Combination of Rays wins and Yankees losses needed to win the AL East title for the fifth time in franchise history and the first since earning back-to-back division crowns from 2020-21.

RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their final homestand of the season, a nine-game stretch against the Astros (3-0), Athletics (2-0, one play), and Red Sox (three to play), this afternoon at Tropicana Field... have won five straight, seven of eight, nine of 11, 14 of 19, and 16 of their last 22 games to improve to a season-high 33 games over .500 for the first time since finishing 2023 at 36 games above the mark (99-63)...including this series, have won three straight sets, are 5-1-1 in their last seven series, and 11-5-1 in their last 17...are an MLB-best 36-17 across their last 52 games (July 20-pres.)...following this series, each of their final three opponents currently occupy a postseason spot (vs. BOS, at NYY, at PHI)...have qualified for the postseason for the 10th time in 29 seasons and sixth time in the last eight years (2019-pres.)...are attempting to finish a season with the AL's best record for the fifth time, joining their division titles in 2021, 2020, 2010, and 2008...lead the second-place Yankees by 4.5 games in the AL East standings, holding an advantage of 3.0 games or more each day since Aug. 3...have led the division for 82 consecutive days (June 27-pres.) and spent a total of 122 days at the helm overall as well as 121 days with the AL's best winning pct., both of which are franchise records.

- ★ The Rays won their fifth straight game last night, 4-3, scoring all four of their runs in the first two innings...they tallied five doubles (or more) for the fourth time this season, first since July 11 vs. SEA (5)...this includes three straight two-out doubles in the opening frame.
- ★ They improved to an MLB-best 24-14 (.632) in one-run games, including four straight wins and a 10-3 mark in their last 13 one-run affairs (July 26-pres.)...it's on pace to surpass the 2008 Rays (29-18/.617) for the franchise's best winning pct. in one-run games over a non-shortened season, with only the 2020 squad posting a better mark overall (14-5/.737).
- ★ The Rays have won five straight games (or more) for the MLB-most seventh time this season, tied for their second-most such streaks in a campaign (also: 2019, 2018, 2010) behind 2021 (8)...their current five-game streak is the longest active stretch in the majors.
- ★ Rays pitchers have allowed 17 runs over the last eight games, turning in a majors'-best 2.15 ERA (71.0IP, 17ER) and 0.83 WHIP in that span (Sept. 8-pres.)...the rotation has yielded one or zero runs in six of those eight contests, pitching to a 1.39 ERA (45.1IP, 7ER)...Rays starters have gone 5.0 IP or more while yielding two runs or fewer in all eight games, tied for the third-longest streak in club history (see table on the right).
- ★ Dating back to July 20, the Rays are a majors'-best 26-4 when scoring first, including five straight wins (Sept. 8-pres.), and 10-13 when allowing the first run...they have played the opening run in three straight home games after going a season-high six straight games at Tropicana Field in which they permitted the first tally (Aug. 30-Sept. 12), their longest home streak since April 15-25, 2025.
- ★ The Rays can stake out a 5.0-game lead atop the AL East with a win today, which would mark their largest since Aug. 19 (5.0)...in the divisional era (since 1969), 44 of 45 teams to hold a 5.0-game in the AL East after the calendar flips to September have gone on to win the division...only the 1978 Red Sox failed hold their lead, finishing second.
- ★ The Rays have entered the finale of a three-game series with an opportunity to sweep the set a club-record and MLB-leading 19 times, ahead of the Dodgers (18), going 15-4 (.789) in those contests...only the Padres (8-1/.889) have a better winning pct. ...this includes a 6-1 record since the All-Star break and a 10-1 mark at home on the year, with the lone loss coming on July 12 vs. SEA (8-2).

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Today, the Rays reinstated **INF Taylor Walls** (right hip flexor strain) from the 10-day IL and optioned **INF Nick Madrigal** to Triple-A Durham.

WHAT'S AT STAKE—With a win today, the Rays would:

- ★ Improve to a season-high 34 games above .500...reach 93 wins in a season for the sixth time, joining 2023 (99), 2021 (100), 2019 (96), 2010 (96), and 2008 (97).
- ★ Tally their MLB-best 16th sweep, extending a franchise record...become the 15th club in the Wild Card era (since 1995) to reach the mark, first since the 2022 Dodgers (16) and the first AL club since the 2019 Astros (17)...along with that Astros squad, become one of six AL clubs to turn the trick in that timeframe, also joining the 2001 Athletics (17), 2001 Mariners (16), 1998 Yankees (21), and 1997 Orioles (18)...overall, become the 19th AL club in the expansion era (since 1961) to reach the mark.
- ★ Record their 11th series sweep at home, also extending a team record...join the 2022 Yankees (11) as the only AL clubs to accomplish the feat since 2009.
- ★ Complete an undefeated season series vs. an AL team for the second time, joining 2018 vs. KC (7-0).
- ★ Sweep the Athletics for the eighth time and the sixth at Tropicana Field, first since April 7-9, 2023.

DREW DAY—The Rays have won each of **Drew Rasmussen's** 10 starts since the All-Star break, with the right-hander going 7-0 with a 2.07 ERA (61.0IP, 14ER) in those games, the AL's third-best ERA to **LAA Reid Detmers** (1.65) and **NYY Cam Schlichter** (1.77)...it ties **Blake Snell** (Aug. 10-Sept. 29, 2018) for the longest single-season team winning streak in a pitcher's starts in Rays history, one shy of the overall record set by **Matt Moore** (11GS) from Sept. 22, 2012-May 19, 2013...the 10-start streak is MLB's longest out of the All-Star break since the Brewers' 11-start streak in **MIL Quinn Priester's** outings in 2025 and the longest by an AL pitcher since **MIN Johan Santana** in 2006 (12GS)...the last longer streak in MLB belongs to **LAD Max Scherzer** (13GS) in 2021.

- ★ Rasmussen has started the finale of a three-game set with the Rays having the opportunity to sweep the series an MLB-most seven times, going 5-1 with a 1.29 ERA (42.0IP, 6ER), a 0.67 WHIP, 7 BB and 49 SO...the Rays are 6-1 in those games, including five straight wins (June 10-pres.).
- ★ Today, he will be opposed by his former rotation-mate, **Jeffrey Springs**...in 2023, both pitchers opened the season with 13.0 straight scoreless innings during the Rays historic 13-0 start—those streaks remain tied for the third-longest season-opening stretches by starters in club history, trailing only 14.0-IP streaks by **Matt Moore** (2013) and **Mark Hendrickson** (2006).

THE CAMINER-SHOW—Between his walk-off homers on Mon. vs. ATH and Fri. vs. HOU, **Junior Caminero** became the sixth Ray with multiple walk-off plate appearances in the same homestand, first since **José Lobaton** on Aug. 16 and 18, 2013, and the first with multiple walk-off home runs, according to Elias...he joined **Brandon Lowe** (2023), **Johnny Damon** (2011), **Evan Longoria** (2011), and **Carl Crawford** (2003) as the only Rays to record multiple walk-off homers in a season...this marks the majors' first instance of a player recording multiple walk-off blasts in a homestand since **BAL Colton Cowser** turned the trick earlier this season from May 24-25 vs. DET.

- ★ He has homered four times in his last 10 games to take sole possession of the AL lead with 41 HR, two ahead of second-ranked **HOU Yordan Alvarez** (39HR)...Caminero is attempting to join **Carlos Peña** (2009, 39HR) as the only Rays to earn at least a share of the AL home run crown...Peña's 39 bombs that season matched **NYY Mark Teixeira** for the Junior Circuit lead...Caminero would need 5 HR across the Rays final 11 games to match Peña's club record from 2007 (46HR).
- ★ He has gone deep 22 times at Tropicana Field, one shy of the most long balls at home in a season in Rays history, a mark set by Peña in 2007 (23HR).

THE COUNTDOWN—Several Rays are within reach of notable accomplishments:

- ★ **Chandler Simpson** (.3098) trails AL Triple Crown candidate **HOU Yordan Alvarez** (.3100) by decimal points for the AL batting title, attempting to join **Yandy Diaz** (2023) as the only Rays to pace the AL in average...he could become the sixth player in AL/NL history to win a batting title within their first two major league seasons and the third since 1942 alongside **SEA Ichiro Suzuki** (.350, 1st season - 2001) and Rays Hall of Famer **BOS Wade Boggs** (.361, 2nd season - 1983).
- ★ Simpson leads the AL in singles (145), is 11st in stolen bases (42), and is T2nd in triples (6)—only four players (5x) in the modern era (since 1900) have paced the AL or NL in all three categories over a full season: **LAD Maury Wills** in 1962, **NYY Snuffy Stirnweiss** in 1944, **SLB George Sisler** in 1922, and **DET Ty Cobb** in both 1917 and 1911 (Elias)...no Ray has ever paced the AL in singles, and only **Carl Crawford** (4x, last: 2010) and **Mallex Smith** (2018) have had the most three-baggers...Crawford (4x, last: 2007) and **José Caballero** (2024) are the only Rays to lead the league in steals.
- ★ With his single last night vs. ATH, Simpson tied Crawford's club record from 2003 (145)...the 145 singles are the most by an AL hitter since **HOU Jose Altuve** (145) and **BOS Dustin Pedroia** (149) in 2016.
- ★ **Bryan Baker** (40SV) is attempting to join **Alex Colomé** (2017, 47SV) as the only Rays to pace the majors in saves over a full season...he has converted 29 straight save opportunities and could become the 12th AL pitcher (13x) since saves became an official statistic in 1969 to record a streak of 30 consecutive saves or more within a single season and the second since 2017 along with **CLE Emmanuel Clase** (34) in 2024).
- ★ Between **Junior Caminero** (HR), Simpson (SB), and Baker (SV), the Rays could become the third club since 1969 to have the league leaders (AL or NL) in homers, stolen bases, and saves on the same team, joining Cleveland in 1995 (HR - **Albert Belle**; SB - **Kenny Lofton**; SV - **Jose Mesa**) and Cincinnati in 1970 (HR - **Johnny Bench**; SB - **Bobby Tolan**; SV - **Wayne Granger**), according to Elias.
- ★ The pitching staff leads the majors with a 1.14 WHIP, which would surpass the club record established in 2022 (1.15) and signal the lowest mark since the 2024 Mariners (1.08)...the Rays are attempting to post the majors' best WHIP for the third time, joining 2023 (1.18) and 2012 (1.17).
- ★ The Rays need to go 3-8 or better over their final 11 contests to record their sixth straight month with a .500 record or better...it would mark the first time in franchise history they have finished a full season with a .500 record or better in every month and tie the team record for consecutive such months (also: July 2019-Sept./Oct. 2020).

TODAY'S START—**Drew Rasmussen** will toe the rubber today for his 29th start of the campaign and his 159th career appearance (110th start)...he ranks highly among qualified AL arms in strikeout-to-walk ratio (1st, 5.93), opp. on-base pct. (2nd, .246), walks per 9.0 innings (2nd, 1.52), WHIP (2nd, 0.92), opp. AVG (3rd, .204), opp. OPS (3rd, .554), opp. SLG (3rd, .308), ERA (5th, 2.81), and quality starts (5th, 17).

- He is one of two active pitchers with four career wins or more and zero losses against the A's, alongside **BAL Andrew Kittredge**...with a win today, he would become the only active pitcher in the majors with five wins or more and zero losses against the club.
- Rasmussen's active seven-game winning streak is tied for the ninth longest in TB history, three shy of the record (**Jalen Beeks** - 10W) and the longest since **Shane McClanahan**'s eight-game streak (March 30–May 24, 2023).
- The Rays won each of his last 10 starts since the All-Star break and 19 of 28 this year...the 10-game team winning streak in his outings is tied for the second-longest by a Rays starter in club history with **Blake Snell** (Aug. 10–Sept. 29, 2018) and is behind **Matt Moore**'s 11-start streak from Sept. 22, 2012 to May 19, 2013.
- Ranks highly among AL arms in day games (min. 50.OIP) in wins (T1st, 7), opp. SLG (2nd, .289), opp. OBP (3rd, .249), opp. OPS (3rd, .538), WHIP (3rd, 0.91), and opp. average (5th, .194).
- He has pitched 588.2 career innings with the Rays, ninth most in franchise history...with 4.0 IP or more today, he will surpass **Matt Garza** (592.1IP) for eighth-most innings pitched in franchise history.
- Since 2021, his 2.79 ERA (605.2IP, 188ER) is tied for third among MLB pitchers (min 500.OIP) with **MIL Brandon Woodruff**, and behind **LAD Shohei Ohtani** (2.68) and **ATL Chris Sale** (2.75).

LAST TIME OUT—Spun 7.0 innings of one-run ball on Sept. 11 vs. HOU (7.OIP, 8H, ER, 4SO)... marked his team-leading 17th quality start of the season, the most by a Ray since **Zach Eflin** (also 17) in 2023...recorded a 1-2-3 1st inning before forcing **Christian Walker** to ground into a double play to end the 2nd frame...his lone blemish came on an RBI-groundout by **Yainer Diaz** in the 4th inning...of his season-high eight hits allowed, one went for extra bases (**Isaac Paredes**, 2B - 4th inn.)...retired nine of his final 12 batters faced before handing the ball to **Tyler Wells** to begin the 8th inning.

- Rasmussen has gone 7.0 innings or more in back-to-back starts (Sept. 5–pres.) for the second time in his career (also: 3G, June 5-16, 2026).
- The outing went down as his 109th start in a Rays uniform, surpassing **Blake Snell** and **Jeremy Hellickson** for seventh most in franchise history, six shy of sixth-place **Alex Cobb** (115GS).
- Across his last four starts (Aug. 24–pres.), opposing hitters are 18-for-93 (.194) and have been limited to three extra-base hits (2 2B, HR)...delivered 6.0 innings or more and allowed two runs or fewer in each of those outings.

BRING THE "A" GAME—Across six career appearances (five starts) against the Athletics, Rasmussen has pitched to a 4-0 record with a 2.67 ERA (27.OIP, 8ER) and 24 strikeouts...the A's are one of two clubs in which he has four wins or more and zero losses against in his career (also: MIA, 4-0)...the Rays are 5-1 lifetime when Rasmussen starts against the A's.

- Rasmussen has made 27 career appearances (23 starts) against AL West clubs, pitching to an 11-4 record with a 2.98 ERA (126.2IP, 42ER), 116 strikeouts, and a 0.90 WHIP in those contests...his career WHIP against the AL West is tied for the second lowest among major league arms (min. 100.OIP) with **Clayton Kershaw**, trailing only **ATL Chris Sale** (0.89) since the division was established in 1969...in six starts this season against the division, he is 2-1 with a 3.60 ERA (35.OIP, 14ER), 28 strikeouts, and a .211 (27-for-128) opp. average.
- He is 11-4 with a 3.04 ERA (115.1IP, 39ER), 118 strikeouts, and a .212 (90-for-424) opp. average in 20 starts against AL clubs this season.

IN TIP TROP SHAPE—The right-hander is slated to make his 15th home start of the season today...so far this year, he is 8-3 with a 3.05 ERA (79.2IP, 27ER) and a 1.00 WHIP at Tropicana Field...the right-hander could become the fifth pitcher in franchise history with a sub-1.00 home WHIP across a single season (min. 80.OIP), and join the following who have turned the trick: **Charlie Morton** (2019, 0.96), **Blake Snell** (2018, 0.87), **Alex Cobb** (2017, 0.96), and **David Price** (2012, 0.94) as the only Rays to do so.

- Min. 250.0 IP, Rasmussen's 2.77 career home ERA as a Ray is the second best in franchise history behind Snell's 2.50 (2016-2020)...his 20 home wins as a Ray are tied for 10th most in team history with **Matt Garza** and **Jeremy Hellickson**, one shy of **Matt Moore** and **Jake Odorizzi** (both 21) for eighth most.

STARDOM—Since the All-Star break, Rasmussen has gone 7-0 with a 2.07 ERA (61.OIP, 14ER) across 10 starts...despite not factoring into the decision in each of his last three outings, he is the first pitcher in franchise history to win his first seven starts following the All-Star break.

- His seven wins are tied for the 10th most by a Rays pitcher in the second half of any season in franchise history and is one shy of being tied for fourth most (6x, last: **Tyler Glasnow**, 2023).
- His .769 (20-6) winning percentage after the All-Star break as a Ray is the highest in franchise history (min. 30GS) and the third-highest mark since the inaugural All-Star Game in 1933, trailing **Julio Urias** (.844) and **Johnny Beasley** (.826).
