BIRD WATCHING: The St. Louis Cardinals come to the end of an eight-game homestand into the All-Star Break against the first place teams in the National League Central (Milwaukee) and East (Atlanta). The Cardinals play the finale of a three-game series against the Braves after winning the first two and holding the Braves to one run in consecutive games for the first time since June 20-21, 2021 in Atlanta. Following today's game, the team will be off for the All-Star Break and resume play in Arizona on Friday with a six-game road trip to Arizona and Los Angeles-AL.

FLIGHT PATTERN: St. Louis enters play in 3rd place in the National League Central, 8.5 games behind first place Milwaukee, and 2.5 games behind 2nd place Chicago. The 'Birds are finishing a stretch of 14 games over 13 days without an off day leading into the All-Star Break (June 30-July 12), all against teams currently in playoff position (2-1 at Braves; 2-1 at Cubs; 5 vs. Brewers 1-4; and 3 vs. Braves 2-0).

SWEEPSTAKES: The Cardinals are looking to sweep their 4th series of the season, brooming Houston on the road (4/17-19), Pittsburgh on the road (4/27-30) and Cincinnati at home (6/5-7). The Cardinals last swept the Braves in their inaugural visit to Truist Park, May 5-7, 2017. The last time the Cardinals swept Atlanta at Busch Stadium was Sept. 9-11, 2011 during an incredible run to pass the Braves en route to the National League Wild Card and their eventual 11th World Championship.

ALL-STAR CARDS: The Cardinals will be sending five members of their squad to Philadelphia for the All-Star Game. Manager **Oliver Marmol** will be joined by OF **Jordan Walker**, RHP **Riley O'Brien** and DH **Iván Herrera**. Bullpen catcher **Kleininger Teran** will join the squad pitching to Walker in the Home Run Derby tomorrow night.

52 PICK-UP: Playing in their 52nd home game before the All-Star Break, St. Louis will match their most contests in front of the home crowd with the 1973 season. Only the Baltimore Orioles have more this season with 53.

DUSTIN OFF THE OPPONENT: Today's starting pitcher **Dustin May** enters on a 13.2 inning scoreless streak at home over his last two starts. May fired a complete game shutout vs. San Diego on June 15 and hurled 4.2 scoreless innings vs. Milwaukee on July 6 in his last start. May has pitched three scoreless starts over his last five starts, one more overall than he had all of last season.

CHURCH CELEBRATES BIRTHDAY ON SUNDAY...OF COURSE: Happy Birthday to Cardinals outfielder **Nathan Church** who is celebrating his 26th birthday today. On his last two birthdays, Church has come through by homering against Wichita while with Springfield (AA) in 2024 and going 3-for-4 with a double, stolen base and two runs scored vs. Charlotte with Memphis (AAA) in 2025.

BACK TO THE FUTURES: Two Cardinals prospects will be playing in the Major League Baseball All-Star Futures game in Philadelphia starting at 11:00 a.m. Central. LHP **Liam Doyle** (Rated No. 3 in the organization and No. 52 in MLB - *Baseball America*) and C **Rainiel Rodriguez** (No. 1 in the organization and No. 22 in MLB) will be playing for the National League squad. Doyle was the Cardinals No. 1 draft pick in 2025 out of the University of Tennessee, while Rodriguez, an international free agent signee, was born in the Dominican Republic and spent part of his childhood in Philadelphia.

WALK-AND-ROLL: **Jordan Walker** extended his on-base streak to a season-high 17 games last night. His 17 game streak is one shy of his career-best of 18 set during his rookie season from June 5-29, 2023; trailing only **Kyle Karros** (COL) for the longest active streak of 19. His 17-game streak marks the 3rd on-base streak of 15 or more games this season by Walker, joining Baltimore's **Taylor Ward** as the only two players with three or more on-base streaks of 15 games this season.

ATLANTA CONNECTIONS

Chip Caray previously served as the play-by-play voice of the Braves for 20 seasons on Bally Sports South and Bally Sports Southeast (2010-22), TBS and Peachtree TV (2005-2009) and on TBS and the Atlanta Braves Radio Network (1991-1992)...his father, **Skip Caray**, was part of Braves broadcasts from 1978-2008.

Jordan Walker was born in Stone Mountain, Ga... Graduated from Decatur (Ga.) High School, where he was a 2019 and 2020 Gatorade High School Player of the Year.

George Soriano spent three weeks this offseason with Atlanta; was claimed by the Braves off waivers from Baltimore (Jan. 9, 2026) and then claimed by Washington off waivers (Jan. 30, 2026).

Kyle Leahy's uncle, **Thomas Leahy**, pitched in the Braves minor league organization (1991-93).

Blaze Jordan and **Austin Riley** graduated from DeSoto Central (Miss.) High School.

Austin Riley made his MLB debut vs. the Cardinals (May 19, 2019 at Truist Park).

Riley O'Brien's grandfather, **Johnny O'Brien**, was drafted by NBA's Milwaukee Hawks, who later became the St. Louis Hawks, and are now the Atlanta Hawks.

Cards.TV Director **Tom Mee** was selected by Atlanta in the 12th round of the 1977 MLB Draft...played two minor league seasons in the Braves system (1977-78) and was teammates with **Brian Snitker**.

As compensation for **Marcell Ozuna** signing with Atlanta in 2020, St. Louis selected **Alec Burleson** in the 2nd round of the 2020 MLB draft.

JoJo Romero (Aug. 21, 2020 at Truist) and **Jon Jay** (April 26, 2010 at Busch III) made their MLB debuts vs. the Braves.

Dylan Dodd pitched three seasons (2019-21) at Southeast Missouri State University and one season with the Hannibal (Mo.) Hoots of the Collegiate Summer Prospect League.

Hall of Fame Manager **Joe Torre** played for & managed both the Cardinals (1969-74 & 1990-95) and Braves (1966-68 & 1982-84)...traded to St. Louis from Atlanta for **Orlando Cepeda** (Mar. 17, 1969).

TODAY'S GAME:

- The 28-year-old **Dustin May** makes his 18th start as a member of the Cardinals (75th career start & 89th appearance) today.
- The Cardinals are 9-8 in his starts this season, with wins in four of his last five (June 9-present).
- His four caught stealing on attempted base stealers, T-7th among NL pitchers with teammates **Matthew Liberatore** and **Kyle Leahy**.
- Limiting opposing right-handed batters to .201/.236/.291 (27-134) with only four walks (140 batters faced).
- Is just 1-6 with a 6.81 ERA (39.2 IP) in eight day starts this season.
- Limiting opponents to bat .215 (17-79) on his four-seam fastball, which ranks in MLB's 95th percentile with a Run Value of 3.
- Over a 12 start span from April 10-June 15, was 5-4 with a 2.54 ERA (74.1 IP), 0.98 WHIP, and .550 OPS.
- Pitched 6.0 innings in every start over a four-game stretch (April 27-May 15), the longest streak of his career and tying **Michael McGreevy** for the longest by a Cardinal this season. All were quality starts.
- Joins **Nathan Church** (2024-26), **Hunter Dobbins** (2026), **Mark McGwire** (1997-2001), **Red Schoendienst** (1945-56, '61-63), and **Rex Hudler** (1990-92) as notable red-headed Cardinals.

LAST TIME OUT (Monday, July 6 vs. Milwaukee at Busch Stadium): ND, L, 5-4, 4.2 IP, 4 H, 0 R, 0 ER, 0 BB, 7 SO, 0 HR , 81 pitches.

- Struck out seven while firing 4.2 scoreless innings in team's come-from-behind loss to the Brewers in Monday's homestand opener.
- Exited with the Cardinals leading 2-0 with two runners on and two outs in the 5th. The Brewers scored four unanswered in the 7th inning.

2026 HIGHLIGHTS:

OUCH!: Exited his July 2 start at Atlanta after two outs after being hit by a **Dominic Smith** line drive off his right ankle. Pitched to the next two batters before exiting with a right ankle contusion.

CODE RED: Threw his first complete game and shutout vs. SD (6/15) carrying a perfect game through 6.0 innings and a no-hitter 6.1. Struck out eight batters in a 3-0 win. First Cardinals pitcher to throw a one-hit shutout at home since Jaime Garcia vs. MIL (4/14/2016).

ALMOST PERFECT: June 15 shutout vs. SD saw D. May carry a perfect game into the 7th inning before his walk to **Fernando Tatis, Jr.**, snapped it, and one batter later, a Manny Machado single through the left side broke up the no-hitter.; struck out eight batters, his 3rd-highest total of the season and threw a season-high 101 pitches for the 2nd consecutive start; it was his 2nd start this season carrying a no-hitter through 6.0 innings.

POPPING THE CORK IN NEW YORK: Fired his first scoreless start as a member of the Cardinals pitching 6.0 scoreless innings of four-hit ball with six strikeouts in a 7-0 'Birds win at Citi Field (6/9), running the St. Louis win streak to five games. His first win since 4/21 at MIA (7 starts).

BASEBALL HQ TOUR: Took time on June 9 to tour MLB's Central Offices while the Cardinals spent their off-day in NYC.

OH NO-NO: Took a no-hitter in the 8th inning at MIL (5/27), broken up by a **Garrett Mitchell** lead-off double, and eventually lost 2-1; Threw a season-high 7.0 IP and fanned a then season-high 9 batters; the only Brewers batsmen to reach safely before the 8th came via a HBP and catcher's interference.

NOCTOURNAL NIGHTMARE: Has made 8 starts in Day games this season (1-6, 6.81 ERA) is 4-0 with a 3.002 ERA in his 8 Night starts.

DECISIONS, DECISIONS: His 2026 season has been one of streaks starting with 2-straight loses, then 3-straight wins, a career-high 4-straight losses and he currently has consecutive wins.

DON'T WALK TO STRANGERS: Tied with **Andre Pallante** (6.8%) the 2nd-lowest walk percentage among Cardinals starting pitchers behind **Michael McGreevy** (5.8%) with 6.8%.

MAY'S DAY: Started on May 3 while wearing uniform No. 3, against his former team, the Dodgers, suffering 4-1 loss that snapped his 3-game winning streak.

MILESTONE WIN: Bested his former team the Red Sox on 4/10 in a 3-2 win. It was his 1st win as a member of the Cardinals and his 20th career win.

TIGER STRIKE: Was hit for a season-high seven runs on seven hits (and struck in leg by line drive) over 3.1 innings in an 11-6 loss at Detroit (4/4) in his second start. First Cardinals pitcher since **Mike Parisi** (2008) to begin a season allowing 6 or more runs in his first two starts of a season; and the first Cardinal to pitch the Opening Day series since **Dizzy Dean** (1936).

OPENING ACT: Took the loss in his Cardinals debut at Busch Stadium vs. TB (3/29) allowing six runs over 4.0 inning. Tied his career-high allowing 10 hits, the first Cardinals pitcher to allow double-digit hits in his debut in 55 years since **Chris Zachary** surrendered 10 to the Phillies (5/3/1971) *Elias*. Recorded his 300th career strikeout retiring **Junior Caminero**.

MAY VS. ATLANTA:

- Making his 4th start (5th appearance) vs. Atlanta.
- Pitched 5.0+ innings in two of his three previous starts, striking out six batters in both (uninterrupted by injury).
- Held the Braves to one unearned run on one hit over 5.0 innings (April 1, 2025) at Dodger Stadium in a no-decision in win (3-1).
- His one relief appearance was Aug. 18, 2019 at Truist Park, suffering a blown save opportunity in 2.0 innings, surrendering a home run to Rafael Ortega.

LAST START VS. BRAVES (July 2, 2026 at Truist Park): ND, W, 11-5, 0.2 IP, 5 H, 5 R, 5 ER, 0 HR, 2 BB, 1 SO; 34 pitches.
