CHICAGO WHITE SOX (33-65) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (39-59) July 19, 2025 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #99/Home #49 RHP Adrian Houser (5-2, 1.56 ERA) vs. RHP Mike Burrows (1-3, 4.83 ERA)

THE PIRATES: dropped the first game of this nine-game homestand on Friday against Chicago (AL)...Will host the White Sox for two more games before welcoming Detroit (July 21-23) and Arizona (July 25-27) to PNC Park to conclude the homestand...Are in a stretch of 15 consecutive games against American League teams, including 12 straight games against American League Central opponents...Are 27-33 since Don Kelly made his managerial debut on May 9 vs. Atlanta.

CRUZING ALONG: Oneil Cruz went 2-for-3 with a stolen base on Friday vs. Chicago (AL), extending his hitting streak to a seasonhigh-tying six straight games (also May 21-26), dating back to July 8 at Kansas City...Cruz has gone 8-for-19 (.421) with a double, a home run, three RBI, a walk, two stolen bases and two runs scored during the streak.

IKF: Isiah Kiner-Falefa followed up his career-high-tying four-hit effort on July 13 at Minnesota (the last game before the All-Star break) with a double on Friday vs. Chicago (AL)...Kiner-Falefa ranks fourth among all National League shortstops with a .275 batting average, trailing only Washington's CJ Abrams (.289), Philadelphia's Trea Turner (.288) and Cincinnati's Elly De La Cruz (.281).

PIRATING: Oneil Cruz stole his 30th base of the season on Friday against the White Sox, which are the most by a Pirate in a season since Starling Marte had 33 steals in 2018...His 30 steals this season are the second-most in all of Major League Baseball, trailing Tampa Bay's José Caballero (31)...Cruz' 91.2-percent stolen base rate (52-for-57) since the beginning of the 2024 campaign is the best in all of Major League Baseball among baserunners with at least 55 stolen base attempts.

ON THE MEND: Johan Oviedo, who had his rehab assignment transferred from Low-A Bradenton to Double-A Altoona on Friday, allowed one run and struck out three batters in 3.1 innings in the Curve's 2-1, 10-inning win vs. Akron...Oviedo has struck out 11 batters in 7.1 innings during his assignment, which has been split between Altoona, Bradenton and the rookie-level FCL Pirates.

H2P: Isaac Mattson tossed a scoreless ninth inning on Friday vs. Chicago (AL) and has struck out 12 batters while allowing just one run over his last nine appearances (9.2ip), dating back to June 20...Mattson enters today with a 1.80 ERA (20.0ip/4er) in his first 17 appearances with the Pirates.

PLAYING THE FIELD: Pittsburgh has committed two errors in its last nine games, dating back to July 5 vs. Seattle...The two errors in that span are tied for the second-fewest in Major League Baseball (Chicago-NL has committed only one error in that span)...The Pirates' 17 errors since Don Kelly managed his first game on May 9 vs. Atlanta are tied with the Cubs for the second-fewest in MLB.

THE RENEGADE: David Bednar has allowed one unearned run over 17.1 innings in his last 18 appearances, dating back to May 24 vs.

Milwaukee (he has posted a .138 batting average against during that time)... Bednar has also posted a 0.96 ERA (9.1ip/1er) in his last 10 appearances here at PNC Park

DOWN ON THE FARM: Cam Devanney went 1-for-3 in his organizational debut last night for Triple-A Indianapolis...Devanney, who was acquired from Kansas City on Wednesday in exchange for Adam Frazier, is 8-for-22 (.364) in his first six games of this month...He comes into today fifth in the International League in slugging (.562) and seventh in OPS (.928).

ANCHOR DOWN: Bryan Reynolds doubled on Friday vs. Chicago (AL) and has now doubled in consecutive games for the fourth time this season...He's done that in three straight games two times this season (June 22-24 and June 27-29)...Reynolds is 17-for-55 (.309) with four extra-base hits and 14 RBI in 15 career games against the White Sox...He is also 7-for-25 (.280) with a double, a home run, two RBI and three walks against Chicago starter Adrian Houser.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

July 19, 2024: Nick Gonzales brought home Andrew McCutchen with a one-out, ninth-inning single that led Pittsburgh to an 8-7, walkoff victory over Philadelphia. The paid attendance of 39,530 was the fourth-largest crowd for a regular-season game in PNC Park history. Carmen Mlodzinski earned the win with a scoreless inning, while Oneil Cruz and Bryan Reynolds each had three hits.

TONIGHT'S STARTER RHP MIKE BURROWS

2025 RECORD: 1-3, 4.83 ERA

HEIGHT/WEIGHT: 6-1/200 BATS/THROWS: R/R

BORN: November 8, 1999

SIGNED: Thru 2025 **AGE: 25** HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the 11th round of the 2018 Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Burrows allowed six runs on five hits over his 1.1 innings in his last start on July 12 at Minnesota (the shortest start of his career), losing a 12-4 decision.

START ME UP: Burrows earned his first win as a starter in the Major Leagues, pitching 5.1 innings while striking out six batters en route to a 3-0 win on June 4 vs. Houston at PNC Park...It was tied for the second-longest outing of Burrows' professional career (also July 7, 2021 for High-A Greensboro vs. Asheville), trailing only an outing of 7.0 scoreless innings for Double-A Altoona on May 26, 2022 at Harrisburg...Burrows became one of just 10 Pittsburgh rookies (11 instances) since at least 1901 to pitch 5.1plus scoreless innings with six-plus strikeouts while issuing zero walks in an outing.

PROVIDING RELIEF: Burrows made his only relief appearance of the season in the 4-2 loss on June 25 at Milwaukee, tossing 2.1 scoreless innings in relief of Paul Skenes.

JUNE BLOOM: Burrows recorded a 2.73 ERA (26.1ip/8er) in six appearances (five starts) during the month of June, tied with Los Angeles (NL)'s Justin Wrobleski for the second-lowest ERA among all Major League rookies with at least 26.0 innings pitched in the month...The only one with a lower ERA was the Athletics' Jacob Lopez (2.64).

IN THE SHOW: Burrows will make his 10th start of the season with Pittsburgh tonight...His nine starts so far this season are tied with Atlanta's AJ Smith-Shawver for fourth-most among all National League rookies...The only ones with more are Milwaukee's Chad Patrick (18), Colorado's Chase Dollander (15) and Chicago's Cade Horton (10).

RISPY BUSINESS: Burrows has limited opposing hitters to a .194 batting average against (6-for-31) with runners in scoring position...In his last seven starts (since June 4 vs. Houston), he has allowed four hits in 24 at-bats with runners in scoring position.

DEBUT DAY: Burrows made his MLB debut in relief of Paul Skenes last season on September 28 at Yankee Stadium...In that game, he earned the win, allowing two runs (one earned) on two hits, three walks, two strikeouts and one home run in 3.1 innings...He was recalled from Triple-A Indianapolis this April 24, but did not pitch before being optioned back to Triple-A after the team's April 25 victory in Los Angeles.

DOWN ON THE FARM: Burrows went 2-1 with a 2.51 ERA (32.1ip/9er) and 41 strikeouts over his eight appearances (seven starts) at Triple-A Indianapolis...At the time of his promotion to Pittsburgh on May 21, Burrows ranked second in the International League with a 1.02 ERA, 28 strikeouts and a 0.85 WHIP, as well as third with a .175 batting average against, in the month of May (four games/three starts).

LOOKING TO THE FUTURE: Burrows represented Pittsburgh at the 2022 All-Star Futures Game at Dodger Stadium...He pitched a scoreless fifth inning in the National League's 6-4, seven-inning win, allowing a hit and a walk (one strikeout)...He was the first Connecticut native to be selected to the game since George Springer (2013).

THE BURROWS FILE: Burrows was drafted by Pittsburgh in the 11th round of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of Waterford High School (Waterford, Connecticut).
