RAY REPORT—The Rays continue a six-game, seven-day road trip against the Red Sox (2-1) and Blue Jays (1-0, two to play) tonight at Rogers Centre...have won nine of 10, 15 of 17, and 25 of their last 33 games...have won 11 of their last 15 road games since a 2-5 start...have won five straight and seven of their last nine series...are a season-high 14 games over .500...since April 4, own the majors' best record (25-8) and ERA (3.00)...own MLB's second-best record overall behind the Braves (28-13)...marks their first time leading the AL after calendar flips to May since July 18, 2023 (60-38)...are tied for their third-best 40-game start in franchise history (see table on the right)...have the second-easiest remaining schedule in MLB by opponent winning pct. (.476) behind the Rangers (470)...including this series, only three of their 18 sets before the All-Star break will come against clubs that currently have winning records: May 22-24 at NYY, June 15-17 at LAD, and July 6-9 vs. NYY...have led the AL East for three straight days...have spent nine days atop the division, 25 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth.

- * The Rays jumped out to a 5-0 lead in the 2nd frame of last night's 8-5, series-opening win, their most runs in the first two innings since Sept. 3, 2025 vs. SEA (8)...they improved to 10-4 in openers with their sixth straight win, matching the Yankees (10-4) for the best mark in the majors.
- * A pair of **Andrés Giménez** homers ended the Rays club-record streak of 16 straight games yielding 3 ER or fewer—in the divisional era (since 1969), only the 2010 Giants (18G: Sept. 5-24) and 1981 Yankees (18G: Aug. 22-Sept. 1 [G1]) have had longer streaks.
- * The Rays 15-2 run marks their best 17-game stretch since May 14-June 1, 2021 (15-2)...it has boosted their postseason odds from 28.5 pct. (April 21) to 81.2 pct. entering play today (FanGraphs).
- * Tampa Bay has won 10 straight and 20 of the last 21 games in which it scored four runs or more...its AL-best 21-4 (.40) record when plating four or more ranks fourth in MLB.
- * The Rays have scored first 11 times in 17 games during their 15-2 stretch...their 18-3 (.857) record when plating the opening run leads the majors.
- * The Rays are a majors-best 10-2 vs. left-handed starting pitchers...this marks the fifth time in six games and seventh time in 11 games during May they have been opposed by a southpaw starter.
- * **Shane McClanahan** has won his last three starts and carries a career-best 16.2 scoreless inning streak into tonight's contest, tied for the majors' third-longest active streak behind ATL **Raisel Iglesias** (23.1) and PHI **Cristopher Sánchez** (20.2)...he will attempt to match **Drew Rasmussen's** franchise record (May 17-June 3, 2025) with a fourth straight scoreless start of 5.0 IP or more.

WHAT'S AT STAKE—With a win tonight, the Rays would:

- * Claim six straight series victories for the sixth time, first since Aug. 11-30, 2023 (6).
- * Record their eighth consecutive series win over AL opponents, tying the third-longest streak in franchise history (also: Aug. 20-Sept. 19, 2018), trailing only streaks of 14 series (June 24-Aug. 25, 2013) and 10 series (July 28-Aug. 31, 2008).
- * Join the 2018 Diamondbacks (9) and 2001 Mariners (9) as the only clubs since 2000 to win their first eight intraleague series to open a season (Stats Perform).
- * Improve to a season-high 15 games over .500 on May 12, their third-earliest date to reach the mark behind the 2023 (18-3 on April 22) and 2010 (22-7 on May 7) clubs.
- * Earn their fifth series victory in their last six sets at Rogers Centre (Sept. 29, 2023-pres.).
- * Become the third AL East team to win 10 of their first 11 games vs. divisional opponents since the division was formed in 1969, joining Cleveland in 1988 and Milwaukee in 1987...become the first team in any division to turn the trick since the 2013 Braves started 10-1 against the NL East (Elias).

ALL-AMERICAN—The Rays (19-3) are the ninth team in the modern era (since 1900) to win 19 of their first 22 intraleague games, joining the 1987 Brewers (19-3), 1984 Tigers (19-3), 1981 Athletics (19-3), 1955 Brooklyn Dodgers (20-2), 1946 Red Sox (19-3), 1918 New York Giants (19-3), 1911 Tigers (20-2), and 1902 Pirates (19-3)...only five of those eight other teams won 20 of their first 23 games vs. their own league: the 1987 Brewers (20-3), 1981 Athletics (20-3), 1955 Dodgers (21-2), 1946 Red Sox (20-3), and 1911 Tigers (21-2)...the Rays have won all seven series vs. AL foes and lost five of six interleague sets...they are in the midst of 10 consecutive games vs. AL East teams, winning six of seven thus far, and 19 in 22 games from May 4-27...at 9-1, they are the first AL East club to win nine of their first 10 divisional games since the 1992 Blue Jays (9-1), per MLB Network...it marks the best intradivision record in MLB, ahead of the Braves (10-3).

- * **Chandler Simpson** is 15-for-36 (.417) vs. AL East opponents and 34-for-120 (.283) against all other clubs...min. 35 AB, the only players with better averages against their own division are ATH **Carlos Cortes** (.474), LAD **Max Muncy** (.429), and ATL **Michael Harris II** (.429).

ARANDA'S WORLD—**Jonathan Aranda** is 4-for-8 with 1 HR and 3 RBI during a three-game hitting streak and has batted .349 (22-for-63) with 1 2B, 5 HR, 16 RBI, and a 1.043 OPS across his last 19 games dating back to April 20, the AL's fifth-best OPS in that timeframe...he paces the AL with 32 RBI, marking the fourth-latest into a season a Rays hitter has led the Junior Circuit in RBI, earlier than only **Evan Longoria** in 2010 (May 22) and 2009 (June 9) and **Austin Meadows** in 2021 (June 10)...it marks the sixth-most RBI by a Ray at the quarter pole and the most since Longoria in 2010 (37).

- * His .469 (15-for-32) average in May is the best in the AL...he is 12-for-20 (.600) vs. RHP this month.

SMALL BALL—The Rays are fourth in the AL with 4.48 runs per game despite ranking 25th in the majors in home runs (33), 29th in doubles (47), and 30th in extra-base hits (87), barrel rate (4.2%), and average exit velocity (87.5 mph)...they lead MLB with 256 singles, their most through 40 games since 2005 (272)...their majors-most 17 sacrifice hits are their most at the quarter pole in team history, surpassing 1998 (16), and put them one pace for 68, which would be the most by an AL team since the 1993 Red Sox (80)...Rays batters also sit atop the majors in infield hits (62, per Baseball-Reference) and whiff rate (19.4%) while ranking highly in strikeout rate (2nd, 18.6%), stolen bases (3rd, 42), bunt hits (T3rd, 10), RISP average (4th, .283), triples (T4th, 7), and on-base pct. (8th, .328).

- * The Rays are tied for second in the majors with nine pinch-hit RBI and rank fifth with a .289 (11-for-38) average by pinch hitters...their 38 pinch-hit at-bats are tied for sixth most in MLB.
- * Tampa Bay holds the majors' best record in one-run games (8-1), winning each of its last eight, tying the longest streak in club history (3x, also: May 19-June 18, 2008 & July 12-Aug. 13, 2003)...the club's 12-4 mark in games decided by two runs or fewer is second in MLB behind Cincinnati (13-4).
- * The Rays are tied for the MLB lead in last at-bat wins (7) and wins without homering (10) and are tied for second with six victories in games they scored three runs or fewer.
- * According to FanGraphs, the Rays .297 average in high-leverage situations is second-best in the majors to the Braves (.328)...**Jonathan Aranda** is 5-for-12 (.417) in high leverage.
- * Rays batters have recorded 3 XBH or fewer in 14 straight games, tied for the seventh-longest streak in franchise history, but have gone 12-2 in that span...it marks their second-longest streak since 2015, trailing a 15-game stretch from April 25-May 11, 2025—they were 7-8 in those games.

THE RAY WAY—The Rays staff leads the majors in opp. on-base pct. (.287), ranks third in WHIP (1.16), and is fourth in opp. OPS (.650)...they have posted a top-six WHIP in the majors in each of the last nine seasons (2017-25)...MLB's longest active streak...the Rays have permitted three runs or fewer 21 times (T5th most in MLB), going 19-2 in those games, compared to an 8-11 mark when allowing four runs or more...they have held opponents to two runs or fewer 16 times (T4th) and one or zero runs 11 times (T1st).

- * The rotation paces the majors in WHIP (1.08) and opp. on-base pct. (.271) while ranking third in ERA (3.15) behind the Braves (3.03) and Yankees (3.06)...this includes an MLB-best 1.86 ERA (9.2 OIP, 19.9R) in their last 17 outings (April 22-pres.)—the Braves (3.09) have next closest ERA in that span.
- * The Rays bullpen has allowed three runs in its last 10.2 IP, four in its last 33.0 IP, and five in its last 47.1 IP...the pen's 1.20 ERA (60 OIP, 8ER) over the last 17 games leads the majors (April 22-pres.)...they entered that stretch with a 5.61 ERA (96.1 IP, 60ER), 27th in MLB (Opening Day-April 21).

O. CANADA—The Rays and Blue Jays continue a stretch of six meetings in a 10-day span (May 4-13) tonight...the Rays swept the Jays in three games from May 4-6 at Tropicana Field to complete a 6-0 homestand...they need to go 3-6 or better over the next nine matchups to clinch a season series win...the Rays have won their first four meetings with the Blue Jays for the second time, joining 2008 (4G)...their last longer streak vs. a single opponent was a 6-0 sweep of the White Sox in 2023, and their last longer streak against an AL East foe was 2021 vs. BAL (6G)...they have won eight straight season sets over Toronto since 2018, 10 in 11 seasons under **Kevin Cash** (since 2015), and 16 in 18 seasons since becoming the Rays in 2008...the eight-season streak is tied for the longest over a single opponent in franchise history, matching another eight-year run over the Angels (2016-24), and is tied for the fourth-longest active streak in the majors by one team over a single opponent, trailing ATL over MIA (11), CHC over PIT (11), and NYY over KC (10), according to Stats Perform.

- * **Junior Caminer** has hit safely in each of his 10 career games at Rogers Centre, going 14-for-42 (.333) with 3 HR and 10 RBI...it marks the fourth-longest career-opening streak by a Ray at the ballpark behind **Tommy Pham** (14G, 2018-19), **Rocco Baldelli** (11G, 2003-04), and **Damian Rolls** (11G, 2001-03)...Caminer recorded his first career home run (Oct. 1, 2023) and grand slam (May 13, 2025) in Toronto.
- * **Jonathan Aranda** has 23 RBI in his last 19 games vs. the Blue Jays (Oct. 1, 2023-pres.), batting .333 (23-for-69) with a 1.108 OPS in those games...min. 50 PA, the only player with a better OPS against the Jays in that span is HOU **Yordan Alvarez** (1.326)...10 of his 32 career homers have come vs. Toronto.

TONIGHT'S START—Shane McClanahan will toe the rubber for his eighth start of the season and fourth away from Tropicana Field...will be making his 82nd career start and 38th career road start tonight...missed the last two years after his second Tommy John surgery wiped out his 2024 season and nerve-related issues sidelined him for 2025...selected by the Rays in the Compensatory Round (31st overall) of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of South Florida.

- ✦ Has allowed no runs over his last three starts (April 25–pres.), tied for the second longest streak in franchise history by a traditional starter...he trails only **Drew Rasmussen** who did so in four straight starts in 2025 (May 17–June 3).
- ✦ McClanahan is one of five AL pitchers (min. 30.0IP) to hold opponents to a .190 batting average or lower (.183)...of the five, he is the only southpaw.

LAST TIME OUT—Tossed 5.2 scoreless frames with two hits, one walk, and four strikeouts on May 6 vs. TOR...his three baserunners allowed tied a career low (6x, last: July 17, 2023 at TEX)...marked the sixth time in his career he has won three consecutive starts (April 25–pres.) and the first time since June 5-16, 2023 (also 3G)...after allowing a 1st inning double to **Kazuma Okamoto**, he retired the next 13 batters and 16 of 17.

- ✦ He is one of five pitchers in the majors, and the only one in the AL, to throw 10.0 innings or more in May with no runs allowed.
- ✦ It marked the third time in his career he has had a sub-3.00 ERA through his first seven starts of a season and trails only the start to his 2023 season (2.03) and his 2022 season (2.52).
- ✦ After issuing 11 walks over this first three starts (March 31–April 14), he has permitted only three over his last four (April 19–pres.) with 21 strikeouts.

BLUEBIRDS—McClanahan will make his 10th career start against the Blue Jays tonight...he's 5-2 with a 2.16 ERA (50.0IP, 12ER) and 48 strikeouts across his nine previous outings against Toronto...he has recorded 5.0 innings or more while allowing one or zero earned runs in six of the nine starts.

- ✦ Tonight marks the fifth time he has faced the same club in back-to-back starts...he has done so on April 22-27, 2023 vs./at CWS; June 15-20, 2022 at/ vs. NYY; Sept. 2-8, 2021 vs./at BOS; and Aug. 19-27, 2021 vs./at BAL.
- ✦ McClanahan's five wins against the Blue Jays are tied for his second most against any opponent in his career with the Red Sox and behind the Orioles (6)...his 48 strikeouts vs. the Blue Jays ranks second behind the Orioles (57).
- ✦ Against AL East opponents, McClanahan owns a 17-7 career record with a 2.92 ERA (179.0IP, 58ER), 193 strikeouts, and a .224 (149-for-666) opp. average over 33 starts...among active AL southpaws, his 17 wins vs. AL East foes is tied for eighth and his strikeouts are 13th most.

ROAD WARRIOR—Through three road starts this season he has a 1-2 record with a 5.14 ERA (14.0IP, 8ER), 13 strikeouts, and a .218 (12-for-55) opp. average...eight of the 12 hits he has allowed on the road came in his last outing away from Tropicana Field on April 19 at PIT...at home this season he has posted a 0.87 ERA (20.2IP, 2ER) with a 0.87 WHIP and a .155 (11-for-71) opp. average.

FEELING SUPPORTED—McClanahan has received three runs of support or more in 41 of his 80 career appearances...in those 41 outings, he holds a 32-1 record, 2.72 ERA (231.1IP, 70ER), .213 (183-for-858) opp. average, 1.08 WHIP, and 255 strikeouts to 66 walks...in games where he receives three runs of support or more, the Rays are 37-4 and have won 17 of the last 18.

STRIKEOUT ARTIST—He has recorded four strikeouts or more in every start this campaign and is now four strikeouts behind **Matt Moore** (494SO) for ninth on the Rays all-time list and fourth among Tampa Bay southpaws.

- ✦ During his first three seasons (2021-23), McClanahan's 10.14 strikeouts per 9.0 IP ranked second among MLB left-handers (min. 400.0IP) behind **Blake Snell** (11.85)...under the same parameter, it was the second-highest mark by a southpaw through his first three major league campaigns, trailing SD/ PIT **Oliver Pérez** (10.34)...his 456 career strikeouts were sixth-most by a left-hander in franchise history and were the most by any Ray through his first three seasons, regardless of handedness, outpacing **James Shields** (448, 2006-08) despite McClanahan (404.2IP) throwing 150 fewer innings than Shields (554.2IP).
- ✦ Min. 1,000 BF, his 33.4 pct. whiff rate from 2021-23 ranked fourth in the majors behind ATL **Spencer Strider** (37.0%), SD **Blake Snell** (33.7%), and MIL **Corbin Burnes** (33.7%)...he led the majors with a 48.4 pct. whiff rate on his changeup in that span (min. 1,000 changeups thrown).
- ✦ Min. 400.0 IP, his 3.02 ERA (404.2IP, 136ER) from 2021-23 ranked second in the AL to LAA **Shohei Ohtani** (2.84) and was second among all left-handed pitchers in the majors to ATL **Max Fried** (2.71).

MLB CAREER RUNDOWN—In 2023, was the Rays Opening Day starter for the second straight year and started 21 games before Tommy John surgery ended his season...after his final start on Aug. 2 at NYY, led the AL in whiff rate (33.4%) while ranking highly in wins (T2nd, 11), opp. average (6th, .222), and ERA (8th, 3.29)...earned the win in each of his first five starts, matching **Matt Moore** (2013) for the longest streak to begin a season in Rays history and was the first Rays pitcher to win 11 of his first 12 decisions in a season...from Opening Day–June 16, went 11-1 with a major-league-best 2.12 ERA (89.1IP, 21ER), 15 points lower than the next closest pitcher (HOU **Framber Valdez** - 2.27)...marked the third-lowest ERA through a Rays pitcher's first 15 starts of a season behind himself in 2022 (1.77) and **Chris Archer** in 2015 (2.08)...was the Rays Roberto Clemente Award nominee.

- ✦ Named the Rays Don Zimmer MVP by the Tampa Bay chapter of the BBWAA and finished sixth in AL Cy Young voting in 2022 after leading the club in wins (12), innings (166.1), and strikeouts (194)...started on Opening Day, for the AL in the All-Star Game and in Game 1 of the Rays Wild Card Series at CLE...his 0.93 WHIP ranked second in the AL and was the lowest in Rays history, passing **Blake Snell** (0.97) in his 2018 Cy Young season.
