METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets dropped a doubleheader yesterday in Baltimore, losing Game 1, 3-1 and falling in Game 2, 7-3...New York is 20-27 on the road this year...The .444 winning percentage is the eighth-worst in the majors.

INTERLEAGUE: The Mets are 14-16 in Interleague play this season as opposed to 39-25 against the NL.

FOUR STARS: Major League Baseball yesterday named LHP David Peterson to the NL All-Star team...He is the fourth member of the Mets named to the team, joining Pete Alonso, Edwin Diaz and Francisco Lindor...The last time the Mets had four All-Stars was in 2022 when Alonso, Diaz, Jeff McNeil and Starling Marte were on the squad.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: On Sunday, Major League Baseball announced that first baseman Pete Alonso and RHP Edwin Diaz will join starting shortstop Francisco Lindor on the National League All-Star team...The 95th All-Star Game will take place on Tuesday, July 15 in Atlanta...Alonso was named to the All-Star team for the fifth time in his career, the most by any first baseman in team history – two more than Keith Hernandez...Alonso becomes the sixth player in franchise history to be named to five or more All-Star teams, joining Tom Seaver (nine), David Wright (seven), Mike Piazza (seven), Darryl Strawberry (seven) and Carlos Beltrán (five)...Diaz was named to an All-Star team for the third time in his career and second as a member of the Mets (also in 2022)...He was an American League All-Star in 2018 with Seattle...Lindor was announced as the National League starting shortstop on July 2...Lindor will make his first trip to the Midsummer Classic as a member of the Mets and his fifth overall after making four straight American League All-Star teams with Cleveland from 2016-19.

AIN'T LIFE GRAND: Brandon Nimmo played in his 1,000th career game in the first game of yesterday's doubleheader...He became the 11th player in franchise history to reach 1,000 games...Ed Kranepool holds the record appearing in 1,853 games.

GRAND GROUP: Four players in franchise history have played in 1,000 or more games, hit 100 or more homers and walked 500 or more times...Darryl Strawberry, Howard Johnson, David Wright and Brandon Nimmo.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Brandon Nimmo's 18 home runs are his most prior to the All-Star Break in any season...Over the last 41 games, Nimmo is batting .314 (50-159) with 25 runs, eight doubles, 10 homers, 26 RBI, 11 walks, nine stolen bases and a 1.023 OPS.

WALK THIS WAY: Juan Soto has drawn 75 walks, the most in team history prior to the All-Star Game...John Olerud is second with 74 walks in 1999...Soto had 83 free passes in 2023 with San Diego, the most prior to the break for him...The last player other than Soto with more walks in the first half was Mike Trout with 76 in 2019.

ONLY JUAN: Since May 30, Juan Soto is tied for first in the majors with 33 runs scored, first with a 1.141 OPS, second with a .469 OPS, fourth with a .672 slugging percentage and tied for fourth with 13 homers during that span.

JUAN-DERFUL: Overall, Soto leads the majors with 75 walks, is fourth in the majors with a .399 OBP, tied for fourth in the majors with 67 runs scored, ninth with a .901 OPS and tied for 11th with 21 homers.

21 FOR THE POLAR BEAR: Pete Alonso hit a game-tying two-run homer in the eighth-inning Tuesday...It was his 21st of the year...He has three homers in his last five games...It was the 13th time in his career he's hit a game-tying or go-ahead homer in the eighth inning or later...Alonso has six seasons of 20 or more homers, tying Mike Piazza and David Wright for the second-most such seasons in franchise history...Darryl Strawberry is first with eight seasons with 20 or more homes.

PEAK PETE PERFORMANCE: Alonso is second in the majors with 25 doubles, tied for seventh in the NL with 21 homers, sixth with a .916 OPS, seventh with a .376 OBP, tied for 10th with a .540 slugging percentage.

RONNY RAKES: Ronny Mauricio is batting .283 (13-46) with seven runs scored, two doubles, two homers, four RBI and four walks over his last 15 games dating to June 19.

WELCOME BACK: Kodai Senga returns to the mound tonight...His last start came on June 12 vs. Washington...Senga's 1.47 ERA is the lowest in the majors (min. 60.0 innings).

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: According to *Elias*, Francisco Lindor has hit 257 home runs and stolen 197 bases as a shortstop...Only two players in major league history had 200/200 (HR/SB) as a shortstop - Derek Jeter (255 HR, 351 SB) and Jimmy Rollins (229 HR, 469 SB).

KEEPIN' IT 100: Francisco Lindor picked up his 100th stolen base as a Met on Saturday becoming the 12th player in franchise history to reach the milestone...He is the sixth player to accumulate 100+ home runs and 100+ stolen bases as a Met...The others are Darryl Strawberry, Howard Johnson, Carlos Beltrán, David Wright and José Reyes...He is also one stolen base away from 200 in his career.

THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT: RHP Jonah Tong and OF Carson Benge have been selected to participate in the 2025 All Star Futures Game on Saturday, July 12 at Truist Park in Atlanta...Tong, the Mets #4 prospect and #92 prospect in MLB Pipeline's Top 100 prospects was selected by the Mets in the seventh round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Georgia Premier Academy...Benge, the Mets #3 prospect and #81 prospect in MLB Pipeline's Top 100, was promoted to Binghamton on June 23 after starting the year with High-A Brooklyn...Benge slashed .302/.417/.480 with an .897 OPS in 60 games with the Cyclones...He was selected by the Mets with the 19th overall pick in the 2024 draft out of Oklahoma State.

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Diaz has recorded 18 saves in 19 chances...The one blown save in LA on June 2, Diaz picked up the win as the Mets rallied for a 4-3 win in 10 innings...He is tied for fourth in the NL and tied for ninth in the majors with 18 saves...He has not allowed a run in 24 of his last 25 games dating back to April 26 with 37 strikeouts covering 25.0 innings.

JEFF McHITS: Is batting .273 (33-121) with 14 runs scored, five doubles, seven homers, 19 RBI and a .831 OPS over his last 35 games dating to May 27.

BRETT THE MET: Brett Baty is hitting .313 (15-48) with four doubles, one homer, six RBI, a .382 OPS and a .840 OPS in his last 16 games dating to June 23.

DON'T STEAL THIS ALBUM: Among catchers with 225 or more innings behind the plate this year, Torrens ranks second in the majors with 37.9 percent caught stealing (18 SB, 11 CS, 412.2 IP)...Only Salvador Perez is better (52.9 percent caught stealing, 8 SB, 8 CS, 410.0 IP).

PITCHING IN: On Tuesday, Alex Carrillo became the 36th different pitcher the Mets have used this season which is the most pitchers that any team in the majors has used this year...It is also already the fourth-most in a season in team history (behind 37 pitchers in 2023 and 2024 and 42 pitchers in 2021).

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered a strained right hamstring on June 12 against Washington and was placed on the 15-Day IL...Threw 5.2 scoreless innings before suffering the injury, allowing one hit and one walk with five strikeouts...He has allowed three or fewer earned runs in all 13 of his starts this season.

SO FAR SO GOOD: In 13 starts this season, Senga has gone 7-3 with a 1.47 ERA (12 ER/73.2 IP), 31 walks and 70 strikeouts...His 1.47 ERA is tied for the second lowest through a player's first 13 starts of a season in franchise history, trailing only Jacob deGrom's 0.69 ERA in 2021 and Jerry Koosman's 1.47 ERA...Courtesy of *Elias*...His 1.47 ERA is currently the third best in the majors and the second best in the NL...Opponents are only batting .195 (51-293) off Senga this season which is the eighth-best mark in the NL.

GOOD THINGS COME IN THREES: Has allowed three earned runs or less in 30 consecutive starts dating back to 6/23/23...It is the longest active streak in the majors and is the third-longest such streak in franchise history...He trails only Jacob deGrom's 40 starts (from 9/9/19-9/18/22) and deGrom's 31 starts (from 4/16/18-4/3/19).

GHOSTING THE BATS: In 2023 Senga's "ghost fork" accounted for 110 of his 202 strikeouts...The pitch had a 59.5% whiff rate and a 28.2% put away rate...Opponents managed just 18 hits in 163 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .110 batting average...In Senga's first 13 starts of the 2025 season, he has picked up 47 of his 70 strikeouts on the "ghost fork" and generated a 41.7% whiff rate, which is the fourth-best in the majors...His forkball has a run value of five which is tied for third in the majors.

SENGA GENESIS: Through Senga's first 43 career starts he has posted 281 strikeouts which is the 19th-most through a pitchers first 43 games in Major League history...It is the fifth most by a Met, trailing Dwight Gooden (first, 377), Matt Harvey (eighth, 308), Noah Syndergaard (ninth, 302) and Jacob deGrom (16th, 286)...It is also the third-most among Japanese-born pitchers in that span, trailing only Yu Darvish (348) and Hideo Nomo (342).

VS. KANSAS CITY: Senga has one previous start against the Royals, working 5.2 innings and allowing three runs on 11 hits with two walks and six strikeouts in the 4-0 loss on August 2, 2023.

2024 REWIND: He missed nearly the first four months of the 2024 season with a right shoulder capsule strain...Returned and made one regular season start on July 26 vs. Atlanta, throwing 5.1 innings and allowing two runs on two hits with nine strikeouts and one walk before exiting with an injury...Missed the rest of the regular season with a strained left calf...He made it back for the Postseason and he made his first career Postseason start on October 5 in Game 1 of the NLDS against the Phillies...Threw 2.0 innings allowing one run, a home run in the first inning, and recorded one walk and three strikeouts...Finished the Postseason making three appearances and pitching 5.0 innings while striking out four.

REMARKABLE ROOKIE: During his rookie campaign in 2023, Kodai Senga recorded 202 strikeouts and became the 18th rookie pitcher in the Modern Era (Since 1900) to have 200 or more strikeouts in a season...Senga's 202 punch outs were the second-most by a Mets pitcher behind only Dwight Gooden's 276 strikeouts in 1984...He joined Hideo Nomo (236), Yu Darvish (221) and Daisuke Matsusaka (201) as the only Japanese-born rookie hurlers to reach 200 strikeouts...Senga's 12 wins were tied with Ron Darling (1984) for the seventh-most wins in a single season by a Mets rookie and was the first Mets rookie to reach double-digit wins since Dillon Gee (13, 2011)...His 2.98 ERA (55 ER/166.1 IP) was the fifth-lowest in a single season by a Mets rookie behind only Jerry Koosman (2.08, 1968), Jon Matlack (2.32, 1972), Dwight Gooden (2.60, 1984) and Tom Seaver (2.76, 1967).

KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST: In 2023, Senga finished second in the NL and fifth in the majors among qualifiers in ERA...His 202 strikeouts were the tied for the eighth-most in the NL and tied for the 14th-most in the majors...Senga held opposing batters to a .208 average, the third-lowest mark among qualifiers in the NL and the fourth-lowest mark in the majors...His 10.93 K/9 rate was the fifth-best mark among qualified major league pitchers in 2023...He finished seventh in NL Cy Young voting.

HEY NOW YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: In 2023 Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver (1967) as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He was the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo Nomo (1995).

- Earned his second save of the season and his career on July 8 at Baltimore (1.0 IP, K)...Three of his last four appearances have been scoreless...In 11 games against Interleague opponents this season he has posted a 0.53 ERA (ER/17.0 IP) and held opponents to a .113 (6-53) batting average.
- Earned his fourth win of the season after tossing a scoreless seventh inning on July 4 vs. New York-AL (BB, 3 K)...Was his fifth appearance this season recording at least three strikeouts and his first since June 3 at Los Angeles-NL.
- Was used as an opener for the third time this season and threw a scoreless first inning on July 2 vs. Milwaukee (G2)...Has not allowed a hit over 4.0 scoreless innings as a starter this season.
