AT A GLANCE: The Yankees opened their 124th season in franchise history against the San Francisco Giants at Oracle Park on Wednesday...their current three-game series (1-0 thus far) is part of a season-opening six-game road trip as the Yankees will also travel to Seattle from Mon.-Wed.

- ▶ Are opening the season on the road for just the third time in the last eight seasons (since 2019)...marks the fifth time the Yankees have begun the season on the road in the last 12 years (since 2015).
- ▶ Are opening the season against San Francisco for the second time in franchise history (also 2023).
- ▶ Are opening the season against a National League opponent for the fourth time in franchise history (also 2020 at Washington, 2023 vs. San Francisco and 2025 vs. Milwaukee).

GAME WON: The Yankees defeated the Giants, 7-0, on Opening Day on Wednesday at Oracle Park...**LHP Max Fried** (6.1IP, 2H, 0R, 1BB, 4K, 1HP) made his fourth career Opening Day start and earned the win after tossing 6.1 scoreless innings...**SS José Caballero** (1-for-4, 1R, 1RBI) hit a go-ahead RBI single in the second inning...**3B Ryan McMahon** (1-for-3, 1R, 2RBI, 1BB) reached base twice and hit a two-run single in the second inning...**CF Trent Grisham** (1-for-5, 1 triple, 2RBI) hit a two-run triple in the second inning...**DH Giancarlo Stanton** (2-for-4, 1R, 1RBI) recorded two hits, including an RBI single in the fifth inning...**C Austin Wells** (2-for-3, 1R, 1BB), **1B Ben Rice** (1-for-4, 1R, 1BB) and **2B Jazz Chisholm Jr.** (1-for-3, 1R, 1HP, 1SB) each reached base multiple times...**RHP Jake Bird** (0.2IP, 1K), **LHP Brent Headrick** (1.0IP, 1H, 1BB, 1K) and **RHP Camilo Doval** (1.0IP, 1WP) were scoreless in relief.

- ▶ Have won each of their last five Opening Day games and are 8-1 in their last nine Opening Day games since 2018.

PITCH PERFECT: Yankees pitchers tossed a shutout on Wednesday, marking only the second time in the last 38 years (since 1989) and the 14th time in franchise history the Yankees tossed a shutout on Opening Day (also 1908, '39, '41-42, '44, '46, '51, '58, '67-68, '77, '88 and 2023)...their 7-0 shutout win matched their third-largest shutout victory in franchise history, trailing only their 8-0 wins on Opening Day in 1967 and 1988 (also recorded a 7-0 win on Opening Day in 1942).

SCHLITZ'S CREEK: RHP Cam Schlichter will make his season debut today at San Francisco...saw his first Major League action in 2025 with the Yankees, going 4-3 with a 2.96 ERA (73.0IP, 58H, 24R/ER, 31BB, 84K, 8HR) in 14 starts...allowed 3R-or-fewer in 12-of-14 starts, 2R-or-fewer in 10 starts and 1R-or-fewer in seven starts.

- ▶ Went 2-0 with a 0.93 ERA (9.2IP, 6H, 1R/ER, 2BB, 11K, 0HR) in three spring starts.

RISPY BUSINESS: Yankees batters went 4-for-11 with RISP on Wednesday at San Francisco.

THE SKIPPER, TOO: The 2026 season marks Manager Aaron Boone's ninth season at the helm...Boone has compiled a career 698-497 (.584) managerial record and has led the Yankees to a postseason berth in seven of his first eight seasons at the helm (2018-22, '24-25)...excluding the abbreviated 60-game 2020 season, the Yankees have averaged 95 wins per year during Boone's tenure...has 698 career regular season managerial wins and needs two wins to reach 700...his 698 wins rank seventh on the Yankees' all-time list, trailing only Joe McCarthy (1,460-867-21), Joe Torre (1,173-767-2), Casey Stengel (1,149-696-6), Miller Huggins (1,067-719-10), Ralph Houk (944-806-7) and Joe Girardi (910-710).

OPENING DAY NOD: LHP Max Fried made his fourth career Opening Day start and first as a Yankee on Wednesday at San Francisco...earned the win after tossing 6.1 scoreless innings (2H, 1BB, 4K, 1HP)...was the first Yankees Opening Day starter to throw at least 6.1 scoreless innings since David Cone in 1996 (also 0R in 7.0IP)...was only the fifth Yankees starter in the Divisional Era (since 1969) to do so, joining Cone, Rick Rhoden (SHO in 1988), Ron Guidry (0R in 9.0IP in 1980) and Catfish Hunter (0R in 7.0IP in 1977).

- ▶ Was only the fourth pitcher in franchise history to toss more than 6.0 scoreless innings and allow 2H-or-fewer on Opening Day, joining David Cone (2H and 0R in 7.0IP in 1996), Ron Guidry (2H and 0R in 9.0IP in 1980) and Mel Stottlemyre (2H in SHO in 1967).
- ▶ Retired his final 8BF, 15 of his last 16BF and 18 of his final 21BF.

GOOD AS GOLD: In 169 career games vs. San Francisco, INF Paul Goldschmidt has batted .301/.403/.551 (181-for-601) with 101R, 44 doubles, 5 triples, 32HR, 118RBI, 105BB and 145B...among active players vs. the Giants, ranks first in hits, runs scored, RBI and OBP, tied for first in triples, second in HR and doubles, third in OPS (.954) and sixth in SLG...his 15 career home runs at Oracle Park are the most by any opposing player at the venue.

MERRY GRISHMAS: Trent Grisham hit a two-run triple in the second inning on Wednesday at San Francisco...became the first Yankee to triple on Opening Day since Johnny Damon did so in 2009.

GOT YOUR NUMBER: OF Aaron Judge has hit .375/.600/1.500 (3-for-8) with 3HR and 6BB against San Francisco's LHP Robbie Ray...INF/OF Amed Rosario has hit .400/.438/.667 (6-for-15) with 4 doubles and 1BB against Ray.

HOW THEY WERE BUILT: Of the 26 players on the Yankees' 2026 Opening Day active roster, 10 were signed as free agents (Bellinger, Blackburn, Escarra, Fried, Goldschmidt, Grichuk, Hill, Judge*, Rosario and Yarbrough), 10 were acquired by trade (Bednar, Bird, Caballero, Chisholm Jr., Cruz, Doval, Grisham, McMahon, Stanton and Weathers), five were originally drafted and signed by the Yankees (Judge*, Rice, Schlichter, Warren and Wells), one was claimed off waivers (Headrick) and one was selected in the Rule 5 Draft (Winquest).

- ▶ Of the 26 players on the Yankees' 2026 Opening Day active roster, 12 were not on the club's 2025 Opening Day active roster — **P (7):** Bednar, Bird, Blackburn, Doval, Schlichter, Weathers, Winquest; **INF (1):** McMahon; **OF (2):** Grichuk, Stanton; **UTIL (2):** Caballero, Rosario.
- ▶ The Yankees' Opening Day active roster included players from the Bahamas, Dominican Republic, Panamá, Puerto Rico and United States.
- ▶ Schlichter and Winquest made their first career Opening Day active roster...Winquest is the only rookie and only player in line to make his Major League debut...three players are in line to make their Yankees debuts (Grichuk, Weathers and Winquest).

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge won his third career American League MVP and his first career batting title in 2025 after hitting .331/.457/.688 (179-for-541) with 137R, 30 doubles, 2 triples, 53HR, 114RBI, 124BB/36IBB, 7HP, 7SF and 125B in 152 games...set career highs in BA, runs scored and IBB...led the Majors in BA (.331), OBP (.457), SLG (.688), OPS (1.144), times on base (310), intentional walks (36) and WAR (10.1 - FanGraphs), ranked second in runs scored (137, first in AL), total bases (372, first in AL), walks (124, first in AL), XBH (85, first in AL) and go-ahead RBI (31, second in AL), fourth in home runs (53, second in AL), tied for fourth in hits (179, third in AL) and game-winning RBI (17, tied for third in AL), fifth in RBI (114, second in AL) and tied for fifth in multi-hit games (51, tied for fourth in AL).

- ▶ Became only the fourth player in franchise history to win the AL MVP at least three times (also 2022 and '24), joining Mickey Mantle (three times), Yogi Berra (three times) and Joe DiMaggio (three times)...became only the fourth Yankee to win the AL MVP in consecutive seasons, joining Roger Maris (1960-61), Mantle (1956-57) and Berra (1954-55).
- ▶ Has hit .417/.523/.861 (15-for-36) with 11R, 1 double, 5HR, 10RBI, 7BB, 1HP and 2SB in 10 career games vs. San Francisco...in four career games at Oracle Park, has hit .400/.500/1.000 (6-for-15) with 5R, 3HR, 6RBI, 3BB and 2SB.

STANTON ISLAND: DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton recorded two hits on Wednesday at the Giants, including an RBI single in the fifth inning...has reached base in 13-of-36 Opening Day plate appearances with the Yankees, batting .324/.361/.706 (11-for-34) with 7R, 1 double, 4HR, 9RBI and 2BB in eight games.

- ▶ **Has hit .323/.403/.722 (64-for-198) with 35R, 17 doubles, 1 triple, 20HR, 43RBI, 23BB and 4HP in 52 career games vs. San Francisco.**
- ▶ Has hit 8HR in his last 12G against the Giants (since 7/7/17).
- ▶ Has also batted .317/.381/.683 (38-for-120) with 17R, 12 doubles, 1 triple, 10HR, 23RBI, 11BB and 2HP in 30 games at Oracle Park.
- ▶ **Needs 2RBI to reach 500RBI as a Yankee.**

YEAR IN REVIEW: The Yankees posted a 94-68 (.580) record in 2025, tied with Toronto for the best record in the American League and tied for the third-best record in the Majors, trailing only Milwaukee (97-65, .599) and Philadelphia (96-66, .593)...their 94 wins matched their 2024 total.

- ▶ The Yankees recorded their 33rd consecutive winning season (since 1993), marking the second-longest streak in the four major sports (MLB/NFL/NBA/NHL), behind only their 39 straight winning seasons from 1926-64.
- ▶ Recorded at least 90 wins for the seventh time in their last eight 162-game seasons (2017-19, '21-22, '24-25)...are one of only two teams to record at least seven 90-win seasons over that span, joining the Los Angeles Dodgers (eight: 2017-19, '21-25)...have recorded at least 90 wins in 22 of their last 29 full seasons since 1996 (1996-99, 2001-07, '09-12, '17-19, '21-22, '24-25)...their 22 seasons are the most in the Majors over that span (next: Atlanta and Los Angeles-NL - 16).

ELITE COMPANY: The Yankees have four former MVPs on their roster: INF/OF Cody Bellinger, INF Paul Goldschmidt, OF Aaron Judge and DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton...the Yankees are only the ninth team in Major League history to have at least four former Most Valuable Players play for them in a single season...join the 2025 Yankees (Bellinger/Goldschmidt/Judge/Stanton), 2025 Dodgers (Betts/Freeman/Kershaw/Ohtani), 2024 Dodgers (Betts/Freeman/Kershaw/Ohtani), 2022 Dodgers (Bellinger/Betts/Freeman/Kershaw), 2021 Dodgers (Bellinger/Betts/Kershaw/Pujols), 1996 Red Sox (Canseco/Clemens/Mitchell/Vaughn), 1982 Angels (Baylor/Carew/Jackson/Lynn) and 1978 Reds (Bench/Foster/Morgan/Rose) - credit: Elias.

THE SAN FRANCISCO TREAT: The Yankees are 17-8 all-time vs. the Giants, winning six of their eight completed series...are 11-3 in their last 14 games against San Francisco (since 7/24/16).

- ▶ **Are 8-2 against the Giants at Oracle Park...have won each of their last seven games at the venue (since 4/26/19).**
- ▶ Have scored at least 5R in 12 of their last 14 games against the Giants (since 7/24/16).

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

March 27, 2025: Austin Wells becomes the first catcher since 1900 to hit a leadoff home run on Opening Day. He also became the first Yankee to hit a leadoff home run on Opening Day (credit: Elias). Wells was the 11th catcher (17th instance) since 1900 to hit a leadoff home run. He also became the first catcher in franchise history to bat leadoff in the starting lineup...

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

March 28, 2024: The Yankees overcome a 4-0 deficit to defeat the Astros, 5-4, on Opening Day. It marked just the second time in franchise history the Yankees have trailed by at least 4R on Opening Day and won (were also down 9-0 on Opening Day in 1950 at Boston and won 15-10).

March 28, 2024: Giancarlo Stanton makes his Yankees debut, going 3-for-5 with 3R, 1 double, 2HR and 4RBI at Toronto. According to Elias, he becomes just the second Yankee to homer twice in his first game with the club, joining Roger Maris, who went 4-for-5 with 2R, 1 double, 2HR and 4RBI on 4/19/60 at Boston. He is also the seventh Yankee to hit 2HR on Opening Day.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP CAM SCHLITTLER (4-3, 2.96 ERA IN 2025)

RHP Cam Schlittler will make his season debut today at San Francisco...the 25-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest after making his final spring start on Saturday at Detroit (ND, 3.2IP, 2H, 0R, 1BB, 1K)...went 2-0 with a 0.93 ERA (9.2IP, 6H, 1R/ER, 2BB, 11K, 0HR) in three spring training starts...made his first career Opening Day roster...saw his first Major League action in 2025 with the Yankees, going 4-3 with a 2.96 ERA (73.0IP, 58H, 24R/ER, 31BB, 84K, 8HR) in 14 starts...allowed 3R-or-fewer in 12-of-14 starts, 2R-or-fewer in 10 starts and 1R-or-fewer in seven starts...**his 84K through his first 14 career games are tied with Dave Righetti (84K in first 14G) for the fourth-most in franchise history**, trailing only Masahiro Tanaka (113K in first 14G), Orlando Hernández (97K in first 14G) and Luis Gil (88K in first 14G)...**his 24R allowed are tied with Bill Stafford (24R in first 14GS from 1960-61) for the second-fewest by a Yankees pitcher through their first 14 career starts**, trailing only Dave Righetti (22R in first 14GS from 1979-81)...the Weymouth, Mass., native was selected by the Yankees in the seventh round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of Northeastern University (Mass.).

GRAPEFRUIT JUICE: Went 2-0 with a 0.93 ERA (9.2IP, 6H, 1R/ER, 2BB, 11K, 0HR) in three spring training starts.

ROAD TRIP: Made six road starts in 2025, going 0-1 with a 2.76 ERA (32.2IP, 22H, 10R/ER, 14BB, 37K, 4HR)...allowed 2R-or-fewer in five of his six starts, including 1R-or-fewer in three of those starts.

- ✦ Recorded at least 6K in five of his six starts last season.
- ✦ The Yankees went 5-1 in his six road starts in 2025...recieved 2R-or-fewer of support in four of those starts.

VS. SAN FRANCISCO/INTERLEAGUE: Will be making his first career start vs. the Giants today.

- ✦ Made two starts vs. National League opponents in 2025, going 1-1 with a 1.64 ERA (11.0IP, 8H, 2R/ER, 5BB, 14K, 2HR).

2025: Saw his first Major League action in 2025 with the Yankees, going 4-3 with a 2.96 ERA (73.0IP, 58H, 24R/ER, 31BB, 84K, 8HR) in 14 starts...opponents batted .217/.309/.337 (58-for-267, 8HR); LH .222/.313/.310 (35-for-158, 4HR); RH .211/.304/.376 (23-for-109)...allowed 3R-or-fewer in 12-of-14 starts, 2R-or-fewer in 10 starts and 1R-or-fewer in seven starts.

- ✦ The Yankees went 9-5 in his 14 starts, including 7-1 over his final eight starts from 8/20-9/27.
- ✦ Began the season in the minors, combining to go 6-6 with a 2.82 ERA (76.2IP, 67H, 30R/24ER, 26BB, 99K, 4HR) in 15 combined games (14 starts) with Double-A Somerset and Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre.
- ✦ **Allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of his first nine career starts from 7/9-8/30, tying Dave Righetti (9GS from 9/16/79-8/16/81) and Herb Thormahlen (9GS from 9/29/1917(G2)-6/8/1918) for the second-longest streak to begin their career in franchise history**, trailing only Joba Chamberlain (11GS from 6/3-7/30/08).
- ✦ From when he made his Major League debut on 7/9 to the end of the season, ranked among AL pitchers (min. 60.0IP) in opponents' SLG (.337, fourth), strikeout rate (27.6%, sixth), K/9.0IP (10.36, seventh), strikeouts (84, eighth) and ERA (2.96, ninth).
- ✦ Made his Major League debut on 7/9 vs. Seattle and earned his first career win after allowing 3R/ER over 5.1IP (4H, 2BB, 7K, 2HR)...became the 10th pitcher in franchise history to record at least 7K in his Major League debut, joining Jordan Montgomery (7K on 4/12/17 vs. Tampa Bay), Luis Severino (7K on 8/5/15 vs. Boston), Masahiro Tanaka (8K on 4/4/14 at Toronto), Orlando Hernández (7K on 6/3/98 vs. Tampa Bay), Hideki Irabu (9K on 7/10/97 vs. Detroit), Al Leiter (8K on 9/15/87 vs. Milwaukee), Rich Beck (8K on 9/14/65 at Washington-AL), Vic Raschi (8K on 9/23/46 vs. Philadelphia-AL) and Bill Hogg (7K on 4/25/1905 vs. Washington-AL)...was the first Yankee to earn the win in his Major League debut since Jhony Brito on 4/2/23 vs. San Francisco.
- ✦ Went 1-1 with a 1.60 ERA (33.2IP, 6ER) and 39K in six starts in August...allowed 2R-or-fewer in all six starts...recorded at least 6K in five of his six starts...**his 1.60 ERA was the third-lowest by a Yankees rookie (min. 25.0IP) in a single calendar month over the last 52 years (since 1974)**, trailing only Luis Gil (0.70 ERA in May 2024) and José Contreras (1.51 ERA in September 2003)...during the month of August, ranked sixth among Major League pitchers in ERA (third in AL), tied for seventh in strikeouts (tied for third in AL), eighth in opponents' BA (.186, fourth in AL), ninth in opponents' SLG (.288, fourth in AL) and 10th in strikeout rate (29.8%, seventh in AL) and opponents' OPS (.555, fourth in AL).
- ✦ Went 3-2 with a 2.47 ERA (58.1IP, 16ER) and 69K over his final 11 starts (8/2-9/27)...allowed 2R-or-fewer in nine of those 11 starts...allowed 4H-or-fewer in eight of those 11 starts, holding opponents to a .192/.284/.298 (40-for-208) slash line over that stretch.
- ✦ Allowed 1R-or-fewer in seven of his final nine starts (8/13-9/27), going 3-1 with a 2.23 ERA (48.1IP, 12ER) and 60K...allowed only 2HR over that span, posting a 0.37 HR/9.0IP ratio (2HR/48.1IP) after surrendering 6HR over his first five starts from 7/9-8/8 (2.19 HR/9.0IP ratio).
- ✦ **Posted a career-high 17.2 scoreless inning streak from 8/13-8/30...was the third-longest scoreless streak by a Yankees rookie in the last 57 years (since 1969)**, trailing only Ron Marinaccio's 19.0 scoreless inning streak from 5/22-7/28/22 and Luis Gil's 18.2 scoreless inning streak from 8/3-9/8/21.
- ✦ Recorded his first career scoreless start on 8/20 at Tampa Bay (ND, 6.2IP, 1H, 0R, 2BB, 8K)...retired his first 18BF before allowing a single to Chandler Simpson in the seventh inning...became the first Yankees rookie to retire his first 18BF in a game since Fritz Peterson retired his first 21BF on 7/4/66 vs. Chicago-AL-Game 2.
