**IN THE TRAINER'S ROOM:** **OF Akil Baddoo** (left quad), **LHP Jared Koenig** (left elbow), **RHP Quinn Priester** (right thoracic outlet), **RHP Brandon Woodruff** (right shoulder), **OF Christian Yelich** (left groin), **LHP Rob Zastryzny** (left shoulder) and **LHP Angel Zerpa** (left forearm) are on the injured list....Baddoo and Zastryzny are on the 60-day IL.

**MANAGER:** **Pat Murphy** (357g, 208-149, .583) is in his third season as Brewers manager....he was voted NL Manager of the Year in 2024 and 2025....he is one of four managers ever to win Manager of the Year in consecutive seasons, joining the Braves' Bobby Cox (2004-05), Rays' Kevin Cash (2020-21) and Guardians' Stephen Vogt (2024-25)....Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell....he signed a multi-year contract extension on 2/20/26.

**COACHES:** Returning from the 2025 staff is offense & strategy coordinator **Jason Lane** (11th season/1st in current role), pitching coordinator **Jim Henderson** (5th season/1st in current role), field coordinator **Néstor Corredor** (4th season/3rd in current role), pitching coach **Chris Hook** (8th season), bullpen coach **Charlie Greene** (3rd season), lead hitting coach **Eric Theisen** (2nd season/1st in current role) and third base coach **Matt Erickson** (3rd season/1st in current role)....assistant pitching coach **Juan Sandoval**, hitting coach **Guillermo Martinez**, hitting coach **Daniel Vogelbach** and first base coach **Spencer Allen** are all in their first seasons on the coaching staff.

**IN THE STANDINGS (39 days):** The team has spent the following number of days alone or tied at each spot in the NL Central standings: **FIRST:** 16, **SECOND:** 1, **THIRD:** 5, **FOURTH:** 11, **FIFTH:** 6....the Brewers are currently in fourth place, trailing the first-place Cubs by 3.5 games and the second-place Reds and Cardinals by 1.5 games....are ahead of the fifth-place Pirates by percentage points.

**LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE:** The Brewers have made 11 replay challenges this season, going 9-2....their last challenge (won) came on 4/29 vs. Arizona as a safe call at second base involving Nolan Arenado was overturned.

**BREWING SUCCESS:** The Brewers have qualified for the postseason seven times in the last eight seasons and three seasons in a row....the team was just two games away from making the postseason in nine straight seasons (2017-25), missing out in both 2017 and 2022 by a single game....Milwaukee has won the NL Central in four of the last five seasons and three seasons in a row.

**BREWING CONSISTENCY:** The Brewers, Astros and Dodgers are the only Major League teams with 86+ wins in each of the last eight full seasons (2017-25)....this does not include the shortened 2020 season....the Brewers have 781 wins since 2017, which ranks fourth in the majors behind the Dodgers (874), Astros (820) and Yankees (811).

**PATRICK AT A GLANCE:** Chad Patrick, 27, will be making his seventh appearance and fifth start of the season....Patrick last pitched last Tuesday in a start vs. Arizona and earned a 13-2 win (5ip, 1h, 2r, 2er, 5bb, 5k, 98 pitches)....the team is 4-0 in his starts....he has 1 quality start....opponents are batting .222 (22-for-99, 2hr)....Patrick was acquired from Oakland on 11/15/23 for INF Abraham Toro....he was selected by Arizona in the fourth round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of Purdue University Northwest....he was traded by Arizona to Oakland on 7/31/23 in exchange for INF Jace Peterson, who is now a consultant to player development with the Brewers.

**LAST SEASON:** Patrick went 3-8 with a 3.53 ERA in 27 games/23 starts during his first Major League season....he had four stints with the team (Opening Day-7/5, 8/18-8/19, 8/24 and 9/9-end of season)....the team went 8-14 in his starts....he had 5 quality starts....opponents batted .248 (113-for-455, 13hr)....he was among 2025 National League rookie leaders in starts (1st), strikeouts (1st, 127) and innings pitched (2nd, 119.2).

**CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD:** Is 3-4 with a 2.71 ERA in 19 games/15 starts (86.1ip, 26er)....is 1-0 with a 1.89 ERA in 4 games/3 starts this season (19ip, 4er).

**CAREER ON THE ROAD:** Is 2-5 with a 4.26 ERA in 14 games/12 starts (61.1ip, 29er)....is 1-1 with a 4.00 ERA in 2 games/1 start this season (9ip, 4er).
