METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed a day off in Chicago yesterday...On Sunday, the Mets swept a doubleheader from the Guardians...New York has won two straight series and has now won seven this season...The Mets are coming off a six-game homestand (5-1) against Tampa Bay (2-1) and Cleveland (3-0)...Tonight, the team begins a six-game road trip to Chicago-NL (three games) and Colorado (three games).

HAPPY BUCK DAY!: Happy Birthday to Buck Showalter...Showalter owns a 1,677-1,601 (.512) career record as a manager...His 1,677 wins place him 19th all-time in major league history...Showalter has now managed four teams to the Postseason...He is the fourth manager to accomplish that feat in major league history, joining Dusty Baker (five teams) and Billy Martin and Davey Johnson (four teams)... Showalter is the first manager in Mets history to record 100 victories in his first season with the club...He also joins Yogi Berra as the only managers to guide the Mets and Yankees into the playoffs.

HIGH FIVE: The Mets are on a five-game winning streak, which matches their season-high...The team also won five straight from April 12-17...New York has posted a 4.02 ERA (21 ER/47.0 IP) with 13 walks and 38 strikeouts in that span...The team is batting .274/.347/.470 with 13 extra-base hits and an .818 OPS in the five games...The Mets are outscoring opponents 28-23 in the winning streak...New York has received quality starts in four of the five games in the winning streak.

ONE AND ONLY: All five wins during the Mets current winning streak have been decided by one run...That is tied for the longest such streak in franchise history (July 20, - July 24, 1984)...The Mets are 11-7 in one-run games this season and are 6-1 in their last seven games decided by one run.

AND I WOULD WALK ABOVE .500: With the duel victories on Sunday, the Mets moved back above .500...It's the first time the club is above .500 since they were 17-16 on May 5...The Mets are two games above .500...Their season-high is seven games.

THE FRIENDLY CONFINES: The Mets begin a three-game set at Wrigley Field tonight...New York took three of four in the Windy City in 2022...Franciso Lindor is a lifetime .353 (18-51) hitter with nine runs, four doubles, two home runs, eight RBI and 11 walks with a .468 ONP and a .549 SLG in 13 games at the ballpark...Brandon Nimmo has hit .289/.341/.421in 10 career games at the ballpark In 66 career contests, Starling Marte has hit .273/.326/.461 with 44 runs, 12 doubles, four triples, 10 home runs, 34 RBI and 17 walks.

THREE NIGHTS IN CHICAGO: The Mets are set to play three consecutive night games in Chicago...The last did that from April 20-23, 2021...Prior to that, the team played three straight night games at Wrigley Field from September 12-14, 2017.

TYLOR THE CREATOR: Tylor Megill is set to make his 10th start of the season...He is 5-2 with a 3.88 ERA(20 ER/46.1 IP) with 23 walks and 35 striekouts....Megill has allowed three earned runs over his last two starts, going 2-0 with a 2.45 ERA (3 Er/11.0 IP)...Tonight will mark his first career start against the Cubs.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets hit the road again...New York has played 27 games on the road this year, the most in the majors...New York is 13-14 with a 4.70 ERA away from Citi Field in 2023...The team's 226 strikeouts on the road is the most in the National League and second-most in the majors...Only the Twins (238 strikeouts in 25 games) have struck out more.

CUBS-METS NOTES: The Mets have not won a season series against the Cubs snce they went 5-2 against Chicago in 2016.

THE HATEFUL EIGHT: Jeff McNeil is on an eight-game hitting streak, batting .400 (12-30) in that span with five runs, two walks and three RBI...He has 178 multi-hit games in his career, which is 19th all-time in Mets history...Wally Backman is next with 179 multi-hit contests.

HOMER HAPPY: After the Mets went five straight games without a home run, the Mets have homered in six straight contests, hitting 13 home runs in that span...The Mets are 20-9 when hitting a home run this season and 9-5 when hitting multiple homers.

ATTABOY ALVAREZ: Francisco Alvarez is batting .271 (16-59) with four doubles, five home runs, 10 RBI, five walks with a .338 OBP and a .593 SLG against right-handed pitching this year...In 16 games in May, Alvarez is batting .271 (13-48) with seven runs, four doubles, four home runs, nine RBI, six walks with a .968 OPS.

**DOUBLE TROUBLE:** Brooks Raley pitched in both games of Sunday's doubleheader...He joins Jordan Weems as the only pitcher in the majors to pitch in both games of a doubleheader this season...He is the first Met to pitch in both games of a doubleheader since Hansel Robles and Josh Smoker pitched in both games of a doubleheader on August 27, 2017 at Washington...Courtesy of Elias.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo is batting .340 (36-106) with 12 runs, seven doubles, two home runs, 15 RBI, 11 walks with a .402 OBP, .462 SLG and an .864 OPS in 27 games on the road this season...He has safely hit in six straight road games, batting .400 (10-25) with two runs, a double, four RBI, two walks with an .860 OPS in that span.

LINSANITY: Francisco Lindor is batting .314 (11-35) with six runs, one home run, three RBI, one walk with an .819 OPS over his last eight games...He has 15 doubles on the season, which tied for fourth in the majors and tied for third in the NL.

EIGHT IS GREAT: The Mets are 22-0 when leading after eight innings this season...The last time the Mets lost a game when they were ahead after eight innings was on September 6, 2021 at Washington... The Mets were up 3-2 and lost 4-3 in the bottom of the ninth...Since then the Mets have won their last 117 games when ahead after eight, the longest active streak in MLB...It's the tied for the longest streak in franchise history....From October 1, 1990- September 2, 1992, the Mets also won 117 straight games when ahead after eight innings.

WHEN I WAS 17: Alonso has hit 17 home runs this year, which leads the majors leagues...His 41 RBI are fourth in The Show and lead the National League...Alonso ranks 12th in franchise history with 421 career RBI...Next up is Kevin McReynolds (456) and Keith Hernandez

**D-FENCE**: The Mets have committed 15 errors in 48 games this year... That gives the team a .991 fielding percentage....Their .991 fielding percentage ranks third in the majors and second in the NL...Their 15 errors are the second-fewest committed...Only the Padres (12) have committed fewer.

FEELING A LITTLE DRAFTY: The Mets have a homegrown player on their roster from the 2019 (Brett Baty), 2018 (Tylor Megill), 2017 (Mark Vientos), 2016 (Pete Alonso), 2013 (Jeff McNeil) and 2011 (Brandon Nimmo) drafts.

# MEGILL NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Earned the win in the Mets' 3-2 victory over the Tampa Bay Rays on May 18...Matched a season-high 6.0 innings pitched, allowed two earned runs on four hits, one walk and four strikeouts.

**BIG DRIP VS THE CUBS:** Today, Megill will make his first career start against the Cubs...Is 0-2 with a 6.00 ERA (18 ER/27.0 IP) in eight career appearances (six starts) against NL Central opponents.

**THE GAME OF RISP:** This season, Megill is holding opposing batters to a .175 average (7-40) with runners in scoring position, tied for the fifth-best mark in the NL and tied for the 13th-best mark in the majors...Megill also ranks fifth in the NL and 11th in the majors with a .477 opponent's OPS with runners in scoring position (Min. 40 batters faced w/RISP).

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** This season, Megill is 2-1 with a 4.74 ERA (10 ER/19.0 IP) in four road starts this season...In five home starts this season, Megill is 3-1 with a 3.29 ERA (10 ER/27.1 IP)...In 21 career road games (17 starts), Megill is 6-6 with a 4.85 ERA (46 ER/85.1 IP) and in 21 career home games (19 starts), Megill is 7-4 with a 4.22 ERA (46 ER/98.0 IP).

**THE FRANCHISE HAS COMPANY:** On April 7, the Mets home opener vs. Miami, Megill threw 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed three hits...Megill joined Tom Seaver (April 5, 1983) as the only other pitcher in franchise history to throw 6.0 shutout innings and allow three hits or fewer in a home opener...Courtesy of Elias.

**COMBINED NO-NO:** Megill threw the first 5.0 innings of MLB's first no-hitter of the season on April 29 at Citi Field...It was the second no-hitter in team history (also, Johan Santana, June 1, 2012 vs. St. Louis)...The Mets combine no-hitter against the Phillies marked the 17th time a team has thrown a combined no-hitter and the 10th time in the Wild Card Era...Drew Smith (1.1 IP, BB, 4 K), Joely Rodríguez (1.0 IP, 2 BB), Seth Lugo (0.2 IP) and Edwin Díaz (1.0 IP, 3 K) finished the job with 4.0 hitless innings out of the bullpen.

**2022 RECAP:** Was the Mets Opening Day starter and earned the victory after tossing 5.0 scoreless innings against the Nationals...Did not allow a run over 5.1 innings and earned the victory in his following start against the Phillies on April 12...Started the Mets combined no-hitter against the Phillies on April 29 and threw 5.0 innings with three walks and five strikeouts...Struck out a season-high nine batters in his following start against the Braves on May 4...Was on the 15-Day Injured List with right biceps inflammation from May 12 - June 10...Made two starts in his return from the IL before beginning another stint on the Injured List with a right shoulder strain on June 17...Was transferred to the 60-day IL on June 27 and returned to action on September 19...Made his final six appearances of the season in relief and allowed four earned runs over 6.0 innings in those appearances.

**OPENOR:** Last year, Tylor Megill was named the Mets Opening Day Starter...With 89.2 career innings pitched entering the 2022 season, Megill had the fewest major league innings of any Mets Opening Day starting pitcher in franchise history...Became the 28th different Opening Day starting pitcher in Mets history.

**RUNS IN THE FAMILY:** His brother, Trevor, is a pitcher in the Minnesota Twins organization...They both made their MLB debut in 2021..According to *Elias*, they are the fourth pair of brothers to make their major league debut in the same season since 2000 (2019, Scott & Tyler Heineman, 2017, Joe & A.J. Jimenez and 2012, Donovan & Jhonatan Solano).

**PUTTING THE K IN FORK:** Senga's "ghost fork" has accounted for 30 of his 55 strikeouts through eight starts...The pitch has a 58.8 percent whiff rate and a 27.8 percent putaway rate...Opponents have managed just five hits in 44 atbats ending with the forkball, a .114 batting average.
