**FLIGHT PATTERN:** The St. Louis Cardinals continue their season-opening six-game homestand tonight with the second game of a three-game series against the Los Angeles Angels at Busch Stadium ... The Cardinals began their 134th season of play in the National League by handing the Minnesota Twins a three-game series sweep over the weekend ... St. Louis enters today in first place in the National League Central Division, 1.0 game in front of the Cincinnati Reds

**NO FOOL'S GOLD:** The Cardinals are 6-5 all-time on April Fool's Day (2-2 at home) and have won their last five April Fool's day games (2024 at San Diego; 2023 vs. Toronto; 2021 at Cincinnati; 2019 at Pittsburgh; & 2018 at New York Mets) ... The Cardinals have never faced the Angels on April Fool's day ... Last season, **Brendan Donovan** finished a triple short of the cycle in the Cardinals 6-2 win at Petco Park ... In his first career game as a Cardinal on April 1, 2021, **Nolan Arenado** went 2-for-5 with an RBI in the 11-6 Opening Day win in Cincinnati ... Cardinals Hall of Famer **Willie McGee** was a career 4-for-9 (.445) with a homer, double, three RBI, and two runs scored in a pair of April Fool's Day games (1996-97).

**CARDINALS OPENING DAY SEES MASSIVE VIEWERSHIP GAINS:** Last Thursday's 2025 Cardinals Opening Day televised on FanDuel Sports Network averaged an 8.60 household rating (almost 110,000 impressions), up 102% over the team's 2024 season opener on the road and was 8% higher than the Cardinals home opener game coverage from last year (*data courtesy of Nielsen*) ... Thursday's telecast was the most-viewed program across all St. Louis DMA programming ... Viewership peaked at 6:45 p.m. CT and 7:30 p.m. CT with over 117,000 impressions (9.20 HH rating).

**NOOT NUGGETS:** **Lars Nootbaar** ranks among Major League leaders in average exit velocity (101.7 mph, 1st), batting average (.462, 5th), OBP (.632, 3rd), OPS (1.555, 5th), times on base (12, T-4th), secondary average (.846, 7th), walks (5, T-7th), hard-hit percentage (.750, T-5th) and fWAR (0.6, T-2nd).

- Nootbaar has reached base safely 12 times over the first four games of the season, most by a Cardinal since **Mark McGwire** reached 12 times in the first four games of his historic 1998 season ... The Cardinals record for reaching base safely in the first five games of a season is 16 shared by **George Fisher** (1930) and **Red Schoendienst** (1955).

- With his homer last night as a right fielder, Nootbaar joined **Stan Musial**, **Wally Moon**, and **Randal Grichuk** as the 4th Cardinal with double-digit career home runs from all three outfield positions (10-LF, 12-CF, & 22-RF).

**AND NOW DEEP THOUGHTS:** **Lars Nootbaar** and **Brendan Donovan** last night became the first set of Cardinals left-handed batters to each homer off left-handed pitching in the same game since June 21, 2006 at Chicago's U.S. Cellular Field when **Jim Edmonds** and **Timo Pérez** went yard off southpaws **Mark Buehrle** and **Matt Thornton**.

**MOONLIGHT MIKE:** OF/PR **Michael Siani** is the 8th Major League position player and first Cardinals position player (since 1901) to appear in each of the first four games of the season without a plate appearance.

- CF/PR **Curt Flood** (1961) and PR/OF **Ray Blades** (1924) each played in the first three Cardinals games of their respective seasons before Siani broke their shared record.

- 2017 Orioles OF **Craig Gentry** was the last Major Leaguer to play in the first four games of a season with no plate appearances.

- Indians 1B **Jerry Kindall** (1964) and Twins 3B **Ron Clark** (1968) share the MLB record appearing in the first five games of the season with no plate appearances.

**START ME UP:** For the first time in franchise history (1901-present), Cardinals starting pitchers have given up four hits or fewer in each of the first four games of any season, joining the White Sox and Astros rotations to also do so this season ... St. Louis starters are limiting the opposition to a .162 batting average this season, 4th-lowest in MLB to the White Sox (.145), Astros (.152), and Reds (.667).

**Nolan Arenado** was born in Newport Beach, Calif...graduated from El Toro High School in Lake Forest, Calif...resides in San Clemente.

**Lars Nootbaar** was born in and resides in El Segundo, Calif...graduated from El Segundo High School...played three years at USC (2016-18).

**JoJo Romero** was born in Camarillo, CA...graduated from nearby Oxnard (Calif.) High School.

**Miles Mikolas** (May 20, 2012), **John King** (Sept. 9, 2020), and **Kyle Leahy** (May 14, 2024) earned their first MLB wins against the Angels.

**Andre Pallante** was born in Mission Viejo, Calif...graduated from San Clemente High School...played college baseball at the University of California, Irvine (2017-19).

Hall of Famer **Ozzie Smith** graduated from Locke High School in Los Angeles...played college baseball at Cal Poly, San Luis Obispo.

Cardinals AGM/Scouting **Randy Flores** was born in Bellflower...graduated from El Rancho High School in Pico Rivera...pitched at the University of Southern California (1994-97).

**Michael Siani** and Angels broadcaster **Mark Gubicza** are both graduates from William Penn Charter in Philadelphia...Siani is first player to make it to MLB who received scholarship established by Gubicza in his father's name for a student from Roxborough neighborhood.

**Ron "Pop" Warner** was born in Alhambra, Calif...graduated from Redlands High School.

**Reid Detmers** was born in Nokomis, Ill...graduated from Glenwood III. High School...grew up a Cardinals fan...father **Kris Detmers** pitched parts of six seasons in the Cardinals minor league organization (1994-99), where he was teammates with **Stubby Clapp** and **Pop Warner**.

**Jon Jay** played in five games for the Angels in 2021 in his final professional season.

Cardinals broadcaster **Bengie Molina** played in eight seasons with the Angels (1998-2004) & won 2002 World Series...originally signed by the Angels as a non-drafted free agent (May 23, 1993).

Hall of Famer **Tony La Russa** served as an executive with the Angels (2019-20).

**Jim Edmonds** was born in Diamond Bar, Calif...drafted by the Angels in the 7th round in 1988 ...played seven seasons with the Angels (1993-99), winning two Gold Gloves (1997-98) and was a 1995 AL All-Star...became a Cardinal via trade with the Angels (March 23, 2000), exchanged for **Kent Bottenfield** and **Adam Kennedy**.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Mark McGwire** is a Pomona, CA native...graduated from Damien High School in La Verne, CA and played college baseball at USC...resides in Southern California.

Former Cardinals personnel now with the Angels include **Phil Plantier**, **Joey Prebyski**, **Tony Ferreira**, **Dann Bilardello**, **Joe Krugel**, **Chris Carpenter**, **Jobel Jimenez**, **Mike Gallego**, and **Matt Swanson**.

St. Louis Post-Dispatch reporter **Daniel Guerrero** is an Anaheim, Calif native and grew up an Angels fan...earned associates degree in journalism at Fullerton College.

FanDuel reporter **Erica Weston** worked for Bally Sports Midwest from 2018-21.

**TONIGHT'S GAME:**

- Left-hander is making his 2025 season debut tonight in the middle game of series vs. the Los Angeles Angels.
- Tonight's start is his 1st in the majors since 7/24/24 at PIT when he suffered a 5-0 defeat at PNC Park.
- It's his 1st start at Busch Stadium since 6/26/24 vs. ATL when he worked 6.0 scoreless IP, fanned 8, and won 4-1 over the Braves.
- Libby owns a career mark of 4-4 with 3.58 ERA in 11 career starts at Busch Stadium.
- Is making his 2nd career appearance against the Angels; Worked 3.1 IP at Angel Stadium in a start on 5/13/24 and took a no-decision in the Cardinals 10-5 win.

**LIBERATORE vs. ANGELS:**

- Is making his 2nd career appearance against the Angels; Worked 3.1 IP at Angel Stadium in a start on 5/13/24 and took a no-decision in the Cardinals 10-5 win.
- Owns a career mark of 3-6, 6.12 ERA in 21 career games (9 starts) in Interleague games
- In 9 career starts in Interleague play has a 1-6 mark with the lone win coming on 8/10/23 at Tampa Bay against his drafting organization
- He's had 3 career starts vs. A.L. West clubs, facing the Rangers and Athletics in 2023 and the Angels in 2024.

**LAST START vs. ANGELS:** 5/13/24 at LAA (ND W 10-5; 3.1 IP, 5 H, 4 ER, 2 BB, 1 SO)

**2024/CAREER NOTES:**

- Spent the entire 2024 season on the Major League roster, his first season on the Opening Day roster and first full season in the majors.
- Appeared in a career-high 60 games making six starts. Ranked 5th on the Cardinals staff in appearances and T-15th among National League left-handers.
- Set Major League career-highs in innings pitched (86.1), strikeouts (76), and tied with three wins.
- Made 12 relief appearances to begin the season before his first spot start vs. CWS (5/5) tossing 3.2 innings, allowing one run, in a game the Cardinals lost 5-1.
- Pitched a season-high 6.0 scoreless innings of two-hit ball in a start vs. ATL (6/26-Game 2), striking out a career-high eight batters in a 4-1 win.
- He was notified that he was starting on the day of game in two of his starts: at MIA (6/19) and vs. ATL (6/26-Game 2).
- Led the Cardinals and ranked 7th in the N.L. with 25 appearances after the trade deadline (8/1).
- Went nine consecutive appearances (4/4-5/5) without allowing a hit against a left-handed batter (0-for-19, one walk).
- Ranked T-2nd among Cardinals relievers with John King with 33 inherited runners, trailing only JoJo Romero (34).
- Graduated from Mountain Ridge High School in Glendale, Arizona.
- Was a childhood teammate and friend of Cardinals infielder Nolan Gorman; both Liberatore and Gorman played in the American Youth Baseball Hall of Fame tournament at Cooperstown Dreams Park in 2012 and on the same World Cup team in 2017, winning the Gold Medal in Canada.
- Ranked by Baseball America as the No. 2 overall player in the 2018 Major League Baseball Draft.
- Selected by the Tampa Bay Rays in the first round (16th overall) of the 2018 MLB Draft, making him the highest drafted high school player in Rays franchise history.
- Acquired by the Cardinals from the Tampa Bay Rays with C Edgardo Rodriguez and Rays Compensation draft pick B (RHP Tink Hence) in exchange for OF José Martínez, OF Randy Arozarena and Cardinals Compensation draft pick A (INF Alika Williams), January 9, 2020.

**2025 SPRING TRAINING:**

- Made six Spring Training appearances, including one start in his final appearance on March 22 vs. Miami
- Worked a spring-high 4.0 IP and threw 71 pitches in his March 22 start, allowing one run on two hits in 8-2 win.
- Was 1-0 overall in Grapefruit League play with a 1.62 ERA covering 12.2 IP.
- Did not allow a HR and had 0.78 WHIP this spring, working 2.0+ IP in each of his five relief appearances.
