PITTSBURGH PIRATES (2-3) vs. CINCINNATI REDS (3-2)

April 1, 2026 - Great American Ball Park - Cincinnati, OH - 12:40 EDT - Game #6/Road #6
RHP Paul Skenes (0-1, 67.50 ERA) vs. LHP Andrew Abbott (0-0, 0.00 ERA)

THE PIRATES: picked up their second win of the 2026 season with Tuesday night's 8-3 win at Cincinnati...Will conclude this season-opening, six-game road trip today before heading home for a six-game homestand against Baltimore (Friday-Sunday) and San Diego (April 6-8)...Have a National League-best eight home runs in their first five games.

HEADING BACK TO THE 412: Pittsburgh's Home Opener on Friday vs. Baltimore is scheduled to begin at 4:12 p.m., marking the fifth straight season that first pitch for the Pirates' Home Opener will be at 4:12 p.m...It will also be the fourth season in a row in which Pittsburgh has opened its home schedule against an American League opponent (the Pirates defeated Chicago in 2023, while falling to Baltimore in 2024 and New York in 2025)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Pittsburgh is the only team in all of Major League Baseball to have four consecutive interleague home openers since the league moved to year-round interleague play in 2013.

KING OF THE QUEEN CITY: Paul Skenes is 4-0 with a 0.31 ERA (29.0ip/1er) and 40 strikeouts in five career starts against Cincinnati...He enters today with a 28.0-inning scoreless streak against the Reds, dating back to the second inning of his first start against Cincinnati on June 17, 2024...Per OptaStats, the only Pittsburgh pitcher with a longer scoreless streak against the Reds was Babe Adams (36.0 innings) from 1910-11...Skenes' 0.31 career ERA against Cincinnati is the lowest by a Pirates pitcher against any single opponent (min. five starts) since earned runs became official in the National League in 1912... He has not allowed a run/issued a walk (16 strikeouts) in 11.0 innings at GABP.

PAINT IT RED: Bryan Reynolds moved into a tie with Jason Bay for ninth place on Pittsburgh's all-time home runs list after hitting the second of back-to-back home runs with Ryan O'Hearn (off Brandon Williamson) in the second inning of Tuesday night's 8-3 win at Cincinnati...He has gone deep 13 times in 51 career games here at Great American Ball Park...Reynolds' 13 home runs here at Great American Ball Park since the start of 2019 (his debut season) are tied with Paul Goldschmidt & Ian Happ for the most among all visiting players.

SIGN HERE, PLEASE: Ryan O'Hearn, who was signed to a two-year contract on January 8, extended his hitting streak to 14 straight games (since last season on September 19 with San Diego) with his three-run home run in the second inning of the Pirates' 8-3 win on Tuesday at GABP...He has gone 8-for-19 (.421) with two home runs, six RBI and three runs in his first five games with Pittsburgh...O'Hearn became one of only seven Pirates to have at least eight hits and six RBI through his first five games with the team since RBI became an official stat in 1920...He joined Walter Mueller (1922), Tony Piet (1931), Jack Merson (1951), Shawon Dunston (1997), Reggie Sanders (2003) and Bligh Madris (2022) on that list.

THE YO GOES ON: Yohan Ramirez earned the win on Tuesday at Cincinnati after striking out the two batters (Matt McLain and Elly De La Cruz) he faced... His seven strikeouts are tied for the third-most among Major League relievers.

CRUZN' FOR A BRUISIN': Oneil Cruz posted his third career multi-homer game (also last season on May 23 vs. Milwaukee and June 29 vs. New York-NL) with his first two home runs of 2026 on Tuesday at Cincinnati...His 444-foot home run in the fourth inning was tied with Seattle's Dominic Canzone (March 26 vs. Cleveland) for the longest by a Major League hitter this season.

April 1, 2018: Pittsburgh swept a doubleheader against Detroit at Comerica Park to complete a season-opening, three-game sweep of the Tigers. The Pirates won the first game, 1-0, after Trevor Williams tossed 6.0 hitless innings and Gregory Polanco drove in the only run with a first-inning single. Pittsburgh won the second game, 8-6, behind home runs from Josh Harrison, Starling Marte and David Freese.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the first round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Skenes allowed a career-high tying five runs (also last season on April 8 vs. St. Louis) while losing an 11-7 decision on Opening Day (March 26) against the Mets at Citi Field... He took the mound with a 2-0 lead, but his 0.2-inning start was the shortest start of his career.

REPRESENTING THE USA: The 23-year-old Skenes represented the United States during this year's World Baseball Classic...He went 2-0 with a 1.08 ERA (8.1ip/1er), nine strikeouts and a 0.96 WHIP...Skenes struck out seven batters and allowed just one hit and one walk over 4.0 scoreless innings on March 9 vs. Mexico, while also giving up one run in 4.1 innings on March 15 at the Dominican Republic...He also pitched 3.0 innings in a March 3 exhibition at San Francisco.

AGAINST THE REDS: Skenes is 4-0 with a 0.31 ERA (29.0ip/1er) and 40 strikeouts (two walks issued) in five career starts against Cincinnati...The only run he allowed came in the first inning of his first start against the Reds (June 17, 2024 at PNC Park)...He has tossed a combined 23.0 scoreless innings while also striking out 33 batters in his four starts against Cincinnati since then...Skenes has pitched 11.0 scoreless innings and struck out 16 batters (zero walks issued) while posting a .154 (6-for-39) batting average against in two starts at Great American Ball Park.

HIT LIMIT: Skenes allowed seven hits in his start against Cincinnati last season on August 7 at PNC Park, snapping a streak of 46 straight starts with six or fewer hits allowed to begin his Major League career...It was the longest streak by a Major League starting pitcher (excluding openers) to begin a career during the Modern Era (since 1901)...It was also tied with San Diego's Dinelson Lamet (July 29, 2017-June 26, 2021) for the second-longest streak by a Major League starter (excluding openers) in the Modern Era...The only starter with a longer streak was Sonny Gray, who did it in 48 consecutive starts from August 25 [G2], 2018-May 5, 2021 (he made the first two starts with New York-AL, while he made the last 46 starts during the streak with Cincinnati).

WHAT'S UP, DOC: Skenes took home National League Cy Young Award honors in 2025, one year after being named the National League Rookie of the Year...He became the second pitcher in Major League history to win the Rookie of the Year Award and the Cy Young Award in consecutive seasons, along with the Mets' Dwight Gooden (1984-85)...Skenes joined Vernon Law (1960) and Doug Drabek (1990) as the only Pirates pitchers to ever win the Cy Young Award.

ELITE COMPANY: Skenes has posted a 2.10 ERA (321.1ip/75er) through the first 56 starts of his Major League career...The only other Major League pitchers in the Live Ball Era (since 1920) with an ERA of 2.10 or lower through the first 56 starts of their career are St. Louis Howie Pollet (2.04, 1941-46), Los Angeles' Orel Hershiser (2.07, 1984-86) and Oakland's Vida Blue (2.10, 1969-72).

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Skenes has gone 7-8 with a 2.30 ERA (121.1ip/31er) in 22 career starts against the National League Central...His ERA is the lowest by any pitcher with at least 100.0 innings pitched since the start of 2024 (Chicago-NL's Jameson Taillon, 3.53, is second on the list).

ON THE ROAD: Skenes went 4-5 with a 2.15 ERA (96.1ip/23er) in 17 starts away from PNC Park last season...The only pitcher in all of Major League Baseball with a lower road ERA was Los Angeles (NL)'s Yoshinobu Yamamoto, who had a 2.13 ERA (105.2ip/25er) over his 18 road starts.

FIRING BLANKS: Skenes struck out seven batters over his 6.0 scoreless innings on September 24 at Cincinnati (his final start of the 2025 season)...He did not allow a run in three of his final four starts...Skenes made a total of 12 scoreless starts in 2025, surpassing Trevor Williams (11) in 2018 for the most scoreless starts by a Pirates pitcher in a season in the Modern Era (since 1901).

IN THE CONVERSATION: Skenes finished tied for sixth in National League MVP Award voting in 2025...He and Arizona's Corbin Carroll each received a total of 83 points...The only players with more points were Los Angeles' Shohei Ohtani (420), Philadelphia's Kyle Schwarber (260), New York's Juan Soto (231), Arizona's Geraldo Perdomo (196) and Philadelphia's Trea Turner (102).

FOR A GOOD CAUSE: Skenes has pledged to donate \$100 for every strikeout he records this season to the Gary Sinise Foundation to support our nation's defenders, veterans, first responders, their families and those in need...Skenes, who spent his first two collegiate seasons (2021-22) at the United States Air Force (CO) Academy before transferring to LSU (2023), raised \$500,000 for the foundation at a Raising Cane's event in Royal Palm Beach, FL, on Veterans Day.
