The Mariners and Twins square off in their first of 2 series in 2025...Seattle goes for its first series win against the Twins at T-Mobile Park since June 2021...the teams will meet again at Target Field in Minneapolis for 4 games from June 23-26

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners play the finale of a 3-game series against the Minnesota Twins (1-1)...the Mariners hosted the Washington Nationals (1-2) as the first of 3 legs on the homestand, and will host the Baltimore Orioles (3 G, 6/3-6/5) to close out the homestand following a Monday off day...today's game will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Dave Valle** on the call and **Jen Mueller** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with Rick Rizzs and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners won yesterday's game in 11 innings by a 5-4 final score, their 3rd-consecutive extra-innings game...Seattle is 15-14 at home and 16-12 on the road this season.

- Rubber Duck** - The Mariners are 7-2 in rubber games this season.
- Rehab Update** - Right-hander **Trent Thornton** (appendicitis) threw a scoreless inning with 2 strikeouts for Triple-A Tacoma on Friday night...right-hander **Logan Gilbert** started for the Rainiers on Thursday.
- Down, But Never Out** - The Mariners earned their 16th comeback win of the season yesterday, tied for 4th-most in the Majors.
- Take the Hit** - The Mariners are 20-1 this season when they record more hits than their opponents.

CAL: THE BEST CATCHER IN BASEBALL...catcher **Cal Raleigh** was 1-for-4 with 1 HR, 2 RBI and 1 walk yesterday, his 22nd HR of the season, tied for the most in the Majors (also: Shohei Ohtani-LAD)...Raleigh's 4 multi-home run games this season (4/16 at CIN, 5/2 at TEX, 5/27 vs. WSH, 5/30 vs. MIN) lead the Majors...the 28-year-old backstop is batting .264 (55x208) with 38 runs, 10 doubles, 22 home runs, 44 RBI, 37 walks and 6 stolen bases, with a .382 on-base percentage, .630 slugging percentage and 1.012 OPS...he leads MLB catchers in virtually every offensive statistical category, and overall in the Majors ranks T-1st in home runs, T-7th in walks, 4th in slugging percentage, 4th in OPS, T-5th in extra-base hits (32), 4th in total bases (131), 3rd in bWAR (3.3), 4th in OPS+ (191), 2nd in fWAR (3.6) and T-3rd in wRC+ (186)...Cal has appeared in all 57 of the Mariners games this season.

CAL RALEIGH: AL POTM IN WAITING?...**Cal Raleigh** had a marvelous month of May, batting .304 (28x92) with 19 runs, 4 doubles, 12 HR, 26 RBI, 19 walks and 2 stolen bases, getting on base at a .430 clip and slugging .739 (1.169 OPS) in 27 games...among AL hitters in May, Cal ranked among the leaders in home runs (1st), RBI (3rd), extra-base hits (T-3rd), walks (T-4th), slugging percentage (2nd), OPS (2nd), OBP (7th) and average (14th), while he was tied for the MLB lead in fWAR (2.2).

- Back to Back Double Digits** - **Cal Raleigh** hit 10 home runs in March/April and 12 homers in May...he is the first Seattle player with 10+ homers in multiple calendar months within the same season since Nelson Cruz in 2016 (10 HR in June, 11 HR in Sept/Oct)...Raleigh is the first to do it in back-to-back months since Alex Rodriguez in July-August 1999.
- Cal Make History in May** - **Cal Raleigh** became the first catcher in MLB history to reach 20 home runs before the end of May and just the 29th overall instance in baseball history...his 22 home runs before June 1 are the tied for the 2nd-most in Mariners history, trailing only Ken Griffey Jr. (24 HR in 1997).
- Approaching More Mariners History** - **Cal Raleigh** has hit 115 homers in his career, trailing only Ken Griffey Jr. (132) through a player's first 5 career seasons in Mariners history...Cal ranks ahead of "Mr. Mariner" Alvin Davis (110) and Alex Rodriguez (106).

LATE AND CLOSE (AGAIN)...the Mariners improved to 11-7 in 1-run games yesterday, tied for the 3rd most 1-run wins in the Majors...dating back to the 2021 season, they have the most 1-run victories (130) and the 2nd most extra-innings victories (44) in the Majors...Seattle leads the Majors in game-tying or go-ahead home runs in the 7th-inning or later since 2021 with 85 such home runs, ranking ahead of the Dodgers (82)...their 9 game-tying or go-ahead HR after the 6th inning are tied for 2nd-most in MLB this season...Seattle also ranks 2nd in the Majors with 250 game-tying or go-ahead plate appearances in the 7th-inning or later since 2021, trailing only the Rays (251), while Seattle is tied for the MLB lead (28) in 2025.

MUÑOZ: STILL THE BEST CLOSER IN BASEBALL...despite allowing his first earned runs of the season on Friday, **Andrés Muñoz** is 1-0 with a 1.09 ERA (3 ER, 24.2 IP) with 8 walks (2 intentional), 31 strikeouts and a 0.81 WHIP, holding opponents to a .143 average...the March/April AL Reliever of the Month set the Mariners record for most innings pitched (23.2) to begin a season without allowing an earned run...Muñoz is tied among MLB relievers in bWAR (1.6) and ranks 2nd in saves (17), trailing only Robert Suárez-SD (18).

WHAT A RELIEF...yesterday Mariners relievers combined 7.0 innings of relief allowing just 1 unearned run while striking out 9 batters to just 2 walks...**Gabe Speier** (1.2 IP, 4 K), **Eduard Bazarzo** (1.1 IP, 3 K) and **Collin Snider** (2.0 IP, K) all covered more than an inning without allowing a run, only the third trio of Mariners relievers to do that in the same game since 2017 (also: 9/8/24 vs. STL and 7/13/22 vs. WSH)...**Jackson Kowar** (1.0 IP) and **Carlos Vargas** (1.0 IP, R, K) also tossed innings in yesterday's win.

MARINERS-TWINS CONNECTIONS...several players on the Mariners and Twins active rosters have ties between the two teams...INF **Jorge Polanco** spent 10 Major League seasons with the Twins (2014-23) while C **Mitch Garver** (2017-21) and INF **Donovan Solano** (2023) have appeared in the Majors for Minnesota...RHP **Casey Legumina** and INF/OF **Luke Valley** have each spent time in the Twins organization...active Twins that have played for the Mariners include INF Ty France (2020-24) who was an All-Star in 2022 for Seattle and owns the franchise record for HBP (95), and RHP Justin Topa (2024)...lastly, **Julio Rodríguez** made his MLB debut in Minnesota on April 8, 2022.

ON THE HOMESTAND...the Mariners continue the 9-game homestand, hosting the Minnesota Twins (3 G, 5/30-6/1) and Baltimore Orioles (3 G, 6/3-6/5)...the rest of the homestand is highlighted by **Little League Day** today, **Pride Night** on June 4 and a pair of **Mariners Value Games** on June 3 and June 5, with tickets starting at \$11.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...infielder **Cole Young** made his Major League debut yesterday at second base, going 1-for-4 with a walk and a walk-off fielders choice, and...**YOU MAY ALSO KNOW**... he became the first player in Mariners history with a walk-off in their MLB debut, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...he became just the **5th player in MLB history** to record a walk-off in their MLB debut, age 21-or-younger?...he joins Don Baylor-BAL (9/18/70 vs. CLE), Sixto Lezcano-MIL (9/10/74 vs. BAL), Tomás Pérez-TOR (5/3/95 vs. CWS) and Miguel Cabrera-FLA (6/20/03 vs. TB)...the 21-year-old is the youngest Mariners player to make their Major League debut since **Julio Rodríguez** made his debut on April 8, 2022 also against the Twins...Young is ranked as the Mariners #2 prospect by *Baseball America* and the #51 overall prospect by the publication.

ABOUT CASTILLO...

- The 32-year-old right-hander is set to make his 12th start of the season and his 1st against the Twins...he is also making his 223rd Major League start and his 8th career start against the Twins.
- Has been named an All-Star in 2019 (CIN), 2022 (CIN) and 2023 (SEA).
- Originally signed as an international free agent by the San Francisco Giants on 12/23/11.
- Made MLB debut on 6/23/17 vs. Washington (w/ Cincinnati).
- Signed a 5-year contract extension with the Seattle Mariners on Sept. 24, 2022 after being acquired in a trade with Cincinnati on July 30, 2022.

LAST TIME OUT...ND on May 25 at Houston, Castillo threw 6.0 innings, giving up 9 hits on 3 runs with 1 walk and 6 strikeouts...Castillo threw 114 pitches, and capped his outing with a 97 mph strikeout to end the 6th inning, and finish 2nd for the most pitches thrown in a game this season.

100 PITCHES AND STILL GOIN'...since Castillo made his Major League debut, he has thrown 100+ pitches in 97 outings, 6th-most in the Majors during that time...in his May 25 start at Houston, Castillo's 76 strikes thrown were his 3rd highest he has thrown in a game in his career...Castillo's 114 pitches was one shy of his career high (8/27/22 vs. CLE 115 pitches, 85 strikes) since making his Mariners debut (8/3/24 at NYY)...he was 1 of 9 pitchers in 2024 to record 12+ games with at least 100 pitches thrown.

FAMILIAR FACE...with his start against the Cincinnati Reds (4/15), Castillo has recorded a start against 29 of 30 MLB teams (ex: SEA).

STRETCHING IT OUT...in a Mariners uniform, Castillo has gone 5.0+ innings in 81 of his 85 starts, 6.0+ innings in 55 of 85, and 7.0+ innings in 18 of 85.

HOME COOKIN'...in 45 starts at T-Mobile Park, Castillo is 19-12 with a 2.86 ERA (85 ER, 267.2 IP), with 308 strikeouts, 66 walks and a 1.02 WHIP...he ranks 1st in SO, 3rd in ERA, 4th in Wins, and 6th in hits allowed in a pitcher's first 45 home games in franchise history (min. 150.0 IP).

AGAINST THE AL...in 88 career starts against the American League, Castillo is 28-31, with a 3.62 ERA (205 ER, 510.0 IP), 1.19 WHIP, and recording 525 strikeouts and 150 walks.

THE CASTILLO SHOW IN MAY...in 5 starts in the month of May this season, Castillo was 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA (10 ER, 30.0 IP), 4 QS, 7 walks and 22 strikeouts, while throwing 6.0+ innings in 4 of 5 starts...the month marks Castillo's career-best ERA, innings pitched per start (6.0 IP/GS), fewest walks (7), and lowest BB/9 (2.10) in his 7 seasons pitching in the month of May.

KEEPING IT CENTRAL...in Castillo's last 5 starts against AL-Central opponents, he is 2-2 with a 3.90 ERA (13 ER, 30.0 IP) 1.10 WHIP, 3 BB and 26 S...in 33 career starts against AL-Central opponents, Castillo is 7-13 with a 4.07 ERA (84 ER, 185.2 IP), 1.18 WHIP, 44 BB and 194 SO.

LUIS, LUIS...since making his Mariners debut (8/3/22 at NYY), Castillo is 33-26 with a 3.42 ERA (190 ER, 500.0 IP), 141 walks, 521 strikeouts, and a 1.15 WHIP while holding opponents to a .228 AVG against...among qualified pitchers during that span, he ranks among the top-10 leaders in QS (49), wins (33), strikeouts (521), innings pitched (500.0 IP), ERA (3.42), AVG against (.228), runs allowed (203), WHIP (1.15), earned runs allowed (190), and K/9 (9.38).

TOP CHARTS...since his MLB debut (6/23/17 vs. WSH), Castillo is 5th in innings pitched (1292.1), QS (123), 6th in SO (1381), AVG against (.226), 7th in ERA (3.54), WAR (25.2), 8th in WHIP (1.18), and 9th in K/9 (9.62) among starting pitchers (min. 1,000 IP).

FOR CLUB & COUNTRY...ranks among the Dominican Republic-born All-Time leaders (min. 1,100.0 IP) in SO/9 (2nd, 9.62), SO/BB (3rd, 3.23), WHIP (3rd, 1.18), Opp. AVG (4th, .228), H/9 (4th, 7.70), ERA (6th, 3.54)...trails only Hall of Famer Pedro Martinez in SO/9 (10.04)...Castillo was born in Bani, Dominican Republic).

TOP OF CLASS...currently holds a 3.32 ERA and recorded his 6th consecutive season with a sub-4.00 ERA in 2024, including 5 qualified seasons (2019-21, 2023-24)...his 5 qualified seasons since 2019 is tied the most in the Majors during that span (also: Gerrit Cole-HOU/NYY and Zack Wheeler-PHI).

STEERING THE SHIP... Castillo is 1st in SO (521), and 5th in ERA (3.42) for a pitcher's first 85 games in franchise history (min. 250.0 IP)...since his Mariners debut (8/3/22 at NYY), Castillo has led the team in SO/9, (10.6 in 2022, and 10.0 in 2023), ERA (3.17 in 2022), innings pitched (197.0 in 2023), and games started (33 in 2023).

CAREER...will be making his 223rd career start and is 1 of 28 active pitchers with 220-or-more carer starts in the MLB...has pitched in parts of 9 Major League seasons with Cincinnati (2017-22) and Seattle (2022-c)...has been named an All-Star 3 times (2019, 2022 w/CIN and 2023 w/SEA)...finished 5th in 2023 AL Cy Young Award voting...has made 4 Opening Day starts in his career: 2019 and 2021 with Cincinnati and 2023-24 with Seattle.

POSTSEASON PEDIGREE...has made 3 career postseason starts, going 1-2 with a 1.83 ERA (4 ER, 19.2 IP), 19 strikeouts and 1 walk (intentional)...earned the win in Game 1 of the 2022 AL Wild Card Series at Toronto...tossed 7.1 scoreless innings with 5 strikeouts, setting a franchise record for most innings pitched in a scoreless postseason start...was tagged with the loss on 10/13/22 at HOU in G2 of the ALDS...allowed 3 runs on 5 hits (2 HR) with 7 strikeouts.

FIELDING HIS POSITION...has only committed 3 errors in 222 games, and has the 4th best fielding percentage (.987) among active pitchers since his MLB debut.
