METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Reds, 3-2, yesterday to snap a three-game losing streak...The Mets are in their first homestand after the All-Star break, a six-game homestand (1-2) against the Cincinnati Reds (1-2) and Los Angeles Angels (three games)...New York is off on Thursday before their final west coast swing of the season, a six-game trip against the Giants (three games) and Padres (three games).

INTERLEAGUE: The Mets are 16-17 in Interleague play this season as opposed to 40-26 against the NL.

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga is set to make his 15th start of the season tonight...He last pitched on July 11 at Kansas City, allowing four hits in 4.0 scoreless innings with two walks and four strikeouts...Has a scoreless streak of 12.2 innings, dating back to the fourth inning on June 6...In 14 starts this season, the right-hander has gone 7-3 with a 1.39 ERA (12 ER/77.2 IP)...His ERA is the second-best in franchise history through a player's first 14 starts of a season, trailing only Jacob deGrom's 0.95 ERA in 2021...At Citi Field this season, has posted a 5-1 record with a 0.96 ERA (4 ER/37.2 IP), which is the second-lowest ERA through a pitcher's first seven home starts of a single season in franchise history...He trails deGrom's 0.86 ERA through seven home starts in 2021.

GOOD THINGS COME IN THREES: Senga has allowed three earned runs or less in 31 consecutive starts dating back to 6/23/23...It is the longest active streak in the majors and is the third-longest such streak in franchise history...He trails only Jacob deGrom's 40 starts (from 9/9/19-9/18/22) and deGrom's 31 starts (from 4/16/18-4/3/19).

KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST: Senga has used his forkball 28.8% of the time this season...He has recorded 51 of his 74 strikeouts using his signature pitch and has posted a 42.0 whiff rate with the ghost fork this year.

CISCO INFERNO: Prior to tonight's game C Francisco Alvarez was recalled from Triple-A Syracuse...Over his last six games with Syracuse (since July 11), Alvarez has hit .476 (10-21) with 10 runs, two doubles, seven homers, 15 RBI, five walks and a 2.164 OPS...Over his 19-game stretch with the club, he hit 11 home runs in 67 at-bats, posting a 1.233 OPS.

HOME, SWEET HOME: The Mets have posted a 34-16 record at home...Their .680 winning percentage at home is the best in the NL and is the second-best in the majors...Their 34 wins are the second-most in The Show...New York has posted a 3.18 ERA at home this year, which is the fourth-best in MLB and third in the NL...Their 34-16 record through their first 50 home games is tied with the '86 team, '88 team, '90 team and '15 team for the best home start in franchise history.

LET'S GOSTREAKING: Pete Alonso entered the game as a defensive replacement yesterday...He has appeared in a franchise-record streak of 353 consecutive games played...It's the second-longest active streak in the majors...He broke a streak of 205 consecutive starts, which was the longest streak in franchise history.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Brandon Nimmo has safely reached base in 14 straight games...He is batting .321 (17-53) with 12 runs, three doubles, three homers, 11 RBI, six walks, four steals, a .400 OBP and a .547 SLG in that span...In 42 games since the start of June, Nimmo has hit .298/365/516 with 25 runs, eight doubles, nine homers, 25 RBI, 14 walks, 10 steals and an .881 OPS...He has stolen 11 bases in 96 games this year...He stole a career-high 15 in 151 contests in 2024.

ANGELS-METS NOTES: The Mets are seeking their first series win against the Angels since June 10-12, 2022 and their first at Citi Field since May 19-21, 2017.

PEAK PETE PERFORMANCE: Alonso is tied for third in the majors with 26 doubles, tied for eighth in the NL with 21 homers, 10th in the NL with a .890 OPS and 12th in the NL at .370 OBP and a .520 slugging percentage.

BRETT THE MET: Brett Baty has hit 10 home runs this season, which ties a career-high...In 45 home games he is hitting .290 (36-124) with 19 runs, three doubles, one triple, 23 RBI, nine home runs...He is on a five game hitting streak, batting .500 (7-14) with three runs, two homers, two RBI and a 1.462 OPS.

JUAN OF A KIND: Since May 30, Juan Soto has hit .300/.441/.653 with 38 runs, five doubles, 16 home runs, 32 RBI, 37 walks and five stolen bases...In that span, leads among qualified Major League batters in OBP and OPS (1.095), is second in walks and runs scored, and third in home runs, SLG and total bases...Soto has drawn 79 walks, which leads the major leagues.

DON'T STEAL THIS ALBUM: Among catchers with 250 or more innings behind the plate this year, Luis Torrens ranks second in the majors with 41.9 percent caught stealing (18 SB, 13 CS, 435.2 IP)...Only Salvador Perez is better (50.0 percent caught stealing, 9 SB, 9 CS, 428.0 IP).

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: According to Elias, Francisco Lindor has hit 258 home runs and stolen 198 bases as a shortstop...Only two players in major league history had 200/200 (HR/SB) as a shortstop - Derek Jeter (255 HR, 351 SB) and Jimmy Rollins (229 HR, 469 SB).

LAST TIME OUT: Returned to action on July 11 against after sustaining a strained right hamstring on June 12 against Washington and was placed on the 15-Day IL...Threw 4.0 scoreless innings before suffering the injury, allowing four hits and two walks with four strikeouts...He has allowed three or fewer earned runs in all 14 of his starts this season...Senga has a current scoreless streak of 12.2 innings, dating back to the fourth inning on June 6.

SO FAR SO GOOD: In 14 starts this season, the right-hander has gone 7-3 with a 1.39 ERA (12 ER/77.2 IP)...His ERA is the second-best in franchise history through a player’s first 14 starts of a season, trailing only Jacob deGrom’s 0.95 ERA in 2021...At Citi Field this season, has posted a 5-1 record with a 0.96 ERA (4 ER/37.2 IP), which is the second-lowest ERA through a pitcher’s first seven home starts of a single season in franchise history...He trails deGrom’s 0.86 ERA through seven home starts in 2021...His 1.39 ERA is currently the best in the majors among pitchers with 70.0-plus innings pitched...Opponents are only batting .199 (55-311) off Senga this season which is the 14th-best mark in the NL.

GOOD THINGS COME IN THREES: Has allowed three earned runs or less in 31 consecutive starts dating back to 6/23/23...It is the longest active streak in the majors and ties the second-longest such streak in franchise history...He trails only Jacob deGrom’s 40 starts (from 9/9/19-9/18/22) and deGrom’s 31 starts (from 4/16/18-4/3/19).

GHOSTING THE BATS: In 2023 Senga's "ghost fork" accounted for 110 of his 202 strikeouts...The pitch had a 59.5% whiff rate and a 28.2% put away rate...Opponents managed just 18 hits in 163 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .110 batting average...In Senga's first 14 starts of the 2025 season, he has picked up 51 of his 74 strikeouts on the "ghost fork" and generated a 42.0% whiff rate...His run value for the ghost fork is eight, which is the third-highest among qualified pitchers who throw a split-finger ball, trailing only Jhoan Duran (9) and Shota Imanaga (9).

SENGA GENESIS: Through Senga's first 43 career starts he has posted 281 strikeouts which is the 19th-most through a pitchers first 43 games in Major League history...It is the fifth most by a Met, trailing Dwight Gooden (first, 377), Matt Harvey (eighth, 308), Noah Syndergaard (ninth, 302) and Jacob deGrom (16th, 286)...It is also the third-most among Japanese-born pitchers in that span, trailing only Yu Darvish (348) and Hideo Nomo (342).

VS. ANGELS: Senga has one previous start against the Angels, working 6.2 innings and allowing two runs on four hits with three walks and 10 strikeouts in the 3-1 loss on August 25, 2023.

2024 REWIND: He missed nearly the first four months of the 2024 season with a right shoulder capsule strain...Returned and made one regular season start on July 26 vs. Atlanta, throwing 5.1 innings and allowing two runs on two hits with nine strikeouts and one walk before exiting with an injury...Missed the rest of the regular season with a strained left calf...He made it back for the Postseason and he made his first career Postseason start on October 5 in Game 1 of the NLDS against the Phillies...Threw 2.0 innings allowing one run, a home run in the first inning, and recorded one walk and three strikeouts...Finished the Postseason making three appearances and pitching 5.0 innings while striking out four.

REMARKABLE ROOKIE: During his rookie campaign in 2023, Kodai Senga recorded 202 strikeouts and became the 18th rookie pitcher in the Modern Era (Since 1900) to have 200 or more strikeouts in a season...Senga's 202 punch outs were the second-most by a Mets pitcher behind only Dwight Gooden's 276 strikeouts in 1984...He joined Hideo Nomo (236), Yu Darvish (221) and Daisuke Matsusaka (201) as the only Japanese-born rookie hurlers to reach 200 strikeouts...Senga's 12 wins were tied with Ron Darling (1984) for the seventh-most wins in a single season by a Mets rookie and was the first Mets rookie to reach double-digit wins since Dillon Gee (13, 2011)...His 2.98 ERA (55 ER/166.1 IP) was the fifth-lowest in a single season by a Mets rookie behind only Jerry Koosman (2.08, 1968), Jon Matlack (2.32, 1972), Dwight Gooden (2.60, 1984) and Tom Seaver (2.76, 1967).

KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST: In 2023, Senga finished second in the NL and fifth in the majors among qualifiers in ERA...His 202 strikeouts were the tied for the eighth-most in the NL and tied for the 14th-most in the majors...Senga held opposing batters to a .208 average, the third-lowest mark among qualifiers in the NL and the fourth-lowest mark in the majors...His 10.93 K/9 rate was the fifth-best mark among qualified major league pitchers in 2023...He finished seventh in NL Cy Young voting.

HEY NOW YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: In 2023 Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver (1967) as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He was the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-

Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo Nomo (1995).

METS-JAPAN CONNECTION: Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

- Earned his 11th hold of the season after tossing a scoreless seventh inning on July 20 vs. Cincinnati (1.0 IP, H, K)...Was his 23rd scoreless relief outing of the season out of his 37 relief appearances.
- In 12 games against Interleague opponents this season he has posted a 1.50 ERA (3 ER/18.0 IP) and held opponents to a .169 (10-59) batting average.
- Allowed two earned runs and four hits in one inning of relief on July 11 at Kansas City (1.0 IP, 4 H, 2 ER).
- Earned his second save of the season and his career on July 8 at Baltimore (1.0 IP, K)...Four of his last six appearances have been scoreless.
- Earned his fourth win of the season after tossing a scoreless seventh inning on July 4 vs. New York-AL (BB, 3 K)...Was his fifth appearance this season recording at least three strikeouts and his first since June 3 at Los Angeles-NL.
- Was used as an opener for the third time this season and threw a scoreless first inning on July 2 vs. Milwaukee (G2)...Has not allowed a hit over 4.0 scoreless innings as a starter this season.
