METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Marlins, 5-1, yesterday in Citi Field... The Mets are on the last leg of a stretch of 16 straight games...The team is 7-6 in that span...Today, the Mets head out on the road for the penultimate time of the season, a 10-game trip against Detroit (three games), Cincinnati (three games) and Philadelphia (four games).

LABORING: The Mets are 28-37-1 all-time on Labor Day.

CALL ME: As roster expand to 28-players, the Mets recalled INF Luisangel Acuñaand RHP Justin Hagenman from Triple-A Syracuse.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 28-37 on the road this season...Their .431 winning percentage on the road is 23rd in the majors and 11th in the Senior Circuit... The Mets have posted a 4.03 ERA on the road, the fifth-best mark in the NL.

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: This year marked the first time in franchise history that the Mets opened their home and road schedule against an Interleague Opponent...The Mets are 21-21 in Interleague Play this season...The team went 24-22 in Interleague Play last year.

INTERGALACTIC: Pete Alonso has hit a franchise-record 65 home runs in Interleague Play...His 65 home runs are the fourth-most all-time...It is third among active players...Only Aaron Judge (82) and Kyle Schwarber (78) have hit more.

DINGERS: The Mets have hit a franchise record 53 homers in the month of August...It topped their previous high of 49 homers in September of 2019 and June of 2017...Their 53 homers were the most in the NL last month and the second-most in the majors...Overall, the Mets have hit 188 home runs, the sixth-most in the majors and the third-most in the NL.

25/25: Juan Soto (35 HR/25 SB) and Francisco Lindor (26 HR/25 SB) join Howard Johnson and Darryl Strawberry (1987) as the only pair of Mets teammates to have 25/25 seasons...Soto and Lindor are also the only pair of teammates to do so in the majors this season...They are two of five total players in the league to record 25+ homers and 25+ steals this year.

SWITCH IT UP: Francisco Lindor has hit nine lead-off home runs this season, which are tied for the second-most in the majors...His nine lead-off homers are tied for the most by a switch hitter in a single season (also: himself 2018, Jimmy Rollins 2007, and Ray Durham 2004)...Has 29 career leadoff home runs which is the sixth-most among switch hitters in Major League history...11 of his leadoff homers have come with the Mets and he is trailing teammate Brandon Nimmo (14) by three for the third-most in franchise history.

TIGERS-METS NOTES: The Mets last visited Detroit in May of 2023... The Mets have dropped six of their last seven in the Motor City...New York is 4-8 lifetime at Comerica Park.

25TH HOUR: Francisco Lindor has earned his fourth career season with 25+ stolen bases and has reached the mark in each of his last three seasons...He is the sixth player in franchise history with three or more seasons of 25+ stolen bases... The others are José Reyes (6), Darryl Strawberry (5), Howard Johnson (4), Mookie Wilson (4) and Lenny Dykstra...Joins Pete Crow-Armstrong and José Ramírez as the only players in the majors this season with 25 home runs, 25 doubles and 25 stolen bases.

ALMOST ALWAYS ON: Francisco Lindor extended his hitting streak to six games with a single in the third inning yesterday...He's hit safely in 18 of his last 19 games and has a .415/.473/.671 (34-82) slashline with six doubles, five home runs, 12 RBI, 19 runs and eight stolen bases...He batted .350 (41-117) in the month of August, his best batting average over a single month in his career since his career-high .373 (44-118) average in May of 2018 with Cleveland.

RISPY BUSINESS: The Mets batted .366 (90-246) with runners in scoring position in the month of August...It's their highest mark in a single calendar month (min. 20 G) in franchise history, the previous being when the team batted .333 (71-213) in July 2006.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Brandon Nimmo has hit safely in his last 14 starts dating back to August 12...In that span, has hit .386 (22-57)...He has recorded an extra-base hit in four consecutive games and six of his seven hits in those games have gone for extra-bases.

HOME GROWN: The Mets Major League roster currently features several players who were either drafted or signed as non-drafted free agents and developed through the Mets organization: Brandon Nimmo (1st Rd. 2011), David Peterson (1st Rd. 2017), Brett Baty (1st Rd. 2019), Pete Alonso (2nd Rd. 2016), Mark Vientos (2nd Rd. 2017), Nolan McLean (3rd Rd. 2023), Jonah Tong (7th Rd. 2022), Jeff McNeil (12th Rd. 2013), Hayden Senger (24th Rd. 2018) and Ronny Mauricio (N DFA 2017).

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has recorded a Major League-leading 111 walks this year...He recorded his sixth season with 100+ walks and became the second Mets player to break the 100 walk barrier...John Olerud recorded 125 walks during the 1999 season.

LAST TIME OUT: Tied a season-high with eight strikeouts on August 26 against Philadelphia...He allowed two earned runs on six hits over 4.2 innings...Has 53 strikeouts over 41.1 IP this season which is good for a 11.54 K/9...He has allowed six or more hits in four of his last five starts...Has failed to complete 6.0 innings in all eight of his starts this season which tied for his longest streak of consecutive starts shorter than 6.0 innings in the same season in his career (also: 7/25 - 9/5/20 while with Oakland).

VS. DETROIT: Has made seven career starts against Detroit and he has a 3-2 record with a 3.35 ERA (14 ER/37.2 IP) against the Tigers...His last start against Detroit came in his first start as a Met on April 1, 2024...He threw 6.0 scoreless innings, only allowed one hit, and struck out eight.

RIGHTY DOMINATION: So far this season righties are batting .248 (31-125) against him...Last season he held right-handed hitters to a .190 batting average, compared to his career average to right-handed hitters being at .250...It was the lowest batting average he's held right-handers to in his career (in a season where he appeared in more than five games).

HERE COMES THE HEAT: So far this season, Manaea has thrown his four-seam fastball 60.1% of the time, and he has picked up 31 of his 53 strikeouts with his fastball...His fastball has generated a 22.0% whiff rate this season...He has thrown his fastball at the 17th-highest clip (60.1%) among all pitchers who have thrown their fastball at least 300 times this season.

HOW SWEEP IT IS: Manaea has thrown his sweeper 34.3% of the time and has generated a 36.3% whiff rate on the pitch...Has recorded 19 strikeouts with the sweeper and is holding opposing batters to a .167 batting average (8-48) on at-bats ending with the pitch...His 34.3% sweepers are the 16th-most in the majors among pitchers who have thrown their sweeper at least 200 times.

REHAB STINT: Was originally placed on the 15-day IL on March 27 (retro. March 24) with a right oblique strain and then was transferred to the 60-day IL on April 29...This season, he has made six rehab appearances (five starts) for Brooklyn, Binghamton, and Syracuse...Over those appearances, he allowed 13 earned runs over 18.2 IP and recorded 23 strikeouts...He made his final rehab start on July 8 with Syracuse, and he allowed three runs over 3.2 IP and struck out five...He threw 73 pitches, 48 for strikes.

2024 A CAREER YEAR: Recorded a career-high in innings (181.2), tied a career-high in wins (12) and starts (32), while his 184 strikeouts were the second-most in his career and were the ninth-most in the NL last season...The southpaw finished with the lowest full-season ERA of his career (3.47), and he was one of eight pitchers who made 32 or more starts and posted an ERA below 3.50...He held right-handed batters to a .190 average, tied for the fourth-lowest mark in the majors...From July 1 until the end of the season, Manaea was first in the majors in innings (105.1), second in quality starts (12) as well as sixth in strikeouts (108) and WHIP (0.93)...Made four Postseason starts, going 2-1 with a 4.74 ERA (10 ER/19.0 IP), eight walks and 19 strikeouts...He earned wins in Game 3 of the NLDS vs. Philadelphia and Game 2 of the NLCS at Los Angeles.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: Last season, Manaea completed at least 7.0 innings in nine of his 32 starts this season and that was tied for the sixth-most such outings in the National League...Manaea recorded back-to-back starts of 7.0 scoreless innings and 10 or more strikeouts on 7/30/24 against Minnesota and 8/5/24 at St.Louis...Manaea joined Tyler Glasnow and Spence Schwellenbach as the only pitchers in the majors last season with consecutive starts of 7.0 or more innings and double-digit strikeouts...Manaea was the only one of three to not allow a run in both of those starts...He became the first Mets pitcher to throw 7.0 or more innings and record 10 or more strikeouts in consecutive starts since Max Scherzer (4/19/22 (2) - 4/25/22)...The southpaw joins Dwight Gooden (Two Separate Occasions) and Tom Seaver (Three Separate Occasions) as the only pitchers in franchise history to post back-to-back starts of 7.0 or more scoreless innings and double-digit strikeouts...He is just the 10th left-handed pitcher in major league history with back-to-back starts of 7.0 or more scoreless innings and 10 or more strikeouts (Last: Chris Sale, 6/24/18-6/30/18).

SPECTACULAR DOWN THE STRETCH: From July on last season, Manaea was second in the majors in quality starts (12), first in innings (105.1), sixth in strikeouts (108) and sixth in WHIP (0.93)...Since June 14, Manaea had allowed three or fewer runs 17 times, which was tied for most in the majors during that span with Chris Sale (17).

CAREER: Over the course of 10 Major League Seasons with the Athletics, Padres, Giants, and Mets he has a 78-64 record, a 4.04 ERA (550 ER/1225.2 IP), and 1162 strikeouts in 237 games and 206 starts...His 1162 career strikeouts are the 13th-most among active left-handers...He resigned with the Mets this offseason on a three-year contract in December 2024.

- Allowed multiple earned runs in an outing for just the third time this season on August 30 vs. Miami (1.0 IP, 3 H, 2 ER, 3 K, BB)...Was the first time he's allowed multiple runs in an outing since April 11 at the Athletics...He has recorded multiple strikeouts in five of his last seven games.
- Earned his career-high-tying sixth win of the season after getting the final five outs against Philadelphia on August 26 (1.2 IP, 4 K)...Struck out a season high four of the five batters he faced...His four strikeouts were his most in a game since September 22, 2024 vs. Philadelphia.
- Earned his 24th save of the season after tossing 2.0 innings on August 16 vs. Seattle (2 H, ER, 2 K, HR)...It was his fourth career six-out save and second of the season (also: July 12 at KC)...Has allowed two home runs over his last five outings after going 34 consecutive games without allowing a home run (from 4/23-8/4)...The homer marked the first home run he had given up to a right hander in 160 at-bats.
- In 59 Interleague games since joining the Mets, he has posted a 6-1 record with 29 saves while having a 1.78 ERA (12 ER/60.2 IP) and he has recorded 107 strikeouts during that span for a 15.87 K/9.

- Had 19 consecutive appearances without allowing an earned run from 6/6-8/4, which was tied for the tenth-longest single-season streak in Mets history and his longest such streak since his 21-game span from 6/22-8/17/22.
- Has allowed just five earned runs over his last 40 games, posting a 1.07 ERA (5 ER/42.0 IP) with 12 walks and 64 strikeouts since April 23...During that span, his 1.07 ERA is the third-best in the majors.
- Over 50 games this season, has gone 6-2 with 24 saves, a 1.92 ERA (11 ER/51.2 IP), 18 walks and 79 strikeouts...The Mets are 38-12 in games that Díaz has pitched in...Hitters have posted a .173 (31-179) average against Díaz this season...He has recorded five saves this season of four outs or more which are tied for the most-such games in the majors this season...His six saves this season with three-plus strikeouts are tied with Mason Miller and Jeff Hoffman for the most such games in the majors...He has 57 career saves with three or more strikeouts are the most since his debut in 2016...Josh Hader is second with 44.
- On August 4, was named as the NL Reliever of the Month for July after going 2-0 with seven saves and a 0.00 ERA (11.0 IP) over 10 appearances...His 10 Reliever of the Month Awards (five as a Met) are the most by any player since the honor was established in 2005...Was also named the NL Reliever of the Month for May...He is the only pitcher to win a monthly award multiple times this year.
- Among relievers in franchise history, he ranks second in strikeouts (519), third in saves (140), eighth in appearances (321) and tied for seventh in wins (24).
