CINCINNATI REDS (27-51) vs

IN THE STANDINGS

For for the third straight day, the Reds are a season-high **17.5 games** out of first place... through Saturday's games the Reds were **25 games below .500** (26-51), also a season high...yesterday's **4-3 walkoff win vs Atl** snapped the Reds' **10-game skid at Riverfront Stadium** from 4/9-5/5, 1986...the Reds went **0-6 on their previous homestand** (0-3 vs Mil, 0-3 vs LAD), their first winless homestand of at least 6 games in length since 7/11-7/17, 1991 (0-4 vs Pit, 0-3 vs StL).

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 1** of a 3-game series vs 2013 Reds media relations intern **Zach Weber's** first-place **Mets** and **Game 4** (1-2) of a season-high 11-game homestand that included a **2-1 series loss vs Atl**, features Thu's **day/night doubleheader vs Pit** and concludes with the **Rays'** first visit to **Great American Ball Park** since **2014**...is the first of the Reds' two **10-day homestands in July** (10g vs StL, Mia, Bal)...the **21 home games** in July will be the Reds' most in a month since **August 1984** (21 home games)...since 1900, the most home games for a Reds team in a month is **28g** in **September 1945**...the Redlegs are coming off a **3-3 road trip** to SF (2-1) and Chc (1-2).

TRANSACTIONS: The Reds today sent to Class AAA Louisville on a rehabilitation assignment **C Tyler Stephenson** (broken right thumb)...he last played for the Reds on **6/9 vs Ari**, when while catching he suffered a broken right thumb on a foul tip...when injured, he led National League catchers in **hitting** (.306), **slugging percentage** (.476) and **RBI** (27).

SERIES NOTES: Beginning **9/24/13**, the Reds are **14-33 vs NYM** (**0-2** in 2013, **2-4** in 2014, **0-7** in 2015, **0-6** in 2016, **3-4** in 2017, **3-3** in 2018, **3-4** in 2019, **3-3** in 2021), including a **14-game losing streak** from **9/7/14 - 9/7/16** that ranks as Cin's **longest ever** vs the Mets and its longest vs any team since a **16-game skid vs Ari** from **5/8/01 - 8/13/03**...dating back to **1962**, the **7-0 series win** by the Mets in **2015** was the **first season series sweep** by either team, followed by NYM's **6-0 series win** in **2016**.

RAYS UP NEXT: Friday night, the Reds and Rays will meet for the first time since **2017** at **Tropicana Field** and for the first time at **Great American Ball Park** since **2014**...Cin leads the series by game, **10-5**, including 3-game series sweeps in **June 2003** at **TB** and **June 2005** at **GABP**...in the teams' most recent meeting, in **June 2017** at **The Trop**, the **Rays** earned the **2-1 series win**.

YOUNG GUNS:

- In this series, the Reds will start rookie pitchers **RHP Hunter Greene**, **LHP Nick Lodolo** and **RHP Graham Ashcraft** (26gs, 8-13, 5.30, 132.1ip, 78er)...all 3 made their Major League debuts **this season**.
- Twice already this season, **rookie pitchers** started 3 consecutive Reds games, including **5/5-5/7/dh** (**Greene**, **RHP Connor Overton**, **RHP Duari Moreta**) and **4/29-5/1** (**Greene**, **Overton**, **LHP Reiver Sanmartin**).
- In **Sanmartin** (Game 2), **Greene** (Game 4) and **Lodolo** (Game 6), the Reds used as many as 3 rookie starting pitchers in the **first 6 games of a season** for only the **second time in their history**...the **1902 Reds staff** used 3 rookie starting pitchers in their first 5 games, and 4 of their first 6 games that season were started by rookie pitchers (**Bob Ewing** 2 starts, **Len Swormsted**, **Martin Glendon**)...courtesy @EliasSports.
- This year's Reds became the **fourth Major League team** since **2000** to use 3 different starting rookie pitchers in the **first 6 games of a season**, joining the **2020 Royals** (**Brady Singer**, **Ronald Bolanos**, **Kyle Zimmer**), **2018 Marlins** (**Caleb Smith**, **Dillon Peters**, **Trevor Richards**) and **2009 Athletics** (**Trevor Cahill**, **Brett Anderson**, **Josh Outman**).

REHABBING:

- LHP Nick Lodolo** (low back strain) from **6/13-6/29** made 4 rehabilitation starts (0-0, 2.84, 12.2ip, 16h, 4er, 3bb, 18k, 1hbp, 1.50whip, .308baa)...he last pitched for Class AAA Louisville, started Wed's **5-3 loss at Toledo** and left in the fifth inning with a 1-0 lead (4.2ip, 6h, 1er, 1bb, 5k, 78 pitches)...he is scheduled to start for the Reds tomorrow.
- OF Tyler Naquin** (left quad strain) is 3 apps into a rehab assignment with Louisville that began on **Thu** (2gs in RF, 1gs at DH, 4-9, .444, 1 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 2rbi, 3bb, 3k, .583opb, 1.111slg, 1.694ops)...last played in yesterday's 6-5 win at Toledo, started in RF and batted leadoff (2-4, 1 2b, 1 3b, 2k)...he last played for the Reds on **5/31 at Bos**.
- RHP Justin Dunn** (right shoulder inflammation) is 2 apps into a rehab assignment that began on **6/26** (0-0, 1.80, 5ip, 3h, 1er, 1bb, 5k, 0.80whip, .176baa)...he last pitched for Class AAA Louisville in Fri night's 12-3 win at Toledo, retired all 9 batters faced (3ip, 4k, 36 pitches)...is scheduled to pitch again for the Bats on Wed vs St. Paul (4ip, 60-65 pitches).

YOUNGSTERS:

- Eight Reds players made Major League debuts this season, including **RHP Daniel Duarte**, **RHP Alexis Diaz**, **RHP Hunter Greene** (starter), **LHP Nick Lodolo** (starter), **C Mark Kolozsvary**, **RHP Jared Solomon**, **RHP Graham Ashcraft** (starter) and **C Chris Okey**.
- 14 rookies**, including **9 pitchers**, have appeared in at least 1 game for the Reds.
- 51 players** have appeared in at least 1 game for the Reds this season...the club record for number of players in a season is **57** (2003).

M*A*S*H:

- The Reds' current injured list includes **14 players**...began the season with **8 players** on the **injured list**, their highest total to begin a season since they began the **2014 campaign** with **8 players** on the **disabled list**...since **2022 Opening Day** have made **24 more additions** to the injured list for a season total of **32 IL stints**.

Tonight's Pitcher - #21 Hunter Greene, RHP

RED HOTS

- Is 22 years old...tonight his 16th Major League appearance and start, all this season.
- Was the National League Player of the Week for 6/6-6/12, the only Reds player so honored so far this season (2gs, 1-0, 0.75, 12ip, 3h, 1er, 2bb, 15k, .079baa)...was the third rookie this season to win his league's Player of the Week award (Cubs OF Seiya Suzuki, Angels LHP Reid Detmers).
- In the rain-shortened, 7-0 win on 6/6 vs Ari and Madison Bumgarner allowed a bunt single to Daulton Varsho, the first batter of the game who was caught stealing for the second out, then retired his last 20 batters of the 7-inning game...faced the minimum 21 batters...became the first Reds pitcher to retire 20 straight batters in a game since Bronson Arroyo did it on 6/26/12 vs Mil.
- In his 20-5 win vs Cubs, Reds batters recorded 20 hits and 20 runs in the same game for only the 12th time since 1900, most recently on 5/19/1999 at Coors Field (24-12 win, 24r, 28h).
- In his other 14 starts the Reds scored 48 runs, including 2 runs or fewer 5 times.
- Bridging starts on 5/15 at Pit and 5/21 at Tor, threw 10.1 consecutive hitless innings.
- On 5/15 at Pit threw 7.1 no-hit innings and in 4 other starts took no-hitters into the fourth inning:
 - In his Major League debut on 4/10 at Atl didn't allow a hit until Matt Olson led off the fourth inning with a single.
 - In the 5-4 loss on 5/10 vs Mil didn't allow a hit until Luis Urias led off the fourth inning with a home run.
 - In the 3-1 loss on 5/21 at Tor didn't allow a hit until Bo Bichette led off the fourth inning with a home run.
 - In the 5-4 loss on 6/17 vs Mil didn't allow a hit until Rowdy Tellez led off the fourth inning with a single.
- In the 1-0 loss on 5/15 at Pit threw 7.1 no-hit innings, the furthest a Reds pitcher ever has gone without allowing a hit before he was removed from a game...Art Warren finished the eighth inning without allowing a hit...was the first game in Reds history in which they used multiple pitchers to hold the opponent to 0 hits.
- In the 5-2 loss on 4/16 at LAD threw 39 pitches at more than 100 miles per hour, the most recorded in the pitch-tracking era (since 2008)...his 13 pitches at 101mph were the most ever recorded by a starter in a game...struck out 2 batters on fastballs clocked at 101mph, tied for the most in a game by a starter on a strikeout pitch of that velocity (Jacob deGrom, Justin Verlander)...courtesy @SlangsOnSports.
- Made his Major League debut in the 6-3 win on 4/10 at Atl in the Reds' fourth game of the season...first career strikeout was Matt Olson (2nd batter)...recorded 2 strikeouts in each of his first 3 innings...didn't allow a hit until Matt Olson singled to lead off the fourth...RHP Art Warren threw a scoreless ninth inning for his first career save.
- At age 22 years, 247 days became the youngest starting pitcher to make his Major League debut for the Reds since Mike Leake received no decision a 3-1 Reds win on 4/11/10 vs the Cubs at 22 years, 150 days old.
- Was 1 of 3 pitchers on the Reds' Opening Day roster with 0.000 days of service time (Alexis Díaz, Daniel Duarte) and 1 of 9 Reds pitchers with less than 1.000 year of service time.
- Was selected by the Reds in the first round (2nd overall pick) of the June 2017 first-year player draft...was rated by MLB.com the best overall prospect and by *Baseball America* the best high school player in that draft...the Twins selected high school SS Royce Lewis with the No. 1 overall pick.
- Missed the 2019 season while recovering from 4/9/19 "Tommy John" surgery.

RED HOTS

- Last name is pronounced luh-DOLE-oh.
- Tomorrow is expected to come off the 60-day injured list to make his fourth start of the season, his first since 4/24...on 4/28 went on the 10-day IL with a lower right back strain...on 6/21 was transferred to the 60-day IL...went 1-2, 5.52 in 3 starts prior to the injury.
- Began the season on the Reds' Taxi Squad for their single-city road trip to Atlanta...was promoted on 4/13 to make his Major League debut in that afternoon's start vs the Guardians.
- In the 4-1 win on 4/24 vs the Cardinals earned his first career victory in his third Major League start...beat Adam Wainwright, whose lifetime record in 429 career apps fell to 186-107...Lodolo was caught by Mark Kolozsvary, who also made his first career start.
- Was selected by the Reds in the first round (7th overall) of the June 2019 first-year player draft...was signed by Paul Scott.
- Is rated By *Baseball America* the No. 3 prospect in the organization and No. 31 on its updated Top 100.
