**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets returned to action yesterday and defeated the Dodgers, 9-4, last night...The Amazins' are seeking their fifth straight series victory of the season...Since starting the season 0-5, the Mets have gone 11-3...The Mets hit the road for their second trip of the season, a six-game trip (1-0) to Los Angeles-NL (1-0) and San Francisco (three games).

**ROSTER MOVES:** Prior to today's game, the Mets made the following roster moves - Placed catcher Francisco Alvarez on the 15-Day IL with a left thumb sprain...Selected catcher Tomás Nido from Triple-A Syracuse...He will wear #3...Designated LHP Kolton Ingram for assignment.

**LET'S GO STREAKING:** The Mets are on a season-high five-game winning streak...Their longest winning streak in 2023 was six games, which they accomplished from July 1-7.

**I LOVE LA:** Brandon Nimmo is a lifetime .383 (23-60) hitter with a .456 OBP, .583 SLG with 11 runs, three doubles, three homers, six RBI and six walks in 19 games at Dodger Stadium...Pete Alonso has hit seven home runs and hit .338 (23-68) in 16 career games at the ballpark...Harrison Bader is 6-15 with in four career games at the yard.

**HIP, HIP JOSÉ:** Today, José Buttó makes his third start of the season...The right-handed pitched tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his last start on April 14 vs. Kansas City...He surrendered only two his, one walk and struck out a career-high nine hitters...He owns a 0.75 ERA (1 ER/12.0 IP) this season with four walks and 15 punchouts.

**HEY MR. DJ:** DJ Stewart has reached base safely in nine straight games, posting a .467 OBP in that span...He has savely hit in five straight contests, batting .400 (6-15) with three runs, two doubles, two home runs, eight RBI, one walks with a 1.345 OPS in that span.

**FRANKLY SPEAKING:** Francisco Lindor has safely reached base in 11 straight games...He has posted a .327 OBP in that span...Over the last five games, Lindor is hitting .350 (7-20) with five runs, one double, one home run, two walks, one steal with a .409 OBP and a .550 SLG...He is batting .286 (6-21) against left-handed pitchers in 2024...This includes a .524 SLG.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** New York begins their second road trip of the year...The team is 5-2 away from Citi Field...New York is batting .296/.364/.462 on the road this year...Their .296 batting average and .364 OBP is the best in the majors, while their .462 SLG is second-best...The Mets have outscored their opponents 50-33 on the road this season...The Mets went 32-49 on the road in 2023...The team posted a 4.73 ERA while batting .241/.316/.401...The Mets went 47-34 on the road in 2022.

**THAT'S OFFENSIVE:** In 11 games since April 6, the Mets are batting .296/.364/.459 with 80 runs, 22 doubles, one triple, 15 home runs, 41 walks with an .822 OPS...Their .296 average and .364 OBP are the best in the majors, while their .822 OPS is second-best...The Mets have outscored their opponents 80-49 in that span...That compares to a .167/.272/.264 slashline with 16 runs, four doubles, six home runs, 16 RBI with a .536 OSP in the previous seven games.

**HEY BABY:** Harrison Bader matched his career-best with four hits last night...He also collected four hits on September 25, 2021 at Chicago-NL...He has safely hit in 10 of his last 12 games...Bader is batting 17-45 (.378) over that span with nine runs, two doubles, one home run, six RBI, two walks, four steals with a .417 OBP...He has raised his batting average to .333 (19-57) for the year.

**A STARLING IS BORN:** Starling Marte is batting .315 (17-54) with 11 runs, two doubles, two home runs, seven RBI, four walks with an .825 OPS in 12 games since April 4...He has safely hit in 10 of those 12 games...The Mets are 11-3 in that span...He is 9-20 with three-extra base hits against left-handed pitchers this year...Overall, Marte is batting .275/.326/.425 with six extra-base hits in 19 contests in 2024.

**HERE'S THE PITCH:** New York owns the lowest ERA in the National League with a 3.09 (59 ER/172.0 IP) mark...Their 185 strikeouts are fourth in the Senior Circuit...The Mets bullpen has posted a 2.82 ERA (24 ER/76.2 IP) with 30 walks and 96 strikeouts...Their 2.82 ERA is the second-best in the Senior Circuit...Their 96 strikeouts from the bullpen lead the major leagues.

**DODGERS-METS NOTES:** The Mets have gone 8-6 against the Dodgers since 2022...This includes a 5-3 record at Dodger Stadium.

**BROOKS IS OFF AND RUNNING:** Brooks Raley has yet to allow a run in eight games (7.0 IP) this season...He has surrendered two hits, walked three and struck out nine.

**ADAM'S SONG:** After allowing two runs in his first two appearances, Adam Ottavino has made six scoreless appearances...He has not allowed a hit or a walk in those 6.1 innings, striking out 11 in that span and stranding one inherited runner...He is 1-0 with a 2.16 ERA (2 ER/8.1IP) this season.

**TAYLOR MADE:** Tyrone Taylor is batting .341 (14-41) with three runs, two doubles, one home run, 10 RBI, with three walks, a .378 OBP and a .463 SLG in 15 games this season...He has safely reached base in all but three games this year.

**TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT:** As a team, the Mets are batting .286/.348/.460 against left-handed pitchers this year...Their .286 average is fourth in the major leagues, as does their .460 SLG ranks third...This compares to a .238/.324/.363 slashline against righties.

**SWING AND NO MISS:** Mets batters have struck out 145 times this year...That is the third-fewest in the major leagues...Overall, the team has posted an 19.6 strikeout percentage, which is the fifth-lowest in the majors and second in the National League...Francisco Lindor ranks seventh in the majors, striking out only 11.1% of the time, while Jeff McNeil places ninth at 11.4%.

### BUTTO NEWS & NOTES

**SECOND TIME AROUND:** Today, José Buttó makes his third start of the season...The right-handed pitcher tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his last start on April 14 vs. Kansas City...He surrendered only two hits, one walk and struck out a career-high nine hitters...He owns a 0.75 ERA (1 ER/12.0 IP) this season with four walks and 15 punchouts.

**QUALITY EATS:** Dating back to September 6, 2023, Buttó has pitched to a 2.52 ERA (11 ER/39.1 IP), allowing 13 walks and striking out 43 in seven starts...Five of those starts have been quality starts and the right-hander has held opposing batters to a .186 (26-140) average during that span.

**SPRING AWAKENING:** Made four appearances (two starts) during Grapefruit League play...Went 1-0 with a 0.90 ERA (1 ER/10.0 IP) with two walks and nine strikeouts...Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse.

**DOWN ON THE FARM:** Made one start for Triple-A Syracuse this year...Started the second game of the season on March 30 vs. Rochester...Took the loss, allowing three runs (two earned) on five hits with four walks and two strikeouts and one home run allowed.

**23 AND ME:** Last season, Buttó pitched to a 1-3 record with a 3.16 ERA (13 ER/37.0 IP) in seven appearances as a starter compared to an 0-1 record with a 7.20 ERA (4 ER/5.0 IP) in two relief appearances...He held opponents to a .212 average...Had a 3.29 ERA (10 ER/27.1 IP) in his final five starts of the year...Allowed two or fewer runs in four of those starts, three of which were quality starts...Was second to only Kodai Senga among Mets rookies in strikeouts with 38...In a three-start stretch from September 6-18, pitched to a 2.08 ERA (4 ER/17.1 IP) with a 0.98 WHIP and held batters to a .194 (12-62) average.

**PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Buttó made two starts during the first week of the season for Triple-A Syracuse last year, going 1-1 with a 1.86 ERA (2 ER/9.2 IP) to go along with eight strikeouts and five walks...For his efforts, he was named International League Pitcher of the Week...He also earned the honor during the final week of the 2022 season after throwing 7.0 shutout innings, allowing two hits and fanning 11 in a September 21 start at Worcester.

**DEBUTTO:** RHP José Buttó made his 2022 season debut on April 16 at Oakland in his last start...He threw 5.0 innings and allowed one run on five hits with four walks and two strikeouts...He did not factor into the decision as the Mets won in 10 innings, 4-3.

**2022:** He made his major league debut on August 21 in a start at Philadelphia...In that start, he threw 4.0 innings and allowed seven runs on nine hits with two walks and five strikeouts...New York came from behind to win, 10-9, thanks to a pair of late-inning home runs by Mark Canha.

- Has reached base in 11 straight games dating back to April 7.
- Became the fourth Met ever to join the 30-30 club (Also: Howard Johnson (1987, 1989, 1991), Darryl Strawberry (1987) and David Wright (2007))...Joined Barry Larkin (1996), Alex Rodriguez (1998), Jimmy Rollins (2007), Hanley Ramirez (2008) and Bobby Witt Jr. (2023) as the only shortstops in major league history with a 30-30 season...Joined Johnson, Rollins, José Cruz (2001), Carlos Beltrán (2004) and José Ramirez (2018) as the only switch hitters with a 30-30 season.
- Became the first Met to reach the 30+ stolen base mark since Eric Young Jr. (30 in 2014).
- Has four seasons of at least 30 home runs, tied with Miguel Tejada and Ernie Banks for the second-most such seasons by a shortstop in major league history...Only Alex Rodriguez (seven) has had more 30+ home run seasons as a shortstop.

- Launched his 150th career home run on April 17 vs. Pittsburgh...Became the 34th player in major league history to record 150+ home runs and 300+ stolen bases...Is the only active player to accomplish the feat and is the third Dominican-born player to accomplish the feat joining Juan Samuel and César Cedeño.
- Is batting .315/.362/.463 with 11 runs and seven RBI over his last 12 games...Is tied for seventh in the majors in runs (11) and tied for ninth in hits (17) since April 6.
- Went 2-4 with a run, a walk and two stolen bases on April 6 vs. Cincinnati...Was his 40th career game with multiple stolen bases, the third-most such games in the majors since 2012.
- Lined a solo home run in his first at-bat of the season on March 29 vs. Milwaukee...Has homered in each of his three home openers as a Met.
- Appeared in 86 games, his fewest since 2017 when he played in 77 contests...Only appeared in four games after the All-Star Game, including his final contest on August 5...Was on the IL from July 20 - August 4 with migraines and again from August 7 (retroactive to August 6) - end of season with a right groins strain.
- Finished tied for 16th in the National League with 24 stolen bases in 2023...Ranks first among active players with 341 stolen bases...Posted his ninth season with 20 or more stolen bases...Only 35 players in the Integration Era (since 1947) have had more 20-steal seasons...He has swiped 20 or more bags in nine of 11 seasons since 2013...No other player in the majors has done so more than seven times during that span.
