**UNDER REVIEW:** Orioles Manager **Brandon Hyde** challenged the call of **3B Brian Anderson** being hit by a pitch in the first inning...Upon review, the call on the field was overturned to a foul ball.

## ORIOLES NOTES

- The Orioles avoided being swept by the Marlins with an 8-7 walk-off victory, moving to 19-34 at home this season...It was the O's fourth walk-off win of the season, and second over their last three games; their previous two came in April...The Orioles avoided being swept for the 12<sup>th</sup> time this season and are now 6-8 in Interleague play this year...Baltimore has hit at least two home runs in six-straight games, their longest stretch since homering two-or-more times in 10-straight games from 7/17-27/19...O's batters walked a combined season-high nine times.
- **RHP Jorge López** allowed five runs on seven hits (one home run) and two walks with two strikeouts through 2.0 innings of the no decision, matching his shortest start of the season (also: 5/15 vs. NYY)...Has given up seven-or-more hits in seven of his last nine games and has allowed five-or-more runs in four of the nine...Threw 58 pitches, 35 strikes.
- **C Pedro Severino** put the Orioles within two runs in the second frame with a three-run shot to center field for his sixth home run of the season...Of 28 career home runs, it was the first to come on a 2-1 pitch...According to *Statcast*, it was his second-farthest (422 ft.) and second-hardest-hit (108.0 mph) homer of the season behind a 114.6 mph blast on 6/20 vs. Toronto and a 431-foot shot on 6/1 vs. Minnesota.
- **DH Trey Mancini** extended his current hit-streak to 10 games with a solo shot to left field in the third inning, cutting Miami's lead to 5-4; it is the third-longest hitting streak of his career...He has now registered an extra-base hit in a career-long six-straight contests, tied for the longest active streak in Major League Baseball (Votto, CIN and Winker, CIN)...Mancini has gone 16-for-41 (.390) over his last 10 games with four doubles, one triple, three home runs, four RBI, three walks, and nine runs scored...He has six multi-hit games over this stretch, and the three homers have come across his last four games.
- **SS Ramón Urías** knocked an RBI double to left-center field in the third inning and doubled again to right field in the eighth frame for his second career game with multiple extra-base hits (also: 2-2B, 9/24/20 at Boston)...It was his 11<sup>th</sup> multi-hit game of the season, tied for the seventh-most on the club.
- **PH/LF Ryan McKenna** recorded the first walk-off of his career when he drew a walk with one out and the bases loaded in the ninth inning, scoring **CF Cedric Mullins**...Mullins walked to lead off the frame before advancing on a wild pitch and a **LF/RF Austin Hays** sacrifice bunt...**DH Trey Mancini** and **1B Ryan Mountcastle** were both intentionally walked to load the bases.

## MARLINS NOTES

- The Marlins could not complete a two-game sweep of the Orioles after dropping tonight's contest, 8-7...They are now 3-11 against American League opponents this season, with two of those wins coming against Baltimore...Despite the loss, the Marlins are winners of seven of their last nine games at Camden Yards since the start of the 2018 season...Miami dropped to 20-35 on the road this season.
- **RHP Jordan Holloway** did not factor in the decision, allowing five runs (four earned) on three hits and four walks with four strikeouts through 2.1 innings...Was his fourth start of the season and first since 6/30 at Philadelphia, but was the shortest start of his career...Has walked four-or-more batters in four outings this season, and each of his last two...Marked the first time he gave up multiple home runs in a game in his career...Threw 60 pitches, 32 strikes.
- **DH Jesús Aguilar** slugged his 18<sup>th</sup> home run of the season to center field in the second inning, a two-run shot that gave the Marlins a 5-0 lead...Was his first longball since homering in back-to-back games 7/16-17...Has notched seven RBI during his current five-game hit-streak since 7/23...Leads Major League Baseball with 24 multi-RBI games this year, this was his fifth game of the season with three-or-more RBI (last: 7/16 at PHI).
- **3B Brian Anderson** extended his career-long hitting streak to 11 games with an RBI single through the right side in the opening frame, increasing the Marlins lead to 2-0...Is batting .425 (17-for-40) over this stretch with three doubles, three home runs, five RBI, seven walks, three stolen bases, and eight runs scored.
