## STAY INFORMED

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RAY REPORT-The Rays continue a seven-game, two-team homestand against the Giants (2-1) and Angels (1-1, 2 to play) tonight at Tropicana Field...they are 3-2 so far in a stretch of 13 consecutive games without an off day that concludes on April 24 vs. Detroit Last night, trailing 3-1 in the 9th inning with two outs and only one hit on the board, consecutive singles by Harold Ramírez and Amed Rosario set the table for José Caballero, who clubbed a two-run triple to keep the Rays alive...it marked the second game-tying/go-ahead triple with two outs in the 9th inning or later in Rays history, joining Sam Fuld's triple on Aug. 10, 2011 vs. Kansas City.
Rosario's game-winning single in the 13th inning marked Tampa Bay's first walk off since a Yandy Díaz homer on Sept. 9, 2023 vs. Seattle.
The Rays have won each of their last 10 games decided by two runs or fewer, tying the longest streak in franchise history (April 22-May 13, 2008).
The 13-inning contest matched Tampa Bay's longest since the current extrainning format was introduced in 2020 (also: May 20, 2022 at BAL).
Los Angeles swiped five bags last night, the most steals in any of its 210 matchups in franchise history against the Rays (prev. high: 4SB, 2x, last: Sept. 2, 2013).
With a win tonight, Tampa Bay can earn its eighth straight season series victory over Los Angeles.
UNDER THE MICROSCOPE-Tampa Bay relievers have posted an MLB-worst 6.27 ERA (74.2IP, 52ER), ahead of only Houston's 5.72 ERA (74.0IP, 47ER).

Despite these struggles, Rays relievers did not allow an earned run across 7.0 innings in last night's win...they conceded just one hit and walked only two batters...it was just the second time this season Tampa Bay's bullpen did not allow an earned run (also April 12 vs. SF).
Rays relievers have posted a 5.00 ERA (45.0IP, 25ER) over their last 10 games,
compared to an 8.19 ERA (29.2IP, 27ER) in eight games to open the year
The Tampa Bay bullpen has allowed an MLB-high 14 home runs and 48 walks.
HOMER (UN)HAPPY-Tampa Bay has allowed an MLB-high 28 home runs, outpacing Toronto (27HR) and Minnesota (25HR)...the 28 HR allowed are the most through 18 games in franchise history, ahead of the 2003 Devil Rays (27HR)...the club record for most homers allowed through 19 games is shared between the 2003 and 2007 Devil Rays (28HR).
ALL ABOUT AMED-Amed Rosario has hit safely in each of his last eight games since April 5, batting . 389 (14-for-36) with 2 2B, 1 HR and 6 RBI during the run...it marks his longest hitting streak since an 11-game stretch from July 11-24, 2022.

The eight-game run is the second-longest by a Ray this season, trailing a ninegame stretch by Isaac Paredes from March 30-April 9.
It is tied with CLE Steven Kwan and BAL Cedric Mullins for the third-longest
active run in the AL behind HOU Jeremy Peña (10G) and TOR Cavan Biggio (9G).
HITTIN'HAROLD-Following a 1-for-17 (.059) start through four games, Harold Ramírez has hit safely in 10 of his last 12 games...during that stretch, he is batting .320 (16-for-50) with $12 \mathrm{~B}, 1 \mathrm{HR}, 8 \mathrm{RBI}$ and 10 R .

In his last 15 games against the Angels since May 11, 2022, Ramírez is batting . 304 (17-for-56) with 32B, 1 HR and 18 RBI.
Ramírez has a 10.3 pct. strikeout rate ( $7 \mathrm{SO} / 68 \mathrm{PA}$ ) through 16 games, ranking in the top 96th percentile of all MLB hitters.
SMALL_BALL-The Rays have tallied 16 infield hits, tied with Texas for the AL lead and tied for fourth in MLB behind Milwaukee (26), Pittsburgh (22) and Philadelphia (21).

Harold Ramírez paces all AL batters with five infield hits and is tied for second in the majors behind PHI Trea Turner (7).
Tampa Bay's 144 infield hits last season were second most in the AL behind Cleveland (153) and fifth most in MLB behind Miami (172), Washington (151) and Chicago-NL (147).
IN A FUNK-In his last 13 games since April 1, Randy Arozarena is batting .118 (6-for51) with $12 \mathrm{~B}, 2 \mathrm{RBI}$ and 5 BB against 14 SO...his .118 AVG during that that stretch is the lowest in the majors (min. 50AB)...the next closest hitters are PHI Nick Castellanos (.145) and SD Xander Bogaerts (.154).

He has not homered in 13 straight contets since going deep in back-to-back games from March 30-31 vs. Toronto...the 13-game homerless drought is his longest since a 15-game stretch from Aug. 2-19 (G1), 2023.
Arozarena has produced an 8.5 pct. walk rate (6BB/71PA) in 2024 after recording a career-best 12.2 pct. walk rate (80BB/654PA) last season.
He has gone 23 straight games without 2+ RBI since Sept. 20, 2023, tied for the second-longest such streak of his career (longest: 42G, Sept. 25, 2021-May 16, 2022).
DÍAZIS DUE-Yandy Díaz is batting. 111 (4-for-36) with 12 B, 1 RBI and 2 BB against 4 SO over his last nine games...he does not have a multi-hit effort in 10 straight games dating back to April 6, marking his longest stretch of games with one hit or fewer since a 12 game run from July 29-Aug 14, 2022.

Despite the recent skid, Díaz has posted a 14.7 whiff rate, ranking in the top 91st percentile of all MLB hitters...he had a 18.3 pct. whiff rate last season.

WHAT'S THE DIFF? - Tampa Bay is off to a 10-8 start despite having a -17 run differential.. it marks the first time since $2018(-32)$ that the Rays have had a negative run differential through 18 games...the 2018 Rays, who opened with a 5-13 record, finished the season 90-72 with a -8 run margin.

THEROAD AHEAD-The Rays are in the midst of a stretch from April 5-May 30 in which 14 of their 16 series are against clubs that missed the postseason in 2023, having gone 7-4 thus far... 12 of those sets are against clubs that were under the . 500 mark last season.

With 749 career wins, Rays manager Kevin Cash is six victories shy of surpassing his predecessor, Joe Maddon, as the Rays all-time managerial wins leader.

COAST TO COAST-The Rays and Angels continue a seven-game season series tonight at Tropicana Field, with all seven matchups between the clubs coming over an 11-day period...the Rays took two of three games from the Angels in Los Angeles from April 8-10. Tampa Bay earned a 4-2 season series victory over Los Angeles in 2023...after
dropping the season series in 2014 (2-5) and tying in 2015 (3-3), the Rays have won each of the last seven season series (did not play in 2020), going 36-17 (.679) during that time.

LHP Reid Detmers threw the 12th no-hitter in Angels history on May 10, 2022 vs. Tampa Bay.

Last season, a three-game set between the Rays and Angels in Anaheim was impacted by Hurricane Hilary, resulting in the series concluding with a day-night doubleheader on Saturday, Aug. 19 After serving as Tampa Bay's manager from 2006-14, Joe Angeles (2020-22) following five seasons managing Chicago-NL (2015-19).
Guy Gallagher, the Angels Director, Equipment and Clubhouse Operations, joined Los Angeles after spending the Vrevious 23 seasons as the Rays originally joined the Tampa Bay originally joined the Tampa Bay
organization in 1996 as a minor league equipment and clubhouse manager.
Angels LHP Matt Moore made 96 appearances (94GS) for the Rays between 2011-2016, going 39-28 with a 3.88 ERA ( $540.01 \mathrm{P}, 233 \mathrm{ER}$ )
and 494 strikeouts. and 494 strikeouts.

TONIGHT'S START-Littell makes his fourth start of the season, including his second at home...marks his first nighttime start of 2024...has allowed a combined 2 ER over 15.1 IP through his first two outings, surrendering only RBI hits to COL Nolan Jones (2B) and LAA Zach Neto (1B)...has gone 1-2 with a 1.55 ERA (40.2IP, 7ER) in his last seven starts dating back to Sept. 7, 2023...min. 15.0 IP, his 1.17 ERA ranks eighth in the AL.
LAST TIME OUT-Allowed only one run, but was limited to 4.1 IP on April 10 at Angel Stadium due to a 38-pitch 1st inning (4.1IP, 6H, ER, 3BB, 4SO)...all three walks came in the opening frame, marking his most walks and pitches in any inning of his career...entering the contest, he had not walked three batters in a game since July 8, 2022 at SD (4BB)...departed after throwing 99 pitches, matching his career high (also Sept. 23, 2023 vs. TOR).

HALO HAPPENINGS-Littell will make his second consecutive star against the Angels this evening...entering the season, he had made on prior appearance opposite the Halos, working around a pair of walks to toss a scoreless 10th frame on June 23, 2021 at Angel Stadium (1.0IP, 2BB, SO) during his stint with the Giants.

In 21 career outings (5GS) against the AL West, he is $1-2$ with a 2.48 ERA (40.0IP, 11ER), his lowest mark vs. any division...this includes a 2.08 ERA (21.1IP, 5ER) in the four starts.

RIGHT WHERE HE LEFT OFF-Littell is the fifth pitcher (6th instance) in Rays history to post a sub-1.20 ERA through his first three starts in a season, joining Jeffrey Springs (2023), Tyler Glasnow (2x: 2019 \& 2021), Matt Moore (2013) and Matt Garza (2010).

He has turned in a 0.46 ERA (19.2IP, 1ER) over his last three home starts since Sept. 7, 2023 vs. Seattle...min. 3 GS, it marks the majors lowest home ERA since the start of last September, out-pacing NYY Gerrit Cole (0.86).
Littell carries a 6.0 scoreless inning streak at Tropicana Field into tonight's outing...he has not allowed an ER at home in his last 17.2 IP since SEA Mike Ford's RBI-single.

NO FLY ZONE-He has not permitted a home run in his last six starts since Sept. 17, 2023 at BAL...Littell has faced 122 consecutive batters since allowing his last HR (MIN Willi Castro - Sept. 12, 2023 at MIN)...excluding openers, he is the first Ray with a six-start homerless streak since Drew Rasmussen (6GS) from July 22-Aug. 20, 2022...the last instance of a seven start streak was Alex Cobb (12GS) from July 23-Sept. 23, 2014.

His current success follows a stretch from Aug. 10-Sept. 12, 2023 in which he allowed 9 HR in a seven-start span (1.90 HR/9.0IP)

SLIDE PIECE-Littell's most effective pitch through three starts has been his slider...opponents are batting 2 -for-22 (.091) with 0 XBH and 6 SO against the pitch; min. 20 AB ending with sliders, it marks the lowest average on any MLB pitcher's slider...opposing hitters are 13-for-37 (.351) against Littell's other four pitches...he has allowed only one hard-hit ball ( $95+\mathrm{mph}$ ) off his slider, a 101.9 mph GIDP by TOR George Springer...Littell's 82.7 mph average exit velocity on the pitch is the lowest mark on any AL pitcher's slider (min. 15 balls put in play).

PINPOINT PRECISION-Despite throwing only 62.6 pct. of his pitches for strikes in his last outing (62/99), Littell's 68.8 pct. strike rate since the beginning of last season ranks fourth in the AL/fifth in the majors (min. 1,250 pitches thrown)...he trails SEA George Kirby (70.6\%), TB Zach Eflin (70.2\%), MIA Sandy Alcantara (69.6\%) and DET Tarik Skubal (69.0\%).

Littell has issued multiple walks in two of his first three starts.. he did not have a multi-walk start in all of 2023, but issued 2+ free pe did not have a multi-walk start in all of 2023 , but issued $2+$ free
pas two of his relief appearances (May 7 at PHI; Sept. 29 at TOR).

ROLE REVERSAL-In 2023, went 0-1 with an 8.10 ERA (3.1IP, 3ER) in his first four relief appearances with the Rays before a May 24-June 14 stint on the 15-day IL with right shoulder fatigue...made two starts as an opener on June 29 at Arizona and July 5 vs. Philadelphia before transitioning to a full-time starting role on July 19 at Texas

Over 14 starts, went 3-5 with a 3.41 ERA (71.1IP, 27ER) and 1.05 WHIP...in 14 relief appearances, he posted an 0-1 mark with a 6.75 ERA (18.2IP, 14ER) and 1.66 WHIP
