## SNAKEBITES

**THE NL CHAMPS:** Last season, the D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23).

**LAST GAME:** The D-backs won the series with a 6-0 victory @ Dodgers, the D-backs' first series win @ Dodger Stadium since April 13-15, 2018 (2-1) and the first D-backs' shutout win @ Dodgers since Sept. 4, 2017 (13-0).

◆ **Ryne Nelson**, who entered after opener **Brandon Hughes** (0 ER in 0.2 IP), tossed 5.0 shutout frames (5 H, 3 BB, 5 K).

◆ **Corbin Carroll** had a 2-run triple and scored on a wild pitch in the fifth inning.

◆ **Christian Walker** hit a solo homer in the sixth inning and **Ketel Marte** added a solo blast in the eighth.

**D-BACKS IN COOPERSTOWN:** The D-backs will be well represented in Cooperstown this weekend for tomorrow's first-ever Hall of Fame East-West Classic: A Tribute to the Negro Leagues All-Star Game...**Chris Young** ('06-'12) is captain of Team East, which features **Josh Barfield** (former front office), **Scott Hairston** ('04-'07), **Edwin Jackson** ('10), **Adam Jones** ('19) & **Melvin Mora** ('11)...on Team West are **Tony Sipp** ('13) & **Justin Upton** ('07-'12).

**SEWALD'S STRIKEOUTS 4 KIDS:** Paul & Molly Sewald launched (locally) Sewald's Strikeouts 4 Kids, which aims to give local children a space free from abuse and neglect by creating strong and successful families, will benefit Child Crisis Arizona ([childcrisisaz.org](https://childcrisisaz.org)), which provides emergency shelter, foster care, counseling and more to support our community's most vulnerable children, youth and families.

• The program, in its third year after launching in Seattle, started after the duo had their first daughter, realized the responsibilities of raising a child and created the program to ensure more families had the resources they needed to create a healthy and safe environment for their families.

• The Sewalds have pledged to donate \$1,000 to Child Crisis for every strikeout thrown by the D-backs closer this season and encourage fans to make a pledge at [dbacks.com/ss4k](https://dbacks.com/ss4k)...the Arizona Diamondbacks Foundation will make a matching gift at the end of the season.

**OFFICIAL SCORING CHANGE:** MLB made an official scoring change for May 20 @ Dodgers...in the bottom of the 1st Ohtani reached on what was originally ruled a single...this has been changed to an error by the pitcher. Affected statistics:

**VS. MARLINS:** The D-backs went 2-4 vs. Marlins last season, 1-2 at home and 1-2 on the road.

◆ Since 2022, are 7-5 vs. Marlins, 3-3 at home.

**AT THE DISH:** **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** has hit safely in 5 straight games (.412, 7-for-17, 1 HR, 2 RBI).

◆ **Corbin Carroll** has 1 hit in each of his last 5 games (.217, 5-for-23, 1 2B, 3 3B, 2 RBI, 1 BB).

**EL PIKE KEEPS GOING:** **Ketel Marte's** career-best 21-game hitting streak (previous was 16 games) is the longest streak, active or overall, in the Majors this season...since last season, it's the second-longest streak (25 G, Marcus Semien/TEX)...since 2021, it is tied for the eighth-longest (also Nick Castellanos/CIN/2021) with the longest being a 27-gamer by Trea Turner/LAD in 2021).

• His streak is 1 of 5 by a D-back of 20+ games...his 21-gamer is tied for fourth-longest in club history with Danny Bautista (2004) behind only 24 by Tony Womack (2000), 26 by Paul Goldschmidt (2013) and 30 by Luis Gonzalez (1999).

◆ Marte's 21-game on-base streak is the second-longest active streak in the Majors behind the 27-game streak for Luis Arraez/SD (also the eighth-longest such streak this season).

**VS. LEFTIES:** **Ketel Marte**, against lefties, has hit safely in 8 straight games (.314, 11-for-35)/.826 OPS) and in 13 of 15 games overall with a .348 average (23-for-66)/.948 OPS with 4 doubles, 3 homers, 4 RBI and 6 walks.

◆ **Randal Grichuk**, in his last 12 games vs. lefties, is hitting .368 (7-for-19)/.842 OPS with 2 doubles and 2 RBI.

◆ **Blaze Alexander** is hitting .302 (13-for-43)/.899 OPS with 3 doubles, 2 homers, 6 RBI and 6 walks vs. lefties.

**JOC ON A ROLL:** **Joc Pederson** has hit safely in 6 of his last 7 games at a .385 clip (10-for-26)/1.077 OPS with 2 doubles, 2 homers and 8 RBI.

• Among all designated hitters (min. 75 PA; stats only as DH), is second in .333 average (Shohei Ohtani/LAD, .348), third in 1.010 OPS (Shohei Ohtani/LAD, 1.059; Marcell Ozuna/ATL, 1.036) and fourth with 16 extra-base hits (Shohei Ohtani/LAD, 31; Marcell Ozuna/ATL, 24; Giancarlo Stanton/NYY, 19).

**NEWMAN AS THE STARTER:** **Kevin Newman** has hit safely in 11 of his last 15 starts, batting .377 (20-for-53)/.949 OPS with 6 doubles, 1 triple, 3 RBI and 4 walks.

◆ In his last 7 home games, since May 5, is hitting .375 (9-for-24)/.923 OPS with 3 doubles, 2 RBI and 2 walks.

**STARTERS STALLING OPPONENTS:** D-backs starting pitchers have allowed 3 or fewer runs in 12 of their last 15 starts, since May 7 (includes opener starts by Joe Mantiplay on May 20 @ Dodgers and Brandon Hughes on May 22 @ Dodgers)...of the 39 runs allowed, 13 games have totaled 25 runs while 14 runs came in 2 outings.

**BULLPEN LOCKING IN:** The D-backs bullpen from the seventh inning on, over its last 10 games since May 12, has a 2.30 ERA (7 ER in 27.1 IP), .240 opponent average (24-for-100)/.650 OPS with 8 walks and 24 strikeouts...this stretch includes 8 games without allowing a run from the seventh inning on.

### NEXT STARTER: LHP JORDAN MONTGOMERY (2-2, 4.98)

◆ The team has won his last 3 starts while he is 1-0 with a 4.42 ERA (9 ER in 18.1 IP).

◆ The team is 2-1 in his 3 home starts.

◆ In 3 starts vs. Marlins, is 1-0 with a 2.12 ERA (4 ER in 17.0 IP), .254 opp average, 4 walks and 16 strikeouts.

**AT A GLANCE:** Sixth season with the D-backs.

- 2023 All-MLB First Team, NL Cy Young finalist and D-backs' Most Valuable Pitcher by the Arizona chapter of the BBWAA for the third time (2020, '22, '23) after going 17-9 with a 3.47 ERA (81 ER in 210.0 IP) and 220 strikeouts over 34 starts.

**GALLEN'S UNCORK FOR A CAUSE:** Zac Gallen hosted Uncork For A Cause benefiting the Zac Gallen Charitable Fund, his first charity event, on May 15...the 250 guests enjoyed an exclusive wine tasting soiree featuring limited-edition autographed bottles of Zac's very own Sonoma Reserve Red Wine...the event raised \$100,000 to be donated to St. Mary's Food Bank to ensure children will receive milk during the difficult summer months.

- ONCE A MARLIN:** Traded from Cardinals to Marlins on Dec. 14, 2017 with LHP David Castano, OF Magneuris Sierra and RHP Sandy Alcantara for OF Marcell Ozuna.
- Made his Major League debut on June 20, 2019 for the Marlins @ Cardinals (7-6 win, ND, 5.0 IP, 5 H, 1 R, 2 BB, 6 K).
  - Went 1-3 with a 2.72 ERA in 7 career starts with Marlins.
  - Acquired by D-backs on July 31, 2019 from the Marlins.

- WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW:** 10th start of the season, fifth @ home.
- Limiting opponents to a .117 average (7-for-60) with 30 strikeouts off his curveball.
  - In 3 starts (all quality) in May, is 2-1 with a 2.41 ERA (5 ER in 18.2 IP), .179 opponent average (12-for-67), 0.91 WHIP, 5 walks and 20 strikeouts.

- LAST START:** Opened with 6.0 scoreless frames and finished with a quality start in an 8-3 loss on May 18 vs. Tigers (3 ER in 6.2 IP, 7 H, 0 BB, 10 K).
- Did not allow a run until the seventh inning.
  - Was his seventh game as a D-back of 10 strikeouts and 0 walks, which ranks third in franchise history behind Randy Johnson (25) and Curt Schilling (15).

- VS. MARLINS:** Fourth career start vs. Marlins, second @ Chase Field.
- In 3 career starts, is 3-0 with a 1.35 ERA (3 ER in 20.0 IP), .169 opponent average (12-for-71), 0.65 WHIP, 1 walk and 19 strikeouts.

- VS. NL EAST @ HOME:** In 9 career home starts (2 with Marlins and 7 with D-backs) vs. the NL East, is 5-1 with a 1.88 ERA (12 R-11 ER in 52.2 IP)... the D-backs are 5-4 in those contests, including 4-1 in his last 5 starts.

- HOME COOKIN:** In 4 home starts, is 3-1 with a 1.52 ERA (4 ER in 23.2 IP), .200 opponent average (17-for-85), 1.01 WHIP, 7 walks, 26 strikeouts and 0 home runs allowed.
- Has allowed 1 run or fewer in 3 of his 4 home starts this season, including 2 starts with 0 runs.
  - His 20 home starts with 1 or fewer runs allowed since 2022, are tied for the most in the Majors with Brady Singer/KC and ahead of George Kirby/SEA, Sonny Gray/STL and Dylan Cease/SD who have 18.
  - Since 2022, his .110 opponent average with runners in scoring position at home (min. 30 starts) is the best in the Majors ahead of Jameson Taillon/CHC (.176), Justin Verlander/HOU (.180) and Yu Darvish/SD (.181).

- Ranks among D-backs pitchers all-time at home (min. 50 starts) in ERA (1st, 2.75), WHIP (1st, 1.04), home runs allowed (T-1st, 34), strikeouts per 9.0 innings (3rd, 10.24), walks (4th, 94), strikeout-to-walk ratio (4th, 4.16), wins (6th, 27) and strikeouts (7th, 391).
- In 16 home games in 2023, went 12-3 with a 2.47 ERA (28 ER in 102.0 IP), .230 opponent average (87-for-378), 1.03 WHIP, 120 strikeouts, and 7 home runs allowed.

- NL RANKINGS:** Ranks among NL starters in wins (T-6th, 5), ERA (9th, 3.02), home runs allowed (T-10th, 5) and walks (T-10th, 14).

- FRANCHISE RANKINGS:** Ranks among D-backs starters in franchise history in ERA (4th, 3.22), WHIP (4th, 1.10), strikeouts (6th, 741), wins (9th, 43) and quality starts (9th, 64).

- AMONG OTHER STARTERS:** Since 2022, his 13 starts of 6.0+ shutout innings, 6+ strikeouts and 3-or-fewer hits allowed are the most in the Majors ahead of Corbin Burnes/BAL (12), Blake Snell/SF (11) and Shohei Ohtani/LAD (10).

- CY YOUNG HOPEFUL:** Finished third (68 votes) in 2023 NL Cy Young Award voting behind Blake Snell/SD (204) and Logan Webb/SF (86).
- In 2022 voting, finished fifth (45 votes).
  - In 2020 voting, finished tied for ninth (2 votes)

- ALL-STAR STARTER:** Named to his first All-Star Game in 2023 at T-Mobile Park and earned the starting nod...tossed 1.0 scoreless inning with 1 strikeout.
- At 27 years old, became the youngest D-backs pitcher, third overall (fourth time) and first since Curt Schilling (35 in 2002) to start an All-Star Game (also: Randy Johnson; 36 in 2000 and 37 in 2001).
  - Was the youngest NL starting pitcher since Matt Harvey/NYM in 2013 (24).

- 2023 POSTSEASON HIGHLIGHTS:** Won the series-clincher in Game 2 of the National League Wild Card @ Brewers (2 ER in 6.0 IP) on Oct. 4, 2023.
- Won Game 2 of the NLDS @ Dodgers (2 ER in 5.1 IP) on Oct. 9, 2023.
  - In 6 postseason starts, went 2-3 with a 4.54 ERA (17 ER in 33.2 IP), .248 opponent average, 14 walks and 24 strikeouts.
  - Game 1 starter for NLCS @ Phillies and World Series @ Rangers.

- 2023 RECAP:** Set career highs in virtually all categories, including wins, innings and strikeouts in 2023.
- His combined 243.2 innings in the regular season and postseason combined were 24.0 more innings than any other pitcher.
  - Along with Gerrit Cole (209.0 IP, 222 K), were the only pitchers in the Majors in 2023 with 200.0+ innings and 200+ strikeouts.
  - In 2023, ranked among qualifying National League leaders in innings pitched (2nd, 210.0), starts (2nd, 34), wins (2nd, 17), strikeouts (3rd, 220), WHIP (6th, 1.12), win percentage (6th, .654), ERA (7th, 3.47) and opponent average (T-9th, .238).

- HOW HE STARTED:** Cardinals' third-round pick in the 2016 draft out of the University of North Carolina.
- Made his D-backs debut on August 7, 2019 vs. Phillies (6-1 win, W, 5.0 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 3 BB, 6 K).
