METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets returned to action with a 9-3 victory over the Yankees last night...The Mets are 11-7 through 18 games this month...The Mets have posted a 3.66 ERA, the fifth-lowest ERA in the majors and third-lowest in the National League in July...The Mets continue a five-game, six-day road trip (2-2) to Boston (1-2) and The Bronx (1-0)...On Thursday, the Mets return to Citi Field for a four-game series against the Washington Nationals.

HIP, HIP, JOSÉ! José Quintana is slated to make his second start of the year tonight against the Yankees...He allowed two runs on six hit with three strikeouts over 6.0 innings of work in his first start of the year on July 20 vs. Chicago-AL... In six career starts (seven games) against the Yankees, Quintana is 3-2 with a 2.97 ERA (11 ER/33.1 IP) with 10 walks and 30 punchouts...He has allowed two earned runs or less in his last 15 starts dating to July 23, 2022.

MULTIPLICITY: Last night, Pete Alonso finished the game going 3-4 with two runs, two home runs, five RBI and a walk...He is the 11th player in franchise history to record a multi-homer game in the Subway Series, joining Francisco Lindor, José Reyes, Jason Bay, Carlos Delgado, David Wright, Carlos Beltrán, Cliff Floyd, Ty Wigginton, Kaz Matsui and Richard Hildago...Alonso has recorded 16 career multi-homer games...That is tied for the fifth-most in franchise history with Dave Kingman and Lucas Duda...Only Darryl Strawberry (22), David Wright (21), Mike Piazza (17) and Carlos Beltrán (17) have more.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Over his last five games, Alonso is batting .474 (9-19) with five runs, two doubles, one triple, two home runs and six RBI...Alonso is one double away from 100 for his career.

INTERLEAGUE PETE: Pete Alonso has hit 39 home runs in Interleague Play since the 2019 season...His 39 home runs against the American League is a franchise record, and the most among any player since 2019...Mike Piazza was the previous record holder with 28 Interleague home runs.

LINSANITY: Over the last 30 games, Francisco Lindor is batting .279 (31-111) with 23 runs, five doubles, two triples, seven home runs, 18 RBI, 17 walks, 11 steals with a .374 OBP, a .550 SLG and a .924 OPS...Lindor has stolen 17 bases in 100 games this season, exceeding his total from 2022 (16 steals in 161 games)...His career-best is 25 steals in 158 games in 2018...The shortstop ranks fourth in the majors with a 94.4% success rate in steals...He has gone 17 out of 18 in stolen base attempts in 2023.

SUBWAY SERIES: The Mets complete the 2023 Subway Series tonight in The Bronx...The Mets are 2-1 in the 2023 version of the series...Last year, each team earned a two-game sweep at their home stadium...The Mets went 4-2 against the Yankees in 2021, scoring a franchise-record 44 runs against their crosstown rivals...The two teams went 3-3 against each other in 2020.

STAND CLEAR OF THE CLOSING DOORS: The Mets are 31-42 against the Yankees in The Bronx...The Amazin's are 62-79 vs. the Yankees all-time during the regular season...The Mets are 110-147-2 vs. the Yankees combined in the regular season, World Series, Spring Training, 2020 Summer Camp, Mayor's Trophy Games, Mayor's Challenge Games and the Big Apple Series.

YANKEE CLIPPERS: Jeff McNeil has hit .349 (30-86) with 12 runs, five doubles, two home runs, 13 RBI, six walks with a .404 OBP and a .477 SLG in 23 career games against the Yankees...His .349 average against the Yankees is the third-highest among active players (min. 80 PA)...McNeil has hit .354 (17-48) with eight runs, four doubles, one home run, seven RBI and four walks in 13 career games in The Bronx...Francisco Lindor has hit .316 (61-193) with 43 runs, 14 doubles, one triple, 10 homers, 22 RBI, 24 walks with a .394 OBP and a .554 SLG against the team from The Bronx.

ALL-AMERICAN: Jeff McNeil has batted .317 (111-350) with 46 runs, 17 doubles, seven home runs, 46 RBI, 24 walks with a .369 OBP and a .426 SLG in 94 career games against the American League...McNeil's .317 average ranks fourth among active players in Interleague games.

YANKEES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 17-22 at Yankee Stadium since the ballpark opened in 2009.

TWO OF HEARTS: The Mets are looking for their first two-game sweep of the Yankees since July 26-27, 2022 at Citi Field...The last time the Mets swept a two-game set at Yankee Stadium was May 12-13, 2014.

YOU LOOK FAMILIAR: Buck Showalter is the fifth manager to manage both the Mets and Yankees joining Casey Stengel, Yogi Berra, Dallas Green and Joe Torre... There have been 155 players who have played for both clubs, including current players: RHP Adam Ottavino, RHP David Robertson and OF Billy McKinney.

THEY'RE OUT OF MY LEAGUE: The Mets are in a stretch of eight consecutive games and 14 of 18 games against American League opponents...They are 4-3 in that span...The new schedule format has New York playing a total of 43 Interleague games in 2023, more than double their previous high for a single season (20)...The Mets are 14-13 against the American League this year...Overall, New York owns a 249-240 record in Interleague play...The team's .509 winning percentage is the second-best among National League clubs.

DR. ROBERTSON: David Robertson is 4-2 with 14 saves, and a 2.05 ERA (10 ER/44.0 IP) with 13 walks and 48 strikeouts in 40 games this year...He is holding lefties to a .185 (15-81) average this year...His 14 saves rank ninth in the National League...His 171 career saves are the eighth-most among active players.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York is 24-31 on the road this season...The team's 55 road games are tied for the most in the majors.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo has hit 15 home runs in 98 games this season... Nimmo's career-high is 17 home runs, which he accomplished in 140 games in 2018...The left-handed hitter smacked 16 home runs in 151 games last season.

DOING THE SPLITS: Brandon Nimmo is batting .290 (63-217) with 30 runs, nine doubles, three triples, six home runs, 28 RBI, 30 walks, a .379 OBP and a .442 SLG on the road...This compares to a .226/.332/.451 slashline with 18 extra-base hits at home...Francisco Lindor is a .258 (56-217) with 39 runs, 15 doubles, two triples, 12 home runs, 43 RBI, 20 walks, a .328 OBP, a .512 SLG and an .839 OPS on the road in 2023...He is slashing .195/.301/.371 with 14 extra-base hits at Citi Field this year.

IF YOU START ME UP: The Mets are 30-6 when the starting pitcher throws at least 6.0 innings...New York has gone 13-1 when its starter pitches 7.0+ innings and are a perfect 5-0 when the starter completes 8.0 innings.

SECOND HALF SQUAD: The Mets are 275-241 in the second half since 2015 (not including 2020)...New York has only posted a losing second half twice during that time frame (2021 and 2017)...New York's .533 winning percentage during that span is the fifth-best in the NL, behind Los Angeles (.626), St. Louis (.596), Chicago (.578) and Milwaukee (.534).

STEAL MY SUNSHINE: New York has been successful in all 18 of their stolen base attempts in July, bringing their season tally to 79 steals in 86 attempts...The team's 91.9 percent success rate is the best in the majors...The Mets had a franchise-record run of 35 consecutive stolen bases without being caught from May 14-June 29... Overall, New York has been successful in 53 of their last 54 stolen base attempts.

YOU CAN CALL ME AL: Francisco Alvarez is tied for the lead all major league catchers in home runs and is third among all rookies in homers...He is tied for second in home runs in the majors this month with seven...Only San Diego's Manny Machado has hit more with 11 dingers.

DOWN ON THE FARM: OF Alex Ramírez went 3-5 with three RBI for the Brooklyn Cyclones yesterday...He is batting .240 (75-313) with 50 runs, 15 doubles, five home runs, 15 RBI and 16 steals in 83 games this year...Since the start of June, Alex is second in the South Atlantic League lead in runs (32), third in pitches-per-plate appearance (4.011), and tied for sixth in walks (24) (min. 180 PA)...Ramírez is scattered among the Cyclones' all-time leaderboard despite joining the team last July 4...Entering Wednesday, the Dominican native is third in franchise history in RBI (75) and is 16 behind INF José Peroza (91) for the all-time mark and five behind INF Luke Rittler (80) for second...He is second in doubles (32), third in hits (138), third in total bases (202) and fourth in runs scored (72).

QUINTANA NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Quintana made his first start with the Mets on July 20 against his former team, the Chicago White Sox...Allowed two earned runs on six hits and no walks in 5.0 innings while fanning three batters...Quintana signed a two-year contract with New York on December 9, 2022...The southpaw began the season on the IL due to a stress fracture in his rib cage...Underwent surgery on March 17.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT RECAP: Made five appearances across St. Lucie (A), Binghamton (AA) and Syracuse (AAA) as part of his rehab assignment after being placed on the 60-day IL with a left rib fracture...Threw 15.2 innings in five games, four of which were starts, pitching to a 4.60 ERA (8 ER/15.2 IP) while tallying 16 strikeouts compared to eight walks.

YANKEE DOODLES: Tonight, Quintana will face the Yankees for the eighth time in his career...Through his first seven career outings (six starts) against the Yankees, Quintana is 3-2 with a 2.97 ERA (11 ER/33.1 IP)...Quintana's last outing against the Yankees came on July 5, 2022 while with Pittsburgh...Allowed one run on six hits and no walks while striking out seven batters in a 5-2 Pirates victory at PNC Park.

YOU GOTTA EARN 'EM: Quintana has allowed two earned runs or fewer in each of his last 15 starts dating back to July 23, 2022...It is the longest such streak of his career and the longest such active streak in the majors by a starting pitcher (excluding openers).

HOT STREAK: Quintana has not allowed a home run over his last 66.2 innings dating back to August 4, 2022...Is the longest such active streak in MLB...Last season Quintana owned the lowest ERA (0.89) in Major League Baseball during the month of September last year and is the lowest ERA in any month in his career.

LEFT 'EM SPEECHLESS: Reached 1,500 career strikeouts in his start vs. Colorado on August 16, 2022. Currently ranks fifth among active MLB lefties in strikeouts (1,535) behind Clayton Kershaw (2,912), Chris Sale (2,135), Madison Bumgarner (2,070) and Patrick Corbin (1,551).

2022 SEASON: Quintana allowed two earned runs or fewer in 26 starts in the regular season...Posted a season-high 19.1-inning scoreless streak from September 11-28, the longest scoreless streak in by a Cardinals pitcher in 2022...NL Ranks 2022: ERA (2.93, 8th), Games Started (31, T10th), HR/9 IP (0.43, 1st), GIDP/9 IP (1.25, 1st), GIDP (25, T1st).
