METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Marlins, 8-0, last night in Miami...Since starting the season 0-5, the Mets have gone 20-19...The Mets are in a stretch of 13 straight games and 26 games in 27 days...New York is 2-6 in that span...The Mets are on an eight game road trip (1-2) to Philadelphia (1-1), Miami (0-1) and Cleveland (three games).

KING LUIS: Luis Severino is slated to make his ninth start of the year today in Miami...He is 2-2 with a 3.00 ERA (15 ER/45.0 IP) with 20 walks and 41 strikeouts...Today will mark his second career start against the Marlins...On April 16, 2018, Severino allowed only one hit, walked one and struck out eight in 6.0 innings of work at Yankee Stadium.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of 10 straight games against the NL East...The team is 2-6 in that stretch...The Mets are 4-7 against the NL East...The Mets went 25-27 against the East last year with a 4.41 ERA...The team hit .237/.315/.395 against the division in 2023.

ESQUIRE MARTINEZ: J.D. Martinez is batting .309 (21-68) with five runs, four doubles, two home runs, seven RBI and five walks in 20 games this year...He has hit 317 home runs in his career...That is eighth among active players...Over the last 10 games, Martinez is batting .342 (13-38) with four runs, two doubles, two home runs, six RBI, three walks with a .943 OPS.

BEAR NECESSITIES: Pete Alonso has hit 202 home runs in his career...His 202 home runs are the most in the majors since he entered the league in 2019...Aaron Judge is second with 1865 dingers, followed by Kyle Schwarber with 183 homers...Alonso's 521 RBI are also the most in baseball in that time frame...He is followed by Matt Olson (509) and Freddie Freeman (483).

STRAWBERRY FIELDS FOREVER: On Saturday June 1, the New York Mets will retire Darryl Strawberry's No. 18 in a special pregame ceremony... Strawberry was a seven-time All-Star with the Mets after he was selected first overall in the 1980 June Draft...Strawberry earned National League Rookie of the Year honors in 1983 when he slugged a then-club rookie record 26 homers...He is the Mets all-time leader in home runs (252), ranks second in RBI (733) and walks (580), third in extra-base hits (469) and runs (662) and fourth in slugging (.520).

DOWN ON THE FARM: Hayden Senger went 3-4 with one run, two doubles, one triple and three RBI for the Syracuse Mets last night...The 2023 Mets Minor League Platinum Glove Winner as the organization's defensive player of the year is batting .273 (12-44) in 16 games at Triple-A this season...Senger was selected by the Mets in the 24th round of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of Miami University of Ohio.

ICE FISHING: Pete Alonso has hit 26 home runs in 78 career games against the Marlins...Among active players, only Freddie Freeman (39) and Bryce Harper (36) have hit more against the Fish...Ronald Acuña Jr. has also hit 26 homers in 88 career games against the Marlins.

MARLINS-METS NOTES: The Mets have won the season series vs. the Marlins every year since 2018, going 63-37 against them over that time.

KEEP FISHING: Jeff McNeil has hit .293 (77-263) with 41 runs, 18 doubles, one triple, seven home runs, 28 RBI, 29 walks with a .375 OBP and a .449 SLG in 79 career games against Miami...Starling Marte has slashed .288/.342/.425 with 19 extra-base hits in 55 games against the Marlins... Francisco Lindor owns a lifetime .283/.363/.519 slashline in 55 games vs. Miami.

ON LOAN: Starling Marte has hit .300 (87-290) with 50 runs, 12 doubles, two triples, eight home runs, 33 RBI, 20 walks with a .361 OBP and a .438 SLG in 77 games at loanDepot park...In 24 games, Francisco Lindor has hit .292 (28-96) with 13 runs, seven doubles, three triples, 14 RBI, 12 walks with a .378 OBP and a .458 SLG...J.D. Martinez is 12-38 with five extra-base hits in 10 games at the yard...Pete Alonso has hit 12 home runs in 36 games in Miami.

PARTY IN THE CITY WHERE THE HEAT IS ON: The Mets are 56-49 lifetime at loanDepot ballpark...The Mets have gone 12-5 at the ballpark since 2022, batting .269/.334/.463 at the yard and posting a 3.07 ERA... Since 2022, the Mets have outscored the Marlins 84-54 at their home.

IN A PINCH: As a team, Mets pinch hitters are batting .270 (10-37) this year with three doubles, two home runs, four walks, a .341 OBP and a .514 SLG...Their 11 RBI from pinch-hitters top the majors...They rank fifth with a .514 SLG and are seventh with a .270 average.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York is 10-10 away from Citi Field...New York is batting .260/.325/.404 on the road this year...Their .260 batting average is the fifth-best in the majors...Their 5.20 runs per game on the road are the fifth-most in the major leagues.

WAY AWAY, AWAY FROM HERE: Brandon Nimmo is batting .254/.427/.540 with 16 runs, four doubles, one triple, four home runs, 15 RBI, 14 walks and a .967 OPS in 17 games on the road this year...This compares to a .186/.307/.291 slashline in 24 games at Citi Field in 2024.

TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT: Since 2021, Brandon Nimmo is batting .278/.362/.416 against left-handed pitchers...That is the ninth-best batting average by a left-handed hitter against Southpaws since 2021... Jeff McNeil has slashed .286/.356/.357 against fellow lefties...His .286 average is fourth-best by a lefty in that time-frame.

MOVING ON UP: Nimmo has hit 93 career home runs...That puts him tied for 20th on the Mets all-time list with Cleon Jones...Next up is John Milner who socked 94, followed by Bobby Bonilla and Curtis Granderson who each hit 95...The Mets have had 15 players who have hit 100 or more home runs with the club.

SEVERINO NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Luis Severino allowed two runs on four hits with three walks and four strikeouts as the Mets defeated the Braves, 4-3, on May 12 at Citi Field...He has struck out 41 in 45.0 innings this year.

NO WAY: Luis Severino carried a no-hitter into the eighth inning on April 29 against the Cubs...Threw 8.0 innings, allowing one run on one hit with two walks and five strikeouts...The outing was tied for the longest no-hit bid of his career...Threw 7.0 hitless innings on October 3, 2022 at Texas with the Yankees...Courtesy of Elias...Marked his longest start since June 16, 2018 vs. Tampa Bay (Also: 8.0 IP)...Became the first Mets pitcher to throw at least 8.0 innings and allow one or zero hits since Marcus Stroman accomplished the feat on July 21, 2021 at Cincinnati...Ranks fourth in the NL among qualifiers in ERA with a 2.31 (9 ER/35.0 IP) mark.

METS DEBUT: In his Mets debut on March 30, Severino became the 25th pitcher to start a game for both the Yankees and Mets (last: Bartolo Colon, 2011 with the Yankees and 2014 with the Mets)...He threw 5.0 innings, allowing 12 hits with six runs (three earned) and six strikeouts.

NEW STARTER IN THE CITI: Severino made his Citi Field debut in his Mets debut, recording 5.0 IP with a 5.40 ERA (3 ER/5.0 IP)...During his eight seasons with the Yankees, he held a 30-16 record with a 3.62 ERA (144 ER/358.0 IP) and 1.13 WHIP with 399 strikeouts against 100 walks while pitching at home.

STRIKE THAT: Severino has recorded 825 career strikeouts...That ranks second among active Dominican pitchers...Only Luis Castillo (1,205) has recorded more.

2023 RECAP: Appeared in 19 games (18 starts) for the Yankees last season, posting a 6.65 ERA (66 ER/89.1IP). From 2015-2022...Held a 3.39 ERA (240 ER/638.0 IP) and 1.12 WHIP, each the sixth-best mark in the American League (min. 600.0 IP).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Over eight seasons with the Yankees, went 54-37 with a 3.79 ERA (306 ER/727.1IP) with 788 strikeouts in 141 games. Is a two-time AL All-Star (2017-18)...In 2017, ranked in the top ten in the AL in strikeouts (fourth, 230), innings pitched (ninth, 193.1), and wins (ninth, 14)...In 2018, finished in the top-10 in AL Cy Young balloting as he ranked eighth in the AL with 220 strikeouts and was third in the league with 19 wins...He was also the fastest Yankee to record 500 career strikeouts, accomplishing the feat in the 85th game of his career.

STRONG START IN SPRING: In his first Spring Training with the Mets, Severino recorded a 1.29 ERA (2 ER/14.0) and allowed just one walk with 12 strikeouts over four starts.

HIGH VELOCITY: In 2023, his fastball velocity (96.4 mph) ranked in the 88th percentile in the majors.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP SEAN MANAEA (2-1, 3.05)

WHAT A MIGHTY GOOD MANAEA: In his first career start with the Mets, April 1 vs. Detroit, Manaea did not allow a hit through his first 5.2 innings...It was the longest no-hit bid by a Mets pitcher in their team debut and the second-longest no-hit bid by a Mets pitcher in their first career start with team...Tracy Stallard threw 6.0 no-hit in his first career start with the Mets on June 2, 1963 vs. Pittsburgh after making 13 relief appearances to begin his career with New York...He joined Kenny Rogers (7/28/99) as the only Mets pitcher to allow one hit and throw 6.0 or more innings in their team debut...He recorded eight strikeouts, which tied Johan Santana (3/31/08) for the most punch outs by a Mets left-handed pitcher in their team debut and were tied for the seventh-most by any Mets pitcher int their team debut...Credit *Elias*.
