**POSTSEASON BOUND**—The Rays have clinched a postseason berth for the seventh time in franchise history (all in 14 seasons since becoming the Rays in 2008), including a third straight season for the first time...the Rays clinched the fourth AL East title in club history and celebrated a division clinch at home for the first time...the Rays have won back-to-back division titles, tying their total from the first 22 seasons of the franchise...the Rays will end the regular season having held sole possession of first place in the AL East for 66 straight days, the longest run in club history.

- While the Rays are one of the two youngest franchises in the majors, their run of three straight postseason berths represent a feat that nine of 30 clubs have never achieved: D-backs, Mariners, Marlins, Mets, Nationals/Expos, Padres, Reds, Rockies and White Sox.
- The Rays have secured a seventh trip to the Division Series since 2008...the only other teams to do so as often are the Dodgers (10, pursuing 11), Yankees (8, pursuing 9) and Cardinals (7, pursuing 8).

**RAY MATTER**—The Rays have outscored opponents, 22-4, on the 3-game winning streak, their longest since Aug 21-31 (9)...the Rays are a season-high-tying and club-record-tying 37 games over .500...entering this season, their highest in the history of the franchise was 34 games over .500 (2008)...the Rays are 6-3 in their last 9 games and an AL-best 43-22 since the All-Star break, 3rd in the majors behind the Dodgers and the Giants.

- At 96-59, the Rays are one shy of tying 2008 for the club record for wins in a single season...they would need to go 4-3 to reach 100.
- The Rays have trailed in 47.9 pct. (46 of 96) of their wins and their 46 come-from-behind wins are a club record and tied with the Red Sox for most in the majors...the Rays have 17 wins after trailing by 3 runs (or more), most in the majors over the Twins (11), including a ML-most 9 wins when trailing by 3+ runs in the 6th inning or later...the Rays have a ML-most 7 wins when trailing after 8 innings.
- The Rays have held sole possession of the best record in the AL for 74 days this season, including 52 straight since Aug 6...they have a 5-game lead over the Astros and are attempting to clinch the AL's No. 1 seed for the third time (2020, 2010)...the magic number for the No. 1 seed is 3—a combination of Rays wins or Astros losses.

**SEEKING SWEEP**—The Rays have a club-record 13 sweeps and seven road series sweeps this season, passing their previous highs of 12 sweeps (2013, 2018) and six road series sweeps (2013)...their 13 sweeps (regardless of series length) are tied with the Red Sox for the AL lead and are tied for 2nd in the majors behind the Dodgers (15)...the Rays are attempting to finish a 12th sweep of 3 games (or more), which would extend their AL lead over the White Sox (8) and Tigers (8) and would break a tie for 2nd in the majors (LAD, 13)...their most recent sweep was Aug 27-29 at Camden Yards.

- The Rays are attempting to sweep a series of 3+ games from the Marlins for the eighth time in franchise history, first since Aug 28-30, 2020 at MIA (3-0)...the Rays have swept them in a series of 3+ games four times at home, most recently Sep 29-Oct 1, 2015 (3-0).

**UNDER THE DOME**—The Rays are 51-29 (.638) at home this season, 4th in the majors and 2nd in the AL behind the White Sox (49-27)...the 51 home wins are tied with 2018 and 2013 for 3rd in franchise history behind 2008 (57) and 2009 (52)...the Rays have pitched to a 2.95 ERA at home, which leads the AL and ranks 2nd in the majors behind the Dodgers (2.92)...the Rays are a major-league-best 44-17 (.721) at home since May 13 and have outscored opponents by 157 runs (345-188) over this span...this comes on the heels of a 7-12 start, which was 28th in the majors through May 12.

**IT TAKES A VILLAGE**—This season the Rays have used 61 players and 38 pitchers (excluding position players), both of which shatter club records...their previous highs were 57 players used and 31 pitchers used in 2019.

- The Rays have 10 players with 10 HR (or more), matching the club record from 2006 and tied with the Giants for most in the majors.
- Excluding the shortened 2020 season, the Rays will join the 2018 Dodgers and 2017 Astros as the only teams in MLB history to win their division without a pitcher to qualify for ERA leaderboards.
- The Rays have 23 pitchers with a win, tied for most in the majors and one shy of tying the single-season club record from 2018 (24).
- The Rays have 13 pitchers with a save, breaking a tie with the 2020 Rays and 1973 Rangers for a major league record...the Rays had 11 pitchers with a save in 2019, 12 in 2020 and 13 in 2021, the first team to have 10+ pitchers with one in three straight seasons...since the All-Star break, 10 Rays pitchers have combined for 16 saves.

**ABOUT THE OFFENSE**—The Rays rank 2nd in the majors with 826 runs scored behind the Astros (830)...they have set a franchise record for runs scored in a single season, passing 2009 (803) and 2010 (802)...the Rays have increased their major league rank in runs scored in five consecutive seasons, from 25th in 2017 to 16th, tied for 15th, 12th and 2nd in 2021.

- With Nelson Cruz and Wander Franco both in the starting lineup together, the Rays have totaled 232 runs in 36 games (6.44 R/G).
- The Rays rank 7th in the majors with 211 HR and 6th with 560 BB, and rank 6th in the AL with a .321 OBP, 7th in avg. (.242), 10th in avg. with RISP (.250) and 6th in avg. with RISP/2 out (.236)...the Rays lead the AL with 1,475 SO, 3rd in MLB behind the Cubs and Marlins...their strikeout rate reached 28.2 pct. in May but has dropped to 25.1 in June, 24.4 in July, 22.5 in August and 21.0 in September.
- The Rays have scored a club-record and ML-most 304 runs in the 7th inning or later (Giants, 267), including a ML-most 110 runs in the 8th (Phillies, 100) and ML-most 79 runs in the 9th (Padres, 65).

**HERE'S THE PITCH**—The Rays have pitched to a 3.73 ERA this season, 5th in the majors and 2nd in the AL, and their 79 games of allowing 3 runs (or fewer) are tied with the Astros for most in the AL...the Rays are attempting to finish among the majors' top ten in ERA for a fifth straight season.

- The Rays have yielded 4 runs (or fewer) in nine consecutive games, their longest streak since Sep 1-10, 2019 (9)...if they do so today, it would mark their longest streak since July 19-Aug 4, 2016 (club-record 15)...the Rays have a 2.63 ERA (82-IP, 24-ER) over this stretch.
- In the last 6 gms, Rays starters/bulk have a 1.86 ERA (29-IP, 6-ER).
- The Rays bullpen has pitched to a 3.21 ERA this season, best in the AL over the Yankees (3.57) and 3rd in the majors behind the Giants (3.04) and Dodgers (3.10)...the bullpen leads the majors with 56 wins and 669.2 IP and leads the AL with a .292 opp OBP and 1.15 WHIP.
- The bullpen has a 1.76 ERA (51-IP, 10-ER) in 11 games since Sep 14.

**THE WANDER YEARS**—20-year-old Wander Franco has a 40-game on-base streak, the longest active in the majors and longest by a rookie in club history, passing Rocco Baldelli (24) in 2003...among players age 20 years (or younger), it passed NYY Mickey Mantle (36) in 1951-52 for the longest in AL history and is the 2nd-longest in major league history behind CIN Frank Robinson (43) in 1956...regardless of age, it is the longest in the modern era (since 1900) for a rookie shortstop, passing CHW Chico Carrasquel (37) in 1950...his streak is the longest for a single season in club history and 2nd-longest overall behind Tommy Pham (48) in 2018-19.

- Has more hits (50) than swings-and-misses (46) during the streak.
- Franco has struck out twice in his last 65 PA and four times in his last 106 PA, compared to 32 SO over the first 170 PA of his career.

**RAYS vs. MARLINS**—The Rays are 4-1 against the Marlins this season (2-0 at home, 2-1 on the road), clinching the "Citrus Series" for a third straight season and 10th time in 14 seasons since 2008...the Rays are 70-58 all-time (36-26 at home, 34-32 on the road), including 49-24 since 2008...the Rays are 14-2 since July 22, 2018 and have outscored them, 86-53, since then.

- The Rays are 14-5 in interleague games this season (8-1 at home).

**FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH**—The Rays have used 18 rookies this season including 12 rookie pitchers...their rookie pitchers have combined for 33 wins, leading the majors over the Marlins (21) and 2nd in franchise history behind 2018 (42)...the Rays currently have a 6-man starting rotation including three rookies (Shane McClanahan, Shane Baz, Luis Patiño) and Drew Rasmussen, who exceeded rookie limits last season with 128 days of service (with MIL)...including postseason, these four pitchers entered the season with a combined 31 apps (1 start) in the majors...the only start came from Patiño in an opener situation on Sep 19, 2020 (1.2 IP, with SD).

- On Monday Shane Baz threw 78.5 pct. (51 of 65) of his pitches for strikes...it marked the highest strike pct. for a starting pitcher in his major league debut since pitches were first tracked beginning in 1988, according to Stats LLC...at 22 years, 95 days he became the 3rd-youngest Ray to start and win his major league debut behind Scott Kazmir (20.212) in 2004 and Joe Kennedy (22.013) in 2001.

**LAST START**—On Mon vs. TOR, recorded the win in his major league debut after yielding 2 runs in 5 IP, becoming the 11th starting pitcher in club history to win his debut...retired his first 4 BF, then yielded a solo homer to **Teoscar Hernández** in the 2nd inning...retired his next 10 BF, including an 8-pitch 3rd, before allowing a 2-out homer to **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** in the 5th...his line: W, 5 IP, 2 H, 2 R/ER, 0 BB, 5 SO, 2 HR, 65 pitches, 51 strikes.

- + Was the third pitcher in Rays history to go 5 IP (or more) and allow 2 hits (or fewer) in his major league debut, joining **Brendan McKay** on June 29, 2019 vs. TEX and **Blake Snell** on April 23, 2016 at NYY.
- + At 22 years, 95 days became the 3rd-youngest Ray to start and win his major league debut behind **Scott Kazmir** (20.212) on Aug 23, 2004 at SEA and **Joe Kennedy** (22.013) on June 6, 2001 at TOR.
- + Induced a 50.0 pct. (10 of 20) swing-and-miss rate on his slider...his 78.5 pct. strike rate was the highest by a starter in his major league debut since pitch tracking began in 1988, according to Stats LLC.

**MINOR MATTERS**—Is currently ranked by *Baseball America* as the No. 11 overall prospect in baseball and by MLB.com at No. 20 overall...these two publications rank him the No. 2 and No. 3 pitching prospect in the minors, respectively...began the season with Double-A Montgomery and made 7 starts there before earning a June 15 promotion to Triple-A Durham...totaled 10 starts with the Bulls, including five before a July 20–Aug 9 stint on the Temporarily Inactive List for participating in the Tokyo Olympics.

- + Went 5-4 with a 2.06 ERA (78.2-IP, 18-ER) in 17 starts this season, including 3-0 with a 1.76 ERA (46-IP, 9-ER) in 10 Triple-A starts.
- + Min. 10 starts, ranks among Triple-A East leaders in ERA (1.76, 1st), WHIP (0.85, 2nd), opp avg. (.174, 3rd) and SO/9 IP ratio (12.52, 5th).
- + Named the organization's Minor League Pitcher of the Month for June, going 3-0 with a 0.93 ERA (29-IP, 3-ER) and 42 SO in 6 starts between two levels...pitched five perfect innings on June 9 vs. Birmingham, his last start before receiving a promotion to Durham.
- + Made the AL Team for the All-Star Futures Game, his first career selection, pitching a perfect 2nd inning with a pair of strikeouts.

- + Recorded a career-high 10 SO in 3 starts (last Sep 11 vs. Norfolk).
- + Has been tabbed by *Baseball America* for having the Best Fastball in the organization for two consecutive years (2019-20) and the Best Slider in the organization for three straight years (2018-20).

**FROM MEDALIST TO MAJORS**—Pitched for Team USA in the 2020 Tokyo Olympics (July 30–Aug 7, 2021) and won a silver medal...named to the U.S. Team roster on July 2, along with then-Bulls teammate **Joe Ryan** and future Rays teammate **David Robertson**...started against Japan in Game 1 of the modified double elimination bracket, his only Olympic appearance, and yielded 5 hits, 2 runs and 3 BB in 2.2 IP of a no decision...Team USA lost, 7-6, on a walk-off single in the 10th inning before defeating the Dominican Republic in the repechage and South Korea in the semifinals to advance to the Gold Medal Game, where they again lost to Japan, 2-0.

**NOTABLE DEBUTS**—Became the 28th pitcher in club history to make his first career regular season app as a starter and the third this season, following **Shane McClanahan** on April 29 vs. OAK and **Brent Honeywell Jr.** on April 11 vs. NYY...all-time, Rays starters making their first career regular season app improved to 11-6 with a 4.67 ERA (142.2-IP, 74-ER)...became the 14th pitcher to make his first regular season app as a starter in the Rays era (since 2008) and they are 7-1 with a 2.07 ERA (74-IP, 17-ER).

- + Became the 61st player used by the Rays this season and the 38th pitcher, both of which extended club records over 2019 (57, 31).

**HOW HE GOT HERE**—Selected No. 12 overall by the Pirates in the 2017 Amateur Draft out of Concordia Lutheran (Texas) HS...committed to pitch at Texas Christian University before signing with them...acquired as the player to be named from the July 31, 2018 trade that sent **Chris Archer** to Pittsburgh and **Tyler Glasnow** and **Austin Meadows** to the Rays...in 2019, made 17 starts for Class-A Bowling Green in his first full season in the Rays organization...in 2020, was part of the Rays 60-man player pool and spent the summer at the alternate training site in Port Charlotte.

- + Is 3-for-27 (all singles) after batting .367 (18-for-49) with 5 HR from Sep 1-12.
- + Has 30+ HR for the eighth time in his career...became the oldest player in major league history with a 30-HR season, passing (by age) a pair of 40 year olds: BOS David Ortiz (38) in 2016 and DET Darrell Evans (34) in 1987.
- + Ranks 8th in the AL with a .317 batting avg. against left-handed pitchers.
