THE HUNT FOR A RED OCTOBER: The Cardinals conclude their homestand with this afternoon's finale of a three-game series vs. the visiting Washington Nationals. St. Louis opened its homestand by dropping two of three to division-rival Milwaukee. With 11 games remaining (all against winning teams in contention for playoff positions), St. Louis enters today in first place in the NL Central, 2.0 games ahead of the Cubs (vs. Reds) and Brewers (vs. Padres).

TIME TO FLY: After a five-game losing streak on a West Coast trip to Oakland and Los Angeles-NL (August 3-7), the Cardinals are 26-12 since August 9, leading Major League Baseball in wins while boasting a MLB-best 2.98 ERA.

CARDS AND CUBS: Beginning tomorrow, seven of St. Louis' final 10 games are against Chicago: a four-game series at Wrigley Field and season-ending three-game weekend set at Busch Stadium (Sept. 27-29). The 2019 season marks the first time in franchise history the Cardinals and Cubs have faced off as many times over the final 10 games when both teams were at the top of the division. The two rivals played seven of the final eight in 1951, and seven of the last 10 in 1950, but neither team was in contention those seasons.

WAINWRIGHT NOMINATED FOR ROBERTO CLEMENTE AWARD: For the 4th time in his career, Cardinals 2019 Roberto Clemente award nominee **Adam Wainwright** will be recognized during an on-field ceremony prior today's game as part of Roberto Clemente Day. Previous Cardinals to win the Roberto Clemente Award include **Yadier Molina** (2018), **Carlos Beltran** (2013), **Albert Pujols** (2008), **Ozzie Smith** (1995) and **Lou Brock** (1975), the most (5) by any club in Major League history.

WAINO'S WORLD: **Adam Wainwright**, who ranks 3rd all-time in MLB history with a career .732 win pct. in September (30-11), is a perfect 5-0 with a 0.53 ERA (34.0 IP/ 2 ER) in five day starts this season at Busch Stadium. Since 2017, Waino is a combined 10-1 with a 1.49 ERA (78.1 IP) in 12 home matinees.

EARLY BIRDS: Winners of nine of their last 11 under natural lighting, the Cardinals are 31-19 in day games in 2019, sporting the NL's 3rd-best winning percentage (.620) behind the Dodgers (.711, 27-11) and Cubs (.625, 40-24). Including today, St. Louis is scheduled to play six matinees over the final 11 games this season, including four of the next five.

NATIONAL NEWS: Since Busch Stadium III opened in 2006, the Cardinals' .725 home winning percentage (30-12) against the visiting Washington Nationals is their 2nd-best against any opponent, trailing only the Colorado Rockies (.745, 38-13). St. Louis has won the home series vs. the Nationals in 11 of 13 visits.

MOLINA MILESTONES: **Yadier Molina's** appearance at catcher today ties him with **Brad Ausmus** (1,938) for 7th all-time in Major League history. Last night, Molina recorded his 378th career double to pass **Joe Medwick** for 4th place all-time in Cardinals history, and also became the 5th Cardinal in franchise history to reach 100 or more hits in 12 seasons. Molina is one double away from tying **Jorge Posada** (379) for 9th all-time in MLB history among primary catchers, and two extra-base hits shy from tying **Ted Simmons** (541) for 10th all-time in Cardinals history.

RUNNIN' REDBIRDS: The Cardinals (110-for-136) lead the NL in stolen bases this season, three more than 2nd place Washington (107). Their 80.9% SB success rate (3rd in NL) currently stands as the highest all-time in franchise history since 1951 (*STATS LLC*)...19 different Cardinals have stolen at least one base, most in MLB and T5th-most in franchise history (record held by 1906 club with 21 Cardinals)...St. Louis has stolen multiple bases in 30 games (1st in MLB).

WASHINGTON CONNECTIONS

Tyler Webb was born in Nassawadox, Va...graduated from Northampton High School in Eastville, Va.

John Gant made his Major League debut against the Nationals (April 6, 2016) while with Atlanta.

Matt Wieters played the previous two seasons with Washington (2017-18) before signing with St. Louis this offseason.

Andrew Knizner was born in Glen Allen, Va...graduated from Hanover (Va) High School, where he was a quarterback and punter for the football team and was an All-State shortstop on the 2013 Virginia AAA State Championship team...was teammates with **Trea Turner** at North Carolina State University in 2014.

Nationals broadcaster **Bob Carpenter** worked 10 seasons with the Cardinals on both radio and television before joining Washington...graduated from nearby McBride (Mo.) High School...his sister, **Judy Carpenter-Barada**, previously served as Cardinals Director of Major League Administration.

Cardinals pitching coach **Mike Maddux** served in the same role with the Nationals for two seasons (2016-17)...also pitched parts of two seasons (1998-99) for the Expos.

Cardinals bullpen coach **Bryan Eversgerd** pitched in 25 games for Montreal in 1995...became an Expo via trade with St. Louis (April 5, 1995), packaged with pitcher **Kirk Bullinger** and outfielder **DaRond Stovall** to Montreal for pitcher **Ken Hill**.

Max Scherzer is a native of Chesterfield, Mo...graduated from Parkway Central (Mo.) High School...originally selected by St. Louis in the 43rd of the 2003 MLB Draft, but did not sign...pitched at the University of Missouri (2005-07).

Matt Adams played parts of last seven seasons in a Cardinals uniform (2012-18), including 26 Postseason games (2013-14)...originally selected by St. Louis in the 23rd round of the 2009 MLB Draft...later traded by St. Louis with cash to Atlanta for infielder **Juan Ypez** (May 20, 2017).

Nationals Bench Coach and interim manager **Chip Hale** played in 132 games for Memphis (AAA) in the Cardinals organization during his final professional season in 1998.

Nationals Manager **Dave Martinez** made his Major League debut vs. St. Louis (June 15, 1986) while with the Chicago Cubs.

Joe Ross' older brother, **Tyson Ross**, pitched in nine games for the Cardinals last season.

Cardinals Sr. Special Asst. to the GM **Bob Gebhard** was a player/coach in the Expos organization from 1974-75, and coached through 1986, including on the Montreal coaching staff in 1982.

Hall of Famer **Lou Brock** served as a baserunning consultant for Montreal in 1993.

Cardinals Hall of Famer and broadcaster **Tim McCarver** played in 92 games for Montreal (1972).

Nationals broadcaster **Charlie Slowes** worked three years at KMOX (1984-86).

TODAY'S GAME

- Makes his 29th start of the season (314th career start) and his 381st career appearance today, facing the Nationals for the second time this season.
- His .732 career win pt. (30-11) in September is tops in Cardinals history (min. 40 decisions) and he ranks 3rd all-time in MLB behind Randy Johnson (.750: 45-15) & Clayton Kershaw (.750, 30-10).
- Is one of five Cardinals to win 30 or more career September games, joining Bob Gibson (44), Bill Sherdel (35), Jesse Haines (33) & Bob Forsch (32).
- Is the first Cardinal since Murray Dickson (13 wins in 1956 at age 39) to post 12+ wins at age 38 or older.
- He and Yadier Molina have been a starting battery for 262 games, 8th-most all-time in MLB history since 1908 (2 shy of T7th - Cleveland's Bob Lemon & Jim Hegan, 264).
- Is 5-0 with a 0.53 ERA (34.0 IP/ 2 ER) in five day starts at Busch Stadium this season. Since 2017, is 10-1 with a 1.49 ERA (78.1 IP) in 12 day starts at Busch.
- Is 8-3, 2.26 ERA in 14 starts at Busch Std., sporting the 5th-best home ERA in the NL.
- Ranks 9th among active pitchers with a 3.37 ERA (min. 1,500 IP) and 14th in starts.
- Has a 65-35 (.650) career mark in post All-Star break games with a 3.37 ERA. He ranks 4th among active NL pitchers in career post All-Star winning pct.
- Passed Bill Sherdel (1918-30, '32) for 4th all-time in wins in franchise history in his 7/14 start vs. ARI & is just three wins (160) back of Bob Forsch (163) for 3rd all-time.
- Is one of five Cardinal pitchers to make 300 or more career starts, joining Bob Gibson (482), Bob Forsch (401), Jesse Haines (387), and Bill Doak (320).
- Since 2016, St. Louis sports a 57-35 record (.620 win pct) in his games pitched.
- Has reached the 100 inning threshold in a season for first time since 2017 (123.1) and 100 strikeouts for first time since 2016 (161).

- Scattered a pair of singles over 6.0 shutout frames for his 12th victory in a 10-0 win over Milwaukee in last Friday's (9/13) homestand opener.
