The Red Sox took 2 out of 3 from the Mariners at T-Mobile Park from June 19-21 this year...last season at Fenway Park (April 22-24, 2025), the Mariners took 2 out of 3 as part of a 6-3 road trip.

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TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners begin the second half of the 6-game road trip with a 3-game series against the Red Sox...Seattle yesterday wrapped up a 3-game set against the Toronto Blue Jays...Seattle is coming off a successful 4-2 homestand against the Chicago Cubs (2-1) and Philadelphia Phillies (2-1)...tonight's game will be televised and streamed on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call and **Brad Adam** serving as field reporter...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Gary Hill Jr.** and **Angie Mentink** on the call.

ODDS & ENDS...the Mariners fell to the Blue Jays in yesterday's series finale by a 7-0 final score...despite the loss, the Mariners sit 3rd in the AL West and remain 5.0 games back of Houston (69-68) for 1st place and 2.0 games behind Texas (67-70).

- **Few Free Passes** - The Mariners starting pitching staff has recorded 39 quality starts with 1-or-fewer walks allowed this season, T-2nd most in MLB (also: TB), trailing only LAD (41 G)...today's starter **George Kirby** leads the Mariners rotation with 11 such starts this season...his 65 total starts rank 2nd-most in MLB since he debuted in 2022, trailing only Logan Webb-SF (66 G).
- **More Gas from Vargas** - Since returning from the Injured List on Aug. 21, RHP **Carlos Vargas** has posted a 1.35 ERA (1 ER, 6.2 IP) with 1 walk and 8 strikeouts while holding opponents to a .167 (4x24) average.
- **Going the Distance** - The Mariners are 41-27 (.603) this season when their starting pitcher goes 6.0+ innings, and 23-46 (.333) when they do not...in addition, the Mariners are 17-6 (.739) when their starter goes 7.0+ innings.
- **Transactions** - Yesterday, RHP **Emerson Hancock** was placed on the 15-day Injured List (left adductor strain, retroactive to Aug. 29)...in a corresponding move, RHP **Nick Davila** was recalled from Triple-A Tacoma.
- **Mark Your Calendars** - On September 1, Major League rosters expand by 2 to a maximum of 28 players, 14 pitchers and 14 position players.
- **Happy Birthday!** - Mariners Director of Pitching Strategy **Trent Blank** celebrates his 37th birthday today.
- **End of August is Here** - The Mariners enter their final game of the month with an 11-14 record in August, which featured back-to-back series wins against the Cubs and Phillies at home.

BIG DUMPER'S BIG SURGE...Cal Raleigh has reached base safely in 12 of his last 13 games (8/16-c), batting .306 (11x36) with 7 home runs, 1 double, 10 RBI, 11 walks, and a .468 on-base percentage while slugging .917 for an 1.385 OPS in 47 plate appearances...he also owns a 1.000 slugging percentage across his last 9 games (8/21-c), marking the 3rd time in his career he has posted a 1.000+ slugging percentage over a 9-game span, doing so twice in 2025 (last: 9/14-24/25).

FURIOUS GEORGE ON THE ROAD...RHP **George Kirby** will take the mound for his 12th road start of the season...Kirby has been exceptional in limiting walks on the road, allowing 2-or-fewer walks in 63 of his 69 career road starts, which ranks 3rd-most such games among all starting pitchers since 2022, trailing only Miles Mikolas-STL/WSH (69 G) and teammate **Logan Gilbert** (65 G)...among all qualified pitchers on the road since 2022, he leads MLB in walk rate (3.8%) and walks-per-nine innings (1.43) while ranking 2nd in strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.61), trailing only Tarik Skubal-DET/LAD (7.09).

JUST JOSHIN' AROUND...in 37 games since the All-Star Break (7/17-c), **Josh Naylor** is batting .312 (44x141) with 14 runs, 6 doubles, 2 home runs, 11 RBI, 10 walks, a .359 OBP while slugging .397 for a .757 OPS, reaching base in 32 of those games...his .313 batting average in the 2nd half ranks 9th in the American League and T-15th in MLB among qualified hitters...he also ranks T-4th in the AL in stolen bases during that span along with José Ramírez-CLE.

RANDY RAKES...in 129 games this season, **Randy Arozarena** is batting .268 (128x477) with 85 runs, 26 doubles, 1 triple, 20 home runs, 58 RBI, 56 walks and 20 HBP, reaching base at a .367 clip and slugging .453 for an .820 OPS...Randy has 6 consecutive 20+ home runs and 20+ stolen bases for the 6th-consecutive season (2021-c), becoming the 11th player in MLB history with at least 6 such seasons and the 5th to do it in at least 6-consecutive seasons, joining Barry Bonds (9, 1990-98), Bobby Bonds (7, 1969-75), Bobby Abreu (7, 1999-2005) and Willie Mays (6, 1955-1960).

- **Lately** - Over his last 18 games since Aug. 11, Randy has an .868 OPS, getting on base at a .354 clip while slugging .515, recording 8 extra-base hits, including 6 home runs that have each been a game-tying or go-ahead home runs.

IN THE CANZONE...Dominic Canzone has reached the 20+ homer mark in a season for the first time in his career...over his last 18 games (8/9-c), Canzone is batting .278 (20x72) with 6 runs, 4 doubles, 2 home runs, 10 RBI, 6 walks, a .342 on-base percentage while slugging .417 for an .758 OPS in 79 plate appearances...he has reached base safely in 15 of those 18 games, hitting safely in 13...overall this season, 'Dom' is batting .253 (95x375) with 47 runs, 21 doubles, 1 triple, the 20 homers, 59 RBI, 37 walks and 2 stolen bases, reaching base at a .327 clip while slugging .475 (.802 OPS).

TAKE A WALK, TAYLOR WARD...Taylor Ward has drawn 8 walks across his last 9 games, including 3 games with multiple walks (last: 8/24)...his 95 walks this season continue to lead the American League while his 16.5% walk rate ranks 6th in MLB among qualified hitters.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...Randy Arozarena, Julio Rodríguez and Dominic Canzone have each hit 20 home runs this season, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that with Cal Raleigh's next home run, the Mariners would become the 4th team this season and the first American League team with 4-or-more players with 20+ home runs...**DID YOU ALSO KNOW?**...with Cal's next home run, he would also become the 18th catcher (min. 50% of games at catcher in a season) in MLB history to record five or more seasons with 20+ homers, and the ninth to do it before turning 30 years old?

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - AUGUST 31

- **1990** - Ken Griffey Jr. and Ken Griffey Sr. play in the same line-up for the first time against the Kansas City Royals. Sr. played left, batting second while Jr. was in CF batting third. The Griffeyes had back-to-back singles in the first inning and the Mariners went on to win 5-2.
- **1997** - The Mariners win their first game ever in a National League park, with a 3-1 win in 10 innings at Chavez Ravine against the Dodgers. The win breaks an 0-7 interleague play start by Seattle.
- **2021** - Abraham Toro clubs game-winning grand slam off of Kendall Graveman, the player he was traded for, in a 4-0 win against Houston...became the 1st player in MLB history to hit a grand slam off a pitcher he was traded for earlier that season.
- **2025** - Andrés Muñoz picked up his 32nd save of the season in the 4-2 win over Cleveland with his 71 saves as a Mariner the 5th most in franchise history the 4th-most saves by a Mexican-born reliever in MLB history.

ABOUT GEORGE KIRBY...

- The 28-year-old right-hander is making his 26th start of the season and 1st against the Red Sox...will be the 138th start of his career and his 7th career start against Boston.
- Is in his 5th season with Seattle; selected by the Mariners in the first round (20th overall) of the 2019 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Ty Holub.
- Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2023.
- Named AL Rookie of the Month in August 2022 after posting a 2.15 ERA and 5-0 record.
- Is the highest drafted player out of Elon University.

LAST TIME OUT...W#9 vs. Philadelphia, tossed 7.2 innings, allowing 1 run (1 ER) on 6 hits and 1 walk while striking out 9 batters...threw 92 pitches and 67 strikes...recorded 21 swing and misses for the 2nd most he has recorded in a single-game in his career, just trailing his 23 whiffs on 4/27 vs. ARI.

GEORGE AND THE GREEN MONSTER...over his last 4 starts against the Red Sox since 2023, owns a 1.52 ERA (4 ER, 23.2 IP) with a 1.141 WHIP and 23 strikeouts to 6 walks (3.83 K/BB)...his ERA ranks 3rd-best against the Red Sox in MLB (min. 20.0 IP) since the start of 2023 while his opponent OPS (.553) ranks 6th best...has allowed 2-or-fewer runs over 5.0 IP in each of his last 4 starts against the Red Sox with 2 of the 4 outings being at Boston...has allowed 1-or-fewer runs over 6.2 IP in 2 starts.

MAKING HIMSELF AT HOME...is making his 12th road start of the season and the 70th road start of his career...among pitchers with 50+ career road starts, his 5.75 strikeout-to-walk ratio on the road ranks 2nd in MLB all-time, just trailing Tarik Skubal's 5.81 K/BB...ranks 11th in the AL (min. 60.0 IP) in K/BB (3.4), just trailing **Bryan Woo** (3.78) on the road this season...his 1.43 walks-per-nine innings on the road ranks 4th best all-time (min. 60 GS), trailing Hall of Famer Cy Young (1.09), Deacon Phillippe (1.34), and Josh Tomlin (1.36)...ranks 8th in the AL in BB/9 (2.23) on the road in 2026 (min. 50.0 IP).

ALL IN A DAY'S WORK...on Aug. 25 vs. PHI put together his 6th outing of the season with 3-or-fewer runs allowed over 7.0+ IP, tied for 11th most in MLB this season...his 28 career games are tied for 13th most in MLB since 2022. ...his last start also marked his 2nd outing of the month with 1-or-fewer runs allowed over 7.0+ IP...is 1-of-7 pitchers with multiple such outings since the start of August...went 7.0 scoreless innings on Aug. 8 vs. MIN for his first 7.0+ inning scoreless outing since Sept. 12, 2025 and the 10th of his career, ranking T-5th most in the AL since 2022...is 1-of-4 pitchers this season with 4+ outings with 7.2+ innings pitched.

MAINTAINING THE RATIO...in his last start on Aug. 25 vs. PHI, recorded his 16th career game with 9+ strikeouts and 1-or-fewer walks...his 16 such career games rank 6th most in the AL since 2022...has made 14 starts this season with 5+ strikeouts and 2-or-fewer walks, ranking T-13th most in the AL...his 76 career games are T-11th most in MLB since 2022...ranks 10th among qualified AL pitchers with a 3.71 K/BB this season...his career 5.88 K/BB ranks 3rd-best in MLB all-time (min. 400.0 IP).

PLAYING THE LONG GAME...has pitched into the 6th inning in 19 of his 25 starts this year, T-13th most in MLB, and has cleared the 7th inning in 6 of those starts...recorded his 2nd career complete game this season on April 7 vs. Texas, tossing 8.0 innings to finish the game...is 1-of-8 AL pitchers with a complete game this season...recorded his 2nd 8.0+ inning outing this season on 6/29 vs. LAA...has recorded 4 career outings with 6-or-fewer base runners allowed over 8.0+ IP ranking T-11th most in MLB since 2023...is 1-of-12 pitchers with 5+ games with 1-or-fewer walks allowed over 8.0+ innings of work since 2023, along with **Logan Gilbert** (5 G).

EFFECTIVE AND EFFICIENT...currently averages 15.5 pitches per inning this season tied for the 13th lowest mark among qualified MLB pitchers...has tossed 6 quality starts with 90-or-fewer pitches thrown in the outing this season, T-11th most such starts in MLB...records a first pitch strike 65.1% of the time in 2026, 9th highest in MLB with a first pitch swing 36.5% of the time, 5th highest in MLB this season...owns 99 strikeouts to 12 walks (8.75 K/BB) with a 1.069 WHIP after a 0-1 count.

QUALITY CONTROL...has thrown 14 quality starts this season (last: 8/25 vs. PHI), tied for 5th-most in the AL...his 77 career quality starts are tied for 5th-most in MLB since 2022...has thrown 39 career quality starts without any walks allowed (4x this season, last: 7/8 at MIA), most in MLB since 2022, ranking ahead of Zack Wheeler-PHI (29 G)...has also tossed a quality start with no walks in 18 career road games (last: 7/8 at MIA), 2nd-most in MLB since 2022...his 18 such games on the road are also most in Mariners history, after surpassing Jamie Moyer's 17 such games on 7/8 at MIA...with his next quality start, Kirby will become 1-of-9 pitchers with 15+ quality starts in 3+ seasons since 2023...is already 1-of-6 pitchers with 10+ QS in each of his last 5 seasons since 2022.

FOR THE M'S HISTORY BOOKS...leads the Mariners franchise (min. 100 GS) in fewest walks-per-nine innings (1.5) and in strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.88)...ranks 6th in franchise history in career ERA (3.67), 3rd in WHIP (1.154) and 9th in total strikeouts (747 SO)...his 26 wins in away games ranks 11th most in franchise history...is 1 road win short of tying Mike Moore (27) for 10th most in Mariners history.

BEST IN ALL THE LAND...among starting pitchers since 2022 (min. 600 IP), he leads the Majors in walks-per-nine innings (1.5), and walk rate (3.9%) while ranking 2nd in strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.88), just trailing Tarik Skubal-DET/LAD (6.23)...is also tied for fewest walks allowed (127).
