**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets fell to the Brewers, 4-1, yesterday at Citi Field...The Mets have lost the first three games of the season for the first time since 2014, when they lost three straight to start the year...The last time the Mets lost four straight games to start the season was in 2005, when they dropped the first five contests of the year...The team continues their opening homestand with three contests against the Detroit Tigers beginning today...Following this homestand, the Mets head out on the road for the first time in 2024, visiting Cincinnati (three games) and Atlanta (four games).

**ATTABOY ALVAREZ:** Francisco Alvarez is 5-10 with three runs, one double, one home run, two RBI and one walk with a .900 SLG through the first three games of the season...He has 15 multi-RBI games since May 1, 2023, tied for fifth-most in the majors by a catcher during that span.

**THE PEN IS MIGHTIER:** The Mets bullpen has posted a 2.70 ERA (4 ER/13.1IP) with five walks and 15 strikeouts...The team's 2.70 ERA is the second-best in the National League.

**A STARLING IS BORN:** Starling Marte has reached base safely in all three games this season...He is batting .300 (3-10) with three runs, one double, one home run, one RBI, two walks with a .417 OBP and a .700 SLG...He has recorded 338 steals in his career, which places him as the active leader in the majors.

**GOOD NIGHT:** New York plays under the lights for the first time this season...Last year, the Mets went 50-57 at night, posting a 4.02 ERA and hitting .239/.313/.409...The Mets went 29-27 under the lights at Citi Field in 2023.

**MULTIPLICITY:** Jeff McNeil has recorded 206 multi-hit games in his career...That places him 18th on the Mets All-Time list...Next up is Lee Mazzilli who record 207 multi-ht games, followed by Kevin McReynolds with 208 and Félix Millán who managed 211 such games with the Mets.

**THEY'RE OUT OF MY LEAGUE:** The Mets play their first Interleague game today against the Tigers...Last year introduced the new schedule format which had New York playing a total of 46 Interleague games in 2023, more than double their previous high for a single season (20)...The Mets went 19-27 against the American League...Overall, New York owns a 254-254 record in Interleague play.

**ONE AWAY:** Pete Alonso is one RBI away from 500 for his career...He would become the 10th player in Mets history to record 500 RBI...He has collected 118 RBI last season the sixth-most by a Met in a single season...He became the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry also recorded three seasons each...Alonso's 499 RBI since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues.

**WHAT A MIGHTY GOOD MANAEA:** Sean Manaea is slated to make his first start with the Mets tonight...From July 29 through the end of the 2023 season, he posted a 2.61 ERA (15 ER/51.2 IP), the third-best mark in the NL and ninth-best in the majors (min. 50.0 IP)...Had a 3.43 ERA (23 ER/60.1 IP) over 17 second half appearances compared to a 5.49 ERA (35 ER/57.1 IP) over 20 first half appearances in 2023.

**MENDOZA LINES:** Carlos Mendoza was named the 25th manager in franchise history...The 44-year-old spent the previous 15 seasons with the Yankees organization, including the last four as the club's bench coach...From 2018-2019, Mendoza served as the Yankees' quality control coach...Prior to joining the big league coaching staff, Mendoza served as a manager and coach in the Yankees farm system...A native of Barquisimeto, Venezuela, Mendoza is the second full-time Venezuelan-born manager in big league history, joining Ozzie Guillén.

**IN THE CITI:** Despite their 0-3 record, New York earned a winning season at Citi Field in 2023, going 44-37 at home last season...The Mets have earned a winning season at Citi Field in each of the last three seasons...The Mets have smashed 115 home runs at Citi Field in 2023...That is the second-most home runs at home in team history...Only the 2019 team (126) hit more at home.

**NEW FACES IN NEW PLACES:** The 2024 Mets enter the season with several new players on the roster...These include: free agent signings OF Harrison Bader, LHP Jake Diekman, RHP Jorge López, LHP Sean Manaea, RHP Luis Severino, RHP Michael Tonkin and INF Joey Wendle; trade acquisitions RHP Adrian Houser, RHP Yohan Ramirez and OF Tyrone Taylor as well as waiver claim INF Zack Short

**THIS BUD'S FOR YOU:** In January, Mets Hall of Famer Buddy Harrelson passed away at age 79 at after a lengthy battle with Alzheimer's...Harrelson played for the Mets from 1965-1977 and was a member of the 1969 Miracle Mets, a two-time All-Star (1970 and 1971) and earned the 1971 Gold Glove at shortstop...He later would serve as a coach with the Mets in 1982 and again from 1985-1990. Harrelson took over the managerial duties early in the 1990 season and led the Mets through the 1991 campaign...In honor of his life and legacy, the Mets will wear a patch commemorating him all season long.

**THE GOOD DOC:** On Sunday, April 14 the New York Mets will retire Doc Gooden's number 16... Gooden spent 11 years with the Mets, winning the 1984 NL Rookie of the Year Award while setting a major league rookie record with 276 strikeouts and was the youngest player ever named to an All-Star team at age 19...The following year, Doc became the youngest pitcher ever to win Cy Young honors when he captured the "Triple Crown" of pitching, leading the majors in wins (24), strikeouts (268) and ERA (1.53)... Gooden was inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame in 2010...He ranks second in franchise history in wins (157) and strikeouts (1,875) and third in innings (2,169.2), complete games (67), starts (303) and quality starts (209).

## MANAEA NEWS &amp; NOTES

**WELCOME TO NEW YORK:** Tonight, Sean Manaea will make his first career start as a New York Met...The eight-year veteran has a career 4.10 ERA (457 ER/1000.2 IP) over 196 games (166 starts) between Oakland (2016-2021), San Diego (2022) and San Francisco (2023).

**FIRST TASTE OF THE GRAPEFRUIT LEAGUE:** Over four Grapefruit League starts, Manaea went 2-2 with a 3..24 ERA (6 ER/16.2 IP) and recorded 21 strikeouts...After allowing three runs over 2.2 innings in his first Grapefruit League start, Manaea allowed three runs in 14 innings over his final three spring starts.

**2023 HIGHLIGHTS:** Appeared in 37 games (10 starts) with the San Francisco Giants...Made his first start of the season vs. Kansas City on April 8 and allowed one run over 6.0 innings while tallying eight strikeouts...Was a starter in six of his first eight games of the season before becoming a full-time reliever on May 16...Tied a season-high eight strikeouts in just 3.2 innings of relief on May 22 at Minnesota... became the first MLB left-hander to throw at least 80 pitches and strike out 8+ batters in a scoreless relief outing since Randy Johnson struck out 16 in 7.0 innings on July 19, 2001...Courtesy of OptaSTATS... Did not allow a home run in a 53.2 inning stretch from May 22 through his first inning of work on August 21 at Philadelphia...Rejoined the rotation on September 12 and started his final four games of the season, going 2-1 with a 2.25 ERA (6 ER/24.0 IP)...Pitched to a 2.61 ERA (15 ER/51.2 IP), the third-best mark in the NL and ninth-best in the majors (Min. 50.0 IP).

**SWEEPIN SAMOAN:** At the end of May 2023, Manaea introduced a sweeper to his arsenal...The pitch generated a 35.1 percent whiff rate and kept batters to a .140 average and .163 slugging percentage...The southpaw allowed just six hits (five singles and a double) in 49 plate appearances ending with the offering.

**TIGER TAMER:** Tonight, Manaea will make his seventh career start against the Tigers...Through his first six starts against Detroit, Manaea is 3-2 with a 3.98 ERA (14 ER/31.2 IP) and 31 strikeouts...Manaea's best effort against Detroit came on September 8, 2019 as a member of the A's when he tossed 7.0 innings of one-run ball, allowed just two hits and recorded 10 strikeouts.

**CITI LIFE:** In three career games (one start) at Citi Field, Manaea is 1-0 with a 4.66 ERA (5 ER/9.2 IP)...Manaea's one career start at Citi Field came on July 22, 2017 when he allowed four hits over 5.2 innings in a 6-5 Mets win over Oakland... Last season at Citi Field, Manaea threw 4.0 innings and allowed one run over two games in relief as a member of the Giants.

**SUPERB SOUTHPAW:** Since his debut season, 2016, Manaea ranks in the top-10 among left-handed pitchers in several categories including innings (1002.2, seventh), wins (65, ninth) and strikeouts (925, 10th)...In 2021, Manaea was tied for the AL lead with 32 games started and ranked eighth in the AL with a career-high 194 strikeouts...In 2018, Manaea ranked sixth in the AL in WHIP with a 1.08 clip (Min. 150.0 IP).

**NO HITS FOR YOU:** On April 20, 2018, Manaea threw a no-hitter against the Red Sox in Oakland...The southpaw walked two and struck out 10...It was the 12th no-hitter in Athletics history and the first since Dallas Braden's perfect game on May 9, 2010 vs. Oakland...According to Elias, the Red Sox .895 winning percentage entering the game was the highest in major league history by a team that was no-hit at least five games into the season.

## TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP ADRIAN HOUSER (0-0, ---)

**HOPE SPRINGS ETERNAL:** Over four Grapefruit League starts, Houser went 0-2 with a 5.25 ERA (7 ER/12.0 IP) with 14 strikeouts and 0.83 WHIP...In his lone Grapefruit League start against the Tigers, Houser threw 3.1 perfect innings and recorded five strikeouts on March 10 at Clover Park.

**YO, ADRIAN:** Tomorrow, Houser will make his Mets debut...The right-hander was acquired from Milwaukee along with OF Tyrone Taylor in exchange for RHP Coleman Crow on December 20, 2023...Last season, Houser went 8-5 with a 4.12 ERA (51/111.1 IP) and 96 strikeouts over 23 games (21 starts)...Over seven major league season with Milwaukee, Houser owns a career 4.00 ERA (240 ER/539.1 IP) over 129 games (97 starts).
