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METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Rays, 8-4, yesterday...The Mets have dropped back-to-back games after winning six straight...The loss marked the sixth time this season they have lost multiple games in a row and is their first time losing back-to-back games since their three consecutive losses from May 18-20... It is just the second time this season they have lost consecutive home games on consecutive days (also: April 30 and May 1 vs. Arizona)...Today, the Mets finish a six-game homestand (3-2) against the Nationals (3-0) and Rays (0-2)...Following this series the Mets are off on Monday before hitting the road for a six-game trip to Atlanta (three games) and Philadelphia (three games).

FATHER OF MINE: The Mets are 30-38 all-time on Father's Day...All 30 MLB clubs will wear symbolic blue ribbons on their uniforms and specially designed light blue caps today to raise awareness for prostate cancer and raise funds for research to fight the disease.

UPCOMING MILESTONES: Juan Soto is three hits away from 1,000 for his career...Francisco Lindor is two steals away from 200 career SB and one steal away from 100 as a Met...He would become the 12th Met to reach 100 stolen bases and the sixth Met to record at least 100 homers and 100 steals with the team (also: Darryl Strawberry, David Wright, Howard Johnson, Carlos Beltrán and José Reyes).

ON THE RECORD: The Mets own a 45-26 record this season...That is the best record in the National League...Only the Tigers have more wins in the majors... Their record through 71 games is tied for the third-best start in franchise history with the 2022 team...Only the 1986 (50-21) and 1988 (46-25) teams had a better season-opening record.

IN THE CITI: The Mets are 27-9 through their first 36 home games this season, which marks their best start at home in franchise history...Their 2.67 ERA at home is the best in the NL...Their .750 home winning percentage is the best in the majors...The Mets have won six of their last eight and 10 of their last 13 at Citi Field.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Over the last seven games, Brandon Nimmo is batting .367 (11-30) with seven runs, one double, three homers, seven RBI, two walks, one steal with a 1.106 OPS...He is slashing .288/351/558 with four homers and 10 RBI in 13 games this month...In 14 games when batting in the two-spot, Nimmo is hitting .373/439/667 with three doubles, four homers, 10 RBI, five walks and one steal.

DOUBLE DARE: Pete Alonso has recorded 22 doubles this year, which is tied with Lawrence Butler and Bobby Witt Jr. for the most in the majors...It is tied with David Wright (2009) and Rusty Staub (1973) for the second-most by a Met through the first 71 games of a season...Only Wright (2012), Todd Zelle (2000) and Edgardo Alfonzo (2000) had more...His 40 extra-base hits this season are tied for the second-most in the majors and the most ever by a Met through the first 71 games of a season...He has 415 career extra-base hits which is tied with Mike Piazza for fifth all-time.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has safely reached base in 22 straight games... The 22-game on-base streak is now the second-longest streak of his career...His career-best is a 36 games streak (8/2-9/9/19)...He is batting .302 (26-86) in that span with 14 runs, six doubles, eight homers, 26 RBI, seven walks, a .384 OBP and a .651 SLG in that span...Alonso has collected 63 RBI in 71 games this season...That is the most in the major leagues...He recorded 88 RBI in 162 contests last year.

OUCH: The Mets have been plunked 47 times this year, which is the most in the majors...New York was hit 92 times last season, the third-most in the majors and the most in the Senior Circuit...Pete Alonso owns the franchise record, having been hit by 95 pitches in his career...Brandon Nimmo is second with 82, followed by Jeff McNeil at 78 HBP.

RAYS-METS NOTES: The Mets are 5-9 against the Rays at Citi Field...New York is 3-13 in their last 16 games against the Rays dating back to July 7, 2018.

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: This year marked the first time in franchise history that the Mets opened their home and road schedule against an Interleague Opponent...The Mets are 11-12 in Interleague Play this season...The team went 24-22 in Interleague Play last year...Overall, New York owns a 289-288 record in Interleague play...The Mets are 4-9 in their last 13 games against Interleague opponents...They went 7-3 in their first 10 Interleague games of the season.

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto ranks 10th in the majors with a 3.0 bWAR this year... In 13 games this month, Soto is batting .333/500/667 with 15 runs, three doubles, four home runs, nine RBI, 14 walks and one steal...He has recorded a major league-leading 57 walks...His 57 walks through the team's first 71 games are the most in franchise history...John Olerud owns the single-season franchise record with 125 walks in 1999...Soto has recorded at least 125 walks in a season four times in his career (145 in 2021, 135 in 2022, 132 in 2023 and 129 in 2024)...The lefty is a perfect 8-8 in stolen base attempts this season...Has surpassed his total from last season (157 games).

LUCKY LINDOR: The Mets have won the last 27 games in which Francisco Lindor has homered...The streak that goes back to July 9, 2024 is the longest streak in team history...Prior to Lindor's streak, the longest was 21 straight wins when George Foster homered between July 3, 1985, and June 29, 1986...Carl Furillo (29, 1951-53) holds the record...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Francisco Lindor has hit eight lead-off homers as a member of the Mets...That is tied with Tommie Agee and Lenny Dykstra for fourth-most in team history...Brandon Nimmo is third with 13 leadoff homers...Curtis Granderson and José Reyes are tied atop the franchise leaderboard with 21 leadoff dingers.

STEAL THIS BASE OR DON'T: Mets runners have now recorded an 86.6 (58-67) stolen base percentage this season which is the best in the majors...The Mets are one of seven teams in the majors to have four players with eight or more stolen bases this season (Lindor, Soto, Acuña, Taylor)...Mets catchers have combined to throw out 41.2% of potential base stealers this year (21-51), the best mark in the majors.

HAPPY JEFF: Over Jeff McNeil's last 22 games dating back to May 18, he has a .293/379/573 (22-75) slash line with five home runs, four doubles, one triple, 10 walks and 15 RBI...He has four home runs in his last seven games...He has reached base safely in his last 17 games dating back to May 25, the third-longest such streak of his career...He has also reached base safely in 19 straight games from 7/7(G1)-8/1/21 and in 18 straight games from 4/23-6/21(G1)/21...In addition, he has hit safely in 14 of his last 15 games including each of his last eight games...He is batting .367 (11-30) with five runs, one double, four homers, 10 RBI and two walks during his current hitting streak.

LAST TIME OUT: Tossed 5.1 innings and allowed four runs on June 10 vs. Washington...He only walked two batters, and it was the eighth time in 13 starts that he's done so...He has thrown 5.0 or more innings in 10 of his 13 starts this season.

VS. TAMPA BAY: He has made five appearances (four starts) against Tampa Bay in his career, and he has a 1-2 record with a 4.01 ERA (11 ER/24.2 IP) with 27 strikeouts in those games...In all four of his starts against the Rays he has completed at least 5.0 innings and recorded four or more strikeouts...He has surrendered two or fewer earned runs in four of those five outings and in his last four straight against the Rays.

QUEENS SUCCESS: In eight career starts at Citi Field he has 2-1 record and a 3.46 ERA (15 ER/39.0 IP) with 41 strikeouts...His ERA at Citi Field is the best since teammate Jose Butto posted a 2.64 ERA in his first eight starts at Citi (4/25/23-5/14/24)...He has allowed one or zero earned runs in five of his eight starts at Citi Field.

START ME UP: His 3.22 ERA (23 ER/64.1 IP) is the best of his career through his first 13 games of a season, topping his 4.29 ERA through his first 13 starts of 2023...He earned his sixth win of the season on June 4 and that matches his most wins through his first 13 starts of a season (2023)...He is one of 38 Mets to post a sub 3.25 ERA through their first 13 starts with the franchise, he and teammate Clay Holmes have done it this season...His ERA is the 20th best in the NL among starters (min. 60.0 IP)...Has allowed two or fewer earned runs in nine of his 13 starts this season and the Mets have an 10-3 record in all games he has started.

GRIFFIN FANNING: During Spring Training, he struck out 22 batters over his 14.1 innings of work, highlighted by his nine strikeouts in 4.2 innings vs. Tampa Bay on March 17...His 22 strikeouts ranked ninth in the Grapefruit League and tied for the 17th-most across the majors...Canning finished the spring with an impressive 1.88 ERA (3 ER/14.1 IP) and a K/9. rate of 13.8%...He struck out a season-high eight batters on April 17 vs. St. Louis and he has racked up 61 strikeouts through his first 13 starts of this season...In his last two major league seasons, Canning has recorded 130 and 139 strikeouts respectively.

SLIDE TO THE LEFT: Canning has thrown his slider more this season than he ever has before...So far, he has thrown his slider 32.0% of the time compared to 24.1% of the time last season and 29.9% during the 2023 season...He has picked up 24 strikeouts on his slider so far this season and is generating a 33.0% whiff rate on the pitch...He has generated 62 swing & misses with his slider this season, which is the 10th-most in the majors this season...He has thrown his slider 360 times this season which is the 12th-most anyone has thrown their slider in majors this year.

WORKHORSE: Last season, he set a career-high with 31 starts and 171.2 innings pitched for the Angels and in 2023 he finished with 127.0 innings...He is just one of 51 pitchers to throw at least 125.0 innings in each of the past two seasons...In the last two seasons combined, Canning has thrown 298.2 innings which ranks 48th in the majors over that time.

KEEP THE CHANGE: Canning's changeup is one of his best pitches and last season it had a run value of four which ranked eighth in the majors...He threw his changeup 26.7% of the time and he held his opponents to a .259 batting average against that pitch...He also generated a 28.8% whiff% on his changeup which was the 11th-highest clip in the majors...So far this season he has thrown it 24.0% and it produced a 24.3% whiff rate while picking up 16 strikeouts with the pitch...His changeup has produced a positive three run value, which is tied for 15th-best mark in the majors this season.

STAY GOLDEN: Canning was awarded the American League Rawlings Gold Glove in 2020, and he owns a career .955 fielding percentage...Last season he had a perfect fielding percentage on his 32 chances, and he is perfect through his first 13 chances so far this season.

WELCOME TO NEW YORK: He signed a one-year contract with the Mets on December 19, 2024, and he had spent his entire five-year major league career with the Angels prior to signing with the Mets this past offseason...Canning owns a career 31-36 record with a 4.61 ERA (293 ER/572.1 IP) and 544 career strikeouts.

- Entered with one out in the seventh inning on June 12 vs. Washington and stranded his only inherited baserunner...He then threw a scoreless eighth inning (1.2 IP)...Was his ninth scoreless relief appearance of 1.2 innings or more which is tied for the most such outings among Major League relievers.
- Has gone 3-1 with one save, eight holds and a 1.64 ERA (7 ER/38.1 IP) through 29 appearances (two as an opener) this season, holding batters to a .180 average (23-128)...21 of his 29 outings this season have been scoreless...With runners on base, has held batters to a .125 average (7-56)...He is one of 16 Mets pitchers to record as low of an ERA through their first 29 games of a season.
- Has recorded a 1.78 ERA (7 ER/35.1 IP) in 27 games as a reliever this season...Among qualified NL relievers this season, is 10th in ERA, tied for ninth in wins and ninth in WHIP (0.91).
- He has a 2.08 ERA (4 ER/17.1 IP) over 13 appearances at home this season and has held batters to a .190 batting average (11-58) at Citi Field.
