TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 9-game homestand with the finale of 3 games against the Baltimore Orioles ( $0-2$ )...Seattle opened the homestand with a 3 -game series vs. the Minnesota Twins (1-2)...the Mariners will wrap-up the homestand with 3 games against the Toronto Blue Jays (July 5-7)... today's game will be televised live on ROOT SPORTS with Dave Sims and Mike Blowers on the call.. the game will also be broadcast live on Seattle Sports (710 AM) with Rick Rizzs and Aaron Goldsmith. ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners fell to the Orioles last night by a score of $4-1$...despite 4 consecutive losses, the Mariners are 20-15 (.571) over their last 35 games ( $5 / 26-c$ ).

- First Place - Seattle (47-41) is in 1st place in the American League West Division by 2.0 games over the 2nd place Houston Astros (44-42)...the Mariners have held 1st place for 53 consecutive days ( $5 / 12-\mathrm{c}$ ).
- Home Field Advantage - Seattle's 28-16 (.636) record at T-Mobile Park is the 6th-best home record in the Majors, trailing only the Guardians (27-9/.750) and Royals (31-17/.646) in the AL...the Mariners are 13-6 (.684) over their last 19 home games since May 27.
- Greatest Hits - Seattle is 35-4 (.897) when out-hitting its opponent this season.
- Dirty Floors - The Mariners are looking to avoid being swept in a series for the first time this season.. Seattle was last swept from Sept. 22-24, 2023 at Texas (3G) and suffered only 4 series sweeps during the 2023 season...Seattle is 1 of 4 teams this season that has yet to be swept in a series of $2+$ games, joining Cleveland, Philadelphia and New York-AL.
- Rehab Update - RHP Gregory Santos began a rehab assignment with Triple-A Tacoma on Tuesday, tossing a scoreless inning with 1 strikeout and 1 hit on 13 pitches, 9 strikes.
FOURTH OF JULY...the Mariners have won each of their last 3 games on the Fourth of July: 2023 at SF (60 ), 2022 at SD (8-2) and 2021 vs. TEX (4-1)...prior to the current 3 -game winning streak on Independence Day, Seattle had lost 8-consecutive Fourth of July games from 2012-19, having previously won 5 in a row on the Fourth from 2007-11...overall, the Mariners are 8-8 over their last 16 games on July 4th and are 1925 all-time...Seattle did not play on July 4th during 3 seasons: 1981, 1983 and 2020...Logan Gilbert threw his first career shutout in last year's Fourth of July contest at San Francisco, tossing 9.0 scoreless innings with 7 strikeouts in the 6-0 Mariners win.
PITCHING AT HOME...Seattle's pitching staff has allowed 129 runs at T-Mobile Park this season, the fewest runs allowed at home in the Majors (next: Texas, 141 R allowed)...the Mariners lead the Majors in home ERA (2.65), WHIP (0.93), hits-per-9 innings (6.49), walks-per-9 innings (1.86), strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.87) and opponent batting average (.199), while ranking 5th in strikeouts-per-9 innings (9.18)...Seattle's 4.87 strikeout-to-walk ratio this year is currently the highest home SO/BB ratio in Major League history, ranking ahead of Cleveland (4.81 in 2017).
THE RECIPE....the Mariners are 36-6 (.857) this season when scoring 4+ runs in a game, as opposed to 11-34 (.244) when scoring 3-or-fewer runs...Seattle's .857 winning percentage when dialing up $4+$ runs is best in the Majors...it is also on pace to be the 2nd-best record when scoring 4+ runs in franchise history, trailing only the 2001 Mariners (.886/101-13).
ALL-STAR(TERS)...the Mariners starting rotation has several All-Star candidates...Logan Gilbert leads the American Leaque in WHIP ( 0.88 ) and innings pitched (117.2), while ranking tied for the AL lead in quality starts (14), 4th in opponent batting average (.199) and 6th in ERA (2.91)...George Kirby leads the Maiors in strikeout-to-walk ratio (10.10) and ranks 2nd in MLB in fewest walks-per-9 innings (0.85)...Luis Castillo's 103 strikeouts rank 11th in the AL, while Bryce Miller ranks 6th in the AL in opponent batting average (.208). QUALITY ASSURANCE...the Mariners pitching staff leads the Majors in quality starts (51), with Seattle going 39-12 (.765) when its starter goes 6.0+ innings while allowing 3-or-fewer earned runs...the Mariners have 4 starters with $8+$ quality starts this season: Logan Gilbert (14 QS), Geore Kirby (11), Luis Castillo (10) and Bryce Miller (8)...Gilbert's 14 QS are tied for most in MLB with Seth Lugo-KC and Zack WheelerPHI...the Mariners and Phillies (Aaron Nola, Cristopher Sánchez, Ranger Suárez and Zack Wheeler) are the only teams in the Majors with 4 pitchers recording 8+ QS this season.
THREE WINNING MONTHS...the Mariners are coming off of their 3rd consecutive winning month, going 15-12 during June...Seattle went 17-13 in March/April and 15-14 in May...Seattle has started the season with 3 winning months for the 5th time in franchise history (2001-03, '18, '24)...with a winning month of July, the 2024 Mariners would become the 3rd team in franchise history to begin the season with 4 consecutive winning months (also: 2001 and 2002).
ANDRÉS MUÑOZ: WORTHY OF BEING AN AL ALL-STAR...right-hander Andrés Muñoz has 13 saves and a 1.64 ERA ( 6 ER, 33.0 IP) with 43 strikeouts and 13 walks in 33 appearances this season...his next save will set a career-high, after he recorded 13 saves in 2023...this season, Muñoz has posted a 1.03 WHIP and limited opposing hitters to a . 179 batting average...the 25 -year-old is 1 of 2 American League pitchers with $13+$ saves and a sub-2.00 ERA, along with Emmanuel Clase-CLE...Muñoz is 1 of 2 MLB pitchers with 10+ saves and $5+$ holds this season, along with José Alvarado-PHI.
THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT...the Mariners had 4 players in their minor league system earn monthly awards for June...pitchers Emerson Hancock (AAA Pacific Coast League), Danny Wirchansky (AA Texas League) and Brandyn Garcia (A+ Northwest League) each earned the Pitcher of the Month Award for their respective leagues, while OF Jared Sundstrom (A+) earned Northwest League Player of the Month...additionally, it was announced yesterday that INF Cole Young and C Harry Ford will represent the Mariners at the SirusXM Futures Game on July 13 at Globe Life Field in Texas.
ON THE HOMESTAND...the remaining promotions on the current 9-game homestand include Patriotic Cap today...the Mariners will welcome the Toronto Blue Jays ( $3 \mathrm{G}, 7 / 5-7$ ) for a weekend series to close out the final homestand before the All-Star Break.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...the Mariners are 3-0 over their last 3 games on the Fourth of July, including last year's 6-0 win at San Francisco behind Logan Gilbert's first career shutout, but...DID YOU KNOW?.. during the current 3 -game winning streak on July 4th (2021-c), Seattle starters are 3-0 with a 0.42 ERA (1 ER, 21.2 IP) with 3 walks and 20 strikeouts?... 2023 Logan Gilbert at San Francisco (0 ER, 9.0 IP), 2022 Chris Flexen at San Diego (6.2 IP, 0 ER) and 2021 Chris Flexen vs. Texas (6.0 IP, 1 ER).

## ABOUT BRYCE MILLER

- The 25 -year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 18th start of 2024 and his 2nd against Baltimore...marks his 43rd career start and 4th against the Orioles.
- Selected by Seattle in the 4th round (113th overall) of the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Derek Miller.
- Spent 3 seasons at Texas A\&M from 2019-21...also spent 2 seasons playing for Brazos Valley Bombers of the Texas Collegiate League in 2018 and 2020, and 1 season with the Falmouth Commodores of the Cape Cod League in 2019.
- Was born in Mount Pleasant, Texas and attended New Braunfels High School in New Braunfels, Texas.
LAST TIME OUT...L\#7 on $6 / 29$ vs. Minnesota...pitched 5.0 innings and allowed 2 runs on 5 hits, with 1 walk and 6 strikeouts...his 12 th consecutive start with 3 -or-less walks allowed.
KEEPIN' IT LOW...his 208 opponent average ( $74 \times 356$ ) against ranks 10th in the Majors and 6 th in the AL....he is 11th in the AL in WHIP (1.05)...the only Mariners pitcher to go a single season with a Opp. AVG below . 200 is Randy Johnson (1997, .194).
HOME SWEET HOME...in his last 8 starts at home (4/12-c), he has a 4-2 record with a 1.46 ERA ( $8 \mathrm{ER}, 49.1 \mathrm{IP}$ ) with 59 strikeouts and 13 walks...in each of the outings he has allowed 2-or-fewer runs and has quality starts in 7 of the 8 starts...his 1.99 ERA (12 ER, 54.1 IP) across all home starts this season is the lowest on the Mariners pitching staff.
YOU GOTTA EARN IT.... has given up 2 ER or fewer in 11 of 17 games this season and 1 ER or fewer in 6 games...George Kirby leads Mariner starters with 13 games of 2 or less ER allowed.
EVERYTHING IS ALL LEFT...left-handed batters are slashing .205/.274/.415 (40x195) with 19 walks, 44 strikeouts, 8 doubles and 11 home runs, in 2024.
HIT LIMITER...his start on $6 / 12$ vs. Chicago-AL was his 12 th career game with $6.0+$ innings pitched and 3 -or-fewer hits allowed...since his debut on May 2, 2023, he is tied for the 9th-most in the Majors and tied for the 4th-most in the AL....he has done so on 5 occasions this season, tied for the 2nd most in MLB while trailing Tyler Glasnow-LAD (8).
IT WORKS $80 \%$ OF THE TIME, EVERYTIME...hitters this season are batting .195 (59x303) against his 4-seam fastball, splitter and sinker combined... $80.3 \%$ of his pitches thrown this year have been one of those three... 82 of his 91 strikeouts this season have come via a 4 -seam fastball (39), splitter (28) or sinker (15) and he has allowed 10 doubles and 10 home runs on those pitches.
SOME QUALITY TIME....has tossed 17 quality starts (6.0+ IP, 3 ER or less) in 42 career outings...in games where he tosses a quality start the Mariners are 15-2.
AMERICAN v NATIONAL...in 5 outings against the National League this year, he is $3-1$ with a 2.37 ERA ( 8 ER, 30.1 IP), 31 strikeouts and 4 quality starts...has allowed 1-or-fewer runs 4 out of 5 starts...NL hitters are slashing .144/.198/.269 against Miller in 2024.
NO APRIL SHOWERS...in his 5 starts in April, he held a 1.19 ERA (4 ER, 30.1
IP) with 3 wins, 4 quality starts and an opponent batting average of .127 (13×102)...this marks the lowest ERA and the lowest batting average against in a single calendar month during his career...it is also tied for the most wins in a month (May 2023, 3) and 2nd-most quality starts during a single month in his career (May 2023, 5).
YOU SHALL NOT SCORE...tossed 14.0 consecutive scoreless innings starting in the 5th inning of his start vs. Boston (3/31) and ending in his start vs. Chicago-NL (4/12) in the 7th.
200 AND COUNTING...recorded his 200th career strikeout in his last start against Cleveland on 6/18 after striking out Bo Naylor-CLE in the 2nd inning...his 210 strikeouts in his first 42 career games ranks 8th in franchise history.
AMONG THE BEST OF THEM...finished in the top 10 among rookies with a minimum of 100.0 innings pitched in various pitching categories in 2023, including BB/9 (1st, 1.78), SO/BB (1st, 4.58), WHIP (3rd, 1.14), GS (4th, 25), wins (T-6th, 8), IP (7th, 131.1) and ERA (9th, 4.32).
MAKING MORE HISTORY...became the 1st pitcher since at least 1901 to go $6.0+$ innings pitched and allow 2-or-fewer hits in at least 4 of his first 10 career appearances.
MAKING IT LOOK EASY...he became the only pitcher in MLB history to have $6.0+$ innings pitched and allow 3-or-fewer baserunners in his first 3 career starts...his 3 -game streak of $6.0+$ innings pitched and 3 -or-fewer baserunners allowed is tied for the longest since 1901...Blake Snell-SDP and Corbin Burnes-MIL were the most recent pitchers to achieve this feat, both doing so in 2021.
AN ALMOST PERFECT BEGINNING...took a perfect game into the 6th inning in his first career Major League start at Oakland on $5 / 2 / 23$ before a Tony Kemp 1-out single broke up the no-hit bid...the 16-consecutive batters retired in a pitcher's MLB debut are the most since 1961 ( $h / t$ Elias
