SNAKEBITES

THE NL CHAMPS: Last season, the D-backs captured their | RUNS IN BUNCHES: The D-backs' 12 innings with 4+ runs second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23).

LAST GAME: The D-backs dropped the series with a 5-1 loss @ Cardinals in the rubber match on Wednesday.

- ♦ Jordan Montgomery, in his second start as a D-back, opened with 5.0 scoreless frames and finished with a quality start (7.0 IP, 6 H, 3 R-2 ER, 1 BB, 4 K).
- ◆ Pavin Smith had a single and a walk in the top spot.
- **◆ Jake McCarthy** had 2 singles.
- ◆ Joc Pederson had a single and hit-by-pitch.

VS. MARINERS: The D-backs are in Seattle for the sixth time (also: 1999, 2001, '09, '15, '21).

♦ Are 5-1 in last 6 games @ Mariners.

GOOD MEMORIES: D-backs' 2023 NL All-Stars Zac Gallen, Corbin Carroll and Lourdes Gurriel Jr. (minus fellow All-Star **Geraldo Perdomo**) return to Seattle for the first time since last summer's All-Star Game.

- Gallen's T-Mobile Park debut was as the NL's starting pitcher (1.0 IP, 1 H, 0 R-0 ER, 0 BB, 1 K).
- Carroll was the NL's fan-elected starting left fielder (0-for-2) at the stadium he grew up visiting as a Seattle native.
- Gurriel was a defensive replacement in left field for Carroll and went 1-for-2 with a seventh-inning single.
- ♦ At the 2001 All-Star Game in Seattle, the D-backs had a trio of All-Stars with two starters, Randy Johnson (2.0 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 0 BB, 3 K) and Home-Run-Derby-Champ Luis Gonzalez (CF, 1-for-2), along with Curt Schilling (DNP).

NO. 7 BACK HOME: Corbin Carroll returns home for the first time in the regular season...the 2019 graduate of Lakeside School was the Gatorade Washington Player of the Year as a senior (.540 AVG, 9 HR, 26 RBI).

• His first baseball memory is being a young boy sitting in the upper deck on the first base side at then-Safeco Field watching Ichiro Suzuki play right field...before the 2019 draft, the Mariners arranged a meeting between Carroll and Ichiro...Carroll took away an important lesson from his lifelong idol: "Be consistent in your routine."

TIES TO THE EMERALD CITY: The D-backs have a handful of ties to the Seattle Mariners:

- Ketel Marte played his first 2 seasons for the Mariners in 2015-16 before being acquired by the D-backs.
- **Eugenio Suárez** played for the Mariners in 2022-23.
- Ryan Thompson grew up in Turner, Oregon, roughly 4 hours south of Seattle, and as a kid, his dad would take him on an annual trip to a Mariners home series (Media Guide pg. 98).

WINS BY 13+ RUNS: The D-backs have set a franchise record with 3 wins by 13+ runs (thru just 26 games)...the 3 wins by 13+ runs also lead the Majors (no other team has 1 such game)...the most wins by 13+ runs in a season since 1998 are the 1999 Phillies' 6 wins (5 such wins has happened 3 times, 4 such wins 10 times and 3 such wins 32 times) [source: STATS LLC].

are tied for the most in the Majors with the Cubs and Reds [source: STATS LLC].

LAST 12 STARTS: D-backs starting pitchers, over their last 12 games (6-6) since April 13, are 5-3 with a 3.62 ERA and opponent .250 AVG/.703 OPS...their 7 quality starts during that span are tied for fourth in the Majors with the Twins, behind 9 for the Mariners and 8 for the Tigers and Phillies.

STOP THE RUNNING GAME: D-back backstops 5 stolen bases allowed and 10 attempts are the fewest in the Majors.

GOLDEN GABI: Gabriel Moreno's 57.1 caught-stealing pct. (4-for-7) is second in the Majors behind Christian Bethancourt/MIA (60.0, 3-for-5).

• Gabriel Moreno leads active catchers with a 40.7 caught-stealing pct. (33-for-81) while teammate **Tucker Barnhart** is 12th with a 30.8 caught-stealing pct. (171-for-556).

MARTE AMONG NL LEADERS: Ketel Marte, among NL leaders, is tied for third with 13 extra-base hits, fourth with 56 total bases, fifth with 33 hits, tied for fifth with 8 doubles, eighth with a .544 SLG and ninth with a .917 OPS.

GURRIEL'S ROAD STREAK: Lourdes Gurriel Jr. has hit safely in all 10 road games at a .391 clip (18-for-46)/.873 OPS with 3 doubles, 6 RBI and 2 walks.

OFFENSE OFF STARTERS: Among all offenses vs. starting pitchers, the D-backs are first in runs (83), AVG (.293) and hits (152), second in OBP (.358), OPS (.816) and total bases (237) and fourth in SLG (.458).

• D-backs hitters, vs. opposing starters are batting .293 (152-for-518)/.816 OPS with 83 runs, 31 doubles, 18 homers and 48 walks.

FIRST-INNING STRIKERS: The D-backs' 13 games with a first-inning run are tied for the most in the Majors (also: Dodgers).

WHEN SCORING FIRST: The D-backs' 19 times scoring first (11-8) are tied for the most in the Majors (also: Red Sox).

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The D-backs' +35 run differential is tied for fourth in the Majors with the Brewers (+35), behind the Guardians (+49), Braves (+44) and Royals (+39).

RISP-Y BUSINESS: Among teams with runners in scoring position, the D-backs are first with 127 runs and 28 extra-base hits, second with a .399 OBP, third with a .517 SLG and .899 OPS and tied for third with a .306 AVG.

NEXT STARTER: RHP SLADE CECCONI (1-0, 3.00)

- ♦ Making his second start of the season...made 4 starts at Triple-A Reno (2-2, 4.58 ERA, 10 ER in 19.2 IP, 17 H, 8 BB, 23 K).
- ♦ Got his first career win and first quality start in a 5-3 win @ Giants on April 21 (6.0 IP, 2 R, 2 H, 0 BB, 3 K).
- ♦ First career start vs. Mariners.

SNAKEBITES

AT A GLANCE: Sixth season with the D-backs.

 2023 All-MLB First Team, NL Cy Young finalist and D-backs' Most Valuable Pitcher by the Arizona chapter of the BBWAA for the third time (2020, '22, '23) after going 17-9 with a 3.47 ERA (81 ER in 210.0 IP) and 220 strikeouts over 34 starts.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: Is making his sixth start of the season and third on the road.

- Limiting opponents to a .121 average (4-for-33) with 20 strikeouts off his curveball.
- The D-backs have scored a combined 36 runs in his 5 starts this year.
- He has exited 4 of his 5 starts this season with the lead.

ALL-STAR STARTER: Named to his first All-Star Game in 2023 at T-Mobile Park and earned the starting nod...tossed 1.0 scoreless inning with 1 strikeout.

- At 27 years old, became the youngest D-backs pitcher, third overall (fourth time) and first since Curt Schilling (35 in 2002) to start an All-Star Game (also: Randy Johnson; 36 in 2000 and 37 in 2001.
- Was the youngest NL starting pitcher since Matt Harvey/NYM in 2013 (24).

NO APRIL SHOWERS: In 15 career April starts, is 7-1 with a 1.77 ERA (18 R-17 ER in 86.2 IP), 0.88 WHIP, .181 opponent average (56-for-310) and 107 strikeouts.

- Dating back to 1915, his 1.77 ERA in April is the fifth best among starting pitchers (min. 10 starts), behind Lefty Williams/CWS (1.54, 1916-20), Tiny Bonham/PIT (1.64, 1941-48), Barry Moore/CLE (1.74, 1967-70) and Pete Schneider/CIN (1.74, 1915-18).
- His 1.77 ERA among D-backs starters (min. 10 starts) in April, is a franchise best, ahead of Brandon Webb (2.66) and Patrick Corbin (2.84).

NL RANKINGS: Ranks among NL starters in wins (T-3rd, 3), strikeouts (T-8th, 32) and strikeouts per 9.0 innings (8th, 10.67).

FRANCHISE RANKINGS: Ranks among D-backs starters in franchise history in ERA (4th, 3.23), WHIP (4th, 1.11), strikeouts (6th, 718) and wins (T-9th, 41).

AMONG OTHER STARTERS: Since 2022, his 12 starts of 6.0+ shutout innings, 6+ strikeouts and 3-or-fewer hits allowed are tied for the most in the Majors (also: Corbin Burnes/BAL), ahead of Blake Snell/SF (11) Shohei Ohtani/LAD (10).

LAST START: Took the loss on April 20 @ Giants (5 R-5 ER in 5.0 IP).

VS. MARINERS: Made his lone career start vs. Mariners on Sept. 12, 2020 at Chase Field (7 ER in 5.0 IP).

VS. AL WEST: Making his thirteeth career start against an AL West team.

- In 5 road starts vs. the AL West, has walked 1 or fewer batters.
- In search of his first road win vs. the AL West since Sept. 18, 2020 @ Astros (3 R-1 ER in 6.0 IP, 6 K).

2023 RECAP: Set career highs in virtually all categories, including wins, innings and strikeouts in 2023.

- His combined 243.2 innings in the regular season and postseason combined were 24.0 more innings than any other pitcher.
- Along with Gerrit Cole (209.0 IP, 222 K), were the only pitchers in the Majors in 2023 with 200.0+ innings and 200+ strikeouts.
- In 2023, ranked among qualifying National League leaders in innings pitched (2nd, 210.0), starts (2nd, 34), wins (2nd, 17), strikeouts (3rd, 220), WHIP (6th, 1.12), win percentage (6th, .654), ERA (7th, 3.47) and opponent average (T-9th, .238).

2023 POSTSEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Won the series-clincher in Game 2 of the National League Wild Card @ Brewers (2 ER in 6.0 IP) on Oct. 4, 2023.

- Won Game 2 of the NLDS @ Dodgers (2 ER in 5.1 IP) on Oct. 9, 2023.
- In 6 postseason starts, went 2-3 with a 4.54 ERA (17 ER in 33.2 IP),
 .248 opponent average, 14 walks and 24 strikeouts.
- Game 1 starter for NLCS @ Phillies and World Series @ Rangers.

CY YOUNG HOPEFUL: Finished third (68 votes) in 2023 NL Cy Young Award voting behind Blake Snell/SD (204) and Logan Webb/SF (86).

- In 2022 voting, finished fifth (45 votes).
- In 2020 voting, finished tied for ninth (2 votes)

MILKMAN DELIVERED: Tossed his first career 9.0-inning shutout on Sept. 8 @ Cubs with 3 hits allowed and 9 strikeouts.

- Previously had a 7.0-inning, complete-game shutout on April 25 Game 1 @ Braves (7.0 IP, 1 H, 2 BB, 6 K).
- Fourth D-backs pitcher (sixth time) to toss 9.0 or more innings, 0 runs, 3 or fewer hits, 1 or fewer walks and 9 or more strikeouts (also: Curt Schilling on April 10, 2001 and May 14, 2003; Randy Johnson on Sept. 14, 2003 and May 18, 2004; lan Kennedy on April 25, 2011).

HOW HE STARTED: Cardinals' third-round pick in the 2016 draft out of the University of North Carolina.

- Made his Major League debut on June 20, 2019 for the Marlins @ Cardinals (7-6 win, ND, 5.0 IP, 5 H, 1 R, 2 BB, 6 K).
- Acquired by D-backs on July 31, 2019 from the Marlins.
- Made his D-backs debut on August 7, 2019 vs. Phillies (6-1 win, W,
 5.0 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 3 BB, 6 K).
