TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners host the Detroit Tigers for the first of 3 games to close out the first homestand of the season...the Mariners opened their season with a 4-game split against the Athletics...**Emerson Hancock** is set to make his season debut tonight, to finish the first turn through the Mariners rotation...tonight's game will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call with **Jen Mueller** serving as sideline reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** and Mariners.com with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners came from behind to beat the Athletics 2-1 in yesterday's game, securing a series split...both of the Mariners victories this season have been comeback wins.

- **Series Business** - since **Dan Wilson** was named manager on Aug. 22, 2024, the Mariners own a 7-2-3 series record in 12 series...Seattle owns a 4-1-2 series record at T-Mobile Park during that stretch.
- **Measurables** - **Julio Rodríguez**'s home run yesterday had and 113.3 MPH, the 3rd-highest exit velocity on a home run in his career, and the highest since his rookie year in 2022 (9/11/22 vs. ATL, 117.2 MPH and 5/15/22 at NYM, 114.0 MPH)...the home run traveled a projected 438 feet, the 4th-farthest homer so far in MLB this season.
- **Patiently Waiting** - Seattle's offense has drawn 16 walks through 4 games, tied for the most walks in the American League...Seattle ranks T-5th in MLB, trailing the Pirates (25 BB in 4 games), Cubs (23 BB in 6 games), Dodgers (21 walks in 5 games) and Phillies (18 walks in 3 games).
- **Winner, Winner** - The Mariners have put together 4 consecutive winning seasons (2021-c), tied for the most consecutive winning seasons in franchise history (also: 2000-03).
- **Runners** - The Mariners are 5-for-6 (83.3%) in stolen base attempts this season, with **Ryan Bliss** (2 SB), **Julio Rodríguez** (2 SB) and **Cal Raleigh** (1 SB) each swiping at least 1 bag so far...the Mariners set a franchise record with a 83.3% (140-for-168) success rate on stolen bases last season.

JULIO'S BIG SWING...**Julio Rodríguez** crushed his first home run of the season in yesterday's game, a go-ahead 2-run blast in the 6th inning that landed in the upper deck in left field...the home run was his 6th career go-ahead home run in the 6th inning or later, and first since Sept. 13, 2024 vs. TEX in the 8th inning...the home run also marked J-Rod's first career home run in March...the earliest he had hit his first home run previously was April 2, 2023 also in the Mariners 4th game of the 2023 season.

PICKING UP WHERE THEY LEFT OFF...the Mariners will complete their first turn through the starting rotation in tonight's game when **Emerson Hancock** makes his season debut...in their first outings, **Logan Gilbert** (7.0 IP, 2 H, 1 R, 1 ER, 8 SO), **Luis Castillo** (5.0 IP, 3 H, 2 R, 2 ER, 4 SO), **Bryce Miller** (5.2 IP, 6 H, 3 R, 3 ER, 4 SO) and **Bryan Woo** (6.0 IP, 3 H 1 R, 1 ER, 5 SO) combined for a 2.66 ERA (7 ER, 23.2 IP), 6 walks and 21 strikeouts...last season, the Mariners starting rotation led the Majors in ERA (3.38), quality starts (92), IP (942.2), SO/BB (4.81), BB/9 (1.77), WHIP (1.03) and Opp. AVG (.221), ranking 2nd in strikeouts (889) and 4th in fWAR (15.2).

MUÑY. MUÑY. MUÑY...**Andrés Muñoz** has recorded saves in each of his first 2 appearances this season...Muñoz set a career-highs with 22 saves and a 2.12 ERA (14 ER, 59.1 IP) last season, earning his first career All-Star nod...on Opening Day, he joined Edwin Díaz, Josh Hader, Craig Kimbrel, Kenley Jansen, Dellin Betances, Ken Giles and Greg Holland as the only pitchers since 2000 to post a 2.64 ERA, 12.4 SO/9 and a 3.53 SO/BB or better over his first 200 career games.

CAL'S ON-BASE STREAK...**Cal Raleigh** has reached base safely via hit, walk, or hit-by-pitch, in a career-high 17 consecutive games dating back to Sept. 14, 2024...the 16-game on-base streak is the 2nd-longest active streak in the Majors, trailing only Shohei Ohtani-LAD (20), while ranking ahead of Juan Soto-NYY/ NYM (15).

HOT START FOR JORGE...third baseman **Jorge Polanco** has hit safely in each of his first 3 games to begin the season, batting .500 (5x10) with 1 home run, 3 RBI and a sacrifice bunt...on Thursday night, "Polo" supplied the go-ahead and eventual game-winning 2-run homer in the bottom of the eighth, his first career Opening Day home run in his seventh Opening Day game.

TERRIFIC AT T-MOBILE...in 2024, Seattle's pitching staff went 49-32 with 21 saves and a 2.85 ERA (234 ER, 739.0 IP) with 168 walks and 795 strikeouts in 81 home games...the 2.85 home ERA led MLB and was the best home ERA in franchise history, surpassing the 2.93 ERA during the 2014 season...the Mariners limited opponents to a .205 batting average at T-Mobile Park, tied for the 6th-lowest in MLB history...Seattle's .256 opponent on-base percentage at home was 4th-lowest in MLB history.

MARINERS EXTEND CAL RALEIGH TO 6-YEAR CONTRACT...the Mariners announced on Wednesday they extended catcher **Cal Raleigh** to a 6-year contract through the 2030 season, with a vesting player option for 2031...the 28-year-old backstop has led MLB catchers in home runs in 3 consecutive seasons and catcher caught stealing in 2 consecutive seasons...Cal led the Mariners in games played (153), plate appearances (628), home runs (34), RBI (100), extra-base hits (50) and total bases (238) last season...Raleigh won a *Rawlings* AL Gold Glove Award in 2024, also named the AL Platinum Glove Award winner and becoming the first Seattle player to go Platinum.

OPENING DAY ROSTER...the Mariners Opening Day, 26-man roster includes **13** pitchers: starters **Logan Gilbert**, **Luis Castillo**, **Bryce Miller**, **Bryan Woo** and **Emerson Hancock**...righty relievers **Eduard Bazarzo**, **Andrés Muñoz**, **Gregory Santos**, **Collin Snider**, **Trent Thornton** and **Carlos Vargas**...left-handed relievers **Tayler Saucedo** and **Gabe Speier**...the roster includes **13** position players: catcher **Cal Raleigh** and catcher/designated **Mitch Garver**...infielders **Ryan Bliss**, **J.P. Crawford**, **Jorge Polanco**, **Donovan Solano**, and **Rowdy Tellez**...outfielders **Randy Arozarena**, **Victor Robles** and **Julio Rodríguez**, and infielder/outfielders **Miles Mastrobuoni**, **Dylan Moore** and **Lukealey**...22 of the 26 appeared in a game for Seattle in 2024 (23 of 26 were in the Mariners organization, with Vargas being the lone holdover yet to make his Seattle debut)...the 3 newcomers to the organization are Mastrobuoni, Solano and Tellez...Seattle has 3 players on the 15-day Injured List: RHP **Matt Brash** (right UCL sprain), RHP **George Kirby** (right shoulder inflammation) and RHP **Troy Taylor** (right lat strain) and 1 player on the 60-day IL: RHP **Jackson Kowar** (right UCL sprain).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...both of the Mariners wins on the young season have come from game-winning home runs in the 6th-inning or later, with **Jorge Polanco** providing the game winner in the 8th inning on Opening Day and **Julio Rodríguez** in the 6th inning of yesterday's game, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...it marks the first time the Mariners have hit multiple game-winning home runs in the 6th-inning or later in the same series since the Mariners did it 3 consecutive games in the same series from July 8-10 vs. TOR?...Eugenio Suárez hit a walk-off 11th-inning home run on July 8, before Carlos Santana hit game-winning home runs in back-to-back games on July 9-10 to help complete a series sweep against the Blue Jays.

ABOUT EMERSON HANCOCK...

- The 25-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his season debut tonight against the Tigers...he is also scheduled to make the 16th start of his career and first against Detroit.
- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (6th overall) of the 2020 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Scott Hunter on June 25, 2020.
- Spent 3 seasons at the University of Georgia, 2018-20... in 2020, was named Vince Dooley Athlete of the Year as the top male student-athlete at the University of Georgia.
- Was named to CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team in 2020.

SPRING RECAP...made last Cactus League start on March 19 vs. TEX, tossing 4.0 innings allowing 1 run on 4 hits (1 HR) with 1 walk and 4 strikeouts throwing 66 pitches... made 5 total Spring Training starts, going 1-2 with a 4.61 ERA (7 ER, 13.2 IP), 3 walks and 14 strikeouts.

2024 TOTALS...was 4-4 with a 4.75 ERA (32 ER, 60.2 IP), 19 walks and 39 strikeouts in 12 games started last season... also made 17 starts with Triple-A Tacoma, going 7-3 with a 3.43 ERA (36 ER, 94.1 IP), 37 walks and 66 strikeouts.

HOME WARRIOR...in 8 games started at T-Mobile Park last season, he held a 3.61 ERA (17 ER, 42.1 IP) with 15 walks, and 26 strikeouts...he allowed 3-or-less runs in 7 of the 8 starts and went 5.0+ innings in 5 of them.

THE COMPLETE PACKAGE...on July 21, 2024 vs. Reno, Hancock threw a 9.0 inning complete game shutout...it is the only 9.0 inning complete game shutout in Triple-A in 2024 and only 1 of 2 in the full-season minor leagues this year...there have only been 2 complete game shutouts in the Pacific Coast League since the start of 2019.

PCL PITCHER OF THE MONTH...was awarded Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Month for June, 2024...held a 1-0 record with a 0.84 ERA in 4 starts as he allowed 2 runs on 14 hits with 7 walks over 21.1 innings...he tallied 17 strikeouts and held opponents to a .187 (14x75) average...after allowing 2 runs in his first inning of June, he did not allow another run in his next 20.1 innings during the month with Tacoma.

UP DOWNS...had 5 stints on the Mariners Major League roster in 2024...he was on the active roster between March 28-May 8, June 13, July 6-8, Sept. 13-22 and Sept. 28 to the end of the season.

CAREER DAY...on June 13, 2024 vs. Chicago-AL, tossed a career-high 7.0 innings allowing 2 runs on 6 hits (2 HR) with 2 walks and 1 strikeout.

THE VERY FIRST ONE...recorded his 1st career win on 4/1/24 vs. Cleveland at T-Mobile Park...tossed 5.1 innings, gave up 4 hits (1 home run) and 3 earned runs with 1 strikeout.

HOME SWEET GEORGIA...is 1 of 5 players in MLB history born in Cairo, GA, the same birthplace as Jackie Robinson, Ernie Riles, Willie Harris and Hurston Waldrep...was the 11th Georgia Bulldog in school history to be drafted in the first round...he became the highest Georgia selection since Derek Liliquist went 6th overall in 1987...1 of 7 Bulldogs to play in MLB in 2024 (also: Jonathan Cannon-CWS, Kyle Farmer-MIN, Jared Walsh-TEX, Alex Wood-OAK, Zac Kristofak-LAA and Aaron Schunk-COL).

THE DEBUT...made MLB debut on 8/9/23 against the San Diego Padres, allowing just 1 run on 2 hits and 3 walks with 3 strikeouts... became just the 6th starting pitcher in franchise history to pitch 5.0+ innings and allow 2-or-fewer hits in a Major League debut, joining Pat Rice, Ken Cloude, Taijuan Walker, Roenis Elías and **Bryce Miller**.
