The Mariners and Astros meet for their second of four series matchups this season...Seattle swept Houston in 4 games from April 10-13 earlier this year.

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners finish a 7-game road trip with the 4th and final game against the Houston Astros (2-1)...Seattle also completed a 3-game set at the White Sox (1-2) on the trip...tomorrow, the Mariners will return home for a 6-game homestand against the Padres (3 G, 5/15-17) and White Sox (3 G, 5/18-20)...today's game will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith, Dave Valle** and Mariners Hall of Famer **Jay Buhner** on the call...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners dropped last night's game against the Astros by a 4-2 score in 10 innings...despite the loss, the Mariners are 11-8 (.579) over their last 19 games (4/22-c).

- **Hold Me Close** - Seattle has played an MLB-leading 17 1-run games this season, going 6-11 in those contests...since 2021, Seattle's 284 1-run games also lead MLB, with Seattle going 156-128 (.549) and ranking 3rd in winning percentage behind the Brewers (.568/138-105) and Cardinals (.550/132-108) during that span.
- **Seas the Day** - Seattle is 10-5 (.667) in day games this season, the 4th best record in MLB...in 2025, the Mariners ranked 1st in the AL and 2nd in the Majors in day games with a 33-21 (.611) record.
- **Rise and Shine** - Since 2023, starter **Luis Castillo** owns a 3.34 ERA (74 ER, 199.2 IP) in 36 day starts, ranking 5th among AL starters during that span (min. 180.0 IP), just ahead of the next closest **Logan Gilbert** (6th, 3.35 ERA) and **George Kirby** (7th, 3.41 ERA).
- **Rehab Update** - Right-handed reliever **Matt Brash** (right lat inflammation) is set to begin a rehab assignment with Triple-A Tacoma tonight.

NATIONAL TV TO VISIT SEATTLE...the Mariners will be featured on national TV twice during their upcoming series against the Padres (May 15-17) that begins tomorrow at T-Mobile Park...Saturday's game will be televised exclusively on **FOX** and begins at 4:15 p.m. PT...on Sunday, the game will be televised exclusively on **Peacock** and be broadcast live on both **ESPN Radio** and **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with the matchup beginning at 4:20 p.m. PT...the Mariners have already been televised on 7 exclusive or co-existing national broadcasts so far this season.

THIS IS RANDY'S WORLD...Randy Arozarena last night went 2-for-5 for his 3rd-consecutive multi-hit game (5/11-c)...Randy has hit safely in the last 7-consecutive games (5/6-c), during which he is batting .500 (14x28) with 7 runs, 2 doubles, 1 home run, 4 RBI, 3 stolen bases and 3 HBP, reaching base at a .548 clip and slugging .679 for a 1.227 OPS...on Tuesday, Randy went 4-for-4 with 4 runs, 2 doubles, 1 home run, 3 RBI, 1 HBP and 1 SB, his 8th career 4-hit game and first with the Mariners...it also marked his 4th career game reaching base safely 5 times...overall this season, Arozarena is batting .306 (49x60) with 31 runs, 11 doubles, 1 triple, 4 home runs, 16 RBI, 17 walks, 11 stolen bases and 6 HBP...his 11 stolen bases rank 8th in the Majors and his .306 average ranks T-5th in the AL.

NAYLOR LOCKED IN...over his last 22 games since April 17, **Josh Naylor** is batting .360 (31x86) with 8 runs, 4 doubles, 3 home runs, 13 RBI, 8 stolen bases, a .411 OBP and slugging .523 for a .912 OPS...during that span, he ranks 5th in the Majors in average and T-3rd in SB...Naylor is 27-for-29 (93.1%) in stolen base attempts with Seattle, ranking 2nd in stolen base percentage trailing only James Jones (93.3%) and ranking just ahead of teammate **Victor Robles** (92.5%) among players with at least 25 attempts.

HOT ROD...since April 3, **Julio Rodríguez** is batting .302 (45x149) with 9 doubles, 7 home runs, 19 RBI, 11 walks and an .861 OPS...during that span, he ranks 8th in the AL in average and 12th in wRC+ (.147)...over his last 16 games since April 25, he is batting .315 (23x73) with 6 doubles, 6 home runs, 12 RBI and a .986 OPS...during that span he ranks 7th in the AL in OPS and T-6th in fWAR (0.8).

BIG TEX IS BACK...Bryce Miller made his season debut last night in Houston, tossing 5.1 innings and allowing 2 runs (2 ER) on 8 hits (1 HR) and 1 walk with 3 strikeouts...he was activated off the Injured List prior to last night's game after missing the start of the season with a left oblique strain...he made 4 rehab starts between High-A Everett and Triple-A Tacoma before being reinstated, where he posted a 1.98 ERA (3 ER, 13.2 IP) with 14 strikeouts.

SOLID ON THE MOUND...the Mariners pitching staff has been among the best in the Majors this season, combining for a 3.63 ERA (158 ER, 391.1 IP), 108 walks and 376 strikeouts...among MLB pitching staffs they rank 1st in SO/BB (3.48), 1st in BB% (6.6%), T-2nd in quality starts (20), T-6th in ERA and 7th in WHIP (1.23)...Mariners starting pitching leads MLB with 251.1 IP and ranks 9th with a 3.90 ERA...Mariners relievers rank 3rd with a 3.15 ERA.

ASTRONOMIC SUCCESS...the Mariners last night snapped a 9-game win streak against the Astros (9/17/25-5/12) that included back-to-back series sweeps (3 G, 9/17-19, 2025 and 4 G, 4/10-13, 2026)...Seattle's 9-game winning streak against the Astros is their longest against Houston in Mariners history (previous: 6 G, 7/19-8/31/13)...Seattle has captured the season series against the Astros in each of the last 3 seasons (2023-c), going a combined 31-14 during that span.

HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS...tomorrow, the Mariners return home for a 6-game homestand against the San Diego Padres (3 G, 5/15-17) and Chicago White Sox (3 G, 5/18-20)...promotions and events on the homestand include **Hello Kitty Clear Crossbody Bag Night** (May 15), **Salute to Armed Forces Night** (May 16), the **Vedder Cup finale** (May 17), **Josh Naylor Bobblehead** (May 18 and May 19), as well as **Mariners Value Games** (May 18-20)...for more information, visit Mariners.com/tickets.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...Julio Rodríguez last night worked a 2-out, RBI walk on a 7-pitch at-bat in the 9th inning to tie the game at 3-3 and push it into extra innings, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...the Mariners offense has recorded 61 game-tying or go-ahead RBI this season, which ranks T-2nd in the Majors along with the Nationals, behind only the Braves (64 RBI)?...among those, 17 such RBI have come in the 7th inning or later, which also ranks T-2nd in MLB with the Padres behind only the Rays (21 RBI)...Rodríguez and **Cole Young** lead MLB batters in game-tying or go-ahead RBI in the 7th inning or later, with 5 each.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - MAY 14

- **1985** - The Mariners tallied 14 hits in Fenway Park on their way to a 5-0 win...Mike Moore went the distance for the shutout...Phil Bradley and Spike Owen each collected three hits.
- **1991** - Harold Reynolds extends his hitting streak to 10 games, going 21x42 over that stretch, on his way to a 12 game string.
- **1996** - Dwight Gooden throws a no-hitter at the Mariners in a 2-0 win at New York.
- **1999** - Alex Rodriguez hits HR, vs. KC, in 1st AB after stint on 15-day DL...David Bell hits 12th HR tying team record for 2B.
- **2021** - Jarred Kelenic records first career MLB hit, homering off Aaron Civale in the 3rd inning...he finished the game going 3-4 with 2 doubles and a home run and became the 10th Mariner to homer for their first hit.

ABOUT CASTILLO...

- The 33-year-old right-hander is set to make his 9th start of the year and his 252nd career start...it will also be his 2nd start against the Astros this season and the 11th of his career.
- Originally signed as an international free agent by the San Francisco Giants on Dec. 23, 2011.
- Made MLB debut on June 23, 2017 vs. Washington (w/ CIN).
- Signed a 5-year contract extension with the Seattle Mariners on Sept. 24, 2022 after being acquired in a trade with Cincinnati on July 30, 2022.
- Named an All-Star in 2019 (CIN), 2022 (CIN) and 2023 (SEA).

LAST TIME OUT...L#4 on May 9 at Chicago White Sox, tossing 4.0 innings and allowing 4 runs (4 ER) on 5 hits (2 HR) with 1 hit-by-pitch, 0 walks and 6 strikeouts...he threw 84 pitches (59 strikes) in his 8th start of the year.

"I've just got to keep my head up. It's not how you start, it's how you end. But I felt like I'm making the pitches, and I have got to give credit to them, because they're putting good swings on it...I've got to keep my head up and keep battling. The moment has to come."

WELL TRAVELED...is making his 5th road start of the season and 2nd of the current road trip...his 121 career road starts are 5th-most in MLB since 2017... has thrown 5.0+ innings in 99 career road starts (7th-most such games in MLB since 2017), 6.0+ in 63 starts, and 7.0+ in 18 starts...his 670.1 career innings pitched on the road ranks 7th-most in MLB since 2017.

AGAINST HOUSTON...is making his 11th career start against Houston including his 10th with the Mariners... went 1-0 with a 1.53 ERA (3 ER, 17.2 IP) and 19 strikeouts across 3 starts vs. Houston last year...in his last appearance vs. Houston at Daikin Park (5/25/25), he threw 6.0 innings, allowing 3 runs (3 ER) on 9 hits with 1 walk to 6 strikeouts...he has spun 6.0+ innings in 8 of his 10 career starts against Houston, tossing a quality start in 6 total starts vs. the Astros.

FAMILIAR FACES...with his next start, the Astros will become 1-of-3 teams that Castillo has faced 10-or-more times with the Mariners, joining the Angels (11 GS) and the Athletics (10 GS)...the Astros are 1-of-10 MLB clubs that Castillo has faced 10+ times all-time across his career; Cardinals (20 GS), Brewers (19 GS) Cubs (18 GS), Pirates (16 GS), Angels (12 GS) and Athletics, Padres, Guardians, Astros, Twins (all 10 GS).

HEATED RIVALRY...across 38 starts with the Mariners against AL West teams, he is 13-10 with a 3.37 ERA (82 ER, 219.0 IP) and 220 strikeouts...is 15-10 with a 3.34 ERA (86 ER, 232.0 IP) and 240 strikeouts across 40 career starts all-time vs. AL West teams...went 2-2 with a 2.37 ERA (15 ER, 57.0 IP) and 47 strikeouts across 10 starts against AL West teams last season.

DOMINATING THE DAY...is pitching in a day game for the 3rd time this season (last: 5/3 vs. KC)...is 17-12 with a 3.46 ERA (90 ER, 234.1 IP) and 243 strikeouts across 42 day games with the Mariners...the Mariners are 22-20 when Castillo starts a day game, including 19-6 when he goes 6.0+ innings in day games... owned a 3.17 ERA (25 ER, 71.0 IP) with 62 strikeouts to 17 walks across 13 day games in 2025.

MAY FLOWERS...across 17 starts in May as a Mariner (since 2023), he is 4-7 with a 3.65 ERA (40 ER, 98.2 IP), 97 strikeouts to 27 walks allowed for a 3.59 strikeout-to-walk ratio and a 8.89 SO/9...has tossed 6.0+ in 12 of those 17 starts in May, including 10 quality starts.

AMONG MARINER GREATS...his 3.65 ERA with Seattle is the 7th-lowest ERA in franchise history (min. 500.0 IP), behind Félix Hernández, Randy Johnson, Hisashi Iwakuma, and James Paxton (all 3.42 ERA), **George Kirby** (3.52), and **Logan Gilbert** (3.59)...his 670 strikeouts with the Mariners are 10th-most in franchise history (next: Hisashi Iwakuma, 714 SO)...his 1.171 WHIP and 9.2 strikeouts-per-nine innings each rank 4th-best among Mariners with 500.0+ innings pitched.

LA PIEDRA...among qualified pitchers since 2017 (his debut season), he is 5th in quality starts (136), 5th in games started (251), 6th in innings pitched (1449.0), 7th in total strikeouts (1530) and T-13th in wins (84).

ALL-DECADE ACCOLADES...is one of 5 pitchers in the last 10 seasons (2017-c) to have at least 1,500 strikeouts and a WHIP below 1.20, joining Gerrit Cole, Aaron Nola, Max Scherzer, and Zack Wheeler.

SEASONED VET...made his 250th career start on May 2nd vs. Kansas City...became 1 of 5 active pitchers with 250+ starts since 2017, joining Patrick Corbin-4Tms (272 GS), Aaron Nola-PHI (260 GS), José Berrios-MIN/TOR (259 GS), and Kevin Gausman-5Tms (259 GS)...among 19 active pitchers with 250+ career starts, his 3.63 ERA and 9.5 strikeouts-per-nine innings each rank 8th-best.

KEEPING IT 100...threw season-high 101 pitches on May 3rd vs. Kansas City...is 1-of-3 Mariners starters to throw 100+ pitches in a start this season, joining **Emerson Hancock** who did so the night before, on Randy Johnson's Number Retirement Ceremony night (103 pitches, 5/2/26 vs. KC), and **Bryan Woo** (104 pitches, 5/12/26 at HOU)...has thrown 100+ pitches in 101 career games, tied for 5th-most games in MLB since 2017.

WHIFF LEADER...registered a season-high 18 swings and misses plus 5 swinging strikeouts in his last start on May 9 at Chicago White Sox, surpassing his 17 swings and misses in his first start of the season (3/30 vs. NYY)...leads MLB since 2017 with 3,485 swings and misses across his career, ranking ahead of Kevin Gausman (3,461) and Max Scherzer (3,308)...his 1,278 career swinging strikeouts are 3rd-most in MLB since 2017, trailing Max Scherzer (1,320), Kevin Gausman (1,312), and ranking ahead of Gerrit Cole (1,267).

1,500...collected his 1,500th career strikeout on a swinging strikeout to Aaron Judge in the 6th inning of his March 30 start vs. Yankees...he became just the 7th pitcher to throw 1,500 career strikeouts since 2017.
