**DOWN TO THE WIRE ... AGAIN:** The Detroit Tigers and Kansas City Royals tonight play the middle game of their three-game set at Kauffman Stadium after the Tigers endured a 4-3, walk-off loss last night, their fourth setback in a row ... the Tigers and Royals have now seen all four of their games against each other this season decided by a last at-bat win by the home team ... the Tigers have lost nine of their last 13 games after winning 10 of their previous 13 games into this stretch.

- The Tigers have now endured a walk-off loss in each of their last four road series (last night, April 29 at Atlanta, April 24 at Cincinnati, April 17 at Boston) ... the Tigers have endured a walk-off loss in four-straight series for the first time in 29 years, when they took a walk-off loss in five series in a row from April 21-May 18, 1997 ... thanks to Elias.
- Detroit is 6-15 on the road thus far, a .286 winning percentage, the lowest road mark in the majors and the club's roughest 21-game road start since a 6-15 opening salvo in 2022 ... the Tigers have been 6-15 or worse through 21 road games just four times in the last 25 years.
- After tomorrow's series finale, the Tigers will take Monday off before concluding this two-city, six-game trek with a three-game set at the New York Mets starting Tuesday.

**NIGHT OWNS:** The Tigers are seven games (2-5) into a stretch of 11-straight night games through next Wednesday in New York ... it is Detroit's longest stretch of consecutive night games in nearly 27 years since an 11-game run from August 16-28, 1999 ... the Tigers are 11-3 during day games this year, good for a .786 winning percentage, the best mark in the majors ... the Tigers are 7-18 at night, which is a .280 winning percentage, last in all of baseball.

**22 OF THIS, 21 OF THAT, AT 21:** Kevin McGonigle enters tonight's game with 22 walks and 21 strikeouts this year at the age of 21 ... as we approach the quarter pole of the season, it's interesting to note that only two rookies since the Year 2000 have finished a rookie campaign with 500 plate appearances and more walks than strikeouts: Boston's Dustin Pedroia (47 walks and 42 strikeouts in 2007) and Cleveland's Steven Kwan (62 walks and 60 strikeouts in 2022).

- In the last 40 years starting in 1986, only two players aged 21-years-old or younger have had 500 plate appearances in a season and finished with more walks than strikeouts: Texas' Jerry Browne in 1987 (61 walks, 50 strikeouts) and Milwaukee's Gary Sheffield in 1990 (44 walks and 41 strikeouts).

**GREENE WITH ENVY:** Riley Greene is now batting .376 (32-for-85) with seven doubles, four homers, 13 RBI, a .470 on-base percentage, a .600 slugging percentage and a 1.070 OPS in his last 25 games over the four weeks starting Saturday, April 11 ... he leads the majors in batting average and on-base percentage and is fifth in the majors in OPS during in this span.

**FIRST THINGS FIRST:** The Tigers are batting .297 (46-for-155) with a .391 on-base percentage, .465 slugging percentage and an .856 OPS in the first inning this season, the best first-inning on-base percentage in all of baseball, the second-best batting average and the sixth-best OPS ... the Tigers are averaging 18.8 pitches seen per first inning, tied for the second-best mark in the big leagues.

**GREENE STREAK:** Riley Greene went 3-for-4 with a double last night and has now reached base safely in 19-straight games, the third-longest active streak in the American League.

- This run marks Greene's second streak of reaching base safely in 16 or more games already this season, as he started off by reaching base safely in his first 16 games of the campaign ... he is the only player in all of baseball with multiple streaks of 16 or more games this year.
- Greene is one game shy of his career-best 20-game streak from August 20-September 14, 2022 ... he now owns the longest on-base streak by a Tiger this season, surpassing Kevin McGonigle who reached base safely in 18-straight games from April 10-30.

**EXTRA, EXTRA!** Detroit has an extra-base hit in 37-straight games dating to March 28, the longest active streak in all of baseball ... Baltimore is next at 31-straight games ... this is Detroit's longest extra-base hit streak since a 44-game run from August 4-September 23, 2025.

**IT'S GOOD FOR SOMETHING:** Kevin McGonigle has a 2.1 bWAR through his first 37 major league games, tied with Mike Trout for the fourth-best mark in the American League and trailing only Bobby Witt Jr, Cody Bellinger and Aaron Judge ... Kevin is 21-years-old.

**HE'S JUST THE ROOKIE OF THE MONTH:** Kevin McGonigle has been named the American League Rookie of the Month for March/April, the seventh-ever Tiger to win the award, the first Tiger since Colt Keith in July of 2024 and only the second Tiger to ever win it in the first month of the season, joining Austin Jackson who did so in April of 2010.

**AND FINALLY:** Kenley Jansen's next appearance will be the 945th relief outing of his major league career, breaking a tie with LaTroy Hawkins for the 17th-most relief appearances in big league history ... Jansen is the active leader in this category, ahead of Boston's Aroldis Chapman (876).

- Has made 13 starts in his career, with his most recent coming in 2018...enters tonight's game with a 1.59 ERA in seven games this year (11.1 innings).
- Made his season debut on April 23 against the Brewers...allowed one hit and one walk while striking out one over 1.1 frames.
- Had his contract selected by Detroit on April 22...when he makes his season debut with the Tigers, it will be the eighth major league team he has pitched for in his career...most recently, he pitched for Baltimore and Miami in 2024.
- Started the year with Triple-A Toledo where he allowed just two earned runs on four hits including one home run in eight games (10.0 innings)...limited opponents to a .114 batting average against him, striking out 16 compared to zero walks.
- Had a 2.35 ERA over eight games (7.2 innings) in 2026 Spring Training with Detroit...struck out nine batters compared to just one walk over that span.

- Earned his first win of the season and second of his major league career on April 30 against Atlanta, tossing 2.0 scoreless frames...allowed one hit and one walk while striking out two, keeping Detroit within a run before they took the lead late.
- Earned his first career major league save with 3.1 scoreless innings, allowing two walks while striking out two in a victory over the Marlins on April 11.
- Signed with Detroit on a one-year major league contract with a club option for the 2027 season on Dec. 16, 2025.
- Spent each of the previous two seasons with the SSG Langers of the KBO League...went 12-7 with a 2.25 ERA (43 ER/171.2 IP) in 30 starts for SSG last season, recording 245 strikeouts in his 171.2 innings pitched, an average of 12.8 strikeouts per nine innings.
- In his two seasons with SSG, went 23-10 with a 2.91 ERA (93 ER/287.1 IP) in 54 appearances (53 starts)...released by Detroit after nine appearances with Triple-A Toledo in 2024 prior to signing with the Langers.
- Has spent parts of five seasons with the Philadelphia Phillies (2017-19), Chicago White Sox (2020) and Texas Rangers (2021) prior to joining the Tigers this year...also pitched with Hiroshima in the NPB for the 2022-23 campaigns.

- Earned the first Major League win of his career with a scoreless inning (one hit, two strikeouts) in his first appearance of the year on March 27 against San Diego.
- Posted a 2-0 record in the World Baseball Classic, helping Team Venezuela to a gold medal...struck out 11 batters with a 1.23 ERA (1 ER/7.1 IP) in the tournament.
- Had his contract selected by the Tigers on March 10, 2026, in the midst of the World Baseball Classic.
- Appeared and started in 30 games for the Kiwoom Heroes last season in the KBO with a 13-11 record and 3.68 ERA (72ER/171.1 IP), recording 171 strikeouts.

- Since being acquired at last year's trade deadline, has gone 4-0 with seven holds, five saves and a 1.04 ERA (4 ER/34.2 IP) in 32 relief appearances ... Finnegan boasts the second-lowest relief ERA in the A.L. and the fourth-lowest ERA among all relief pitchers in baseball (min. 30 relief innings) starting last August 1, trailing only Atlanta's Raisel Iglesias (0.27 ERA), Boston's Aroldis Chapman (0.87 ERA) and San Diego's Mason Miller (0.91 ERA).
- Earned his first save of the season on April 30 against Atlanta, allowing one hit while striking out one in a scoreless ninth inning...marked his first save with the Tigers since Aug. 16, 2025, at Minnesota.
- Did not allow a run over his first 11 games (11.0 innings) this year, allowing five hits and eight walks while striking out five over that span...his first earned run came on April 24 against Cincinnati in a game in which he struck out four batters over 1.2 frames.
- Re-signed with Detroit on a two-year deal as a free agent on Dec. 20, 2025...appeared in 16 games with the Tigers last season, posting a 3-0 record with a 1.50 ERA (3ER/18IP) with 23 strikeouts.

- Clubbed his first major league home run on Sunday, April 12, against Sandy Alcantara and the Miami Marlins.
- Became the first Tiger to record six doubles in his first 15 major league games in 16 years since Brennan Boesch did exactly that in 2010.
- Became the first player in Tigers franchise history to notch a multi-RBI game in each of his first two major league games when he laced his tiebreaking, game-winning two-run eighth-inning single into right field in game two for Detroit.
- First Tiger with a go-ahead or game-winning RBI in the eighth inning or later within his first two major league games since Omar Infante was credited with an eighth-inning game-winning RBI on Sept. 7, 2002, in his big league debut at Yankee Stadium (Elias).
- Ripped the first pitch he ever saw in the big leagues into right field for a two-run double, instantly becoming only the sixth Tiger since the RBI became a stat in 1920 to record two RBI in his major league debut, the first since Isaac Paredes on Aug. 17, 2020...is the second of the six to accomplish this feat on Opening Day, joining Paredes, JaCoby Jones (Aug. 30, 2016), Rob Richie (Aug. 19, 1989), Jake Wood (Opening Day April 11, 1961), Hank Riebe (Aug. 26, 1942) and Sammy Hale (April 20, 1920) in turning this trick.
- Became the first Tiger ever with two doubles in his major league debut on Opening Day and the second in the history of the franchise with two doubles in his major league debut on any day, joining Hank Riebe on Aug. 26, 1942.
- McGonigle is the second player in franchise history to collect four hits in his major league debut, joining Billy Bean (April 25, 1987).
- At 21 years, 220 days old on Opening Day, he became the second-youngest player in the history of the Tigers franchise to make his major league debut in the starting lineup on Opening Day and the youngest in 112 years since starting first baseman George Burns made his major league debut on Opening Day April 14, 1914 ... thanks to Elias.
- Named to the Opening Day roster at 21 years old, marking the youngest Tigers player to do so since Omar Infante in 2003.
- Is a career .308 (208-for-676) hitter in three minor league seasons, collected 51 doubles, six triples, 25 home runs and 130 RBI over that span...also drew 123 walks compared to just 84 strikeouts, good for an OBP of .410.
