METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Marlins, 5-1, yesterday in Miami...New York won its first series of the season...Today, the Mets continue their first road trip of the year, a seven-game trip to Miami (3-1) and Milwaukee (three games)...Following this series, the Mets head to New York...The team will host the Marlins (three games) and Padres (three games).

THREE'S COMPANY: The Mets pitching staff has allowed three or fewer runs in each of their first four games of the season for the first time since 2007, when they allowed three total runs through their first four contests...The Mets have allowed seven runs through their first four games...The last time New York allowed seven or fewer runs through their first four games of the year was in 2016 (also: seven runs).

THE PEN IS MIGHTIER: In four games this year, the Mets bullpen has allowed one run in 13.2 innings, good for a 0.66 ERA...They have allowed eight hits, striking out 15 and walking three...The team's 0.66 ERA leads the major leagues...Last year, the Mets bullpen posted a 3.50 ERA, which ranked third in the National League.

C IS FOR COOKIE: Carlos Carrasco is set to make his season debut today in Milwaukee...In 29 starts last year, Carrasco went 15-7 with a 3.97 ERA (67 ER/152.0 IP) with 41 walks and 152 strikeouts...He is set to make his sixth career start against the Crew and is 2-1 with a 3.60 ERA (12 ER/30.0 IP) with 11 walks and 38 strikeouts in his five previous starts...Today will mark his fourth career start in Milwaukee where he is 1-1 with a 5.29 ERA (10 ER/17.0 IP) with seven walks and 21 punchouts.

ALL IN THE FAMILY: The Mets play their lone series at American Family Field this year...In 28 career games at the yard, Tommy Pham is a .317/.375/.663 hitter with 20 runs, seven doubles, two triple, eight home runs, 19 RBI and nine walks...Starling Marte has hit .304/.337/.510 with 27 runs, 12 doubles, two triple, eight home runs, 25 RBI and 6 walks in 51 career games in MKE...Francisco Lindor has hit .293/.326/.756 with nine runs, two doubles, one triple, five home runs and 10 RBI...Daniel Vogelbach, who played for Milwaukee, has hit 11 home runs in 161 games at the ballpark, and has posted a .503 SLG at the yard.

KODAI, THE FRIENDLY GHOST: Yesterday, Kodai Senga became the 64th pitcher whose major league debut came in a start for the Mets... He joined Masato Yoshii as the only two Japanese-born pitchers to make his MLB debut in a start for the Mets...Including Senga, 16 Mets have started and earned a win in their major league debut (eight Mets have won in relief in their MLB debut).

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: The Mets have recorded eight doubles this season which is tied for second in the national league...The team's 17 runs are third in the Senior Circuit.

DAY MAN!: The Mets are 3-0 in day games this year...In 2022, the Mets went 39-19 in day games...The team's .672 winning percentage in the sunlight was the second-best in the National League and third-best in the majors...The Mets posted a 3.16 ERA with 150 walks and 564 strikeouts in the daytime last year...Their 3.16 ERA in the daytime was third in the majors and second in the NL.

BREWERS-METS NOTES: The Mets earned a series win over the Brewers from September 19-21, 2022, clinching a spot in the playoff.

THE GAME OF RISP: Over the first four games, New York's pitching has held their opponents to four hits in 27 at bats with runners in scoring position...That equates to a .148 opponent average in RISP situations...The team's .148 opponents average is fourth in the majors and third in the NL...Last season, the Mets ranked fourth in the majors and second in the NL with a .228 opponent average with runners in scoring position.

ALL YOUR BASE ARE BELONG TO US: The Mets have stolen four bases this season...New York has a stolen base in each of its first four games for the first time since the 1993 season...The team's four steals places them tied for the National League lead and tied for sixth in the majors...In 2022, the Mets stole a total of 58 bases, which placed them 23rd in the majors and 12th in the majors.

OMAR'S COMING YO!: In three games with the Mets, Omar Narváez is 3-7 with a run, two RBI and a walk...In December, the Mets signed catcher Narváez to a one-year contract with a player option for 2024... The backstop played 247 games for the Brewers from 2020-22.

CANHA GET AN AMEN?: Mark Canha went 0-6 with a walk and was hit by pitch in his first two games...Over the last two contests, Canha is 4-7 with three runs, a double, a home run, two RBI and two walks... He is in his second year with the Mets and has hit .267/.370/.408 with 74 runs, 25 doubles, 14 home runs, 63 RBI and 51 walks in 144 games with the club.

ONLY A FEW CAN COM-PETE: Pete Alonso set a franchise single-season RBI record with 131 last year...His 131 RBI were tied for the major league lead and led the National League...Only once before in franchise history has a Met finished the season with the most or tied for the most RBI...Howard Johnson recorded a career-best 117 RBI in 1991 to lead the National League...He had 27 game-winning RBI season, the most since the stat was first tracked in 1974...His 35 go-ahead RBI were tied for the second-most in a single season in Mets history...Keith Hernandez had 36 go-ahead RBI in 1985.

HITTING THE ROAD: New York is 3-1 on the road his year...The team finished the 2022 season going 47-34 on the road...Their .580 road winning percentage placed them third in the majors and second in the NL...It was tied for the fourth-best road record in team history and the highest road-winning percentage since 2007...Overall, they hit .265/.334/.424 away from Citi Field...Their .265 road average was second in the majors and the best in the NL, while their .334 OBP led The Show...They ranked fourth in MLB and second in the Senior Circuit with a .424 SLG...Brandon Nimmo (.406), Jeff McNeil (.399) and Mark Canha (.378) ranked three through five in road OBP in the National League.

CARRASCO NEWS & NOTES

SPRING IN HIS STEP: Made four starts in spring exhibition play, three of which were at home...Posted a 4.15 ERA (6 ER/13.0 IP) with 14 strikeouts over those four starts...Carrasco's best appearance of Spring Training was his last on March 17 against the Marlins, in which he tallied seven punchouts in his lone Grapefruit League win...Ended exhibition play with a 1.08 WHIP and a .240 opponent's batting average.

VS. MILWAUKEE: Owns a 2-1 record with a 3.60 ERA (12 ER/30.0 IP) in five career against the Brewers...Has a 5.29 ERA (10/17.0 IP) in three career starts at American Family Field compared to a 1.60 ERA (2 ER/13.0 IP) in two home starts against Milwaukee...Carrasco's last outing against Milwaukee came on September 20, 2022 at American Family Field...Pitched 4.0 innings surrendering three runs on five hits and two walks while also tallying four strikeouts in a 7-5 Mets victory.

2022 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Recorded a 3.97 ERA (67 ER/152.0 IP) in his first full season with the Mets...Ended the season ranked tied fifth in the National League in wins with 15 and 11th in win percentage with .628...According to Baseball Savant, excelled in chase rate in the 94th percentile for MLB...Locked it down in July with a 0.90 ERA (3 ER/30.0 IP) in five starts that month, tallying three wins and 27 strikeouts...The slider and changeup were effective pitches for Carrasco in 2022, with a 35.5 and 31.6 whiff percentage and 26.2 and 21.8 put away percentage, respectively.

CLUTCH COOKIE: Did not allow a run in 22.2 straight innings from July 14-August 4, surpassing his previous career-long scoreless streak of 22.0 innings from July 30-August 11, 2015...He threw three straight scoreless starts for the first time in his career from July 14-30...He had three scoreless innings streaks of at least 10.0 innings in a single season for the first time since 2018 (also, 12.2 innings from April 27-May 10 & 10.2 innings from April 10-21)...Allowed three earned runs or fewer in a career-high 12 consecutive starts from July 3-September 20, posting a 2.42 ERA (17 earned runs/63.1 innings) in that span...Marked his best ERA in a 12-start span since July 27-September 30, 2018 (2.30 ERA).

WINNER, WINNER: Carrasco earned the 100th win of his career on July 30 at Miami after tossing 7.2 scoreless innings with four hits, two walks and seven strikeouts...His 15 wins were tied for the eighth-most in the majors...He was the first Met to have a 15-win season since Jacob deGrom in 2017...Joined Justin Verlander, Gerrit Cole, Max Scherzer and Zack Greinke as the only pitchers with three or more 15+ win seasons since 2017...Won six straight decisions from May 3 (G2)-June 6, matching his single-season career-high from the end of the 2017 season...Was the first Mets starter to win at least six straight decisions in a single season since Zack Wheeler won seven from July 14-August 25, 2017.

MILESTONES & MORE: Heading into the 2023 campaign, Carrasco is nearing 1500.0 career innings with 1448.0...Is also on the precipice of 300 games and 250 starts with 283 and 236, respectively. Last season, Carrasco made 29 starts last year, his most in a single season since making 30 starts in 2018...Carrasco is one of 14 hurlers with at least five seasons of 150+ strikeouts since 2015.

VENEZUELAN BORN: Carrasco ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher...Has 1,507 career strikeouts, the second-most among active pitchers who have never been selected to an All-Star game...Became the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone and the fifth-fastest to accomplish the feat, doing so in his 274th career game...Is one of 16 active pitchers with 100 career victories...Became one of nine Venezuelan-born pitchers to eclipse 1,400.0 career innings pitched on July 24 vs. San Diego.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP MAX SCHERZER (1-0, 4.50)

LAST TIME OUT: Earned the win in his seventh career Opening Day start on March 30 at Miami...Allowed three runs over 6.0 innings on four hits, two walks and six strikeouts...He threw 91 pitches, 63 of which were strikes.

DOUBLE THE FUN: Scherzer ranks tied for third all-time with 110 double-digit strikeout games in his career, two more than Pedro Martinez...His next 10+ K game will break a tie with Roger Clemens, who also had 110 in his career...He'll then need over 100 more to catch the top two: Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212).
