ST. LOUIS CARDINALS (17-13) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (16-15) April 30, 2026 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 12:35 EDT - Game #32/Home #17 RHP Hunter Dobbins (2026 Debut) vs. RHP Paul Skenes (4-1, 2.48 ERA)

THE PIRATES: lost, 5-4, on Wednesday vs. St. Louis and have dropped the first three games of this seven-game homestand...Will host the Cardinals for one more game before welcoming Cincinnati to PNC Park for a three-game series (Friday-Sunday)...Will embark on a six-game, seven-day road trip to Arizona (May 5-7) and San Francisco (May 8-10) following this homestand...Are in the seventh game of a stretch of 10 straight games against the National League Central.

SEEING RED: Pittsburgh will welcome Cincinnati to town for a three-game series this weekend...The Pirates took two of three games from the Reds from March 30-April 1 at Great American Ball Park...Pittsburgh is 43-21 (.672) vs. Cincinnati at PNC Park since the start of 2018 (the Pirates have won every season series at home during that span except for 2020, when they went 2-2).

PICK SIX: Pirates pitchers have at least six strikeouts in 68 straight games (since last year on August 18 vs. Toronto)...That is the fourth-longest streak by any Major League team during the Modern Era (since 1901), behind New York-AL (77 games, August 4, 2018-April 23, 2019), Miami (76 games, April 5-June 29, 2023) and Cincinnati (71 games, August 2 [G2], 2020-April 23, 2021)...Pittsburgh's 289 strikeouts so far this season are the second-most in all of Major League Baseball, trailing only Cleveland (297).

PIRATING: Pittsburgh has at least one stolen base in 16 of its last 19 games, a stretch that began on April 10 at Chicago (NL)...The Pirates' 26 steals in that time are the most in Major League Baseball (Tampa Bay, 22, is second)...Pittsburgh's 87.9 stolen-base rate (29-for-33) in 2026 ranks second in MLB, behind Philadelphia (89.5 percent, 17-for-19)...Eight different Pirates have stolen a base...Oneil Cruz has a team-best 10 steals, while Konnor Griffin (seven) & Jake Mangum (five) are second and third, respectively.

SKENES DAY: Paul Skenes, who will start this afternoon's series finale vs. St. Louis, enters today with the longest-active scoreless streak (16.0 straight innings) in all of Major League Baseball (teammate Isaac Mattson, 15.1 innings, ranks second)...His 0.95 ERA (28.1ip/3er) during his four April starts is the lowest by any Pirates pitcher during the month (minimum four starts) since earned runs became an official stat in 1913...Bob Friend (1.06, 1960) and Babe Adams (1.21, 1914) rank second and third, respectively.

GOOD GONZO: Nick Gonzales extended his hitting streak to a career-high 10 straight games (since April 19 vs. Tampa Bay) with his eighth-inning single off George Soriano on Wednesday vs. St. Louis...He is hitting .450 (18-for-40) with two doubles, five RBI and six runs during the streak...His .324 average (33-for-102) ranks eighth in all of Major League Baseball...Oneil Cruz (12 consecutive games, March 31-April 13) holds the longest hitting streak by any Pirate so far this season.

HIT COLLECTORS: Pittsburgh's 264 hits through its first 31 games of 2026 are the sixth-most in all of Major League Baseball, trailing only Atlanta (291), Los Angeles-NL (286), Chicago-NL (279), Colorado (267) and Houston (265).

ON THE MEND: Jared Jones (recovery from right UCL surgery on May 21, 2025) began a rehab assignment with Low-A Bradenton on Wednesday and struck out five batters over 3.0 perfect innings in the Marauders' 5-1 win vs. Lakeland...It marked his first professional game since he struck out seven batters over 4.1 innings of work on September 27, 2024 at Yankee Stadium.

WALK THIS WAY: Bryan Reynolds drew a walk on Wednesday night vs. St. Louis and has now drawn at least one walk in five of his last six games, dating back to April 24 at Milwaukee (he has seven walks total during that stretch)...His 24 walks are tied with St. Louis' Iván Herrera, Detroit's Gleyber Torres and Chicago (AL)'s Miguel Vargas for the fifth-most in all of Major League Baseball, behind only the Athletics' Nick Kurtz (32), Los Angeles (AL)'s Mike Trout (32), Washington's James Wood (30) and Chicago (AL)'s Munetaka Murakami (25)...Reynolds' 24 walks are tied with Jason Bay (2006) for the most by any Pirate in March/April in a season in the Modern Era (since 1901).

April 30, 2003: Adam Hyzdu's third career grand slam highlighted a five-run third inning as Pittsburgh defeated San Diego, 8-5, at Qualcomm Stadium. Jack Wilson gave the Bucs an early 1-0 lead with his first-inning solo shot off Padres starter Oliver Pérez. Kris Benson started and earned the win after tossing 6.0 innings. Mike Williams pitched a scoreless ninth inning and earned his sixth save of the year.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the first round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Skenes won a 6-0 decision after allowing just one hit and striking out seven batters over 7.0 innings of work on April 24 at Milwaukee (he was perfect through 6.2 innings)... He has now won four straight decisions (since April 1 at Cincinnati) for the third time in his career, along with May 17-July 11, 2024 (six games) and August 16-September 9, 2024 (four games)...Skenes has a 0.95 ERA (28.1ip/3er) and a 0.53 WHIP during his current winning streak.

HISTORIC PERFORMANCE: Skenes pitched 6.2 perfect innings before allowing a single to Jake Bauers on April 24 at Milwaukee (he went on to strike out seven batters and surrender just the one hit over his 7.0 innings)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he tied Nellie Briles (August 22, 1972 at San Francisco), Bert Blyleven (August 16, 1980 vs. Montréal) and Nick Kingham (April 29, 2018 vs. St. Louis) for the third-longest perfect game bid by a Pirates pitcher during the Expansion Era (since 1961), behind only Ken Brett (8.0ip, May 27, 1974 vs. San Diego) and Jeff Karstens (7.2ip, August 6, 2008 at Arizona)...Skenes also became just the sixth Pittsburgh pitcher during the Modern Era (since 1901) to have a start of at least 7.0 scoreless innings with one or zero hits allowed, zero walks issued and at least seven strikeouts...Skenes joined Bob Friend (September 7, 1955 at Chicago), Woodie Fryman (July 1, 1966 at New York), A.J. Burnett (April 17, 2013 vs. St. Louis), Kingham (April 29, 2018) & Jared Jones (May 4, 2024 vs. Colorado).

AGAINST THE CARDINALS: Skenes is 0-4 with a 2.39 ERA (37.2ip/10er) and 41 strikeouts in six career starts against St. Louis (he has received a total of three runs of support when in the game during his career against the Cardinals)...Skenes pitched a career-high 8.1 innings on July 23, 2024 vs. St. Louis (lost four straight starts against the Cardinals from July 23, 2024-May 6, 2025).

CENTRAL PERK: Skenes has a 0.75 ERA (12.0ip/1er) and 12 strikeouts in two starts against the National League Central this season...He allowed one run in 5.0 innings on April 1 at Cincinnati and pitched 7.0 scoreless innings on April 24 at Milwaukee...Skenes' 2.16 ERA (133.1ip/32er) against the division since his debut season of 2024 is the lowest by any pitcher in Major League Baseball (minimum 100.0 innings pitched against the National League Central) during that time.

BEST OF THE BEST: Skenes' 2.01 ERA (349.2ip/78er) through his first 61 Major League starts is the lowest by any pitcher through his first 61 career starts during the Live Ball Era (since 1920)... His 21 scoreless starts (last on April 24 at Milwaukee) in his first 61 career starts are the most by any pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1901)...José Fernández (18, 2013-16) is second on the list.

THANKS FOR YOUR SUPPORT: Skenes' 10.24 average runs of support this season are the third-most among Major League pitchers (minimum 29.0 innings pitched), trailing only New York (AL)'s Will Warren (10.63) and Washington's Cade Cavalli (10.27)...His 3.40 average runs of support last season were the third-fewest among all qualified pitchers in Major League Baseball.

WHAT'S UP, DOC: Skenes took home National League Cy Young Award honors in 2025, one year after being named the National League Rookie of the Year...He became the second pitcher in Major League history to win the Rookie of the Year Award and the Cy Young Award in consecutive seasons, along with the Mets' Dwight Gooden (1984-85)...Skenes joined Vernon Law (1960) and Doug Drabek (1990) as the only Pirates pitchers to ever win the Cy Young Award.

FOR A GOOD CAUSE: Skenes has pledged to donate \$100 for every strikeout he records this season to the Gary Sinise Foundation to support our nation's defenders, veterans, first responders, their families and those in need...Skenes, who spent his first two collegiate seasons (2021-22) at the United States Air Force (CO) Academy before transferring to LSU (2023), raised \$500,000 for the foundation at a Raising Cane's event in Royal Palm Beach, FL, on Veterans Day.

PAUL-STAR GAME: Skenes started for the National League in last season's All-Star Game on July 15 at Atlanta's Truist Park after also starting for the National League on July 16, 2024 at Texas' Globe Life Field...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the first pitcher and one of five Major League players ever to start the All-Star Game in each of his first two seasons, joining Joe DiMaggio (seven, 1936-42), Ichiro Suzuki (four, 2001-04), Rod Carew (three, 1967-69) and Frank Robinson (two, 1956-57)...Skenes also joined Rip Sewell (1943-44, 1946) and Bob Veale (1965-66) as the only starting pitchers in team history to be selected to the All-Star Game in at least two straight seasons (there was no All-Star Game in 1945)...He also became the first player in team history to be selected to the All-Star Game in each of his first two Major League seasons.

Has hit safely in five of his last six starts (went 0-for-3 on Sunday at Milwaukee)...Hit his first home run of the 2026 season on 4/14 vs. Washington. Is hitting .309 (51-for-165) in his 52 games at PNC Park since the beginning of the 2025 campaign...Has posted a 3.55 catcher's ERA (106.1ip/42er).

Has made one start at first base, one in left field, one in center field and one in right field...Has hit safely in three of five games w/a plate appearance.

Is one of only six Major League players since 1920 with at least nine home runs, 10 stolen bases and 26 RBI through his first 29 games of any season. Has at least one RBI in five of his last six games (seven RBI total)...Is batting .281 (9-for-32) w/18 RBI with runners in scoring position so far this year. Is one of three Pirates since RBI became official in 1920 with 26-plus RBI in March/April of a season...Is 13-for-37 (.351) against left-handed pitchers.

Was 2-for-4 with a walk and a career-high three runs on 4/13 vs. Washington (also posted the sixth stolen base of his career during the sixth inning).

Joined Howie Camnitz (1910) and Bud Hafey (1935) as the only Pirates ever to hit their first career home run on their birthday on 4/24 at Milwaukee. Is 7-for-21 (.333) with nine RBI with RISP...Has hit safely in eight of his last nine home contests with a plate appearance (since 4/13 vs. Washington).

His 18 RBI out of the No. 2 spot of the lineup so far this year are tied with Seattle's Cal Raleigh for the fourth-most in all of Major League Baseball. Became the first Pirate since RBI became an official statistic in 1920 with at least five RBI in back-to-back games (he achieved that from 4/12-13).
