RAY REPORT—The Rays continue a six-game homestand against the Angels (2-1) and Tigers (three to play) tonight at Tropicana Field...despite dropping five of their last seven games, have won seven of 12, 18 of 26, 24 of 33, and 31 of their last 44 games...have owned the AL's best record for each of the last 23 days (May 9–pres.), including eight consecutive days leading the majors from May 18–25...have the majors' fourth-easiest remaining schedule (.481 opp. winning pct.)...including the current set, each of their next four series will come against teams currently below .500...have an 89.6 pct. chance to make the postseason (FanGraphs), fourth highest in the majors to the Dodgers (99.8%), Yankees (98.8%), and Braves (97.9%) and an MLB-leading 60.1 pct. increase from their Opening Day odds (29.5%)...have spent 29 days leading the AL East, 25 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth.

★ **Jonathan Aranda's** 1st-inning solo homer and a pair of bases-loaded walks helped the Rays earn their third straight rubber-game win yesterday afternoon, securing their sixth straight series win at Tropicana Field...see "Dome Sweet Dome" below for more information.

★ Rays hitters drew a season-high nine walks, their most since June 15, 2025 at NYM (9)...it was their third time this season recording multiple bases-loaded walks, joining April 21 vs. CIN and April 16 at CWS...entering 2026, they had two such games over the previous three years combined (2023-25): May 4, 2024 vs. NYY and May 20, 2023 vs. MIL...on the season, their 11 bases-loaded walks are tied with the Yankees for the most in the majors.

★ They have drawn an AL-leading 78 walks in their last 16 games (May 12–pres.), their most across any 16-game span since May 24–June 11, 2021 (79BB), compared to 128 walks in their first 40 games (Opening Day–May 11), second fewest in the AL, ahead of only the Blue Jays (116BB).

★ The Rays went 18-3 last month, tied for their third-most wins during May in club history...see "Summer in the Air" below for more information...they enter June with sole possession of the AL East lead for the fifth time, joining 2023, 2021, 2010, and 2008...they qualified for the postseason in each of those previous four occurrences.

★ The Rays are 9-1-1 over their last 11 series following a 3-5-0 start and have gone 10-1-1 in series play vs. AL opponents...they have won eight of their 10 home sets.

★ They have tallied six straight series-opening wins at Tropicana Field, tied for the third-longest home streak in team history and their longest since a club-record 13-game run from Sept. 22, 2022–June 9, 2023...overall, the Rays 14-5 record in series openers is tied for the best in MLB (also: ATL & MIL).

SUMMER IN THE AIR—The Rays AL-best 18-8 (.692) record in May ranked second in the majors to the Brewers (19-7/.731) and marked their second-best winning pct. during the month in franchise history, trailing only May 2013 (22-6/.786)...the 18 wins tied 2013 (18-10) for their third-most behind 2021 and 2008 (19-10)...they won 13 of 15 games at Tropicana Field, tying the second-most home wins during any month in franchise history behind March/April 2023 (14-2), matching June 2009 (13-2) and May 2008 (13-3)...the Rays led the majors in May average (.270) and on-base pct. (.348) while their .749 OPS ranked third in the AL (7th in MLB) behind the Yankees (.793) and White Sox (.763)...they drew 103 walks (5th in AL/8th in MLB), their most in a calendar month since May 2024 (105BB), while striking out a majors-low 182 times...it was their 10th time recording 100 BB or more with 200 SO or fewer in a month, first since March/April 2014 (108BB/181SO)...the last team in the majors to accomplish the feat was the Blue Jays in May 2025 (108BB/191SO)...last month, Rays hitters recorded an MLB-high six games with more walks than strikeouts, and their 13 such games this season are tied with the Yankees for second most in the majors behind the Guardians (14G).

★ The pitching staff ranked fifth in the AL with a 3.46 ERA (236.2IP, 91ER), turning in a 2.70 ERA (193.2IP, 58ER) in the first 21 games (May 1-25) before posting a 6.91 ERA (43.0IP, 33ER) over the last five (May 26-30)...the starting rotation's AL-leading 2.66 ERA (128.1IP, 38ER) was their best since September 2024 (2.47) and surpassed 2019 (2.68) for their lowest during May in club history.

★ **Jonathan Aranda** led the majors in average (.374) and on-base pct. (.464) last month while ranking second in OPS (1.024) behind A's **Nick Kurtz** (1.025) and tying for second in hits (34) to MIA's **Otto Lopez** (37)...min. 75 PA, it was the third-highest average and on-base pct. during May in franchise history, trailing **Matt Joyce** (.414, 2011) and **Jason Bartlett** (.388, 2009) in average and **Fred McGriff** (.476, 1999) and **Joyce** (.470, 2011) in on-base pct...Aranda became the first Ray to lead the AL in average over a calendar month since **Yandy Diaz** (.400) in June 2024.

★ **Diaz** tied single-month career highs in homers (7, 3x, last: March/April 2023) and extra-base hits (13, 4x, last: March/April 2019).

★ **Shane McClellan** went 4-0 with a 1.41 ERA (32.0IP, 5ER) over six starts last month, four of which were scoreless...min. 25.0 IP, it was the lowest ERA by a Ray over a single month since McClellan turned in a 1.36 ERA (33.0IP, 5ER) during June 2022.

FIRST THINGS FIRST—The Rays have homered in the opening frame in three straight games, their longest streak since another three-game run from Aug. 6-9, 2025, with their last longer streak coming from May 21-25, 2022 (4G)...the three-game streak of scoring a run in the 1st inning matches the Rays' longest this season (3x, also: May 17-19 & May 10-12), and they last turned the trick in four straight games from June 14-18, 2024...the Rays 11 HR in the opening frame are their most in any inning and are tied for fifth most in the AL...they connected on seven 1st-inning homers during May, matching August 2025 for their most in any calendar month over the last three seasons (2024-26).

★ The Rays have scored in the 1st inning in four of five and 11 of their last 18 games (May 10–pres.) compared to nine of their first 38 games (Opening Day–May 8)...they are 15-5 when scoring in the 1st.

★ **Yandy Diaz** has tallied leadoff homers in two of his last three games after recording one in his first 50 games (March 30 at MIL)...his 10 RBI in the 1st inning are sixth most in the AL.

THE BIG THREE—**Jonathan Aranda** (11HR), **Junior Caminero** (13HR), and **Yandy Diaz** (11HR) are one of four trios of MLB teammates with 10 HR or more each, joining groups from the Braves (Baldwin, Harris II, Olson), Dodgers (Muncy, Ohtani, Pages), and White Sox (Montgomery, Murakami, Vargas)...they are on pace to become the first trio of Rays teammates to each record 30-homer seasons in the same year...the trio has accounted for 35 the Rays 48 HR (72.9%), 109 of their 248 RBI (44.0%), and 62 of their 138 extra-base hits (44.9%)...Aranda, Caminero, and Diaz have a combined .293/.387/.509 slash line while the rest of the Rays lineup has posted a combined .244/.311/.331 line.

★ Aranda is 11-for-21 (.524) in his last six games, reaching safely in 17 of 28 PA (.607 OBP), and has a nine-game hitting streak, the third longest of his career, trailing streaks of 13 (June 15-28, 2025) and 10 games (July 28, 2025–March 29, 2026).

★ Caminero is slashing .383/.517/.617 (18-for-47) with 7 XBH, 9 RBI, 13 BB, and 8 R over his last 13 games since May 16, pacing the majors in on-base pct. over that span while tying for third in walks.

★ Diaz has hit .378/.465/.838 (14-for-37) with 5 2B, 4 HR, and 11 RBI across his last 10 games (May 18–pres.), ranking second in the majors with a 1.303 OPS across that span, trailing NYM **Juan Soto** (1.357).

BAKE SHOW—**Bryan Baker** earned his 16th save yesterday, third in the majors behind CLE's **Cade Smith** (20) and SD's **Mason Miller** (17) and tied with **Ferando Rodney** (2012) for the most by a Ray before the end of May in franchise history...he has converted five straight save opportunities and 12 of his last 13, earning saves in three straight and five of the Rays' last seven wins (May 17–pres.)...Baker is on pace for 46 saves, which would rank third in team history behind Rodney's 2012 season (48) and **Alex Colomé** (47) in 2017...he entered the campaign with four saves in 205 career appearances.

DOME SWEET DOME—The Rays' MLB-leading 21-6 home record marks the second-best home start in franchise history behind only 2023 (22-4)...they have won 17 of their last 19 games at Tropicana Field (April 22–May 31), tied for their best 19-game, single-season stretch at home (6x, last: April 1–May 5, 2023)...the club has outscored opponents, 103-58 (45), in that span, homering in 14 of the 19 contests...the Rays have won six consecutive home series, tied for their seventh-longest stretch in team history and their longest since claiming six straight at Steinbrenner Field from May 9–June 8, 2025...the franchise record is nine consecutive home sets, done three times, most recently from Sept. 2, 2011–April 30, 2012...the Rays are in a stretch of 19 home games within a 28-game span from May 29–June 28, going 2-1 thus far.

★ **Junior Caminero** has hit safely in eight straight games at the Trop, going 14-for-28 (.500) with 7 XBH, 9 RBI, 10 BB, 7 R, and 4 SO in that span, reaching base safely in 24 of 38 PA (.632 OBP)...the 24 TOB are tied with **Carlos Peña** (Aug. 22–Sept. 5, 2007) for the most in club history across any eight-game span at home (excl. multi-season spans)...Peña also holds the record across a nine-game span (26 TOB from Aug. 21–Sept. 5, 2007).

MOTOR CITY KITTIES—The Rays and Tigers open a six-game series tonight, with the clubs reconvening from Aug. 24-26 at Comerica Park...the clubs split six matchups last season, with both sides winning home series...the Rays are 5-2-1 in the last eight season sets dating back to 2017, going 30-21 in that span despite a 4-8 mark over the last two years (2024-25)...the Rays have dropped three of their last four sets with the Tigers on the heels of a 7-1-1 stretch (July 9, 2018–Aug. 6, 2023).

★ The Rays are 26-9 (.743) vs. AL opponents, the best intraleague record in MLB and tied for the best intraleague start by any team through 35 games since 1985, matching nine other clubs (last: 2025 Padres)...this includes a 10-2 mark against the AL Central, second in the AL behind the Yankees (6-0).

DOWN ON THE FARM—Triple-A Durham RHP **Brody Hopkins** (MLB No. 83 | TB No. 2) was named International League Pitcher of the Week for May 25-31 after working 5.0 hitless innings of relief in a winning effort on May 29 at Norfolk, striking out nine against one pitcher...FCL Rays LHP **Blake Morgan** (2GS, 1-0, 0.82 ERA, 11.0IP/1ER, 11SO, 1BB, 0.73 WHIP) earned FCL Pitcher of the Week honors.

TONIGHT'S START—Griffin Jax will toe the rubber tonight for his seventh start and 18th appearance of the year, including his fourth start and seventh outing at Tropicana Field...marks his seventh straight start after pitching out of the bullpen in each of his first 11 appearances...is the 23rd start of his major league career...acquired from the Twins for **RHP Taj Bradley** on July 31, 2025.

★ Jax has allowed two earned runs or fewer in each of his last nine starts dating back to Oct. 2, 2021 with MIN, the second-longest active streak among Rays arms behind **Nick Martinez** (11GS, March 30-pres.).

LAST TIME OUT—Took the mound on May 26 at BAL and suffered the loss after going 2.0 innings and allowing three runs (1ER) on a season-high-tying four hits with three strikeouts...he worked a 1-2-3 1st inning before giving up three runs (1ER) in the 2nd inning...he exited after the 2nd in which he was struck in the lower back by a line drive from **Leody Taveras** that had an exit velocity of 107.2 mph, the fifth-hardest batted ball on a Jax pitch this season...three runs allowed tied his season high as a starter (also: May 7 at BOS).

★ The loss marked his first as a starter since Sept. 26, 2021 vs. TOR...as a starting pitcher in his career, he is 3-6 with a 4.97 ERA (92.1IP, 51ER) and a .250 (88-for-352) opp. average in 22 starts.

LIONS, TIGERS, OH MY—Jax has appeared in 20 games opposite the Tigers in his career, all as a relief pitcher...he holds a 3-3 record, 4.30 ERA (23.0IP, 11ER), 25 strikeouts, and two saves in those outings...his longest outing against them came on April 28, 2022 at Target Field, earning a 3.0-IP save...his teams are 14-6 when he pitches against the Tigers and have won four straight (April 20, 2024-pres.).

★ In his career, 108 of 316 games (34.2%) he has appeared in have been against the AL Central...in those outings, he has a 12-12 record, 3.32 ERA (146.1IP, 54ER), and .231 (125-for-541) opp. average...he has made 10 starts vs. AL Central opposition, going 2-2 with a 4.17 ERA (41.0IP, 19ER) and 36 strikeouts...three of those starts have come since joining the Rays, all as an opener prior to joining the rotation.

BACK IN THE BAY—At Tropicana Field this season, Jax holds a 2.13 ERA (12.2IP, 3ER) in six games (three starts) with 16 strikeouts to five walks and a .143 (6-for-42) opp. average...in his lone home outing as a traditional starter on May 19 vs. BAL, he went 5.0 innings and allowed one run on three hits, one walk, and one home run with six strikeouts...in his career, he holds a 4.33 ERA (195.1IP, 94ER) in home games compared to a 3.67 ERA (191.1IP, 78ER) on the road.

★ Since joining the Rays, he has a 1.57 ERA (23.0IP, 4ER) between Steinbrenner Field and Tropicana Field in eight starts.

GET JAX UP AND MOVING—This marks the first time Jax has been a regular starter since his 2021 rookie season with the Twins, when he made his final 14 appearances as a member of the Twins rotation after his first four came in relief...he started two games for the Rays last season, working as an opener for **Ian Seymour** on Sept. 5 vs. CLE before starting a bullpen game on Sept. 10, 2025 at CWS...both starts lasted 1.0 scoreless frame...for his career, he is 3-6 with a 4.97 ERA (92.1IP, 51ER) in 22 starts compared to 21-28 with a 3.70 ERA (294.1IP, 121ER) in 294 relief appearances.

★ Jax spent his first five professional seasons (2016-19, 2021) as a starter...he first transitioned to a full-time relief role in 2022...from 2016-21, 50 of his 55 minor league appearances were starts.

CAPTAIN JAX—Jax is currently a Captain in the U.S. Air Force Reserve, earning the promotion in June 2021, and remains the only Air Force Academy graduate to play in the majors...after his graduation from the Academy in 2017, he made five starts with Class-A Cedar Rapids and Rookie-level Elizabethton during his 60-day leave ahead of his first active duty assignment, departing on July 22 to begin his role as an acquisitions officer working with civilian contractors such as SpaceX and Boeing...the following year, he was accepted into the Air Force World Class Athlete Program, which allows soldiers to train for the upcoming Olympic Games as their active duty job responsibility for a two-year period, allowing him to continue his baseball career while completing his active duty requirement...became eligible for the program when baseball was readmitted for the scheduled 2020 Tokyo Olympics.

★ He completed his active duty requirement and was admitted to the Air Force Reserve in November 2019...was notified of his promotion to Captain on June 5, 2021, the same day he was selected to the Twins major league roster ahead of his MLB debut three days later.

MLB CAREER RECAP—Last season, made a career-high 73 appearances (2 starts), tied for sixth most in the AL, between the Twins (50G) and Rays (23G), going a combined 1-7 with a 4.23 ERA (66.0IP, 31ER)...also set career bests in strikeouts (99) and holds (28)...acquired at the July 31 trade deadline for **RHP Taj Bradley**...of his 99 strikeouts, 97 came as a reliever, fourth most in the AL behind **HOU Bryan Abreu** (105), **CLE Cade Smith** (104), and teammate **Edwin Uceta** (103)...min. 250 BF, ranked second in the majors in chase rate (38.1%) behind **CIN Graham Ashcraft** (38.3%) and was fifth in whiff rate (37.3%)...joined Abreu as the only pitchers in the majors to make 70 appearances or more each season from 2023-25...his 216 appearances in that timeframe ranked third to **SF/NYM Tyler Rogers** (226G) and **Abreu** (220G).

★ In 2024, received the Joseph W. Haynes Award as Twins Pitcher of the Year, as voted on by the Twin Cities chapter of the BBWAA...became the first Minnesota pitcher to record 10 saves and 20 holds in a season.

★ In 2023, made the Twins Opening Day roster for the first time and spent the year in the club's bullpen...tied for ninth in the AL with a team-leading 23 holds...led the majors with a 3.3 pct. barrel rate (min. 250BF).

★ In 2022, transitioned to a relief role for the first time after spending his first six professional seasons (2016-21) as a starter...led the Twins bullpen in innings (72.1), tied for the team lead in holds (18), and ranked second in appearances (65)...began the season with Triple-A St. Paul after spending spring training with the Twins...made one appearance before being recalled April 12 when **Jorge Alcala** was placed on the injured list, remaining with the big-league club through season's end.

★ Made his major league debut in 2021 across four stints with the Twins: June 5-16, June 24-July 7, July 19-20, and July 30-end of season...maintained a regular spot in the rotation during his season-ending stint with the club...named the recipient of the Bob Feller Act of Valor Award, given annually to the major leaguer who best embodies the spirit of the late Hall of Famer, both in terms of commitment to country and love for baseball.

PITCH MIX
