**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets defeated the Dodgers, 5-3, yesterday... The Mets are a season-high tying five games above .500...New York earned their fifth series victory (out of six) of the season...With the victory, the Mets secured at least a .500 road trip...The Mets finish their second road trip of the season an 11-day, 10-game trip (5-1) against the Athletics (3-0), Dodgers (2-1) and Giants (four games)... The Mets are off on Monday before they return home for a six-game homestand against the Nationals (three games) and Rockies (three games).

**WAR, WHAT IS IT GOOD FOR?:** Brandon Nimmo leads the National League and is second in the majors with a 1.3 fWAR...Francisco Lindor is fourth in the National League and sixth in the majors with a 1.1 fWAR.

**WALK THIS WAY:** Brandon Nimmo has drawn 15 walks and struck out just seven times this season...Jeff McNeil has 12 walks and has also struck out only seven times...There are 25 players with at least a dozen walks in 2023 and Cleveland's Steven Kwan is the only other with fewer than 10 strikeouts...Overall, the Mets are tied for the major league lead with 92 free passes this season.

**CANHA GET AN AMEN:** Mark Canha has recorded seven extra-base hits through 18 games this season...He had no extra-base hits until his 15th game last year and did not collect his seventh until June 6, his 45th game...He is hitting .317 (19-60) with a .990 OPS in his last 15 games against the Giants with a double, a triple, five home runs, 15 RBI and 15 runs scored.

**THE MAY BE GIANTS:** Francisco Lindor hit .375 (12-32) with four doubles, a triple, three homers, 12 RBI, seven runs scored and a 1.207 OPS in seven games vs. SF last season...Eduardo Escobar has hit safely in each of his last nine games against the Giants, going 16-35 (.457) with a 1.256 OPS...His .315 average is the highest against any opposing team other than the Pirates, which he has a .400 average against.

**FIVE FOR FIGHTING:** Yesterday, Brandon Nimmo went 5-5 with two runs, one home run and two RBI...It was the second time in his career that he recorded five hits (also, August 15, 2018 at Baltimore)...See chart below for Mets who have recorded multiple five-hit games:

**INVADER NIM:** Overall, in 18 games this season, Brandon Nimmo is batting .349 with 12 runs, five doubles, 10 RBI, 15 walks, a .481 OBP and a .476 SLG...His .481 OBP ranks second in the majors and in the Senior Circuit...The left-handed hitter has drawn 338 walks in his career, which places him tied for 17th in franchise history with John Milner...Dave Magadan is 16th with 347 free passes...Nimmo has posted a .389 OBP, which is the third-highest in franchise history (min. 2,000 PA)...Only John Olerud (.425) and Dave Magadan (.391) had higher OBP.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** The Mets are 5-1 on their current 10-game road trip...The team has hit .246/.359/.415 with 11 doubles, eight home runs, 35 RBI and seven steals during the trip...The Mets are outscoring opponents 37-25 during the first six games of the trip...Overall, the Mets are 8-5 on the road this season.

**GIANTS-METS NOTES:** In 2022, the Mets won the season series for the first time since they went 4-3 in 2018...New York is 33-40 at Oracle Park since the ballpark opened in 2010.

**HOMER HAPPY:** The Mets have homered in six of their last seven games...The team has hit 10 home runs in that span...The Mets hit a total of 10 home runs in the previous 12 games.

**ALL YOUR BASE ARE BELONG TO US:** The Mets have stolen 21 bases this season, which is tied for fourth in the majors and is tied for second in the National League...New York is one of only five teams with 20 or more stolen bases in 2023, joining the Guardians (26), Orioles (25), Cubs (22) and Pirates (21)...The team's 21 steals through 19 games are tied for the second-most in club history (courtesy of Sportsradar)... they also had 21 in 2007 and 1970, with a franchise-most 29 in 1991.

**WHEN YOU WISH UPON A STARLING:** Starling Marte is tied for sixth in the majors and tied for third in the NL with seven steals...He ranks third among active players with 321 career SB...Only Elvis Andrus (337) and Billy Hamilton (324) have more.

**D-FENCE:** The Mets have committed just four errors in 19 games this season, the fewest in the majors...The team's .994 fielding percentage is the best in the majors...Francisco Lindor has recorded five DRS (defensive runs saved) according to the Fielding Bible...That is tied for the most in the majors.

**BROTHERS IN ARMS:** Together, Adam Ottavino and David Robertson have combined to post a 1.58 ERA (3 ER/17.1 IP) with five walks and 19 strikeouts...They have converted seven of eight save opportunities... They are one of three pairs of teammates who have each recorded multiple saves this season (also, Devin Williams and Bryse Wilson of the Brewers, Carlos Estévez and José Quijada of the Angels).

**THE SMITH:** Drew Smith has 12 strikeouts in 7.2 innings this season... His 14.09 K/per nine among relievers is 11th in the NL (minimum 5.0 innings)...He is 1-0 with a 2.35 ERA (2 ER/7.2 IP) in nine games this year.

**POWER STATION:** Pete Alonso is tied for the major league lead with eight home runs...He is tied for sixth in the NL with 15 RBI, ranks fifth in the league with a .615 SLG and 10th with a .978 OPS...Alonso has safely hit in 11 of his last 13 games, batting .333 (17-51) with 11 runs, seven home runs, 13 RBI, six walks with a .404 OBP and an .745 SLG.

### SENGA NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Senga fell one out shy of winning his third straight start to begin his career...Threw 4.2 innings in the Mets 17-6 win on April 14 against Oakland, allowing four runs on seven hits with four walks and seven strikeouts.

**PUTTING THE K IN FORK:** Senga's "ghost fork" has accounted for 16 of his 21 strikeouts through three starts...The pitch has a 62 percent whiff rate and a 36 percent putaway rate...Opponents have managed just one hit in 20 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .050 batting average.

**ALL I DO IS WIN:** Tonight, Senga will look to become the second Mets starting pitcher ever to begin his career 3-0 (Steven Matz, who won his first four career decisions, is the other)...The only Japanese-born pitchers to start their career 3-0 or better are Senga won his first two starts this season, making him the fourth player in franchise history to earn the win in their first two career major league starts, joining Steven Matz, Mike Pelfrey and Gary Gentry...Additionally, he joins Kazuhisa Ishii, Hideki Irapu and Koji Uehara as the only Japanese-born pitchers to win each of their first two career major league starts.

**MLB DEBUT NOTES:** Senga became the 64th pitcher whose major league debut came in a start for the Mets...New York has had one pitcher make his MLB debut as a starter in each of the previous three seasons: José Butto in 2022, Tylor Megill in 2021 and David Peterson in 2020 (the Mets won each of those three games)...Senga allowed one run over 5.1 innings on three hits, three walks and eight strikeouts in his major league debut...His eight strikeouts were tied for the fourth-most by a Japanese-born pitcher in their major league debut and tied for the third-most by a Mets pitcher in their major league debut.

**METS-JAPAN CONNECTION:** Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

**CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:** Prior to joining the Mets, Senga spent 11 seasons in Japan's NPB with the Fukuoka Softbank Hawks...During his NPB career he posted a 87-44 record with a 2.59 ERA (313 ER/1,089.0 IP) and 1,252 strikeouts (10.3 K/9.0)...He was also a three-time NPB All-Star (2013, 2017 and 2019), a two-time Pacific League Best Nine Award winner (2019 and 2020) and a two-time Mitsui Golden Glove Award winner (2019 and 2020).

**2022:** Last season, Senga went 11-6 with a 1.94 ERA (31 ER/144.0 IP), 156 strikeouts, a 1.06 WHIP and a 0.4 HR/9 rate over 22 appearances.

**INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION:** Senga appeared in four games in the 2017 World Baseball Classic for Team Japan...He posted a 0.82 ERA, throwing 11.0 innings and allowing one run on seven hits with 16 strikeouts and one walk...He also pitched in two games during the Tokyo Summer Olympics, throwing a total of 3.0 scoreless innings as Japan won the gold medal on its home turf.
