TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 1** of a 3-game series vs **Jay Horwitz'** first-place **Mets** and the Reds' first games here since **2019**...is **Game 5** (3-1) of the Reds' first road trip of the second half, a 7-game jaunt that included a **3-1 series win at Wrigley Field**...following this series the Redlegs return to **Great American Ball Park** for Monday's off day and then a 6-game homestand vs the **Twins** (2g) and **Pirates** (4g) that kicks off a stretch in which the Reds will play **21 consecutive days**.

TRADE DEADLINE TRANSACTIONS:

- **Late Tuesday night**, acquired from the Yankees **RHP Luis Cessa** (#85, SESS-uh) and **LHP Justin Wilson** (#34) for a player to be named.
- **Wednesday morning**, acquired from the Rockies **RHP Mychal Givens** (#48) for minor leaguers **RHP Noah Davis** and **RHP Case Williams**.
- Designated for assignment **RHP Edgar García**, **RHP Ashton Goudeau** and **LHP Josh Osich**.
- **Thursday morning**, traded **RHP Ashton Goudeau** to Rockies for cash.
- **Today**, sent to Louisville on rehabilitation assignments **IF Mike Moustakas** (right heel contusion) and **IF/OF Nick Senzel** (left knee arthroscopic surgery)...**RHP Edgar García**, who was designated for assignment on Tue when the Reds acquired **Cessa** and **Wilson**, was claimed off waivers by the Twins...**LHP Josh Osich**, who was designated for assignment on Wed when the Reds acquired **Givens**, cleared waivers, refused an outright assignment and elected free agency.

SERIES NOTES: Beginning **9/24/13**, the Reds are **12-32 vs NYM (0-2** in 2013, **2-4** in 2014, **0-7** in 2015, **0-6** in 2016, **3-4** in 2017, **3-3** in 2018, **3-4** in 2019, **1-2 in 2021**), including a **14-game losing streak** from **9/7/14 - 9/7/16** that ranks as Cin's **longest ever** vs the Mets and its longest vs any team since a **16-game skid vs Ari** from **5/8/01 - 8/13/03**...dating back to **1962**, the **7-0 series win** by the Mets in **2015** was the **first season series sweep** by either team, followed by NYM's **6-0 series win** in **2016**.

BIG CITI LIGHTS: The Reds are **0-5-1** in their **last 6 completed series** and **5-15** in their **last 20 games** at **Citi Field** (**2-2** in April/May 2019, **1-2** in August 2018, **1-3** in September 2017, **0-3** in April 2016, **0-3** in June 2015, **1-2** in April 2014)...the Reds last won a series at **Citi Field** from **5/20-5/22, 2013** (4-3, 4-0, 7-4 wins)...the Reds' **10-5 win** on **9/10/17** snapped their **9-game losing streak** at **Citi Field** dating back to a **2-1 win** here on **4/6/14**.

JOEY VOTTO:

- 8 of his last 9 hits were home runs...an infield single in the fifth inning yesterday snapped a streak in which each of **8 consecutive hits** were **home runs**, tied for the second-longest such streak in the **Expansion ERA** (since 1961)...**Mark McGwire** holds the record with 11 consecutive hits as home runs from **7/18-8/12, 2001**...courtesy @EliasSports.
- Has homered a **6 consecutive games** (8hr, 14rbi), a franchise record for consecutive apps with at least 1 HR and 2 games shy of the Major League record shared by **Ken Griffey Jr.** (1993), **Don Mattingly** (1987) and **Dale Long** (1956).
- His **8 HR** during this club record 6-game homer streak are the most by a Reds batter over **any 6-game span**...he is the second player this season with **at least 8 HR** in a **6-game span** (**Kyle Schwarber**, 9hr in 6g, 6/19-6/25).
- Joins **Graig Nettles** (8/11-8/22, 1984) and **Frank Thomas** (9/5-9/11, 2006) as the only players in the modern era **age 37 or older** to homer in at least **6 straight games**...**Nettles** and **Thomas** each produced a 6-game homer streak.
- In the 3-1 series win at **Wrigley Field** completed yesterday, he produced **10 RBI** and **with 6 HR** tied **Johnny Bench's** club record for home runs in a 4-game series...**Bench** had **6 HR** and **14 RBI** in a 4-game set vs StL from **7/24-7/27, 1970**.
- The **6 HR** tie the record for most homers in a series by a visiting player at **Wrigley Field**, joining by **Jose Abreu** (3-game series in 2020) and **Matt Carpenter** (5-game series in 2018)...his **10 RBI** fell 3 shy of the ballpark series record for a visiting player (**George Kelley**, 1924 Giants, 4g)...courtesy @EliasSports.
- Tue and Wed became the fourth Reds player in the last 50 years to produce multiple home runs in consecutive apps, joining **Joe Morgan** (1976), **Barry Larkin** (1991) and **Todd Frazier** (6/16 & 6/17, 2015 vs Det)...at **37 years, 321 days old**, **Votto** is the third-oldest player in Major League history to produce consecutive multi-homer games (**David Ortiz**, 38.177, 5/13-5/14, 2014 & **Ty Cobb**, 38.139, 5/5-5/6, 1925)...courtesy @EliasSports.

MORE VOTTO: **Joey Votto** has **1,980 career hits, 315 HR** and **1,024 career RBI**...he is trying to become only the second Major League player ever to record in the same season his **2,000th hit, 300th home run** and **1,000th RBI**...**Billy Williams** did it in **1971**...**Votto** recorded his **300th HR** on **4/30 vs Cubs** (2-run off **Jake Arrieta**) and his **1,000th RBI** on **6/30 vs SD** (solo HR off **Joe Musgrove**)...courtesy @EliasSports.

DOT, DOT, DOT... The Reds went **16-12-6** in their **34 completed series**, including **8-7-3 at GABP** and **8-5-3 on the road**...have **5 series sweep wins** (3g vs Pit, 4g at StL, 3g vs Col, 3g at Mil, 3g vs Cubs) and **5 series sweep losses** (3g vs Ari, 3g at StL, 4g vs SF, 4g at SD, 3g vs Mil).

BETTER LATE THAN NEVER: The Reds rank third in the Major Leagues and lead the National League with **29 come-from-behind wins** (Bos 33, TB 30)...**after the sixth inning**, Reds batters rank among the National League leaders with **184 runs** (1st, 2nd ML), **300 hits** (1st ML), **64 doubles** (1st, 2nd ML), **43 HR** (3rd), **.261 BA** (1st ML), **.432 slugging percentage** (1st ML) and **.348 on-base percentage** (1st ML)...from **7/1-7/5** the Reds trailed in 5 consecutive games but won all 5...was their longest such streak since **1918**.

RED HOTS

- Tonight is making his third career start vs the Mets and his first career appearance in Flushing.
- In Sun's 10-6 loss to the Cardinals allowed a career-high 8 runs and tied his career high by allowing 3 home runs (Tyler O'Neill 2-run, Harrison Bader 3-run, Dylan Carlson 2-run).
- Tomorrow will make his third start since a 10-day stint on the injured list (right rib cage strain).
- Missed the first 13 games of the season with a muscle strain in his back...from 6/9-7/1 missed 22 games with a right groin strain...from 7/8-7/18 missed 6 games surrounding the All-Star break with the right rib cage strain.
- In his 5-2 win on 7/7 at KC, in the 200th start of his Major League career did not return after a 72-minute rain delay after the seventh inning...left leading, 3-2...became the 36th active pitcher with 200 career starts, the 23rd active righthander...the next day went on the 10-day injured list for the third time this season.
- Started 2 of the Reds' 5 shutout wins...Wade Miley started the other 3.

- His 2.13 ERA in July ranks fourth in the Major Leagues (Lance Lynn 1.44, Walker Buehler 1.67, Robbie Ray 1.99).
- In the 9-6 loss at Coors Field on 5/14 allowed a season-high 8 runs (3+ip)...in 11 starts since then is 4-1, 2.38 (68ip, 18er, .264oba).
- From 5/21-5/30 was on the 10-day injured list with a left foot sprain...in 10 starts since his return is 4-0, 2.42 (63.1ip, 17er, .261oba).
- Is his second season with the Reds...joined the club in December 2019, when he signed a 2-year contract through this year.

- This week has homered every day and leads all Major League batters in runs scored (7), HR (6), RBI (10, tied) and slugging percentage (1.667)...in his career has been named National League Player of the Week 5 times, most recently from 4/23-4/29, 2018.
 - Produced at least 1 RBI in each of last 7 apps (16rbi), the longest RBI streak of his career and the longest active streak in the Major Leagues, and in 9 of his last 10 apps (18rbi)...Joe Morgan holds the club record for consecutive apps with at least 1 RBI (10g, 1976, 17rbi).
 - In his last 6 apps has 14 RBI, his highest RBI total over any 6-game span...broke his previous best 6-game RBI total established earlier this season, from 6/9-6/14, when he had 12 RBI over 6 apps.
 - Has a 7-game hitting streak, including at least 1 extra-base hit in each appearance (12-27, .444, 1 2b, 8hr, 16rbi, .515obp, 1.370slg)...his streak of at least 1 extra-base hit in 7 straight apps ties Jesse Winker for the longest active streak in the Major Leagues.

 - In the 10-inning, 1-0 win on 5/5 vs WSox made his 1,800th Major League appearance...in the bottom of the fourth inning was hit by a Dallas Keuchel changeup and left the game after the fifth with the broken left thumb.
 - Did not play in the 10-7 win on 6/22 at Min while serving a 1-game suspension for his actions on Sat at SD that led to his 13th career ejection.
 - In the third inning of the 8-6 win on 4/30 vs Cubs became the third Reds player and ninth active player with 300 career home runs...his 2-run HR off Jake Arrieta gave the Reds a 3-2 lead they would not relinquish...on the Reds' all-time home run list, with 315 HR trails only Hall of Famers Frank Robinson (324) and Johnny Bench (389).
 - In the eighth inning of the 10-inning, 3-2 win on 4/17 vs Cle recorded the first 2 outs of the Reds' 31st triple play, their first since 7/25/2017 at NYY...Josh Naylor lined into the 3-3-5 triple play...Votto also participated in the July 2017 triple play.
 - In the first inning of the 7-5 loss on 6/19 at SD was ejected after arguing a check-swing strikeout...was the 13th ejection of his career, his first this season...singled on the first pitch of his first plate appearance the next day.
 - In the eight inning of the 4-3 win on 7/10 at Mil was ejected after arguing a check-swing strikeout...was the 14th ejection of his career, his second of the season.
 - On 6/30 vs SD homered off Joe Musgrove for his 1,000th Major League RBI...was his 1,821st career appearance.
 - Made his 14th Opening Day roster...appeared in his 13th Opening Day game, fifth-most in Reds history, 1 game behind Johnny Bench and 4 games behind all-time franchise leaders Barry Larkin and Pete Rose (17).
 - Is the 2010 National League Most Valuable Player and Hank Aaron Award winner, a 6-time NL All-Star, a *Sporting News* NL All-Star and the only Reds first baseman ever to win a Rawlings Gold Glove Award.
 - Holds franchise records for career games played at first base (1,796) and intentional walks (142)...shares with Joe Morgan the club career record for number of seasons with at least 100 walks (6).

- 33 JESSE WINKER, lfRoad Trip: 8-18 (.444), 4 2b, solo HR, 2rbi, 2bb, 5r
- Is an All-Star for the first time in his career...in the American League's 5-2 win at Coors Field, started in RF batting sixth behind teammate Nick Castellanos...in the second inning walked (Lance Lynn) and in the fifth grounded out (Nathan Eovaldi).
 - Has a 7-game hitting streak, including at least 1 extra-base hit in each appearance (14-30, .467, 7 2b, 2hr, 6rbi, .529obp, .900slg)...his streak of at least 1 extra-base hit in 7 straight apps ties Joey Votto for the longest active streak in the Major Leagues.
 - Through his third plate appearance on Sunday was hitting .290 (96-331), his lowest batting average of the season...since then is hitting .422 (19-45, 9 2b, 2hr, 8rbi).
 - Hit safely in 71 of his 95 apps...reached base safely in 82 of his 95 apps...is on pace to reach base safely in 128 games...will fall short of the club record for number of games reaching base safely via hit, walk or HBP (150, Joey Votto, 2017).
 - On 6/6 at StL, in his 50th appearance hit his 15th, 16th and 17 home runs to establish a new single-season career high (2019, 16hr in 113g).
 - In the 10-7 win on 6/22 at Min, in his 65th appearance, established a new career high with 45 RBI (2018, 43rbi in 89g).
 - Is the only player in Reds history to produce in a single season a pair of 3-homer games (5/21 vs Mil, 6/6 at StL)...most recently among Major Leaguers, Atl's Adam Duvall had two 3-homer games last season.
 - On 5/21 vs Mil became the 31st player in Reds history to produce 3 HR in a game, accomplished for the 39th time...had his second 3-homer game and a career-high 6 RBI in the 8-7 win on 6/6 vs the Cardinals that led the Reds to their first 4-game sweep in St. Louis since 1990.
 - Received votes for National League Player of the Month for May but finished behind SD's Fernando Tatis Jr....teammate Nick Castellanos also received votes.
 - Has 3 leadoff HR this season and 7 in his career.
 - From 5/21-5/23 vs Mil became the first Reds batter with 5 HR in a 3-game series since Willie Greene did it from 9/24-9/26, 1996 vs Cubs (5hr) and the first ML player since José Abreu did it from 8/21-8/23, 2020, also vs Cubs (6hr).
 - On 5/23 vs Mil hit a 456-foot HR off Freddy Peralta, the longest homer of his career and the second-longest by a Reds batter this season (Tyler Naquin, 5/21 vs Mil off Adrian Houser, 459 feet).
 - In the third inning of the 7-2 loss on 5/11 at Pit became the 41st player to hit a homer that reached on the fly or bounced into the Allegheny River (61st time).
 - Started at designated hitter in 5 of the Reds' 7 interleague road games (3-19, .158, 2 2b, 2rbi, 3bb, 6k).
