TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

May 3, 1951: Gil McDougald drives in six runs in an 11-run 9th inning of a 17-3 win at St. Louis's Sportsman's Park, hitting a two-run triple and a grand slam. The Yankees also set the club record for most extra-base hits in an inning with 7.

May 3, 1936: Joe DiMaggio makes his Major League debut for the Yankees in a 14-5 victory vs. St. Louis at Yankee Stadium, going 3-for-6 with 3R, 1 triple and 1 RBI.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their seven-game homestand today with the third game of a four-game wrap-around series vs. Baltimore (2-0 thus far)...will also face Texas in a three-game set from Tues.-Thurs.

- **Their 22-11 (.667) record is the best in the American League and the second-best in the Majors**, trailing only Atlanta (24-10, .706).
- **Have won 12 of their last 14 games (since 4/17), 13 of their last 16 games (since 4/15) and 14 of their last 18 games (since 4/13).**
- The Yankees' 12 wins over their last 14 games marks their most over a 14-game span in a single season since going 12-2 from 5/29-6/12/24.
- Are a season-high 11 games over .500.
- The Yankees are 18-3 this season when scoring first.
- With Saturday's win, have clinched at least a series split vs. the Orioles...have won or split nine of their 11 series this season (are 7-2-1 in their completed series), including each of their last six (are 4-0-1 in their completed series over that span).
- The Yankees' +57 run differential this season is the best in the AL and the third-best in the Majors.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Orioles, 9-4, on Saturday at Yankee Stadium...**LHP Ryan Weathers** (5.0IP, 3H, 3R/1ER, 2BB, 5K, 1HR) started and earned his second win of the season...**LF Cody Bellinger** (4-for-4, 3R, 1 double, 2HR, 4RBI, 1SB) recorded a season-high four hits and drove in four of the Yankees' nine runs, hitting a go-ahead solo home run in the second inning, an RBI double in the third inning, a solo home run in the fifth inning and an RBI single in the seventh inning...marked his 21st career multi-HR game and second of the season...**CF Trent Grisham** (2-for-4, 2R, 1 double, 1HR, 2RBI, 1BB) reached base three times and hit his fifth HR of the season with a two-run shot in the fourth inning...**2B Jazz Chisholm Jr.** (1-for-3, 1RBI, 1BB) reached base twice and hit an RBI single in the seventh inning...**1B Ben Rice** (1-for-3, 1R, 2BB, 1SB) and **RF Aaron Judge** (0-for-3, 1R, 2BB/1BB) each reached base multiple times...**Yankees relievers** allowed only 1R/ER in 4.0IP (1H, 3BB, 3K).

PITCH PERFECT: **Yankees pitchers have posted a Major League-best 3.01 ERA this season** (full rankings on left)...have allowed only 3ER-or-fewer in 10 of their last 12 games (since 4/19) and 11 of their last 14 games (since 4/17)...have allowed only 1ER-or-fewer in eight of their last 14 games, posting a 2.10 ERA (124.0IP, 29ER) over that 14-game span.

- Have allowed 112R this season, their second-fewest through their first 33 games of a season in the last 45 years (since 1982), trailing only their 97R in 2022.

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge has reached base multiple times in nine of his last 11 games (since 4/21), hitting .314/.520/.629 (11-for-35) with 10R, 2 doubles, 3HR, 5RBI, 14BB/2IBB, 1HP and 1SB.

- Has reached base in 25 of his last 27 games (since 4/3), batting .290/.445/.667 (27-for-93) with 26R, 5 doubles, 10HR, 18RBI, 24BB/2IBB, 2HP and 5SB over that span.
- **Is tied for second in the Majors in home runs (12, tied for second in AL)**...also ranks second in pitches per PA (4.51, second in AL), tied for fifth in runs scored (28, tied for second in AL), sixth in OPS (1.003, fourth in AL) and SLG (.607, fourth in AL), tied for sixth in XBH (17, tied for fourth in AL) and WAR among position players (1.7, fourth in AL - FanGraphs), and tied for ninth in total bases (71, tied for fourth in AL).
- **Has hit 9HR in his last 19 games (since 4/12).**
- In 122 career games vs. Baltimore, has hit .322/.459/.728 (137-for-426) with 117R, 20 doubles, 51HR, 110RBI, 103BB/8IBB, 7HP, 2SF and 5SB...his 51HR against Baltimore are his most vs. any opponent...marks the most by any Major League player vs. a single opponent since 2017...also marks the most home runs among active players vs. Baltimore.
- Has reached base safely in each of his last 24 games vs. Baltimore (since 5/2/24), hitting .405/.571/.905 (30-for-74) with 23R, 1 double, 12HR, 15RBI, 27BB/4IBB, 3HP and 1SF over that span.
- Has hit 6HR in his last 14 games vs. Baltimore (since 4/29/25) and 12HR in his last 22 games (since 6/20/24).
- 17 of his 30H this season have been XBH (12HR, 5 doubles).

BRONX BOMBERS: **Yankees batters** hit 3HR on Saturday vs. Baltimore...have hit multiple home runs in four of their last five games (since 4/27) and six of their last eight games (since 4/24)...lead the Majors with 53HR this year (full rankings on left).

► **Have hit .344/.426/.570 (32-for-93) with 4 doubles, 1 triple, 5HR, 45RBI, 17BB and 5SF with RISP over their last 13 games (since 4/18).**

► Have scored at least 4R in 14 of their last 16 games (since 4/15) and 17 of their last 20 games (since 4/11)...the Yankees are 19-5 this season when scoring at least 4R.

MERRY GRISHMAS: OF Trent Grisham reached base three times and hit his fifth HR of the season with a two-run shot in the fourth inning on Saturday vs. Baltimore...has hit 5HR in his last 17 games (since 4/13)...has hit .333/.381/.944 (6-for-18) with 1 triple, 3HR, 15RBI, 2BB and 1SF with RISP this year.

MATCHING UP: The Yankees are 10-1 in their last 11 games vs. Baltimore (since 6/21/25).

SAVED BY THE BELL: INF/OF Cody Bellinger recorded a season-high four hits and drove in four of the Yankees' nine runs on Saturday vs. Baltimore, hitting a go-ahead solo home run in the second inning, an RBI double in the third inning, a solo home run in the fifth inning and an RBI single in the seventh inning...**marked his 21st career multi-HR game and second of the season** (also 4/18 vs. Kansas City)...marked his fourth multi-HR game as a Yankee.

- His 4H on Saturday matched his second-most in a game in his career, trailing only his career-high 5H on 4/17/23 at Oakland with Chicago-NL...marked his ninth career game with at least four hits (most since 8/19/25 at Tampa Bay).
- **Has hit .500/.529/1.125 (8-for-16) with 3R, 4 doubles, 2HR, 6RBI, 1BB and 1SB over his last four games (since 4/28).**
- Has hit safely in 12-of-14 home games this year, batting .353/.460/.765 (18-for-51) with 13R, 6 doubles, 5HR, 14RBI, 11BB, 1SF and 1SB.

LAND OF THE FRIED: LHP Max Fried will make his eighth start of the season today vs. Baltimore...**has gone 4-1 with a 2.09 ERA (47.1IP, 11ER) in seven starts this season**, holding opponents to a .161/.227/.217 (26-for-161) slash line this year...**has not allowed a run in four of his seven starts, including each of his last two starts (14.0IP).**

► **Has posted a Major League-best 0.19 HR/9.0IP ratio and .217 opponents' SLG**...is also tied for first in the Majors in innings pitched (47.1, first in AL) and starts (seven, tied for first in AL), ranks second in opponents' BA (.161, first in AL), opponents' OPS (.445, second in AL) and WHIP (0.80, second in AL), fourth in opponents' OBP (.227, second in AL), tied for sixth in wins (four, tied for third in AL) and eighth in ERA (2.09, sixth in AL).

- **Has tossed at least 6.0IP in six of his seven starts, tied for the most in the Majors**...his three starts of at least 7.0IP and two starts of at least 8.0IP are also tied for the most in the Majors.
- His four scoreless starts of at least 6.0IP are the most in the Majors.
- Has allowed only 1HR to 177FB this season.
- **In 49 career starts vs. the American League, has gone 31-7 with a 2.18 ERA (310.0IP, 75ER)...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 37 of those 49 starts, including 23 of his last 31 starts (since 6/17/24), going 20-4 with a 2.08 ERA (199.0IP, 46ER) in that span.**
- In 27 career starts against the AL East, has gone 18-4 with a 2.20 ERA (175.2IP, 43ER)...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 20 of his 27 starts...has tossed at least 6.0 innings in 23 of his 27 career starts against the AL East...as a Yankee, has gone 8-2 with a 2.23 ERA (93.0IP, 23ER) in 14 starts vs. the AL East.

RICE RICE BABY: C/INF Ben Rice reached base three times on Saturday vs. Baltimore...**has hit .330/.447/.717 (35-for-106) with 28R, 8 doubles, 11HR, 26RBI, 23BB/2IBB, 1HP, 2SF and 2SB in 32 games this season**...19 of his 35H this season have gone for extra bases (8 doubles, 11HR)...has reached base safely in 25-of-28 starts.

- **Has hit 7HR in his last 15 games (since 4/16).**
- **Has hit 8HR in his last 12 games vs. Baltimore (since 7/14/24)**...has hit .375/.434/.958 (18-for-48) with 13R, 2 doubles, 1 triple, 8HR, 17RBI, 4BB, 1HP and 1SB during those games.
- **Leads the majors in OBP (.447), SLG (.717) and OPS (1.164)**, is tied for second in WAR among position players (1.9, tied for second in AL - FanGraphs), tied for third in XBH (19, tied for second in AL) and go-ahead RBI (seven, tied for third in AL), ranks fourth in total bases (76, third in AL), tied for fourth in HR (11, fourth in AL) and game-winning RBI (five, tied for second in AL), tied for fifth in runs scored (28, tied for second in AL), ninth in BA (.330, fifth in AL), 10th in PA/BB (5.74, sixth in AL) and tied for 10th in times on base (59, tied for fifth in AL)...is also tied for third in the AL in RBI (26) and tied for eighth in walks (23).

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters have posted a Major League-best 2.67 ERA (188.2IP, 56ER) and 189K in 33 starts this season...have allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 13 of their last 14 starts (since 4/17), posting a 1.79 ERA (85.1IP, 17ER) over that span...have tossed at least 6.0IP in 10 of their last 14 starts.

- Have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 29 of their 33 starts this season.
- **Have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 21 of their 33 starts, their second-most through their first 33 games of a season in franchise history**, trailing only their 25 starts in 2022.
- **The Yankees have three of the Major's top-11 lowest ERAs:** RHP Cam Schlichter (1.51, second in Majors), LHP Max Fried (2.09, eighth in Majors) and RHP Will Warren (2.39, 11th in Majors).
- **Lead the Majors in ERA (2.67), opponents' BA (.201), opponents' OBP (.263), opponents' SLG (.319), opponents' OPS (.582), WHIP (1.00) and strikeouts (189)**, rank second in K/BB (3.71, second in AL) and BB/9.0IP (2.43, second in AL), third in innings pitched (188.2, second in AL) and strikeout rate (25.3%, second in AL), fourth in HR/9.0IP (0.86, third in AL) and ninth in K/9.0IP (9.02, fifth in AL).

FAST AND FURIOUS: Yankees baserunners have recorded 345B this season, marking their most through their first 33 games of a season in the last 25 years (since 2002)...the last time they recorded more was 2001 (425B).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP MAX FRIED (4-1, 2.09 ERA)

LHP Max Fried will make his eighth start of the season today vs. Baltimore...the 32-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest due to Thursday's team off day...last pitched on Monday at Texas and earned his fourth win of the season in the Yankees' 4-2 victory after tossing 6.0 scoreless innings (4H, 2BB, 5K, 1PO)...**owns a 14.0 scoreless inning streak (since 4/22)**...in seven starts this season, has gone 4-1 with a 2.09 ERA (47.1IP, 11ER)...went 19-5 with a 2.86 ERA (195.1IP, 164H, 73R/62ER, 51BB, 189K, 14HR) in 32 starts in his first season with the Yankees in 2025, setting career highs in wins, starts, innings pitched, strikeouts and pickoffs (eight)...over 10 Major League seasons with the Atlanta Braves (2017-24) and Yankees (2025-26), has gone 96-42 with six complete games (four shutouts) and a 2.99 ERA (1,127.0IP, 973H, 416R/375ER, 309BB, 1,089K, 91HR) in 207 career games (190 starts)... among Major League pitchers since 2020 (min. 700.0IP), ranks first in ERA (2.78), wins (77), winning percentage (.713) and pickoffs (28), is tied for first in shutouts (four), second in HR/9.0IP (0.64), opponents' SLG (.326) and opponents' OPS (.604), third in groundball percentage (53.6%) and groundball/flyball ratio (2.13), sixth in opponents' OBP (.279) and WHIP (1.08), and tied for sixth in complete games (five)...his 94 wins since 2019 are the most in the Majors...the three-time All-Star (2022, '24-25) and four-time Gold Glove Award winner (2020-22, '25) has finished in the top-five of Cy Young Award voting three times in his career (second in 2022, fourth in 2025 and fifth in 2020)...the Santa Monica, Calif., native was originally selected by San Diego in the first round (seventh overall) of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft...was acquired by Atlanta along with INF Jace Peterson, OF Dustin Peterson and OF Mallex Smith in exchange for OF Justin Upton and RHP Aaron Northcraft on 12/19/14...was signed by the Yankees to an eight-year contract extending through the 2032 season on 12/17/24.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his fourth win of the year on Monday at Texas after tossing 6.0 scoreless innings (4H, 2BB, 5K, 1PO)...marked his second straight scoreless start and fourth of the season...marks the second time this season he has tossed back-to-back scoreless starts (also 3/25-31).
 ✦ **After tossing 6.0 scoreless innings on Monday, Fried now has a sub-3.00 career ERA (2.99).**

2026: In seven starts this season, has gone 4-1 with a 2.09 ERA (47.1IP, 11ER)...has held opponents to a .161/.227/.217 (26-for-161) slash line this year...**has not allowed a run in four of his seven starts, including each of his last two (14.0IP)**...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in six of his seven starts.

- ✦ **Has posted a Major League-best 0.19 HR/9.0IP ratio and .217 opponents' SLG**...is also tied for first in the Majors in innings pitched (47.1, first in AL) and starts (seven, tied for first in AL), ranks second in opponents' BA (.161, first in AL), opponents' OPS (.445, second in AL) and WHIP (0.80, second in AL), fourth in opponents' OBP (.227, second in AL), tied for sixth in wins (four, tied for third in AL) and eighth in ERA (2.09, sixth in AL).
- ✦ **Has tossed at least 6.0IP in six of his seven starts, tied for the most in the Majors.**
- ✦ Has tossed at least 7.0IP in three starts, tied for the most in the Majors...his two starts of at least 8.0IP are also tied for the most in the Majors.
- ✦ **His four scoreless starts of at least 6.0IP are the most in the Majors.**
- ✦ Has allowed only 1HR to 177BF this season.
- ✦ Has allowed 4H-or-fewer in five of his seven starts.
- ✦ Has allowed 3BB-or-fewer in each of his starts.
- ✦ Has not exited a start this season with the Yankees trailing.
- ✦ **Posted a season-opening 13.1 scoreless inning streak from 3/25-31...was tied for the third-longest by a Yankees starter to begin the season in the last 15 years** (since 2012), trailing only Luis Gil's 18.2 scoreless inning streak in 2021 and Cam Schlichtler's 13.2 scoreless inning streak to begin this season (Nestor Cortes also had a 13.1 scoreless inning streak in 2022).
- ✦ Was only the seventh pitcher in franchise history to toss at least 6.0 scoreless innings in each of his first two appearances of a season, joining Ray Caldwell (first 3G in 1914), Mel Stottlemyre (first 2G in 1967), Bob Turley (first 2G in 1958), Allie Reynolds (first 2G in 1947), Bob Shawkey (first 2G in 1922) and Slow Joe Doyle (first 2G in 1906)...was the 10th pitcher in franchise history to toss at least 6.0 scoreless innings in each of his first two starts of a season (also George Mogridge's first three starts in 1916, Freddy Garcia's first two starts in 2011 and Lew Brockett's first two starts in 1909).
- ✦ Made his fourth career Opening Day start and first as a Yankee in the club's 7-0 win on 3/25 at San Francisco...earned the win after tossing 6.1 scoreless innings (2H, 1BB, 4K, 1HP)...**was the first Yankees Opening Day starter to throw at least 6.1 scoreless innings since David Cone in 1996** (also OR in 7.0IP)...**was only the fifth Yankees starter in the Divisional Era (since 1969) to do so**, joining Cone, Rick Rhoden (SHO in 1988), Ron Guidry (OR in 9.0IP in 1980) and Catfish Hunter (OR in 7.0IP in 1977)...**was only the fourth pitcher in franchise history to toss more than 6.0 scoreless innings and allow 2H-or-fewer on Opening Day**, joining David Cone (2H and OR in 7.0IP in 1996), Ron Guidry (2H and OR in 9.0IP in 1980) and Mel Stottlemyre (2H in SHO in 1967)...retired his final 8BF, 15 of his last 16BF and 18 of his final 20BF.
- ✦ Tossed 8.0 scoreless innings and earned the win on 4/22 at Boston (3H, 2BB, 9K)...marked his longest scoreless start as a Yankee and his longest since 9/27/24 vs. Kansas City with Atlanta (8.2IP)...marked the longest scoreless start by a Yankee since Carlos Rodón tossed 8.0 scoreless innings on 7/11/25 vs. Chicago-NL...his 8.0IP matched his season high (also 8.0IP on 4/11 at Tampa Bay) and his 9K marked a season high...retired his final 14BF.

ON A ROLL: Has gone 10-1 with a 1.83 ERA (93.2IP, 19ER) over his last 14 starts (since 8/22/25)...has allowed 1R-or-fewer in nine of those 14 starts...has tossed at least 6.0IP in 12 of those 14 starts and at least 7.0IP in eight of those starts.
 ✦ Has held opponents to a .183/.247/.235 (60-for-328) slash line over his last 14 starts.

VS. BALTIMORE: Has gone 2-2 with one shutout, a 3.27 ERA (33.0IP, 12ER) and 34K in five career starts vs. the Orioles...went 1-0 with a 2.08 ERA (13.0IP, 3ER) and 20K in two starts against Baltimore last season...last faced the Orioles on 9/18/25 at Camden Yards and earned the win after recording a career-high-tying 13K over 7.0 scoreless innings (3H, 1BB)...also faced Baltimore on 6/20/25 at Yankee Stadium and did not record a decision in the Yankees' 5-3 loss (6.0IP, 7H, 3R/ER, 0BB, 7K, 0HR, 2HP)...allowed a two-run single to Gary Sánchez in the first inning and an RBI single to Coby Mayo in the sixth inning.
