STAY INFORMED

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RAY REPORT—The Rays open a nine-game, 10-day homestand against the Guardians (three to play), Rangers (three to play), and White Sox (three to play) tonight...are coming off a 3-5 road trip through Boston (0-4) and Toronto (3-1)...have won three of their last four games following a season-high five-game losing streak (July 12-19), which was their longest since April 2-8, 2025 (also 5G — excl. multi-season streaks)...entering the skid, went 13-4 in their previous 17 games (July 24–July 11)...are currently 3-5 on stretches of 11 games in 10 days (July 17-26) and 20 games in 20 days (July 17–Aug. 5)...have gone 5-2-2 in their last nine series (June 19–pres.), including 4-0-2 in their last six home sets...overall, lead the AL with a 59-43 record, fourth best in the majors and their sixth-best mark through 102 games...have spent 68 days leading the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth, including 27 consecutive days in first (June 27–pres.), their second-longest stay atop the division this season behind May 9–June 12 (35 days)...marks the latest into a season they have led the AL East since winning the division in 2021.

- ✦ The Rays were unable to complete a four-game sweep after tallying three hits, tying a season low (3x, also: July 17 at BOS [G1] & June 16 at LAD), during yesterday's 3-1 loss in Toronto...despite the defeat, they still earned their first series win in a four-game set since May 13-16, 2024 at BOS, snapping an 0-6-9 skid, the second-longest streak of winless four-game series in club history (15) behind an 0-15-7 span (22) from 2002-04.
- ✦ **Casey Legumina** (2.0IP) served as an opener for **Ian Seymour** (6.0IP), marking the Rays first loss this season when using an opener, halting a six-game winning streak.
- ✦ Despite going homerless in back-to-back games for the first time since July 5-6, the Rays still lead the AL with 43 HR and 14 multi-homer games in their last 29 contests since June 21, going deep in 21 of those games...this comes after they produced the majors' fewest home runs (60) and multi-homer efforts (14, tied with BOS) over their first 73 games through June 20.
- ✦ The Rays are batting .278 with RISP, second in MLB to the Twins (.285)...they have gone 12-for-25 (.480) with RISP over their last three games vs. 6-for-38 (.158) across their previous six games (July 12-20).
- ✦ The Rays are an MLB-best 35-15 (.700) at home, including wins in nine of their last 12 contests at Tropicana Field, outscoring opponents, 62-41 (+21), in that span while out-homering them, 21-15 (+6)...the 35-15 record is tied with 2023 for their second best through 50 home games behind 2008 (36-14).
- ✦ This marks the fourth time in nine games since the All-Star break the Rays will be opposed by a left-handed starting pitcher...they faced one southpaw in their previous 17 games entering the break (June 30 at KC - **Noah Cameron**)...the club's AL-best 19-10 (.655) record in games vs. left-handed starters ranks second in the majors to the Diamondbacks (16-8/.667).
- ✦ The Rays are an AL-leading 22-11 in series openers, trailing only the Brewers (26-7/.788) in all of MLB...they are 5-2 in their last openers (June 26–pres.).
- ✦ With a win tonight, the Rays would become the first AL club and fourth team overall to reach 60 wins, joining the Dodgers (65), Brewers (64), and Braves (60)...they would reach 60 wins before the end of July for the seventh time, including the fourth time over the last seven seasons since 2019 (excl. 2020), joining 2023 (65), 2021 (63), and 2019 (62).

KID CAMI—**Junior Caminero** needs 1 HR to become the fourth player in franchise history with multiple 30-HR seasons, joining **Evan Longoria** (4), **Carlos Peña** (3), and **Brandon Lowe** (2)...he would join Peña (3 straight, 2007-09) as the only Rays to reach the mark in back-to-back seasons...he currently has 74 HR between his age 21- and age-22 seasons (2025-26; age as of June 30), third most in the modern era (since 1900) behind MLN **Eddie Mathews** (87) and NYY **Joe DiMaggio** (75)...Caminero could become the 11th player in the modern era with multiple 30-HR campaigns before his age-23 season, joining LAA **Mike Trout** (2012, 2014), FLA **Giancarlo Stanton** (2011-12), FLA **Miguel Cabrera** (2004-05), STL **Albert Pujols** (2001-02), SEA **Alex Rodriguez** (1996, 1998), OAK **José Canseco** (1986-87), ATL **Bob Horner** (1978-80), CIN **Frank Robinson** (1956, 1958), Mathews (1953-54), BOS **Ted Williams** (1939, 1941), and PHA **Jimmie Fox** (1929-30)...he could also become the seventh Dominican-born third baseman in MLB history with multiple 30-HR seasons in his career, joining **Adrian Beltré** (5), **José Ramírez** (4), **Aramis Ramírez** (4), **Rafael Devers** (3), **Tony Batista** (3), and **Pedro Alvarez** (2).

- ✦ Caminero leads MLB with 14 HR in his last 27 contests since June 23...he has hit safely in 10 of his last 12 games (July 9–pres.), batting .356 (16-for-45) with 4 2B, 3 HR, 6 RBI, and a 1.107 OPS in that span.

PITCHING IN—The Rays staff turned in a 2.06 ERA (35.0IP, 8ER) in four games last series against the Blue Jays compared to a 6.80 ERA (41.0IP, 31ER) during a five-game losing streak that preceded the set (July 12-19)...they yielded 1 HR during the series, their fewest in a four-game span since May 4-7 (1HR) and fewest in any four-game set since June 12-15, 2023 at OAK (1HR)...the staff has permitted three runs or fewer in four straight games, matching their third-longest streak this season behind stretches of 13 (April 22–May 6) and five games (June 24-28)...their eight runs allowed last series tied their fewest in any four-game set across the last four seasons (2023-26), matching Aug. 19-22, 2024 at OAK.

- ✦ The bullpen has yielded three runs in its last 20.0 IP and has a 1.87 ERA (43.1IP, 9ER) across the last 11 games (July 10–pres.), third in the majors to the Red Sox (0.97) and Orioles (0.99).
- ✦ Rays pitchers have the majors' highest usage rate (20.7%) and third lowest opp. average (.176) on changeups, trailing the Blue Jays and Yankees (both .175)...they have tallied an MLB-most 262 strikeouts on the pitch, over 100 more than the next closest club (Phillies: 155SO)...the Guardians are batting an MLB-worst .187 in at-bats ending with changeups.

MILESTONE WATCH—**Yandy Díaz** is slated to play in his 915th game with the Rays tonight, which would surpass **Kevin Kiermaier** for sole possession of fifth most in franchise history...he enters the contest with 113 homers in his Tampa Bay career, one shy of matching **Ben Zobrist** (114HR) for sixth on the club's all-time list (see tables on the right)...he has tallied 999 hits in a Rays uniform, one shy of becoming the franchise's fourth player to reach the 1,000-hit mark along with **Carl Crawford** (1,480), **Evan Longoria** (1,471), and **Zobrist** (1,016)...306 of those 999 hits have gone for extra bases, sixth most in team history and 3 XBH shy of fifth-ranked **Aubrey Huff** (309XBH).

SWEET (VICTORY)—Over his last 11 games, **Victor Mesa Jr.** is batting .355/.394/.871 (11-for-31) with 12B, 5 HR, 8 RBI, 2 BB, 5 R, and 2 SB...during that span (July 7–pres.), he ranks third in the majors (min. 30PA) in slugging pct., is tied for third in homers, and is fifth in OPS (1.265)...he has tallied hits and RBI (5H, 5RBI) in four of his last five games...Mesa Jr. has recorded a .915 OPS across his last 25 games since June 14, 10th best among AL hitters during that timeframe (min. 75PA) and second among Rays to **Junior Caminero** (1.075)...he posted a .522 OPS over his first 14 games of the season (May 25–June 13).

- ✦ During the month of July, the 5-9 spots in the Rays lineup are slashing a combined .293/.335/.470 (104-for-355), marking the majors' best average from 5-9 hitters this month...that portion of the order is on pace for their best average in a calendar month since April 2018 (.294) and the fifth best in franchise history (excluding March/October).

THE BAKE SHOW—**Bryan Baker** converted his 15th consecutive save opportunity on Wed. at TOR, the majors' third-longest active streak behind SD **Mason Miller** (25) and TOR **Louis Varland** (21)...it marks the longest streak by a Rays closer since **Pete Fairbanks** (15) from May 19–Aug. 30, 2023, with the last longer stretch being **Alex Colomé**'s 21-save streak from April 17–July 21, 2016...Baker's 26 saves on the year are tied with STL **Riley O'Brien** for second most in MLB to CLE **Cade Smith** (29).

- ✦ During the 15-save streak (May 17–pres.), Baker paces the AL (min. 20.0IP) in ERA (0.45), WHIP (0.60), opp. average (.119, 8-for-67), opp. on-base pct. (.181), and opp. OPS (.360).

EN GARDE!—The Rays and Guardians continue a six-game season series tonight after Tampa Bay took two of three games at Progressive Field from April 27-29...the Rays are 13-17 in the last 30 meetings (July 25, 2021–pres.) on the heels of a franchise-record 11-game winning streak from May 25, 2019–July 24, 2021...they have won three straight and five of their last six home series against Cleveland (Sept. 10, 2018–pres.), with the lone loss coming from July 29-31, 2022...the Rays lost five of seven matchups in 2025, with three of the five setbacks coming by one run...it was their first season series defeat since 2022 (4-2), but they are still 4-2-1 in the last seven season sets since 2018 (clubs did not meet in 2020).

- ✦ Rays pitchers have yielded 3 ER or fewer in a franchise-record 10 straight games vs. CLE (Sept. 15, 2024–pres.) tied with 10-game streaks vs. the Blue Jays and Mariners in 2012 for their third-longest streak against a single opponent in club history, trailing runs against the Astros (18G - 2013-16) and Angels (12G - 2011-12)...their 2.03 ERA (88.2IP, 20ER) against the Guardians in that span is the third lowest by any AL team against an AL opponent, trailing the Yankees vs. KC (1.58) and the Guardians vs. DET (1.97).
- ✦ In his last 10 home games against the Guardians (Aug. 11, 2023–pres.), **Yandy Díaz** has batted .341 (14-for-41) with 5 2B, 6 RBI, and an .836 OPS.

TONIGHT'S START—Shane McClanahan will toe the rubber for his 19th start of the season and ninth at home...marks his 93rd career start and 49th at home...has yielded 2 ER or fewer in 13 of 18 starts, held opponents homerless in 13, allowed three hits or fewer in nine, and surrendered 0 XBH in eight of those starts (T1st in AL with LAA **José Soriano**)...missed the last two years after his second Tommy John surgery wiped out his 2024 season and nerve-related issues sidelined him for 2025...the Cape Coral High School (Fla.) product was selected by the Rays in the Compensatory Round (31st overall) of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of South Florida.

- Min. 80.0 IP, he ranks among AL leaders in opp. SLG (2nd, .322), opp. OPS (5th, .609), and home runs per 9.0 IP (7th, 0.70).
- His 41 career wins are seventh most in franchise history, one shy of sixth-ranked **Blake Snell** (42)...min. 50 career starts, he owns the best winning pct. by any pitcher in Rays history (.651/41-22)...he needs two wins to become the first Tampa Bay hurler to record double-digit wins in each of his first four major league campaigns.
- The Rays are 41-4 in his career when he receives three runs of support or more (7-0 in 2026) and 14-33 with two runs or fewer (3-8 in 2026).
- Left-handed hitters have gone 9-for-72 (.125) against McClanahan this year...min. 60 AB, the .125 opp. average vs. LHB is the lowest mark among AL arms and ranks third in the majors behind MIL **Jacob Misiorowski** (.102) and STL **Gordon Graceffo** (.113).
- In series openers, McClanahan boasts a career 2.67 ERA (141.2IP, 42ER) across 28 outings (27 starts), the third-lowest clip among active major leaguers since the start of 2021 (min. 125.0IP) behind PIT **Paul Skenes** (1.94) and NYY **Max Fried** (2.67)...in series openers at home (min. 50.0IP), McClanahan's 2.11 ERA (64.0IP, 15ER) is the fifth-lowest mark among active MLB starters during that span behind Misiorowski (1.62), Skenes (1.82), **Cristopher Sánchez** (1.89), and LAD **Eric Lauer** (2.04).
- While pitching on four days of rest, McClanahan has fashioned a lifetime 12-6 record with a 3.51 ERA (141.0IP, 55ER) and a .284 opp. OBP...his 12 wins in such starts are the most by any Ray since the start of 2021.

LAST TIME OUT—Was dealt his sixth loss of the year on July 19 at BOS after tying a season high in runs (6) and marking a season high in earned runs (5) across 5.0 innings (L, 5.0IP, 5H, 6R-5ER, 3SO, 3BB, HR, HBP)...his 87 pitches were his third most in a start this season, the most since May 18 vs. BAL (90)...was his shortest outing since June 17 at LAD, when he worked 3.2 innings after allowed two runs on three hits (3.2IP, 3H, 2ER, 5BB, 3SO)...snapped a streak of three straight starts of 6.0 innings or more (June 23–July 8).

CLEVELAND, THIS IS FOR YOU—McClanahan is making his second career start opposite Cleveland alongside his loss in his lone appearance against the club on July 31, 2022 vs. CLE (4.1IP, 7H, 4SO, 5ER, 3BB, HBP).

- McClanahan has gone 9-6 with a 2.92 ERA (98.2IP, 32ER) in 18 career starts against AL Central foes, his lowest ERA (min. 40.0IP) among all divisions.
- He has made four starts against AL Central foes in 2026, turning in a 3-0 record with a 1.64 ERA (22.0IP, 4ER) and 19 strikeouts...made his most recent start against an AL Central club on July 1 at KC, pitching 6.0 scoreless frames in the win (W, 6.0IP, 3H, 0R, 4SO)...the Rays are 3-1 in his starts against the AL Central in 2026.
- AL hitters are slashing .199/.259/.318 (47-for-236) with 57 strikeouts and a .577 OPS against him, tied for the third-lowest opp. average among AL southpaws (min. 40.0IP), trailing rotation-mate **Ian Seymour** (.177/31-for-175) and CWS **Sean Newcomb** (.188/27-for-144).
- Also made a start against Cleveland in Game One of the 2022 AL Wild Card on Oct. 7, 2022 at CLE, twirling a quality start despite being dealt the loss in a 2-1 defeat (L, 7.0IP, 7H, 2ER, 5SO, HR).

I JUST LOVE THE DOME—McClanahan is 6-1 with a 1.88 ERA (43.0IP, 9ER), 39 SO, and a .199 (31-for-156) opp. AVG across eight starts at Tropicana Field this season...the team has won seven of those eight starts, with his only loss coming on June 23 vs. KC (L, 6.0IP, 6H, 6R-2ER, 4SO, BB, 3HR).

- Min. 40.0 IP in home starts, his ERA ranks sixth in the majors and second in the AL behind CWS **Davis Martin** (1.80).
- His .199 opp. AVG (31-for-156) at home is the lowest clip among AL lefties (min. 130AB).
- Opponents have gone 4-for-30 (.133) against him with RISP at the Trop compared to 16-for-48 (.333) in nine road starts.
- His 27 career wins at Tropicana Field are fourth most in the venue's history, trailing **James Shields** (48), **David Price** (37), and **Scott Kazmir** (28).
- McClanahan's 307 career strikeouts inside Tropicana Field are eighth most in the stadium's history...is 16 punchouts shy of tying **Alex Cobb** (323) for seventh most.
- Min. 40 career starts at Tropicana Field, his .750 winning pct. (27-9) is the highest mark in the venue's history...under the same parameter, it is the fifth-highest clip by a southpaw in any single venue before their age 30 season during the modern era (since 1900), trailing LAD **Sandy Koufax** (.815 - Dodger Stadium), NYY **Ron Guidry** (.782 - Old Yankee Stadium), LAD **Julio Urias** (.757 - Dodger Stadium), and OAK **Mark Mulder** (.754 - Network Associates Coliseum).
- His career 2.77 FIP at the Trop is the lowest in stadium history (min. 200.0IP).

FALTERED IN THE 5TH—From innings 1-4, McClanahan has pitched to a 2.26 ERA (71.2IP, 18ER) and 0.95 WHIP...17 of the 39 (43.6%) runs against him have come in the 5th frame, where he has recorded a 7.71 ERA (14.0IP, 12ER) and 2.07 WHIP...opponents are batting .354 (23-for-65) against him in the 5th, including 9-for-26 (.346) with RISP, compared to .175 (43-for-257) over the first four innings (.196/9-for-46 with RISP).

KEEP THE CHANGE—He has held opponents to .149 (17-for-114) average on his changeup, the third-lowest mark in the majors (min. 75AB), trailing teammates **Nick Martinez** (.132) and **Bryan Baker** (.147)...this includes an 4-for-31 (.129) clip across his last four outings (June 17–pres.)...under the same parameter, it would mark the seventh-lowest opp. average on changeups by a Ray in the pitch-tracking era (since 2008)...he has yielded only 3 XBH on changeups and tallied nearly half (42) of his 85 strikeouts on the offering.
