LHP Yusei Kikuchi (0-5, 5.65 ERA) vs. RHP Braxton Ashcraft (14-5, 3.59 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have won three of the first four games on their penultimate homestand of the 2026 season vs. San Francisco (2-1, Tuesday-Thursday) and Los Angeles-AL (1-0, Friday-Sunday), including a 1-0 win on Friday vs. the Angels...Will have the day off on Monday before starting a six-game road trip to Chicago-AL (September 8-10) and Chicago-NL (September 11-13)...Have hit 163 home runs (they hit 117 home runs in 2025)...Have the second-most hits (1234) in all of Major League Baseball, behind only Milwaukee (1238)...Have scored 692 runs, tied with Los Angeles (NL) for the fourth-most in Major League Baseball, behind Chicago-NL (759), Washington (738) and Milwaukee (715), after scoring 583 runs in 2025.

AMERICAN SPIRIT: Pittsburgh will play 11 of its final 20 games vs. American League teams...The Pirates will play vs. Los Angeles (Saturday-Sunday), at Chicago (September 8-10), vs. Kansas City (September 18-20) and at Detroit (September 25-27)...They have won nine straight interleague series here at home, dating back to a three-game sweep from July 21-23, 2025 vs. Detroit.

MORE WITH LESS: The Pirates have won back-to-back games in which they had five or fewer hits (Thursday vs. San Francisco and Friday vs. Los Angeles-AL) for the first time since May 14-15, 2022 vs. Cincinnati...They have never done that in three consecutive contests during the Modern Era (since 1901).

LOWE OR NEVER: Brandon Lowe, who is one home run shy of becoming the first Pirate with a 30-homer season since Josh Bell (37) in 2019, has the third-most home runs by a player in his first season with the Bucs in team history, behind only Brian Giles (39) in 1999 and Reggie Sanders (31) in 2003.

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The Pirates have won three straight series (August 24-26 at San Diego, August 28-30 at St. Louis and Tuesday-Thursday vs. San Francisco) and are looking to win four straight series for the first time since July 9-24, 2024...They have also won three straight series here at PNC Park (also August 14-16 vs. Boston and August 17-19 vs. Detroit) and are looking to win four straight home series for the first time since May 24-June 19, 2024.

HALO AGAIN: Pittsburgh picked up its third shutout in 28 all-time games vs. Los Angeles (AL) with its 1-0 win on Friday (also July 22, 2023 and April 23, 2025 at Angel Stadium)...It was also the Pirates' 12th all-time 1-0 win vs. an American League team and their first since April 9, 2023 vs. Chicago...Pittsburgh's four 1-0 wins this year (also May 3 vs. Cincinnati, May 6 at Arizona and August 25 at San Diego) lead all of Major League Baseball...The last time the team had more than four such wins in a season was 2013 (five).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

September 5, 1969: Steve Blass went 4-for-5 with a three-run home run (the only home run of his career) and two runs scored at the plate in the Pirates' 9-2 win over the Cubs at Wrigley Field. Blass also tossed a complete game, allowing two runs and striking out seven Chicago batters while picking up his 14th win of the year. Jose Pagan went 3-for-5 with a double, an RBI and a run scored in the victory.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the second round of the 2018 Draft.

AS OF LATE: Ashcraft won a 5-4 decision after allowing two runs over 5.0 innings of work on August 30 at St. Louis...He has pitched at least 5.0 innings while allowing two or fewer runs and one/zero walks in four straight starts (since August 13 at Miami)...The only Pirates in the Modern Era (since 1901) to do that in at least five straight starts were Jack Chesbro (five, 1902), Howie Camnitz (five, 1909), Babe Adams (five, 1910 and five, 1913), Heinie Meine (five, 1931), Preacher Roe (seven, 1945), Nellie Briles (five, 1973), Iván Nova (five, 2016) & Paul Skenes (five, two separate instances, 2025).

ASHCRAFT IN AUGUST: Ashcraft went 4-1 with a 2.13 ERA (38.0ip/9er) in his six starts last month...He ranked tied for first in the National League in wins, second in WHIP (0.74), third in innings, tied for seventh in opponent average (.176) and ninth in ERA.

FOUR YOUR INFORMATION: Ashcraft has won three straight decisions (since August 13 at Miami) and is looking to win four straight decisions for the third time this year (also May 9-31 and June 17-July 4)...The last Pirates starter with three such streaks during a single season was Gerrit Cole, who had three such streaks in the 2015 season.

LEADING THE WAY: Ashcraft has a team-high 14 wins this year, the most by a Pirate since Jameson Taillon and Trevor Williams (14 wins each) in 2018...The last Pittsburgh pitcher with more than 14 wins in a year was Gerrit Cole, who won 19 games in 2015.

DON'T WALK HERE: Ashcraft has averaged just 1.96 walks per 9.0 innings of work this year...That is the fifth-lowest mark among all qualified pitchers in Major League Baseball...He trails only Tampa Bay's Nick Martinez (1.35), Tampa Bay's Drew Rasmussen (1.66), Atlanta's Chris Sale (1.74) & Seattle's Bryan Woo (1.88) on that list.

DOUBLE THE FUN: Ashcraft has gotten his opponents to ground into a double play a Major League-high 20 times this season...The only Pittsburgh pitcher since 2018 to induce more GIDPs in a single year was Mitch Keller (22 GIDPs) during the 2022 season.

COMING RIGHT AT YOU: Ashcraft's 14.6 average pitches per inning this season are the third-fewest among all qualified pitchers throughout Major League Baseball...He trails only Tampa Bay's Nick Martinez (14.0) and Detroit's Keider Montero (14.6) on the list.

MR. EFFICIENT: Ashcraft won a 4-1 decision after allowing one run over 8.0 innings (he threw 80 pitches) on August 18 vs. Detroit during his first start since his 9.0-inning complete game on August 13 at Miami (85 pitches)...He was the third Major Leaguer (since pitch counts began being tracked in 1988) to pitch at least 8.0 innings and allow one/zero runs on 85 or fewer pitches in back-to-back starts...He joined Cincinnati's Tom Browning (June 29-July 4, 1989) & Detroit's Shane Greene (April 9-14, 2015) on the list.

GO THE DISTANCE: Ashcraft pitched his first career complete game in Pittsburgh's 13-1 win on August 13 at Miami...It was the first complete game by a Pirate since Paul Skenes (8.0 innings) on May 18, 2025 at Philadelphia, the first 9.0-inning complete game since Mitch Keller on May 6, 2024 vs. Los Angeles (AL) and the first 9.0-inning road complete game since Johan Oviedo on August 28, 2023 at Kansas City...The 85-pitch complete game was the third 9.0-inning complete game on 85 or fewer pitches by a Pirate (since pitch counts began being tracked in 1988)...It was also done by Doug Drabek (80 pitches, September 30, 1990 at St. Louis) and Jeff Karstens (83 pitches, July 15, 2011 at Houston)...Ashcraft was the first Major Leaguer (since 1988) to throw a 9.0-inning complete game on 85 or fewer pitches while having 10 strikeouts.

#25 BILLY COOK (OF) HOMESTAND: 0-0 (----) 0 HR 0 RBI SERIES: 0-0 (----) 0 HR 0 RBI LAST HR: 9/28/24 at NYY (Gil) CURRENT STREAK: 0-for-12	⚔ Played the final inning 2.0 innings in center field in the victory on 8/30 at St. Louis...Drew his first MLB walk in his 102nd career PA on 8/16 vs. Boston. ⚔ Has made 10 starts in center field, two in right field, one at first base and one in left field...His 25 games as a pinch runner lead Major League Baseball. ⚔ Was recalled from Triple-A Indianapolis, where he has gone 24-for-82 (.293) with five home runs, 17 RBI and a .901 OPS across his 22 games, on 8/14. ⚔ Posted a career-high three hits on 7/19 at Cleveland...Has made one career error in 125 total chances (throwing, at first base, 9/24/24 vs. Milwaukee).
