# TAMPA BAY RAYS (36-39) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (36-38) June 21, 2024 at PNC Park, Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - GAME \#75/HOME \#37 RHP RYAN PEPIOT (4-4, 4.57) vs. RHP CARMEN MLODZINSKI ( $1-2,4.42$ ERA) 

THE PIRATES:... had the day off yesterday...Shut out the Reds 1-0 in the third and deciding game of their series Wednesday at PNC Park.... Have gone 13-12, including 8-6 at home, in one-run games...Have won nine games in their last at-bat (won 10 in all of 2023)...Have been involved in eight walkoffs this season; tied for the most in all of MLB along with Colorado (have gone $4-4$ in those games)...Have gone $28-3$ (.903 winning percentage) when outhitting their opponents this season...Have the fifth-best record (19-16) among all National League teams since $5 / 11 \ldots$ The only four National League teams to produce a better record since $5 / 11$ are the Phillies (22-13), Cardinals (22-14), Dodgers (21-16) and Brewers (21-16)...Are hitting .273 (35-for-128) with runners in scoring position this month, which ranks sixth in all of MLB behind the Diamondbacks (.314), Mets (.313), Yankees (.294), Red Sox (.294) and Blue Jays (.294)...Have gone 8 -3 this month in games when the team does not make an error...Have posted the seventh-best fielding percentage (.988) in all of MLB this month...Have the third-best ERA (3.31) among starting rotations this month behind the Mariners (2.98) and Cubs (3.15)...Pittsburgh's strikeout rate this month ( 9.28 per 9.0 innings) is also third-best in MLB...Have surrendered 13 home runs this month, which is tied with the Reds and Orioles for the fewest among all teams in MLB.

A RARE VISIT FROM THE RAYS: The Pirates will close out their six-game homestand with this weekend's series against the Rays...It's Tampa Bay's first visit to PNC Park since 2017 and fourth one ever in the ballpark's history along with 2005 and 2008...It matches the Pirates' fewest home games against any opponent in the modern era (since 1901)...Pittsburgh has also played just nine home games against the Angels...Special thanks to StatsPerform.

CASHING IN AT PNC: The Pirates have won four straight series at PNC Park...The Bucs took two of three games against the Braves from May 24-26, two of three against the Dodgers from June 4-6, and two of three from the Reds in their series from earlier this week...The last time the Pirates had a longer series streak at PNC Park was between August and September of 2015 when the team won five straight.

CARMEN'S ELECTRIC: Carmen Mlodzinski will start tonight in the opener of this three-game series against the Rays...M Modzinski allowed a leadoff single before the retiring the next three batters he faced in his last outing Tuesday night against the Reds...Since being scored upon four times in his first five appearances from May 17-31, Mlodzinski has recorded an 0.84 ERA (10.2ip/ $/ 1$ er),, 162 batting average against and 0.84 WHIP in his last eight appearances (two starts).

JUNE BOOM: Pittsburgh's 10 wins this month are one shy of their June win total from last season (11-15)...The last time the Pirates had a winning June came in 2015 when the team posted a 17-9 record...Pittsburgh's $10-7$ record this month is tied for the fourth-best among National League behind the Mets (11-5), Diamondbacks (12-6) and Dodgers (11-7).

I WILL FOLLOW: Luis Ortiz allowed one run in 5.0 innings of relief in his last outing one week

LET'S GO REYNOLDS: Bryan Reynolds is hitting . 343 (24-for-70) with seven doubles, a triple, two home runs and 10 RBI during his current career-high tying 17-game hitting streak...It's the longest active hitting streak in MLB coming into today (the longest hitting streak this season in MLB is 21 games, which was accomplished by Ketel Marte and Anthony Volpe)...Reynolds' hitting streak is also the longest by a Pirate since 2019...That year Reynolds also hit safely in 17 straight games, while Kevin Newman had a 19-game hitting streak.

June 21, 2003: One night after walking the Indians off in 15 innings, the Pirates won in 15 for the second night in a row. Abraham Nunez ended the game after scoring on a wild pitch to cap off pittsburgh's $7-6$ win in a game that lasted 4 hours and 58 minutes in front of a sellout crowd of 36,856 . Brian Giles went 2 -for- 7 to extended his on-base streak to 30 games, but provided the highlight of the night by making a spectacular catch at the wall in left field to rob Cleveland's Brandon Phillips of a home run in the eigth inning.

STARTING OFF: Last name is pronounced ma-JINSK-ee...The 25 -year-old righthander is in his second Major League season, both with the Pirates...Entering today, he's made 48 career appearances (three starts) for the Bucs, including 11 relief appearances and two starts in 2024...He began the 2024 season on the injured list with right elbow inflammation and was optioned to Triple-A Indianapolis after being activated on April 10...He was recalled by Pittsburgh on May 15...Mlodzinski was selected with the Pirates' Comp A selection (31st overall pick) in the 2020 First-Year Player Draft.

SOMETHING NEWISH: Today will be Mlodzinski's fourth career Major League start and his third of the season, having served as an "opener" previously on June 14, 2024 at Colorado (0 ER in 1.0 IP ), June 8, 2024 vs. Minnesota (0 R in 1.2 IP) and July 9, 2023 at Arizona ( $1 \mathrm{R} / 0 \mathrm{ER}$ in 1.1 IP ).

- Carmen spent his first two professional seasons as a starter from 2021-22, making 36 starts in that time between High-A Greensboro and Double-A Altoona...He also started 14 of 26 games during his collegiate career at the University of South Carolina from 2018-20.

LAST TIME OUT: Mlodzinksi last appeared on June 18 vs. Cincinnati, tossing a scoreless eighth inning, allowing just one hit on 13 pitches.

It marked his eighth outing out of his last nine without allowing an earned run.
VS. TAMPA BAY Mlodzinski will be making his first start and appearance against the Rays this evening.

BATTLING RIGHTIES: Mlodzinski is holding right-handed hitters to a . 174 average (4-for-23) with no extra-base hits over his last nine outings since May 31, as well as a. 179 mark ( 5 -for-28) with just one extra-base hit (double) over his last 10 outings since May 26...Carmen had a streak of 18 consecutive right-handed hitters without allowing a hit from the second batter on May 26 through the second batter on June 12.

DOWN ON THE FARM: Mlodzinski went $0-1$ with a 6.60 ERA ( 11 ER in 15.0 IP) and 13 strikeouts in 13 games with Indianapolis while also making one appearance on rehab with Low-A Bradenton...Began the season on the 15-day Injured List with right elbow inflammation.

2023 RECAP: Mlodzinski reached the Big Leagues for the first time last season, making his Major League debut on June 16 at Milwaukee...In total, he appeared in 35 games ( 1 start), posting a $3-3$ record with 11 holds, 1 save, 2.25 ERA ( 9 ER in 36.0 IP), 34 strikeouts and 18 walks... 24 of his outings were scoreless.

- Posted a 1.88 ERA (5 ER in 24.0 IP) over his last 24 appearances, dating back to July 18...Made a team-high 14 appearances during the month of September/ October and posted a 2.19 ERA (3 ER in 12.1 IP).
Earned his first career win on June 30 vs. Milwaukee...Earned his first save in the Pirates historic 13-12 victory over Cincinnati on September 23 (overcame a 9-run deficit to win).

AS A PROSPECT: Entered the 2021 season ranked by MLB Pipeline as Pittsburgh's 10th-best prospect...Was rated by MLB Pipeline as having the "Best Changeup" in the Pirates minor league system at the end of the 2020 season.
