Turning Two

Atlanta's infield turned a pair of double plays last night, a 3-6-3 twin killing in the top of the second inning and a 6-4-3 turn in the seventh.

The Braves have turned six double plays through five games this season, tied with the Reds for the most in the National League and behind just the Astros (8) in the majors.

Atlanta ranked 24th in baseball last season after turning just 98 double plays in their infield on the year.

The Braves turned a pair of double plays behind Chris Sale on Opening Day, matching the total from his starts all of last season.

Bullpen

RH Joel Payamps and LH Martín Pérez combined to tossed 5.1 innings of one-run baseball in relief for Atlanta last night, and the club's 1.47 ERA (3 ER/18.1 IP) from the bullpen ranks fifth in the majors.

Only the Marlins, with a 0.51 mark from their relievers, have been better in the NL.

Atlanta relievers have fanned 18 batters and issued just two free passes, its fewest base-on-balls allowed through five games since 1994.

Pérez and RH Didier Fuentes are two of just five relievers in the majors this year to go at least 4.0 innings in an appearance.

TODAY'S GAME: The Braves and Athletics today conclude a three-game midweek set in what are the only scheduled meetings between the clubs this season...The A's won two-of-three to take the series between the clubs last year.

A The Athletics claimed their first victory of the season last night, beating the Braves, 5-2, to even the series at one game apiece...The two will play the rubber game this afternoon.

A The two clubs last played here at Truist Park in 2024, and Atlanta won two-of-three...Since the facility opened in 2017, the Braves are 5-2 in seven total games versus the Athletics here...The A's are 5-11 all-time in the city of Atlanta.

A Despite dropping the series last season, Atlanta is 20-10 (.667) all-time against the Athletics franchise...Atlanta's .667 winning percentage versus the A's is its second-best mark against any AL club in interleague play (Minnesota, 20-8, .714)...Conversely, the A's .333 winning percentage against the Braves is also its second-lowest mark against any NL club (Chicago, 7-17, .292).

A RH Luis Severino is set today to make the sixth start of his career against Atlanta, and his first since 2024...The 6-foot-2, 218-pound native of the Dominican Republic is 1-2 with a 4.13 ERA (11 ER/24.0 IP) all-time versus the Braves, but has not beat the club since pitching 6.0 scoreless innings in 2015 in his first appearance against them.

CHRIS SALE: LH Chris Sale will make his second start of the season for Atlanta this afternoon, after pitching 6.0 scoreless frames and earning the win on Opening Day versus Kansas City.

A The 6-foot-6, 180-pound left-hander has made 12 starts and 17 total appearances against the Athletics in his career, and is 6-4 with a 3.42 ERA (32 ER/84.1 IP) and one save against them.

A He last faced the Athletics on June 1, 2024 and allowed nine hits and eight runs over just 4.0 innings, the most runs he has allowed as a member of the Braves...Since the date of his next start following that appearance, June 7, 2024, his 2.23 ERA is best by a qualified left-hander in the National League and trails only Paul Skenes (2.02) in all of baseball.

A The Braves signed Sale to a one-year, \$27 million contract extension this spring that will cover the 2027 season, with a \$30 million club option for 2028.

RUBBER GAMES & DAY GAMES: The Braves are set to play their first rubber game of the season this afternoon after splitting the first two games of this series, and their second game in the daytime.

A The Braves went just 8-14 (.363) in series-deciding games last season, including losses in both of their last two opportunities.

A Atlanta was 23-28 (.451) last year in day games, and lost its first such game this year on Sunday.

DRAKE BALDWIN: Opened last night's scoring with a solo home run out to right field in the first inning, and ended the game 1-for-4 with a walk...The drive counted for his third home run through Atlanta's first five games.

A His three homers are tied for most in the National League and trail just Chase DeLauter and Shea Langeliers, who both have four, in all of baseball.

A Baldwin is the first Braves primary catcher to homer three times in the team's first five games in modern-era franchise history (since 1900)...Just 12 players have done so in total, regardless of position, with Marcell Ozuna in 2024 being the last.

A Baldwin has 22 total homers since the beginning of 2025, trailing just Colorado's Hunter Goodman (32) for most by a catcher in the National League.

A Through an admittedly small sample of the season's first five games, Baldwin ranks in the 95th percentile or better in all of baseball in expected weighted on-base (95th, .513), expected slugging percentage (95th, .784), hard-hit percentage (96th, 69.2%) and bat speed (97th, 76.7 mph).

OZZIE IN PLAY: Ozzie Albies snapped his on-base streak at four straight games to open the season last night, but also put the ball in play in all four trips to the plate.

A Albies has not struck out in any of his 20 plate appearances this season, extending his streak to 40 consecutive plate appearances without fanning dating to 2025...It is the longest active streak in the majors.

A Albies (426) needs just one extra-base hit to pass Braves Hall of Famer Tommy Holmes and Brian McCann (426) for 10th in franchise history and sixth in Atlanta history...His Opening Day homer tied Holmes and McCann in franchise annals.

FORMER TEAM CARD: Matt Olson is set tonight to face the A's for the 16th team in his career...A former first-round pick of the A's in 2012, he appeared in 575 career games for the club from 2016-21.

A The Atlanta native finished fourth in AL Rookie of the Year voting for the A's in 2017, won Gold Gloves with the franchise in 2018 & 2019, and represented the club at the 2021 All-Star Game...His 142 home runs for the A's rank 16th in the 125-year history of the franchise.

A Olson has batted .254 (15-for-59) in his first 15 games against his former club, with three homers, 10 RBI and a .786 OPS...He has base hits in both games of this series, including a run-scoring double on Monday night.

OPENING IN INTERLEAGUE: For the first time in franchise history, Atlanta opened its season with an interleague series as the Braves hosted the Kansas City Royals this weekend.

A Atlanta will play 12 of its first 16 games against American League opponents to open the year, with just one of its first five series of the season against a fellow NL club.

Today's Game

Slated to make the 18th career appearance and 13th career start against the Athletics, and second start of the season...Last faced the Athletics on June 1, 2024, allowing eight earned runs over 4.0 innings in a 9-11 loss here at Truist Park.

Over 17 career appearances (12 starts) against the Athletics, Sale owns a 6-4 record with a 3.42 ERA (32 ER/84.1 IP) and 91 strikeouts...Eight of his 12 starts came during his time with Chicago (AL) from 2010-16.

Made his 37th career appearance (26th start) against Kansas City on Opening Day, his most against any opponent...Lowered his ERA against the Royals to 2.58 (56 ER/195.2 IP), the second-lowest ERA by a pitcher against Kansas City (min. 190 IP).

Earned the win in his seventh career opener start on March 27, holding the Royals to three hits over 6.0 scoreless innings with six strikeouts and three walks in the 6-0 victory

Became the first Braves starting pitcher to throw 6.0-or-more innings on Opening Day since Michael Soroka (6.0 IP, July 24, 2020).

Is the first Braves lefty to toss 6.0-plus scoreless innings while allowing three or fewer hits in the season opener since Tom Glavine on April 7, 1992 at Houston.

Threw 88 pitches (54 strikes) in the win, inducing two double plays, and did not allow a runner past second base...It was his sixth career Opening Day start with 85-or-more pitches, the most such games by a starting pitcher since Madison Bumgarner logged six between 2015 and 2021.

His seven Opening Day starts are tied for the second-most among active pitchers with Toronto's Max Scherzer...Trails only Detroit's Justin Verlander (12)...Is the 11th pitcher in MLB history to make multiple Opening Day starts for three different teams.

Was the season-opening starter for Chicago (AL) in 2013-14, '16, Boston in 2018-19 and Atlanta in 2025-26.

Following his Opening Day start, Sale's career ERA stands at 3.00 (697 ER/2090.0 IP)...His career ERA of 3.00 ranks 11th lowest in baseball history dating to the Live Ball era among pitchers with as many games pitched and as many starts.

Posted a 2.41 ERA (83 ER/309.1 IP) with 396 strikeouts in 51 appearances (50 starts) through his first three seasons with Atlanta (2024-26).

Since joining the Braves in 2024, Sale's 2.41 ERA is the third lowest in the majors among qualified pitchers...Trails only Cy Young Award Winners Pittsburgh's Paul Skenes (2.10) and Detroit's Tarik Skubal (2.27).

Sale's career rate of K/9 (11.13) and K/BB ratio (5.29) are both the highest marks in baseball history among pitchers with at least 2,000.0 innings pitched.

He's logged 91 games with 10 or more strikeouts throughout his career; eighth-most in MLB history...Has 20 career games with at least 10 strikeouts and zero walks issued, also the eighth most in baseball history dating to 1901...Needs two more to tie six-time All-Star Curt Schilling for seventh on the all-time list.

Signed a one-year, \$27 million contract extension with Atlanta on February 24, keeping him under club control through 2027 with a team option for 2028.

Went 2-0 with a 2.75 ERA in five Grapefruit League starts this spring, striking out 15 over 19.2 innings with just one walk...Allowed one run over 6.0 innings in his final spring outing on March 21 at Boston.

Celebrated his 37th birthday on Monday, March 30.

2025

Went 7-5 with a 2.58 ERA (36 ER/125.2 IP) and 165 strikeouts in 21 games (20 starts) in his second season with Atlanta...Was named to the NL All-Star team for the second consecutive season.

Missed 62 games after landing on the 15-day injured list on June 21 with a fractured left rib cage...Posted a 1.75 ERA in six appearances since being activated.

Pitched to a 2.72 ERA with a 51:6 strikeout-to-walk ratio over his final 36.1 innings after returning from the injury.

Recorded his 2,500th career strikeout on May 29 against Philadelphia - the fastest pitcher to reach the milestone in innings pitched (2,026.0 IP), breaking Hall-of-Famer Randy Johnson's previous mark (2,107.2 IP).

Sale went 2-0 with a 1.11 ERA in five starts during the month of May...His ERA was the fourth lowest in the majors during that span.

Dating to 1913 when earned runs became an official statistic, Sale's career 2.35 ERA in May is the lowest among pitchers with at least 50 starts...Edging out Hall-of-Famer Pedro Martínez's 2.36 ERA in May.

Sale's last outing before landing on the injured list came on June 18 against New York (NL)...He finished one out short of a shutout, holding the Mets to five hits and one walk over 8.2 scoreless innings with seven strikeouts, earning his fifth win of the year.

Threw 116 pitches in his start, the most since also throwing 116 on July 23, 2019 against Tampa Bay with Boston...It was the 36th career outing with as many pitches thrown.

Made his first relief appearance since May 8, 2012 while with Chicago (AL) in the season finale on September 28 against Pittsburgh, striking out nine over 5.2 innings to earn the win.

Career Recap

Awards: NL Cy Young (2024), Rawlings Gold Glove (2024), NL Comeback Player of the Year (2024), AL All-Star (7x, 2012-18), NL All-Star (2024-25), and World Series Champion (2018).

In his 16th major league season, Sale was selected to seven consecutive AL All-Star teams from 2012-2018, was selected to the NL All-Star team in 2024 & 2025, and has eight career Top 10 finishes in Cy Young voting, winning the award with Atlanta in 2024.

In his first year with Atlanta and 14th major league season, Sale was named the National League Cy Young Award winner, a Rawlings Gold Glove Award recipient, a National League All-Star, a First-Team All-MLB Nomination and the National League Comeback Player of the Year, going 18-3 with a 2.38 ERA (47 ER/177.2 IP) and 225 strikeouts.

Led the National League in wins, strikeouts and ERA...Became the first pitcher in Braves franchise history to win the triple crown and first in the National League since Clayton Kershaw with Los Angeles in 2011.

- Appeared in 42 games in his second season as a Brave, pitching to a 3-2 record and a 3.81 ERA (23 ER/54.1 IP) with 51 strikeouts and a 1.25 WHIP, his lowest since 2020...Was placed on the injured list on August 24 due to left shoulder inflammation and missed the remainder of the season.
- Ranked in the 99th percentile in baseball with a barrel rate of just 3.2% in 2025...His seven total barrels and 2.3% barrel rate allowed since joining the Braves in 2024 are both the best in the majors (min. 400 batters faced).
- Opponents hit ground balls off him 55.8% of the time last season (league average 42.4%)...Since his debut in 2017, Bummer's career ground ball rate of 64.2% is highest in the majors (min. 350 games).
- Tossed his curveball a career-high 35.1% of the time in 2025, the most of any major league pitcher with at least 900 total pitches last season...Utilized a curveball for the first time in 2024 at a 2.3% clip.

- In his third full season with Atlanta, appeared in a career-high 70 games and went 29-for-34 in save opportunities...Pitched to a 3.21 ERA (24 ER/67.1 IP)...Ranked fourth in the NL and tied for ninth in the majors in saves.
- Among active pitchers with as many appearances since his Braves debut on August 5, 2022 (222 apps.), Iglesias owns the best WHIP (0.94) and second-best ERA (2.35, 57 ER/218.2 IP).
- Ranks second among Braves pitchers in franchise history (min. 100 G) in WHIP and ERA+ (180), third in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.88), fourth in hits-per-nine-innings (6.5) and fifth in ERA and saves (97).
- Did not allow a run in 42 of 45 appearances from June 9 until the end of the season...Led major league pitchers in this span (min. 40.0 IP) in hits-per-nine-innings (4.15) and saves (21), tied for the most fWAR among relievers (1.5) and ranked second in ERA (1.25, 6 ER/43.1 IP) and WHIP (0.69).
- Was named the NL Reliever of the Month for August for the third consecutive season after converting all 10 of his save opportunities and allowing a 0.69 ERA (1 ER/13.0 IP) in the month.

- Set a career high and led the team with 74 appearances, going 2-4 with a 3.29 ERA (25 ER/68.1 IP) and matching a career high with 76 punchouts...Collected the first two saves of his major league career.
- Did not allow a run in 31 of his first 38 appearances through June 29, tying for the sixth-lowest ERA (1.67, 7 ER/37.2 IP) among major league pitchers in that span (min. 35.0 IP).
