METSCELLANEOUS: Last night, the Mets topped the Padres, 2-1, in the first game of their three-game series...They improved 14-20 in one-run games this season...New York has won at least three consecutive one-run games for the first time since they won five straight one-run games from May 17-23, 2023...Per Elias...Improved to 14-20 in one-run games this season...New York is seeking their 17th series victory of the season and their 10th at home...The team is in the midst of a six-game homestand (4-0) against the Nationals (2-0) and Padres (2-0)...Following this series, the Mets head to Chicago for a brief three-game trip against the White Sox.

LET'S GO STREAKING: The Mets have won four games in a row, which matches their season-high...The Mets won four straight games thrice this year - April 3-7, May 27-31 and August 4-8...The Mets have posted a 2.00 ERA (8 ER/36.0 IP) in that span, while batting .248/328/405...The team has outscored their opponents 15-9 during the stretch.

ZAC ATTACK: Through eight career starts, Zac Thornton is 3-3 with a 2.78 ERA (14 ER/45.1 IP) and is holding opposing batters to a .230 (37-161) average...His ERA is the 15th-best in franchise history through a player's first eight career starts and it is the second-best mark by a left-hander in franchise history...He has completed at least 6.0 innings in five of his first eight career starts...He is one of 21 pitchers in franchise history to do so and the first since Noah Syndergaard did in 2015...Three of his first eight starts have been scoreless and at least 5.0 innings...He joins Nolan McLean as the only two players in franchise history to throw

ASSISTED LIVING: The Mets recorded three outfield assists (Carson Benge -2, A.J. Ewing - 1) for the 13th time in franchise history...Is the first time they did so since Mark Canha had three outfield assists on July 23, 2023 at Boston...Carson Benge recorded two assists last night...His two outfield assisted were clocked at 99.9 MPH and 103.9 MPH...He is the first player with two 99+ MPH outfield assist in the same inning in the Statcast Era (Since 2015) and just the second player with two in the same game (also: Bradley Zimmer 6/18/17)...Per Sarah Langs...His second assist is the third-fastest outfield assist in the Statcast Era only trailing Aaron Hicks 105.5 MPH assist on April 20, 2016 and Brett Phillips 104.0 MPH assist on September 13, 2017...It is the fastest outfield assist since 2017...Benge is the only player with multiple outfield assists of 100.0+ MPH this season and he owns five of the 12 fastest outfield assists this season...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

RUN AT YOUR OWN RISK: Last night, Carson Benge threw out two runners at home plate in the first inning...He is the first Met with multiple outfield assists in the same inning since Jeff McNeil had two in the fifth inning on September 20, 2023 vs. Miami and is the first Mets outfielder to ever have two assists to the catcher in one inning...He became just the fourth outfielder in the last 30 seasons to record a solo outfield assist at home plate on consecutive opposing batters (also: Rocco Baldelli 8/12/04, Gary Sheffield 4/25/01 and Brian Hunter 5/18/98)...Per Sarah Langs...His nine outfield assists this season are the fourth-most in the majors and are tied for the fifth-most by a rookie in franchise history.

A BAKER'S DOZEN: The Mets improved to 10-3 over their last 13 games...improved to 10-3 over their last 13...It is the best record in the majors during that span and it is their best stretch since they posted the same record from May 31 - June 13, 2025...Their bullpen combined to throw 3.0 scoreless innings...Over their last 13 games, their relievers have pitched to a 2.60 ERA which is the fourth-best mark in the majors

BLAME IT ON THE BENGE: After batting .189/.247/.278 with four extra-base hits and six RBI in his first 28 games of the season, since May 1 he is slashing .294/.357/.449 with an .806 OPS...His 18 steals are the fifth-most by a Mets rookie in franchise history...Darryl Strawberry (1983) is next with 19...Mookie Wilson (1981) owns the franchise record with 24.

IN THE CITI: The Mets have won four straight home games after dropping three straight at Citi Field...This is the second time the Mets have won four straight home games (also, May 27-31)...Overall, they are 29-34 at home this season...The team has posted a 3.97 ERA in New York, while batting .233/.310/.382.

GOTTA GO TO BOS: Bo Bichette gave the Mets' a 1-0 lead with an RBI single in the first inning...That marked his 500th career RBI...He is 71st active player to reach the milestone...Has hit safely in seven of his last eight games...Over 15 games in August he is batting .345 (20-58) with 10 RBI and an .940 OPS...In the month he ranks tied for second in hits and fourth in batting average among NL qualifiers...In 66 games since the start of June, he is batting .310/.349/.457 with an .806 OPS.

THE ROAD TO 300: Francisco Lindor has 291 career home runs...That is the seventh-most all-time by a Puerto Rican born player...He recently surpassed Bernie Williams (287)...Ruben Sierra is next with 306, followed by Iván Rodríguez (311)...His 291 home runs are 20th among active players.

LINSANITY: In 29 games following the All-Star break, Francisco Lindor is batting .282/.388/.527 with 18 runs, four doubles, one triple, seven homers, 18 walks, 20 RBI and a .915 OPS...This compares to a .216/.298/.373 with 22 runs, three doubles, three triples, five homers, 12 RBI, 16 walks and a .671 OPS in 40 games in the first half of the season.

NEW SKIPPER: Andy Green has been named Interim Manager for the remainder of the 2026 season...Green, who joined the Mets organization in 2023 and previously served as Senior Vice President, Baseball Development, managed the San Diego Padres from 2016-19, guiding the club to a 274-366 (.428) record...The 48-year-old played parts of four Major League seasons with the Diamondbacks (2004-06) and appeared in four games with the Mets in 2009...He will wear #70...The Mets are 23-22 since Green took the helm.

LAST TIME OUT: Fired 6.0 innings and allowed three earned runs on seven hits and one walk at Atlanta on August 12 (6.0 IP, 7 H, 3 ER, BB, 2 K)...His seven hits allowed were a career-high and he hasn't allowed more than three earned runs in each of his last seven starts following his debut.

ZAC ATTACK: Through eight career starts, he is 3-3 with a 2.78 ERA (14 ER/45.1 IP) and is holding opposing batters to a .230 (37-161) average...His ERA is the 15th-best in franchise history through a player's first eight career starts and it is the second-best mark by a left-hander in franchise history...He has completed at least 6.0 innings in five of his first eight career starts...He is one of 21 pitchers in franchise history to do so and the first since Noah Syndergaard did in 2015...Three of his first eight starts have been scoreless and at least 5.0 innings...He joins Nolan McLean as the only two players in franchise history to throw at least 5.0 scoreless innings in three of their first eight career starts.

GOOSE EGGS: After allowing a run in the first inning on June 26 vs. Philadelphia, each of Thornton's next 18.0 innings were scoreless until the first inning of his start on July 27 vs. Atlanta... His 18.0 consecutive scoreless innings were the longest such streak in franchise history by a rookie starting pitcher since Steven Matz fired 19.0 scoreless innings from May 20-31, 2016...He is one of 11 rookie starters in franchise history with a streak as long...The longest scoreless streak by a Mets rookie starting pitcher in franchise history is 25.0 innings from Jon Maine from July 21-August 12, 2006...He is the first Mets starter with as long a scoreless streak since Kodai Senga tossed 19.2 scoreless innings from April 1-25, 2025...*Per Elias.*

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: His Major League debut came on May 20 at Washington (4.1 IP, 4 H, 4 ER, 2 BB, 3 K, HR) and he tossed 4.1 innings while allowing four runs on four hits, two walks and recorded three strikeouts...The 24-year-old, Winona, Minnesota native, is in his third professional season after being drafted by the Mets out of Grand Canyon University in the fifth round of the 2023 First-Year Player draft...The left-hander is currently ranked as the No. 7 prospect in the Mets system by *MLB Pipeline*...Over three seasons between Low-A St. Lucie, High-A Brooklyn, Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse, he is 12-11 with a 3.32 ERA (75 ER/203.1 IP) and 197 strikeouts...Overall, he has held minor league batters to a .240 (183-761) batting average.

2026: Has made 14 appearances (13 starts) this season between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse...Between the two clubs, he is 1-5 with a 4.02 ERA (28 ER/62.2 IP) and 65 strikeouts...His first five starts came with Binghamton and he pitched to a 3.60 ERA (10 ER/25.0 IP) with 27 strikeouts...His last nine appearances (eight starts) came with Syracuse, and he went 1-3 with a 4.30 ERA (18 ER/37.2 IP) and 38 strikeouts...His last start in the minors came on July 8 at Norfolk and he completed 2.0 scoreless innings and recorded five strikeouts...He threw 30 pitches...His season-high in terms of pitches was 90 on June 2 vs. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre.

CUT IT UP: Over his seven appearances with Triple-A Syracuse, his most-used pitch is his cutter...He has thrown it 35.6% of the time in the minors...In his eight Major League starts, his cutter has been his most-used pitch, and he has thrown it 29.3% of the time....Of his 29 Major League strikeouts, five of them have come via the cutter...In the minors, 47.1% of his swing-and-misses came on his cutter...The most by any of his pitches.

LOVE OF THE LOPES: Pitched his first two collegiate seasons at Barton Community College in Great Bend, Kansas, before transferring to Grand Canyon University for his junior season in 2023...That season, he finished 9-2 with a 3.87 ERA (38 ER/88.1 IP) and 91 strikeouts over 15 starts...He earned All-WAC second-team honors as a starting pitcher...Was named WAC Pitcher of the Week two times (Feb. 20 and Mar. 13) and was named a semifinalist for the Dick Howser Trophy, given to the nation's top player...Completed at least 5.0 innings in 14 of his 15 starts that season...Notably, he was a college teammate of Jacob Wilson of the Athletics.

PERSONAL: His parents are Paul and Julie Thornton...His mom participated in track and field, cross country and soccer at Lewis & Clark College and St. Olaf College from 1988 to 1992...She was an All-American in heptathlon in 1991 and 1992 and was inducted into the St. Olaf's athletics hall of fame in 2004...His dad also ran track at St. Olaf from 1989-1993 and he was a conference champion in the 1,000-meter run in 1993...His favorite team growing up was the St. Louis Cardinals and his favorite athletes were Yadier Molina, Adrian Peterson and Max Fried.

- Has pitched to a 0.89 ERA (2 ER/20.1 IP) over 15 appearances this season...14 of his 15 appearances have been scoreless.
- Has pitched 2.0 or more innings four times this season and during those 8.1 innings hasn't allowed a run and only two hits.
- Earned the win on August 10 at Atlanta (2.0 IP, BB) with 2.0 shutout innings.
- Notched his second career save and first as a Met on August 5 at Cleveland (1.0 IP, BB) when he tossed a scoreless 10th inning...His only other Major League save came on August 13, 2023, at Pittsburgh while with Cincinnati.
- Tossed 2.0 scoreless innings and recorded a career-high-tying three strikeouts (2.0 IP, 3 K).
- Threw 1.1 scoreless innings on July 22 at Milwaukee (1.1 IP, K, BB)...Was his first Major League appearance since June 14 vs. Atlanta.
- Was recalled from Triple-A Syracuse prior to their game on July 21...Marks his fourth stint with the team this season.
- In 24 appearances (seven starts) with Syracuse this season he is 3-2 and has pitched to 4.75 ERA (16 ER/30.1 IP) with 30 strikeouts...His last appearance came on July 17 vs. Buffalo where he tossed a scoreless inning and stuck out the side on 15 pitches.
- Tossed 2.1 scoreless innings in his season and Mets debut on May 19 at Washington (2.1 IP, H, K)...Marked his longest Major League appearance.
- Pitched in the WBC for Mexico, and over two appearances, he allowed one run over 2.0 innings.
- Before this season, his last Major League appearance came on April 3rd, 2024, at Milwaukee while with Minnesota...He pitched in two games for the Twins that season.
- Made 31 appearances for the Reds in 2023 and pitched to a 3.69 ERA (13 ER/31.2 IP) with three wins and one save...Over 34 Major League appearances between Cincinnati and Minnesota from 2022-2024, he went 3-0 with one save, a 3.99 ERA (17 ER/38.1 IP) and 28 strikeouts.
- Pitched for Los Mochis in the Mexican Winter League in 2025-2026, and he didn't allow an earned run over 24.0 innings.
