METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Braves, 3-2, last night...The Mets are seeking their third straight series win and their 16th series win of the season...New York is 37-15 when scoring first this season...Tonight, the Mets finish a seven-game road trip (4-2) to St. Louis (3-1) and Atlanta (1-1)...The Mets are off on Thursday before returning to New York for a 10-day, nine-game homestand against the Angels (three games), Rangers (three games) and Mariners (three games).

RETURN OF THE BACH: Daniel Vogelbach has recorded four home runs over his last 10 games...He is batting .321 (9-28) in that span with six runs, 11 RBI, eight walks with a .486 OBP and a .750 SLG...He has popped an .830 OPS in 26 games following the All-Star break.

HANG 10: New York has won seven of its last 10 games...The Mets are batting .272/.345/.488 and have posted a 3.78 ERA (37 ER/88.0 IP) during the streak...Over the last 10 games, the Mets have outscored their opponents 65-37.

QUINTESSENTIAL: José Quintana has made six starts this year and is 1-4 with a 3.03 ERA (12 ER/35.2 IP) with 14 walks and 25 strikeouts this season...He has not allowed more than three runs this season and his tossed at least 6.0 innings in five of his six appearances.

LINSANITY: Lindor is on a nine-game hitting streak, batting .395 (15-38) in that span with 10 runs, four doubles, one home run, eight RBI, two walks and three steals...Over his last 55 games, he is batting .309 (64-207) with 44 runs, 11 doubles, two triples, 11 home runs, 34 RBI, 27 walks, 16 steals with a .393 OBP, a .546 SLG and a .939 OPS...Lindor has stolen 22 bases in 125 games this season, exceeding his total from 2022 (16 steals in 161 games)...His career-best is 25 steals 158 games in 2018.

I DECLARE fWAR: Francisco Lindor ranks fifth in the majors and fourth in the National League with a 5.3 fWAR...Since he joined the Mets, Lindor has posted a 16.3 fWAR...Only Freddie Freeman (17.9) and Mookie Betts (17.0) have posted a higher mark in the Senior Circuit...His 16.3 fWAR since 2021 ranks fifth in the majors in that span.

TO THINE OWN SELF BE TRUIST: Jeff McNeil has hit .389 (42-108) with 16 runs, nine doubles, two home runs, eight RBI, six walks with a .426 OBP and a .528 SLG in 28 career games at the home of the Braves...In 67 career games against Atlanta, McNeil is a .346 (88-254) hitter with 33 runs, 22 doubles, five home runs, 25 RBI, 10 walks with an .876 OPS...He has safely hit in eight straight games against ATL, batting .417 (15-36) with five runs, one double, two RBI, two walks and an .892 OPS in that span.

JEFF McHITS: Jeff McNeil is on a seven-game hitting streak, batting .419 (13-31) with six runs, two doubles, one home run, six RBI, one walk and two steals...He has safely hit in 16 of his last 18 games, batting .366 (26-71) with 13 runs, three doubles, three home runs, 13 RBI, and four walks with a .410 OBP and a .535 SLG in that span...In 37 games following the All-Star break, McNeil is batting .301 (44-146) with 22 runs, six doubles, one triple, three home runs, 21 RBI, seven walks with a .352 OBP...He has struck out only 12 times in 159 plate appearances following the All-Star break.

DINGERS: The Mets have homered in nine straight games, blasting 21 home runs in that span...It is the third-longest streak of the season...Overall, the Mets have hit 165 home runs, which is fourth in the National League.

MONTHLY REPORT: Pete Alonso has recorded nine home runs in 20 games this month...His career-best for any single month is 11 home runs, which he recorded in 27 games in September of 2019...He has recorded five months with at least 10 home runs in his career...His next home run would mark the second time this year that Alonso has hit 10 homers in a single month...He hit 10 home runs in May...He also hit one home run in March and nine in April.

THIS IS ALMOST 40: Pete Alonso is third in the majors and second in the National League with 39 home runs...Alonso is one home run shy of recording his third season of 40 or more home runs...He socked 53 in 2019 and 40 last season...He is the only player in franchise history with multiple seasons of 40 or more home runs...Since he entered the league in 2019, only two other players have recorded multiple seasons with 40 or more home runs (Shohei Ohtani and Mike Trout)... Only one active player (Nelson Cruz, four) has more than three 40-HR seasons...Alonso's 185 home runs since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues...With one more long ball, he'll become the fifth player in MLB history with three or more seasons with 40+ home runs in a player's first five years...He would join Ralph Kiner (4), Ryan Howard (3), Albert Pujols (3) and Eddie Matthews (3).

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 23-34 in the history of the ballpark.

THE ROAD TO 100: Pete Alonso is second in the majors and in the NL with 95 RBI... He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...He is seeking to become the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry recorded three seasons each.

GIMME A BREAK: Alonso is hitting .256 (34-133) with 20 extra-base hits, 34 RBI, 23 runs, 17 walks and a .966 OPS in 37 games following the All-Star break...He batted .211 (64-304) with 50 runs, seven one triple, 26 home runs and 61 RBI in the 82 games before the break.

INVADER NIM: Over the last 14 games, Brandon Nimmo is batting .370 (20-54) with eight runs, two doubles, three home runs, four RBI, nine walks, a .460 OBP and a .574 SLG...He is batting .297 (46-155) with 11 doubles, one triple, two home runs, 13 RBI, 12 walks with a .366 OBP and a .419 SLG against left-handed pitchers this year...His .297 average is the eighth-best in the majors by a left-handed hitter against fellow lefties.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 28-40 on the road this year...They have posted a 4.79 ERA in away games...New York has played 68 games on the road this year...That is the most in the majors.

I DON'T WANT TO ROCK, DJ: In 30 games this year, DJ Stewart is batting .246 (16-65) with nine runs, two doubles, six home runs, 12 RBI, eight walks, a .333 OBP and a .554 SLG...Over the last seven games, Stewart is batting .375 (9-24) with five home runs and nine RBI...Stewart recorded a career-high 12 home runs in 100 games with Baltimore in 2021.

150: Kodai Senga now has 154 strikeouts on the season...He became the seventh pitcher in franchise history to record at least 150 strikeouts in his rookie season...Senga is tied with Gary Gentry for sixth place among rookie pitchers in team history (Gentry had 154 in 1969)...His is the fifth pitcher of Japanese origin to post at least 150 strikeouts as a rookie, joining Hideo Nomo (236 in 1995), Yu Darvish (221 in 2012), Daisuke Matsuzaka (201 in 2007), and Kenta Maeda (179 in 2016)... Courtesy of sportsradar.

DOING THE SPLITS: Brandon Nimmo is batting .292 (73-250) with 37 runs, 11 doubles, three triples, seven home runs, 30 RBI, 35 walks, a .380 OBP and a .444 SLG on the road this season...This compares to a .238/.345/.444 slashline with 21 extra-base hits at home...Francisco Lindor is a .278 (74-266) hitter with 50 runs, 20 doubles, two triples, 14 home runs, 53 RBI, 25 walks, a .348 OBP, and a .526 SLG on the road in 2023...He is slashing .223/.322/.398 with 18 extra-base hits at Citi Field this year.

IF YOU START ME UP: The Mets are 37-10 when the starting pitcher throws at least 6.0 innings...New York has gone 15-1 when its starter pitches 7.0+ innings and are a perfect 5-0 when the starter completes 8.0 innings.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 1969, the Mets earned a 3-2 walk-off win over the Dodgers in front of 40,974 fans at Shea...The Mets were leading 2-0 until L.A. scored two in the top of the eighth to even it up...Jerry Grote hit an RBI double in the bottom of the ninth to earn the win...Don Cardwell was dominant as he allowed two runs (one earned) on five hits with two walks and struck out three in 7.2 innings of work... Ron Taylor earned the win, tossing 1.1 perfect innings.

DOWN ON THE FARM: The Rumble Ponies defeated the Fisher Cats, 5-2, last night...RHP Blade Tidwell tossed 5.0 scoreless innings, allowing four hits and striking out six...In 21 starts between two levels, Tidwell is 10-5 with a 3.79 ERA with 54 walks and 132 strikeouts...OF Drew Gilbert hit his third homer in his last seven games in the victory...In 16 games in the Mets organization, Gilbert is batting .333 (20-60) with nine runs, two doubles, one triple, three home runs, 12 RBI, five walks with a .397 OBP, a .550 SLG and a .947 OPS.

QUINTANA NEWS & NOTES

RECENTLY: Quintana made his first start with the Mets on July 20 against his former team, the Chicago White Sox...Quintana signed a two-year contract with New York on December 9, 2022...The southpaw began the season on the IL due to a stress fracture in his rib cage...Underwent surgery on March 17.

LAST TIME OUT: Quintana made his sixth start of the season on August 17 against the Cardinals at Busch Stadium and earned his first win in a Mets uniform...He threw 6.0+ innings and allowed two earned runs on three hits and four walks while striking out five batters.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT RECAP: Made five appearances across St. Lucie (A), Binghamton (AA) and Syracuse (AAA) as part of his rehab assignment after being placed on the 60-day IL with a left rib fracture...Threw 15.2 innings in five games, four of which were starts, pitching to a 4.60 ERA (8 ER/15.2 IP) while tallying 16 strikeouts compared to eight walks.

HOME OF THE BRAVES: Today, Quintana will make his seventh career start against the Braves...Quintana last faced Atlanta just 11 days ago on August 12, 2023 at Citi Field and allowed one run over 6.0 innings.

YOU GOTTA EARN 'EM: Quintana has allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of his last 20 starts dating back to July 23, 2022...It is the longest such streak of his career and the longest such active streak in the majors by a starting pitcher (excluding openers)...It marks the longest such streak in the majors since Atlanta's Max Fried allowed three earned runs or fewer in 21 straight starts from June 20, 2022 - April 28, 2023...Quintana's streak of 16 straight starts allowing two earned runs or fewer came to an end in his start against Kansas City on August 1.

HOT STREAK: Quintana's homerless inning streak came to an end at 97.1 innings in his last start after allowing a solo homer to Tyler O'Neill to lead off the bottom of the seventh inning...The last pitcher before Quintana to reach 90.0+ homerless innings was Tyson Ross (100.0 IP) in 2015...Courtesy of Elias... Last season Quintana owned the lowest ERA (0.89) in Major League Baseball during the month of September last year and is the lowest ERA in any month in his career.

LEFT 'EM SPEECHLESS: Reached 1,500 career strikeouts in his start vs. Colorado on August 16, 2022. Currently ranks fifth among active MLB lefties in strikeouts (1,557 behind Clayton Kershaw (2,918), Chris Sale (2,145), Madison Bumgarner (2,070) and Patrick Corbin (1,563).

2022 SEASON: Quintana allowed two earned runs or fewer in 26 starts in the regular season...Posted a season-high 19.1-inning scoreless streak from September 11-28, the longest scoreless streak in by a Cardinals pitcher in 2022... NL Ranks 2022: ERA (2.93, 8th), Games Started (31, T10th), HR/9 IP (0.43, 1st), GIDP/9 IP (1.25, 1st), GIDP (25, T1st).

FRIDAY'S STARTER: KODAI SENGA (10-6, 3.19)

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his tenth win of the season, after allowing one run over 7.0 innings on August 19 at St. Louis...Allowed two hits, two walks and struck out five batters.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: On July 8, Major League Baseball announced that Kodai Senga was added to the National League All-Star team, which took place on July 11 at T-Mobile Park in Seattle...Senga was the fifth Mets rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Tom Seaver (1967), Jerry Koosman (1968), Dwight Gooden (1984) and Pete Alonso (2019).
