TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 3** (1-1) of a 3-game series vs **Mike Burkhardt's Cubs** and **Game 3** (1-1) of the Reds' longest road trip of the season, an 11-day, 9-game jaunt through the **NL Central Division** to **Wrigley Field** (1-1), **StL's Busch Stadium** (3g) and **Pit's PNC Park** (3g) highlighted by off days in **St. Louis** tomorrow and in **Pittsburgh** on Monday...is their longest road trip since **7/24-8/11, 2017**, when they went **3-7** over **11 days** at **Cle** (0-1), **NY** (0-2), **Mia** (1-3) and **Pit** (off day, 2-1)...on **9/17** will return to **Great American Ball Park** for their final homestand of the regular season (3g vs LAD, 3g vs Pit, 4g vs Wsh)...will finish the 2021 championship season on the road at Chi's **Guaranteed Rate Field** (3g) and **Pit's PNC Park** (off day, 3g).

SERIES NOTES: The Reds are **11-7 vs Cubs** this season, including a **Fourth of July** weekend sweep at **Great American Ball Park**...was the Reds' first **series sweep** of the Cubs (3g) since a **4-game sweep** from **6/21-6/24, 2018**, also at **GABP**...against the Cubs, **Joey Votto** ranks second among all active players with **45 HR** and third with **139 RBI**, trailing only **Albert Pujols** (57hr, 146rbi) and **Ryan Braun** (141rbi)...his **45 HR** are the second-most by a Reds batter vs the Cubs (**Frank Robinson**, 53).

THE FRIENDLY CONFINES: The Reds are **5-4 at Wrigley Field** this season...since a 4-1 Reds win on **6/25/14** and beginning **9/15/14**, the Cubs have won **29** of the **last 36 night games** vs the Reds at **The Friendly Confines**...in the Reds' 3-1 series win here in July, **Joey Votto** produced **6 HR** and **10 RBI**...the **6 HR** tied the record for most homers in a series by a visiting player at **Wrigley**, joining by **Jose Abreu** (3-game series in 2020) and **Matt Carpenter** (5-game series in 2018)...his **10 RBI** fell 3 shy of the ballpark series record for a visiting player (**George Kelley**, 1924 Giants, 4g)...**Nick Castellanos'** 1.156 career OPS at **Wrigley Field** (est. 1914) is the highest in the ballpark's history (minimum 100pa, 39g, 60-161, .373, 22 2b, 1 3b, 12hr, 36rbi, .410obp, .745slg)...**Joey Votto's 129 career hits** at Wrigley are the most by any active opposing player (129-404, .319, 40 2b, 2 3b, 22hr, 68rbi, .424obp, .592slg, 1.015ops).

CARDINALS UP NEXT: The Redlegs are **9-7 vs StL** this season, including a **6-game winning streak** from 6/3-7/24...was their longest winning streak vs the Cardinals since a 6-game winning streak from **5/5-5/14, 2003**...the Reds went **7-7-3** in their previous **17 series vs StL**, including **3-2 in series this season**...from **6/3-6/7**, the Reds earned their first **4-game sweep in St. Louis** since **5/4-5/7, 1990**...**Joey Votto** has **207 apps** and **221 career hits** vs StL, both the most among active players (221-722, .306)...in the live ball era, his **career .425 OBP vs StL** ranks ranks second among all players with at least 500 plate apps (**Lefty O'Doul** .477, **Ralph Kiner** .424).

ROOKIE OF THE YEAR: **2B Jonathan India** is trying to become only the third rookie in Major League history to lead his league in on-base percentage (Cle's **Joe Jackson**, .468 in 1911 & Cin's **Cuckoo Christensen**, .426 in 1926)...**India** ranks eighth in the National League in **on-base percentage** (.379; Juan Soto 1st, .449)...**In the first inning**, he ranks third in the Major Leagues in **on-base percentage** (.465) while ranking fourth in the National League in **batting average** (.357)...**beginning 5/21** ranks fourth in the Major Leagues in **on-base percentage** (.399)...leads all Major League rookies in **on-base percentage**, **doubles** (tied) and **walks**...also leads all National League rookies in **RBI**, **hits** (tied), **extra-base hits**, **total bases**, and **runs scored**...**India** is trying to become the eighth Reds player and second Reds second baseman to win the BBWAA's **Rookie of the Year Award** (LF **Frank Robinson** 1956, **2B Pete Rose** 1963, **3B Tommy Helms** 1966, **C Johnny Bench** 1968, **RHP Pat Zachry** 1976, **3B Chris Sabo** 1988, **RHP Scott Williamson** 1999).

CATCH YOU LATER: Reds catchers **Tucker Barnhart** and **Tyler Stephenson** combined have committed just **2 errors**, both on **catcher's interference** on **Barnhart** (8/20 vs Mia, 8/28 at Mia), in **1,397 total chances** and **1,241.2 innings caught**...offensively, they combine to lead the Major Leagues at that position in **hitting** (.289), **hits** (146) and **doubles** (35) while ranking fourth in the majors in **on-base percentage** (.357) and eighth in **slugging percentage** (.436)...only twice **since 1882** have the Reds finished a season using only **2 catchers**, in **1959** (**Ed Bailey**, **Dutch Dotterer**) and **1979** (**Johnny Bench**, **Vic Correll**).

TOP OF THE ORDER: Reds batters in the **top 3 spots** in the starting lineup combine to lead the Major Leagues in **hitting** (.292), **hits** (498), **doubles** (117), **extra-base hits** (208) and **total bases** (874) while leading the National League and ranking second in the majors in **on-base percentage** (.368) and **slugging percentage** (.518)...are **24-12** (.667) when **Jonathan India**, **Jesse Winker** and **Nick Castellanos** hit first, second and third, respectively, in the starting lineup...that trio last started together in that order on **8/15 at Phi**.

DOT, DOT, DOT...: The **Brewers' Magic Number** to clinch the **NL Central** is **12**...the Reds are **21-17 (.553) in 1-run games**...haven't had a winning record in 1-run games since 2013 (.551, 27-22)...lead the National League lead and rank T3rd in the Major Leagues with **36 come-from-behind wins** (TB 43, Bos 39, NYY 36)...are **10-8 (.556) after off days**...the Reds went **20-19-7** in their previous **46 series**, including **10-10-4 at GABP** and **10-9-3 on the road**...the Reds are **eighth in Baseball America's Mid-Season Organization Talent Rankings**, a leap up from **19th** at the season's start.

RED HOTS

- Tonight is making his fourth start of the season vs the Cubs and his third appearance at Wrigley Field, where he made his Major League debut.
- Wasn't promoted until 5/28 but still leads National League rookies in wins (9)...also ranks among the NL rookie leaders in ERA (3rd), strikeouts (6th), starts (5th), inning pitched (4th), opponents' batting average (5th, .254) and WHIP (5th, 1.33).
- Received votes for National League Rookie of the Month for August (6gs, 4-2, 2.80)...Cubs 1B Frank Schwindel (26g, .344, 6hr, 18rbi) won the August award.
- His streak of 6 consecutive quality starts from 7/27-8/22 was the longest by a Reds pitcher since Sonny Gray did it from 8/20-9/17, 2019 and the longest by a Reds rookie since Raisel Iglesias had 7 straight QS from 8/1-9/2, 2015...Dan Straily (7/2-8/7, 2016) was the last Reds pitcher to produce 7 consecutive quality starts.
- From 7/27-8/12 won 4 consecutive starts (4-0, 1.78), the longest streak by a Reds rookie since RHP Robert Stephenson won 4 straight starts from 8/19-9/5, 2017.
- His 5-game winning streak from 7/5-8/12 was the longest by a Reds rookie since Logan Ondrusek went 5-0 from 7/23-10/2, 2010 and the longest by a Reds rookie starting pitcher since Mike Leake did it from 4/22-6/5, 2010.
- On 5/28 was promoted from Class AAA Louisville to start at Wrigley Field in his Major League debut...in that 1-0 loss, allowed only a solo HR to David Bote leading off the top of the fifth inning...first career strikeout victim was Willson Contreras, his 14th batter...gametime temperature was 50 degrees with a wind chill of 45 degrees and the wind blowing in at 9 miles per hour.
- Until his 5/28 promotion spent the minor league season at Louisville, where he went 2-0, 2.65 in 3 starts (17ip, 9h, 5er, 7bb, 21k, 3hr, .153oba, 0.94whip).
