METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets had a day off on Monday...On Sunday the team fell to the Pirates, 2-1...The Mets are coming off a six-game road trip (1-5) to Atlanta (0-3) and Pittsburgh (1-2)...New York has lost eight of their last nine games...Today, the Mets start a six-day, fivegame homestand against the Yankees (two games) and Cardinals (three games).

PUT ME IN COACH: To start the Subway Series, St. John's Men's Basketball coach Rick Pitino will throw out a ceremonial first pitch... Pitino was named the 22nd head coach in the history of St. John's Men's Basketball program on March 20, 2023...A native of New York City, Pitino was a standout guard for St. Dominic High School in Oyster Bay, Long Island from 1966-70.

TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME: With the expected large crowds at Citi Field for the Subway Series, the Mets encourage fans to take mass transit to the game.

SUBWAY SERIES: The Mets begin the Subway Series tonight in Queens... Last year, each team earned a two-game sweep at their home stadium... The Mets went 4-2 against the Yankees in 2021, scoring a franchiserecord 44 runs against their crosstown rivals...The two teams went 3-3 against each other in 2020.

STAND CLEAR OF THE CLOSING DOORS: The Mets are 31-36 against the Yankees in Queens...The Amazin's are 60-78 vs. the Yankees alltime during the regular season...The Mets are 108-146-2 vs. the Yankees combined in the regular season, World Series, Spring Training, 2020 Summer Camp, Mayor's Trophy Games, Mayor's Challenge Games and the Big Apple Series.

THIS IS METS WILLETS POINT: Jeff McNeil has hit .351 (26-74) with 11 runs, four doubles, two home runs, eight RBI, five walks with a .400 OBP and a .486 SLG in 20 career games against the Yankees...Francisco Lindor has hit .315 (57-181) with 39 runs, 12 doubles, 10 homers, 22 RBI, 22 walks with a .392 OBP and a .558 SLG against the team from The Bronx.

YOU LOOK FAMILIAR: Buck Showalter is the fifth manager to manage both the Mets and Yankees joining Casey Stengel, Yogi Berra, Dallas Green and Joe Torre...There have been 155 players who have played for both clubs, including current players: RHP Adam Ottavino, RHP David Robertson and OF Billy McKinney.

**RETURN OF THE MAX:** Tonight's starter Max Scherzer has gone 4-5 with a 3.67 ERA (28 ER/68.2 IP) with 27 walks and 77 strikeouts in 11 career  $\,$ starts against the Yankees...He made two starts against the team from The Bronx in 2022, going 0-1 with a 2.63 ERA (4 ER/13.2 IP) with three walks and nine strikeouts...Overall, Scherzer has started 53 Interleague games, posting a 23-19 record with a 2.75 ERA (105 ER/343.1 IP) with 85 walks and 452 strikeouts...His 452 strikeouts in Interleague games is the most in major league history...Right behind him is teammate Justin Verlander who has recorded 428 Interleague punchouts.

IN THE CITI: The Mets have played 27 games at Citi Field, the fewest home games in the majors this season...The team is 15-12 at Citi Field this year...Their .556 winning percentage at home is sixth in the National League.

FIRST IS THE WORST: The Mets have been outscored 49-14 in the first inning this year.

YANKEES-METS NOTES: The Mets have won three straight and four of their last five games against the Yankees at Citi Field.

THEY'RE OUT OF MY LEAGUE: The new schedule format has New York playing a total of 43 Interleague games in 2023, more than double their previous high for a single season (20)...The Mets are 8-7 against the American League this year...Overall, New York owns a 243-234 record in Interleague play...The team's .509 winning percentage is the secondbest among National League clubs.

INTERSTELLAR: Jeff McNeil owns a .328/.377/.437 slashline with 41 runs, 15 doubles, seven home runs and 36 RBI in 82 Interleague games, while Starling Marte has slashed .326/.388/.545 with 120 runs, 46 doubles, 11 triples, 29 home runs and 89 RBI in 184 Intearleague games...They rank third and fourth in average among active players in Interleague play (min. 250 PA)...McNeil's .328 clip is the highest all-time by a Met.

STEAL THIS BASE: The Mets stole two bases on Sunday...As a team, the Mets have stole 22 consecutive bases without being caught...The last time a Mets player was thrown out attempting a stolen base was on May 10 (Francisco Lindor at second)...The Mets are first in the major leagues with an 88.9% stolen base success rate this season...Starling Marte has swiped 18 bags this year, tied for seventh in the majors and tied for fourth in the National League...His 332 career stolen bases rank second among active players...Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 341 steals.

DR. ROBERTSON: David Robertson has posted a 2-1 record with a 1.91 ERA (6 ER/28.1 IP) in 25 appearances this season...He has walked seven. while striking out 37...He ranks 12th in the NL in ERA among relievers and is tied for 13th with 37 punchouts.

PHAM-TASTIC: Tommy Pham is on a five-game hitting streak, batting .316 (6-19) with four runs, four doubles, one home run, one walk, six RBI with a .333 OBP, a .684 SLG and a 1.018 OPS in that span...Over his last 16 games, Pham is batting .333 (15-45) with eight runs, six doubles, one triple, three home runs, 13 RBI with a .392 OBP and a .711 SLG.

A STARLING IS BORN: Over his last 30 games, Starling Marte is batting .305 (32-105) with 15 runs, one double, one triple, two home runs, 10 RBL three walks with a .342 OBP...He has safely reached base in 11 of his last 13 games...He has safely hit in seven of his last eight games.

HIP, HIP, HOME RUN: The Mets have homered in seven straight games, blasting 14 home runs in that...The Mets have homered in 22 of their last 24 games, socking 38 bombs in that span...The Mets rank fifth in the National League with 79 blasts this season.

THE YOUNG AND THE RESTLESS: Francisco Alvarez as hit 12 home runs this season...That is the third-most by a rookie in the majors and the second-most in the National League...10 of his home runs have come as a catcher...Only one other rookie catcher in Mets history have had more homers in a season...Travis d'Arnaud (12) holds the club mark for home runs by a rookie catcher in 2014...Alvarez's 12 homers in his first 44 games played in a season as a primary catcher at age 21 or younger are the most in the majors...Johnny Bench had 11 homers in 1969...Hit tip Sarah Langs.

FIRST IS THE BEST: The Mets are 18-7 (.720) when scoring first this season...On the other hand, the Mets are 13-28 (.317) when their opponent scores first.

IF YOU START ME OFF: New York is 17-1 when their starter goes at least 6.0 innings...The Mets are still 7-0 when the starter goes at least 7.0 innings.

### **SCHERZER NEWS & NOTES**

**LAST TIME OUT:** Struck out a season-high 10 batters over 5.2 innings pitched against Atlanta at Truist Park on June 7...Allowed five runs and surrendered a season-high 11 hits..Did not allow any walks in the Mets' 7-5 loss.

**THE OTHER GUYS:** Scherzer has made 11 starts against the Yankees in his career...In those starts, he is 4-5 with a 3.67 ERA (28 ER/68.2 IP)...When facing the Yankees at home, Scherzer has pitched to a 2.84 ERA (8 ER/25.1 IP) in four starts, with a 2-1 record...His last win against the Yankees came on April 6, 2013 while with Detroit, during which he threw 5.0 innings, allowing four earned runs on five hits and two walks while striking out seven... In 53 Interleague starts, Scherzer owns an 23-19 record with a 2.75 ERA (105 ER/343.1 IP)... Scherzer holds the strikeouts record with 452, the most in Interleague play history.

**TURNING THINGS AROUND:** After pitching to a 5.56 ERA (14 ER/22.2 IP) in his first five starts this season, Scherzer has picked up three wins over his last five starts (since May 14 at the Nationals) and has pitched to a 2.35 ERA (8 ER/30.2 IP) during that span...In that time frame, he has tallied 38 strikeouts compared to four walks, holding opponents to a .233 average and pitching to a 1.01 WHIP.

**TERRIFIC TEN:** Scherzer whiffed ten batters for the first time this season in his last start...The last time he struck out ten or more batters was August 28, 2022...He did not record more than six strikeouts in any of his first eight starts of the season and dating back to his final start of the 2022 season...He has had six strikeouts or fewer in eight straight starts only one other time in his career (September 2009-April 2010 with Arizona/Detroit).

**DOUBLE THE FUN:** With his most recent start, Scherzer advanced to third place all-time with 111 double-digit strikeout games in his career, three more than Pedro Martinez...He broke a tie with Roger Clemens, who had 110 in his career...He'll need over 100 more to catch the top two: Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212).

**LEGENDARY:** Scherzer and Justin Verlander swapped places on the all-time strikeouts leaderboard all season long in 2022...Now teammates in 2023, the pair are neck and neck, with just 20 punchouts separating the two...With 120 more strikeouts this season, Scherzer can enter the top-10...Scherzer now ranks 12th all-time, having passed all-time greats Fergie Jenkins, Pedro Martinez, Bob Gibson, Curt Schilling, CC Sabathia and John Smoltz last season...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

**OPENING UP:** Scherzer made his seventh career Opening Day start...Earned the victory as the Mets downed the Marlins, 5-3...Tossed 6.0 innings and allowed three runs on four hits with two walks and six punchouts...All three runs scored in the sixth inning after Scherzer tossed 5.0 scoreless frames to begin his day...Scherzer exited with the score tied, 3-3, then the Mets rallied for two runs in the top of the seventh to leave him in line for career victory No. 202...He improved to 2-3 in season openers and has a 2.96 ERA (15 ER/45.2 IP) in those games...He became the first pitcher ever to start both for and against the Mets on Opening Day...Madison Bumgarner (Arizona) is the only other active pitcher who has started for and against the same team on Opening Day in his career.

**2022 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS:** Won his Mets debut on April 8 in Washington against his former team...Tossed 7.0 one-hit innings, allowing just one run while racking up 10 strikeouts in his Mets home debut vs. San Francisco on April 19...Threw 7.0 shutout frames, punched out 10 and allowed only two hits in his hometown at the Cardinals on April 25, setting the stage for New York's five-run, ninth-inning comeback rally...Threw 6.0 scoreless innings and struck out a season-high 11 batters in his return from the IL on July 5 at Cincinnati...Blanked the Yankees over 7.0 innings on his 38th birthday, July 27, in a 3-2 Subway Series victory at Citi Field... Defeated Atlanta three times over an eight-start stretch (July 11, August 6 and August 17)... Earned his 200th career victory in the Mets' playoff-clinching win at Milwaukee on September 19, throwing 6.0 perfect innings in his first start after a two-week stay on the IL.

**ALWAYS IMPROVING:** Scherzer set a career-best mark with a 2.29 ERA last season after posting what was then a career-best 2.46 ERA in 2021...No other pitcher since 1913 has thrown 130.0 or more innings and posted an ERA below 2.50 in both his age 36 and age 37 seasons...Only five pitchers have done that twice at any point after turning 36: Hoyt Wilhelm (three times - 1959, 1964-65), Eddie Plank (three times - 1915-17), Randy Johnson (2001-02), Dennis Martinez (1991-92) and Babe Adams (1919-20).
