METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Cubs, 3-2, on Tuesday night... The Mets are 4-9 in rubber games this season...The Mets continue a 10-day, 10-game homestand (1-1) against the Cubs (1-1), Braves (four games) and Pirates (three games).

I DECLARE AN fWAR: Francisco Lindor ranks eighth in the majors with a 4.3 fWAR...That is fifth-best in the National League...Since he joined the Mets in 2021, Lindor ranks fifth in the major leagues with a 15.3 fWAR

PICK SIX: Francisco Lindor owns a six-game hitting streak, batting .455 (10-22) with five runs, two doubles, one home run, four RBI, two walks with a .500 OBP and a .682 SLG in that span...He has safely hit in 10 of his last 11 games, batting .415 (17-41) with 10 runs, three doubles, three home runs, seven RBI, five walks, with a .489 OBP, a .707 SLG and a 1.197 OPS.

LINSANITY: Over the last 43 games, Lindor is batting .304 (48-158) with 33 runs, eight doubles, two triples, 10 home runs, 25 RBI, 24 walks, 12 steals with a .398 OBP, a .570 SLG and a .967 OPS...Lindor has stolen 18 bases in 112 games this season, exceeding his total from 2022 (16 steals in 161 games)...His career-best is 25 steals 158 games in 2018.

THE DAVID: David Peterson is set to make his second start since returning to the rotation...He allowed only one hit, walked three and struck out one in 3.0 innings against the Orioles on August 4...Today will makr his fifth career start against the Cubs...Peterson is 1-2 with a 4.92 ERA (8 Er/14.2 IP) with 10 walks and 15 strikeouts in his previous outings...Peterson made six appearances in relief this year and went 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA (2 Er/8.0 IP) with three walks and eight punchouts... In his last 10 games, Peterson is 2-1 with a 2.05 ERA (6 ER/26.1 IP) with 14 walks and 24 strikeouts.

OTTOMATIC: Over his last 14 games, Adam Ottavino has posted a 1.35 ERA (2 ER/13.2 IP) with seven strikeouts...He has posted a 2.30 ERA (7 ER/27.1 IP) with 23 strikeouts over his last 29 games since May 25.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has homered in back-to-back games, hitting three home runs in that span...It was the seventh time this season that Alonso has homered in consecutive games...He is third in the majors and second in the Senior Circuit with 34 home runs...He is third in the majors and second in the NL with 85 RBI...He is hitting .329 (23-70) with 13 extra-base hits, 23 RBI, 12 runs and a 1.134 OPS in his last 18 games...He was hitting .132 (12-91) with seven extra-base hits and a .549 OPS over his previous 25 games (since his return from the IL on June 18-19).

POLAR BEAR VS. WINDY CITY CUBS: Pete Alonso has 14 home runs and 32 RBI in 26 career games against the Cubs...His 14 career home runs against the Cubs are the fourth-most by an opposing player against Chicago since 2019...Alonso is averaging one home run per 6.57 AB against Chicago-NL, the second-highest rate all-time (min. 100 PA) behind only Mark McGwire (5.43 AB/HR against the Northsiders)...He has 32 RBI in 89 career at-bats against the Cubs... His 2.88 AB/RBI ratio vs. Chicago-NL is the best since RBI became an official stat in 1920...His 32 career RBI are the fifth-most by an opposing player against Chicago since 2019...Alonso has homered in six of his last seven games against the Cubbies, including twice during a three-game set at Wrigley Field this May...He has hit safely in nine consecutive games vs. the Cubs, going 12-31 (.387) with seven homers, 15 RBI, eight runs scored and a 1.551 OPS.

CUBS-METS NOTES: The Mets have not won a season series against the Cubs since they went 5-2 against Chicago in 2016.

IN THE CITI: The Mets are in a stretch where 19 of 25 games are at home...New York is 1-1 in that span...The Mets are 27-24 at home this season...The team has posted a 3.75 ERA in Citi Field...That is the fourth-lowest mark in the National League...This compares to a 4.93 mark on the road...The team's 51 games at home are the fewest in the majors.

JEFF McHITS: In 17 games since July 21, Jeff McNeil is batting .292 (19-65) with 11 runs, two doubles, one triple, one home run, nine RBI, four walks with a .370 OBP and a .400 SLG...In 23 games (87 at-bats) following the All-Star break, McNeil has struck out seven times.

HERE'S THE CATCH: Francisco Alvarez has hit 21 home runs this season...He joins Pete Alonso (53, 2019) and Darryl Strawberry (26, 1983) as the only Mets rookies to have 20 or more home runs in a season...Alvarez leads all major league catchers with 19 home runs playing that position and is second beind Arizona's Corbin Carroll for the rookie lead in homers.

IF YOU START ME UP: The Mets are 34-9 when the starting pitcher throws at least 6.0 innings...New York has gone 14-1 when its starter pitches 7.0+ innings and are a perfect 5-0 when the starter completes 8.0 innings.

STEAL MY SUNSHINE: New York has recorded 80 steals in 89 attempts...The team's 89.9 percent success rate is the best in the majors...The Mets had a franchise-record run of 35 consecutive stolen bases without being caught from May 14-June 29...Overall, New York has been successful in 53 of their last 57 stolen base attempts.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 1969, the Mets downed the Braves, 5-3, in Atlanta...Tom Seaver improved to 16-7, tossing 7.1 innings and allowing three runs (two earned) on six hits with five walks and three strikeouts in 7.1 innings of work...Tommie Agee was born on this day in 1942...Agee played five seasons with the Mets and batted .262/.329/.419 with 107 doubles, 14 triples, 82 home runs, 265 RBI and 92 steals.

DOWN ON THE FARM: RHP Mike Vasil took a no-hitter into the ninth inning as the Syracuse Mets defeated the Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, 3-0, on Tuesday...Vasil allowed only two walks heading into the ninth inning before the first batter of the ninth singled to break up the no-no...Overall, the right-handed pitcher tossed 8.0 scoreless frames, allowing only the single hit, walked two and struck out seven...In 19 starts betwen two levels this year, Vasil has going 3-3 with a 4.52 ERA (45 Er/89.2 IP) with 30 walks and 102 strikeouts...The 23 year-old was selected in the eighth round of the 2021 First Year Player Draft out of the University of Virgina...He ranks as the 12th-best prospect in the organization according to MLB Pipeline.

MILITARY SOFTBALL: Yesterday, the Mets hosted the seventh annual Military Softball Tournament in partnership with Fiserv...Five teams made up of personnel from each branch of the U.S. Military (Army, Air Force, Navy, Marines, and Coast Guard) competed in round-robin tournament style play culminating in a championship game...The players enjoyed lunch in the Bullpen Plaza with Mr. Met and received a Mets military T-shirt, Mets challenge coins and tickets to a future game.

PETERSON NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 3.0 innings in his first start for the Mets since July 8 at Baltimore...Did not allow any runs and just one hit while walking three and striking

ALL THAT JAZZ: Tonight, Peterson will face the Cubs for the fifth time of his career and the first time this season...He has made four starts against the Cubs and has posted a 4.91 ERA (8 ER/14.2 IP) in those outings...This will be Peterson's third time facing the Cubs at home...This season, Peterson is 2-2 in home games.

MAKIN' IT MAJOR: Since returning to the majors on June 27 after a stint with Syracuse (AAA), Peterson has pitched to a 2-1 record with a 2.05 ERA (6 ER/26.1 IP) in ten games, four of which were starts...Since July 14, Peterson has pitched to a 1.64 ERA (2 ER/11.0 IP) over six relief appearances and one start...Did not allow a homer in any of those outings.

A MINUTE IN THE MINORS: Peterson was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse on April 29, was recalled on May 9, then optioned again on May 16...In his first start with Syracuse following his May 16 option, he dealt 8.0 shutout innings, allowed just two hits and struck out nine...For his effort, he as named International League Pitcher of the Week...All told, he has made seven starts for the Syracuse Mets this season...Has a 1-2 record with a 4.86 ERA (20 ER/37.0 IP).

NO PLACE LIKE NEW YORK: This season, Peterson has pitched to a 2.67 ERA (8 ER/27.0 IP) in eight home outings (four starts)...Over ten road outings (eight starts) this season, the southpaw has pitched to an 7.75 ERA (33 ER/38.1 IP).

LETHAL LEFTY: Peterson has limited lefties to a .243 (62-255) average in his career...He whiffed 32 of the 96 left-handed batters he faced last year, a 33 percent strikeout rate that ranked fourth among all left-handed pitchers to face a minimum of 90 LHB in 2022.

SLIP 'N' SLIDE: Peterson held batters to a .175 (24-137) average with his slider last season and 78 of his 126 strikeouts came on the pitch...His 52.0 slider-strikeout percentage was the second-highest in MLB (min. 150 PA) behind only teammate Edwin Díaz (54.7) and his 47.9 whiff percentage with the pitch was the thirdhighest in the majors behind only Díaz (54.7) and Seattle's Andres Muñoz (50.8).

STRIKE 'EM OUT, STRIKE 'EM OUT: Peterson struck out at least five batters in 11 straight starts from June 20-September 9 last season, the second-longest streak by a left-handed starter last season...It was the sixth-longest streak by a Mets left-handed starter in franchise history...Peterson had 82 strikeouts across 58.2 innings during that span (13 G/11 GS) good for a 12.58 K/9 ratio.

2022 RECAP: Set career-high marks in wins (seven), games (28), starts (19), innings (105.2), and strikeouts (126) last season...Went 7-5 with a 3.83 ERA for New York...Appeared mostly as a starter until mid-September...His final five appearances of the season came out of the bullpen...Went 6-5 with a 3.86 ERA (39 ER/91.0 IP) as a starter...In nine relief appearances, Peterson went 1-0 with a 3.68 ERA (6 ER/14.2 IP).
