games is the best in franchise history... The Mets have posted a 2.98 ERA at home, the second-best mark in the NL and the fourth-best mark in MLB.

AMAZIN' METS FOUNDATION: The Amazin' Mets Foundation (AMF) 50/50 Raffle gives fans a unique opportunity to support the Foundation's vital work while also winning cash prizes...This weekend, one raffle will run across all three Subway Series games, with a rolling jackpot that builds throughout the series. One lucky winner will be drawn after the 6th inning during the game on Sunday, July 6...Fans can purchase raffle tickets at Mets.com/5050.

SOTO-SENTIONAL: Juan Soto a game-tying two-run home run in the first inning...lt marked his team-leading 21st home run of the season which is also tied for the ninth-most in the majors (seventh in NL)...His 21 home runs through his first 88 games of a season are tied with his 2024 season for the most in his career...Soto recorded at least three hits for the fourth time this season, each of those games have come since June 6...He is the 10th player in the majors to total at least 15 doubles and 20 home runs this season and is the first Met to do so through the team's first 89 games of a season since Pete Alonso in 2019 (29 home runs, 21 doubles).

ONLY JUAN: Since May 30, Juan Soto leads the majors with a .482 OBP, a 1211 OPS, is tied for first with 30 runs scored and is first with 29 walks. He is a also second with a .739 slugging percentage and tied for thrd with 13 homers,

JUAN-ERFUL: Overall, Soto leads the majors with 71 walks, second in the NL with a .399 OBP, tied for third in the NL with 64 runs scored, fifth with a .915 OPS and seventh with 21 homers.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: Congrats to Francisco Lindor who was named the National League's starting shortsop in the All-Star Game...Lindor will make his first trip to the Midsummer Classic as a member of the Mets and his fifth overall after making four straight AL All-Star teams with Cleveland from 2016-19... He will become the third Mets shortstop to start for the National League, joining Buddy Harrelson (1971) and José Reyes (2007). Reyes was named a starter in 2011, but was injured and didn't start...The last time the Mets had a fan-elected starter was in 2016 when Yoenis Céspedes started in the outfield.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Brandon Nimmo's 17 home runs are his most prior to the All-Star Break in any season...Over the last 36 games, Nimmo is batting .307 (43-140) with 21 runs, seven doubles, nine homers, 21 RBI, 10 walks, seven steals and a .912 OPS...Nimmo scored his 552nd career run on Juan Soto's home run in the first inning yesterday...He passed Carlos Beltrán for sole possession for place eighth place in franchise history...Five of Nimmo's last six hits have gone for extra-bases (2 HR, 3 2B).

THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT: Congrats to RHP Jonah Tong and OF Carson Benge have been selected to participate in the 2025 All Star Futures Game on Saturday, July 12 at Truist Park in Atlanta...Tong, the Mets #4 prospect and #92prospect in MLB Pipeline's Top 100 prospects leads all of minor league baseball with 115 strikeouts and is second in the minors with a 1.73 ERA in 14 starts.... He is also second in MiLB and first in all of Double-A with a .137 opponent's batting average, while his strikeout percentage (K%) of 40.5% is second in all of MiLB...Tong was selected by the Mets in the seventh round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Georgia Premier Academy...Benge, the Mets #3 prospect and #81 prospect in MLB Pipeline's Top 100, was promoted to Binghamton on June 23 after starting the year with High-A Brooklyn...Benge slashed .302/.417/.480 with an .897 OPS in 60 games with the Cyclones...He was selected by the Mets with the 19th overall pick in the 2024 draft out of Oklahoma State.

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Díaz has recorded 18 saves in 19 chances...The one blown save in LA on June 2, Díaz picked up the win as the Mets rallied for a 4-3 win in 10 innings...He is tied for fourth in the NL and tied for eighth in the majors with 18 $\,$ saves...He has not allowed a run in 22 of his last 23 games dating back to April 26 with 34 strikeouts covering 23.0 innings.

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: According to Elias, Francisco Lindor has hit 257 home runs and stolen 196 bases as a shortstop...Only two players in major league history had 200/200 (HR/SB) as a shortstop - Derek Jeter (255 HR, 351 SB) and Jimmy Rollins (229 HR, 469 SB).

EDANKIE MONTAC'S LIGHS

LAST TIME OUT: Surrendered six runs, seven hits, and suffered his first loss of the season on June 29 at Pittsburgh...He recorded five strikeouts and he has struck out five batters in each of his two starts since returning from the IL...Over his two starts he has thrown 9.0 innings and surrendered six runs while striking out 10...He has thrown 80+ pitches in each of his two starts this season.

NEW YORK, NEW YORK: He has made four career appearances (three starts) against the Yankees, and he has posted a 1.89 ERA (4 ER/19.0 IP) with 18 strikeouts over those appearances...Montas appeared in nine games and made eight starts for the Yankees over the '22 and '23 seasons...He had a 6.15 ERA (28 ER/41.0 IP) during his time in the Bronx.

2024: Over 30 starts with Cincinnati and Milwaukee he finished with a 7-11 record, 4.84 ERA (81 ER/150.2 IP) and 148 strikeouts...Prior to being traded to the Brewers on July 30, 2024, he posted a 4-8 record, a 5.01 ERA (52 ER/93.1 IP), and recorded 78 strikeouts in 19 starts with the Red...ln 11 starts with the Brewers he had 3-3 record, a 4.55 ERA (29 ER/57.1 IP), and 70 strikeouts...His K/9 went from 7.52 with Cincinnati to 10.99 with Milwaukee...He struck out eight or more batters in a career-high tying three consecutive games from September 6-17 (also: 7/23-8/4/21 and 6/9-6/20/19)...He started Game 2 of the NL Wild Card Series against the Mets at American Family Field...Allowed three runs (one earned) and struck out three over 3.2 innings.

HOME COOKING: In 82 career appearances (66 starts) at home he has a 3.62 ERA (158 ER/393.1 IP) compared to a 4.65 ERA (186 ER/360.0 IP) over 80- games (65 starts) on the road...In home games he has recorded 422 strikeouts compared to 348 on the road.

REHAB RECAP: Was placed on the IL with a right lat strain on March 27 (retroactive to March 24) and he was sent on his rehab assignment on May 24...Between Brooklyn and Syracuse, he made six rehab starts and he threw 356 pitches over 18.2 innings...He struck out 12 batters over those eight starts including three in a game twice...In his final rehab start for Syracuse on June 18 he tossed 5.0 innings allowed seven hits, five runs, and he struck out two...He threw 80 pitches (47 strikes) in his final rehab start.

RIGHTIES BEWARE: He has held righties to a .236 batting average over his career, and he has held righties to a .658 OPS, opposed to a .798 OPS against left-handed batters...Last season right-handed batters hit .209 (59-282) with 21 extra-base hits against him compared to lefties who hit .276 (81-294) with 32 extra-base hits against him...Last season, 81 of his strikeouts came against right-handed batters and 67 were at the expense of left-handed batters.

SPLIT THE DIFFERENCE: So far this season he has thrown his splitter 14.5% of the time and has generated a 60.0 whiff % with the pitch...The splitter was one of Montas's most effective pitches last season and he generated a 42.6% whiff rate which was the fourth-best in the majors...He also picked up 34 of his strikeouts with the pitch and generated 92 swing and misses with the pitch which was the 11th most in the majors.

THE KITCHEN SINK: Last season Montas threw his sinker 19.3% of the time and he ended with a seven-run value with the pitch according to Baseball Savant...That was tied for 17th-best in the majors and he was one of 20 pitchers in the majors to have a run value as high with his sinker.

FIRST IMPRESSIONS: Over his Major League career, he has pitched for six different teams and over his six debuts with the teams he has a posted a 3.57 ERA (9 ER/22.2 IP)...He has allowed one or zero earned runs in four of his six first games with a franchise...Last season he made his Reds debut as their opening day starter, and he fired 6.0 scoreless innings with four strikeouts and zero walks.

INNINGS EATER: From 2021-24 Montas threw 483.1 innings and recorded a 4.02 ERA (216 ER/483.1 IP)...He is one of 40 pitchers in the majors to throw as many innings and have as low of an ERA in that span...He has thrown over 140.0 innings in three of his last four seasons and he is one of 37 pitchers to do so over that time.

WHAT A SEASON: In 2021 he established career highs in wins (13), starts (32), innings (187.0) and strikeouts (206)...In the AL, was tied for first in starts, ranked third in innings and fourth in strikeouts and fourth among qualifiers in ERA (3.37)...His 206 strikeouts were the second-most in a single season in franchise history during the Oakland Era (1968-2024)...As a result he finished a career-best sixth in AL Cy Young voting...He posted a 2.17 ERA (21 ER/87.0 IP) in 14 starts after the All-Star Break compared to a 4.41 ERA (49 ER/100.0 IP) in 18 starts prior to the All-Star Break...In the second half, ranked second in the AL among qualifiers in ERA and third in strikeouts (102)...He was named AL Pitcher of the Month for September/October after going 3-0 with a 2.19 ERA (9 ER/37.0 IP) and 40 strikeouts in six starts.

CARRER NUMBERS: Owns a record of 44-47 with a 4.11 ERA (344 ER/753.1 IP), 267 walks and 770 strikeouts over the course of 10 major league seasons with the Chicago White Sox, Oakland Athletics, New York Yankees, Cincinnati Reds, Milwaukee Brewers, and New York Mets.

- Earned his fourth win of the season after tossing a scoreless seventh inning on July 4 vs. New York-AL (BB, 3 K)...Was his fifth appearance this season recording at least three strikeouts and his first since June 3 at Los Angeles-NL.
- Was used as an opener for the third time this season and threw a scoreless first inning on July 2 vs. Milwaukee (G2)...Has not allowed a hit over 4.0 scoreless innings as a starter this season.
- On June 28 at Pittsburgh, allowed a season-high-tying four earned runs over 0.1 IP (2 H, 2 BB, K)...Gave up an RBI single to Ke'Bryan Hayes in eighth inning and left the game with the bases loaded, all runners eventually scored...Allowed four or more runs for the fourth

- time in his career and second time this year (also: June 19 at ATL)...Was also tied for his shortest outing of the season (also 5/3-G1 at St. Louis and June 24 vs. ATL).
- Has been scoreless over 15.0 innings against Interleague opponents this season, holding American League batters to a .087 average (4-46)...Has faced the Yankees twice this season (5/17-18) and combined to throw 3.2 scoreless innings (H, 3 BB, 5 K).
- Prior to his outing on June 19, had not allowed more than one earned run in each of his first 30 outings of the season...Has allowed a total of 11 earned runs over his last six appearances (5.1 IP)...Allowed 13 earned runs over nine appearances in the month of June (13.50 ERA) after allowing just five earned runs over 25 combined appearances in March, April and May (1.34 ERA).
- This season, has gone 4-2 with one save, 10 holds and a 3.65 ERA (18 ER/44.1 IP) through 36 appearances (three as an opener), holding batters to a .189 average (28-148)...Right-handed hitters have batted .163 (14-86) against him compared to a .226 average against left-handers (14-62)...With runners on base, has held batters to a .130 average (9-69)...His 1.11 ERA through his first 24 games of the season was the eighth-best in franchise history through as many games.
- Has stranded 21 of 24 inherited runners this season...His inherited runners scored percentage (12.5%) is the seventh-best mark in the majors and the second-best in the NL among qualified relievers.
