TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue their final homestand of the regular season with the 2nd of 3 games against the Houston Astros ( $0-1$ )...Seattle will also host the Texas Rangers (4 G, Sept. 28-Oct. 1) on the homestand...the Mariners are coming off a 3-3 road trip at Oakland (3-0) and Texas (0-3)...tonight's game will be televised live on ROOT SPORTS with Aaron Goldsmith and Mike Blowers on the call...it will also be televised live on TBS with Don Orsillo and Ron Darling on the call...the game will be broadcast live on Seattle Sports (710 AM) and Mariners.com with Rick Rizzs and Dave Sims.
ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners dropped last night's series opener to the Astros by a 5-1 score...the Mariners are 21-18 over their last 39 games, 29-20 over their last 49, 31-21 over their last 52, 34-22 over their last 56, 37-24 over their last 61 and 46-30 over their last 76 contests...the Mariners are $65-26$ when scoring at least 4 runs and 19-46 when scoring 3-or-fewer...the Mariners are 41-34 at T-Mobile Park and 43-38 on the road this season...they are 28-27 in day games and 56-45 at night...Seattle would need to win each of their final 6 games of the season to match their 90-win campaigns from both 2021 and 2022.

- Programming Note - Tonight's game is scheduled for a 7:05 p.m. first pitch.
- Tonight I Bounce Back - Seattle's current 4-game losing streak ties a season-high (done 4 x )... Seattle's season-high winning streak is 8 games (done 2 x ).
- Bombs Away - The Mariners have hit 203 home runs this season...Seattle has hit 200+ home runs in a season 8 times in franchise history: 1996-99, 2016-17, 2019 \& 2023.
POSTSEASON PICTURE...the Mariners have 6 regular season games remaining ( 2 vs . HOU, 4 vs . TEX)... Seattle enters play today 4.0 games back of the Texas Rangers for the AL West Division lead and 1.5 games back of the Houston Astros for the 3rd and final AL Wild Card spot...the Astros have 5 games remaining ( $\mathbf{2}$ at SEA, 3 at ARI), the Rangers have 6 games remaining ( 2 at LAA, 4 at SEA) and Toronto has 6 games remaining ( 3 vs. NYY, 3 vs. TB).
A PITCHING NOTE ...the Mariners pitching staff ranks T-2nd in MLB in ERA (3.77), 1st in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.51), 2nd in walks-per-9 innings (2.57), T-2nd in WHIP (1.19), 2nd in FIP (3.89) and 3rd in fWAR (19.6) this season...the Mariners are the only team in the Maiors to have 3 pitchers with 17+ quality starts this season...Luis Castillo (18), George Kirby (18) and Logan Gilbert (17) make up the trio.
ANOTHER PITCHING NOTE...the Mariners pitching staff leads the Maiors with 16 shutouts this season, ranking ahead of Atlanta, Los Angeles-NL and San Diego with 15 each...Seattle also set a franchise record, surpassing its 15 shutouts in 2003...Seattle also leads the Majors registering 19 games with no walks, ranking ahead of San Francisco (18)...the Mariners are 14-5 (.737) in those contests.
ANOTHER 'NOTHER PITCHING NOTE...Seattle pitchers age 26 -or-younger lead the Majors in fWAR (13.6) by a wide margin over next-closest Cleveland (9.3), Los Angeles-NL (9.2) and Miami (9.2)...the Mariners have 4 pitchers that rank in the top-18 in MLB (age 26-or-younger): George Kirby ( 3.9 fWAR, 3rd), Logan Gilbert (3.2, 6th), Bryce Miller (2.1, T-13th) and Matt Brash (2.0, T-16th).
THE GOLD STANDARD...defensively, Julio Rodríguez's 12 Outs Above Average rank T-2nd among American League outfielders with Kevin Kiermaier-TOR, trailing only Luis Robert Jr.-CWS (13)...Eugenio Suárez' 10 OAA rank 2nd among AL third basemen, trailing only Maikel Garcia-KC (13)...Cal Raleigh's 23 catcher caught stealings are tied for most in the AL with Shea Langeliers-OAK.
JULIO \& GEORGE: SOPHOMORE STUDS...Julio Rodríguez has produced 6.1 FanGraphs Wins Above Replacement this season, 3rd-most in the American League behind Shohei Ohtani-LAA (6.6) and Corey Seager-TEX (6.2)...George Kirby's 3.9 fWAR places him 7th among AL pitchers...the second-year stalwarts produced 5.4 and 3.0 fWAR, respectively, during their 2022 rookie campaigns...Rodríguez and Kirby became the first position player/pitcher rookie duo to accumulate $5.0+$ and $3.0+$ fWAR, respectively, as teammates since Alvin Davis and Mark Langston did it for the 1984 Mariners...Rodríguez and Kirby are the first teammate duo in Major League history to follow up those rookie performances with 5.0+ and 3.0+ fWAR, respectively, in their follow-up season of their rookie campaigns.
THE J-ROD SHOW: AL MVP CANDIDATE?...Julio Rodríguez leads American League outfielders in fWAR (6.1) by more than a full "win", ranking ahead of Luis Robert Jr.-CWS (5.0) and Aaron Judge-NYY (4.9)...among AL outfielders with at least 400 plate appearances for the rate stats, Julio ranks 1 st in hits (179), 2nd in stolen bases (36), 5 th in batting average (.283), 4th in home runs (31), 2nd in runs scored (100), 3rd in RBI (101), 6th in slugging percentage (.494), 6th in OPS (.835), 4th in OPS $+(131)$, 2 nd in doubles (37), 1st in total bases (313) and 2nd in extra-base hits (70)...in 2022, Julio won an AL Silver Slugger Award in his rookie season, alongside outfielders Aaron Judge-NYY and Mike Trout-LAA.
- A Chance To Make History - J-Rod currently leads the AL in hits (179) and ranks 2nd in total bases (313), trailing only Shohei Ohtani-LAA (325)...he could become the youngest plaver to lead his league in hits AND total bases since Hank Aaron for the 1956 Milwaukee Braves...if J-Rod finishes with the league lead in hits, he would become just the 3rd player in franchise history to lead the AL in hits, joining Alex Rodriguez (1998) and Ichiro Suzuki (7x, 2001, 2004, 2006-10) and just the 9th player age 22-or-younger in AL history to lead the league in hits.
SILVER IN CAL'S FUTURE...Cal Raleigh leads Major Leaque catchers in home runs (30) and is set to do so in back-to-back seasons after leading catchers with 27 HR in 2022...Raleigh is the first catcher in Mariners history with a $30+$ homer season...the 26 -year-old backstop ranks 2 nd among AL catchers in fWAR (4.6), trailing only Adley Rutschman-BAL (4.7)...Raleigh has 5 multi-homer games this season, most among MLB catchers and tied for 5th-most overall.
CRAWFORD'S CAREER YEAR...J.P. Crawford this season has set career-highs in home runs (17) and RBI (58) and is on pace to set additional highs in on-base percentage (.377), slugging percentage (.430) and OPS (.807)...J.P. ranks 4th in the American League in walks (89) and 4th in OBP.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...the Mariners pitching staff set a franchise record with its 1,392 nd strikeout of the season last night...the record-setter came on a Luis Castillo strikeout of Houston's Jose Altuve as the first batter of the game, but...DID YOU KNOW?...that the Mariners are the only team in the Maiors to either match or break their franchise record number of strikeouts in each of the last 3 seasons?...in 2021, Seattle's 1,328 strikeouts as a pitching staff matched its franchise-high from the 2018 season...in 2022, Seattle's 1,391 strikeouts as a staff set a franchise record...last night, Seattle once again set a franchise record...the Mariners enter tonight with 1,401 strikeouts and 6 regular season games remaining...h/t to Elias Sports Bureau for confirmation of the 2021-23 strikeout research.

## ABOUT KIRBY

- 25-year-old right-hander is making his 30 th start of the season, 2nd against Houston.... he is also making his 55th career start, and 3rd career start against the Astros.
- Selected by the Mariners in the first round (20th overall) of the 2019 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Ty Holub.
- Played 3 seasons (2017-2019) at Elon University (NC), going 19-8 with a 3.30 ERA ( 88 ER, 240.0 IP) in 45 games ( 34 GS) with the Phoenix.
- Became the first rookie in MLB history to record a save in the postseason in his first career relief appearance.
- Graduated from Rye HS (Rye, NY) where he was named to the all-metro, all-state, all-section and all-league baseball teams 3 times.
LAST TIME OUT...W\#11 in last start on $9 / 20$ at OAK... pitched 7.0 innings and allowed 3 runs on 8 hits ( 2 HR ) with 3 strikeouts.
THESE BOOTS WERE NOT MADE FOR WALKING...leads all qualified pitchers in the Majors with a 8.94 strikeouts-to-walk ratio, ranking ahead of Zach Eflin-TBR (7.58)...his 8.94 SO/BB ratio currently ranks as the 4th best in a single season in American League history among qualified starting pitchers
QUALITY KIRBY...with his last outing against Oakland Kirby recorded his 11th qualaity start with no walks allowed this season which leads the majors...Kirby has 18 quality starts this season which is tied for the 6th most in the American League with teammate Luis Castillo...pitched 8 consecutive quality starts (4/9-5/26), his longest quality start streak in his career....his 8 -game quality start streak is tied for the 2nd longest streak in the Majors this season.
ON ANOTHER LEVEL....has made 7 starts this season where he has pitched $7.0+$ innings and not allowed a walk which is the most in the Major Leagues this season...he currently ranks ahead of Zach Eflin-TBR (6)...George now has 8 such starts in his career.
NO FREE PASSES...has the fewest walks allowed through the first 29 starts in a season in franchise history with 18 ....he currently ranks ahead of Logan Gilbert who allowed 31 walks through his first 29 starts this season... his 18 walks allowed are also tied for the 5th fewest in the first 29 starts of a pitcher's season in MLB history.
NIFTY FIFTY...through his first 50 career starts Kirby recorded 275 strikeouts and 36 walks....his 7.64 strikeout-to-walk ratio is highest in Major League history through a pitcher's first 50 career starts...Kirby ranks ahead of Shane Bieber (6.00), Corbin Burnes (5.81) and Masahiro Tanaka (5.73)

CAREER-HIGH INNINGS...threw 9.0 innings and allowed only 3 hits, 0 runs, 0 walks and struck out 7 over 103 pitches in his start against BAL on $8 / 12 \ldots$...his 9.0 IP is a new career high (previously: 8.0, 2x, last: $5 / 31 / 23$ vs. NYY)...the last time a Mariners pitcher tossed $9.0+$ innings in a team loss was Félix Hernández on 7/26/13 vs. Minnesota.
ALL-STARS IN SEATTLE ...pitched 1.0 inning in the 2023 All-Star Game on July 11... Kirby pitched the 4th inning, becoming the 4th Mariners pitcher to appear in an All-Star Game in Seattle, joining Freddy Garcia, Jeff Nelson and Kazuhiro Sasaki, who all pitched in the 2001 All-Star Game...this was Kirby's 1st career All-Star appearance.
CAREER-HIGH STRIKEOUTS...matched a career high in strikeouts for a single game with 10 in his start against Minnesota on 7/20...this was the 7th instance this season of a Mariners pitcher recording at least 10 strikeouts in a start...he joined Logan Gilbert, Bryce Miller, and Luis Castillo...Castillo has recorded 10+ strikeouts in a game three times this season.
LUCKY NUMBER 7 ...pitched 7.0 innings in his last outing against Oakland....this marked the 11th time this season Kirby has pitched at least 7.0 innings in a game...he is tied for the 3th most $7.0+$ inning games in the Majors this season.
TRIPLE SEVENS...pitched at least 7.0 innings in 3 consecutive starts (4/275/9)...this marked a career high in consecutive games with at least 7.0 innings pitched...prior to the streak, Kirby had never pitched $7.0+$ innings in consecutive games...during the streak Kirby was $2-1$ with a 1.64 ERA ( $4 \mathrm{ER}, 22.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ) and allowed 2 walks while striking out 18.
KIRBY'S COMPLETE....pitched his first career complete game on $4 / 27$ against Philadelphia, tossing 8.0 innings allowing just 1 run on 4 hits and 1 walk with 7 strikeouts...he became the first Mariners pitcher to lose a complete game since Taijuan Walker on Sept. 24, 2014 in a 1-0 loss at Toronto.
