RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals look for a series split with the visiting Colorado Rockies in the finale of a four-game weekend series today at Busch Stadium ... After a scheduled off day tomorrow, the Redbirds continue their seven-game homestand on Tuesday with the opener of a threegame series with the division-rival Pittsburgh Pirates ... After yesterday's loss, the Cardinals have now dropped six of their last nine games (May 31-present) after winning 12 of 15 from May 12-29.

FLIGHT PATTERN: The Cardinals enter today pct. point behind Chicago in 5th place in the NL Central, 7.5 games behind Milwaukee, and 1.0 game back in the National League Wild Card race ... Since Mother's Day (May 12-present), the Cardinals and Royals tie for MLB's 4th-best winning pct. (.625, 15-9).

BEST 100-GAME FINISHES: The Cardinals (30-33) have 99 games remaining in the regular season starting today ... Under the 162-game format (since 1962), the best 100 -game finish by any Cardinals team that had a sub- 500 record after their first 62 games was done by the 1996 Redbirds, who finished 59-41 over their final 100 games, and won the NL Central Division by 6.0 games with an 88-74 record in Tony LaRussa's 1st year as manager (lost to Atlanta in seven games in the NLCS).

- The 1996 Cardinals are the only team in franchise history to make the postseason after sporting a losing record through the first 62 games.

- No Major League team in the Expansion Era (1962-present) has ever reached $100+$ wins after starting with sub- 500 record through the initial 62 games
- The best final 100 -game finish by any Major League team was the 2004 Atlanta Braves ( $30-32$ ), who finished $66-34$ and won the NL East by 10.0 games.
- The 2007 and 2009 Colorado Rockies each started 30-32 and made the postseason (chart left).

SUNDAY FUNDAY: After starting the season 0-6 on Sundays, the Cardinals have won three of their last four Sunday games ... Since May 12, their three Sunday wins share the MLB lead (nine others) ... St. Louis is 7-13 in series finales, but are winners of their last five since May 22 (vs. Orioles, vs. Cubs, at Cincinnati, at Philadelphia, and at Houston).
TAP THE ROCKIES: The Cardinals .730 home win pct. (46-17) vs. the Rockies is its best against any opponent since Busch III opened in 2006, although Colorado has won four of its last six in St. Louis (Aug. 4, 2023-present) ... The Cardinals have won the season series vs. the Rox in 22 of 30 seasons since Colorado joined MLB as an expansion team in 1993.

CLOSE CALLS: Forty-five of the Cardinals 63 games ( $71 \%$ ) have been decided by three runs or fewer, tying the Mets and Cubs for most in MLB this season ... The Cardinals are 9-8 in one-run games, 7-8 in two-run games, and 8-5 in three-run games.

- St. Louis sports MLB's 2nd-lowest average margin of victory (2.50) ahead of only the Tampa Bay Rays (2.32).

GOLD-RUSH: Paul Goldschmidt has reached base safely in 25 consecutive games (May 11-present), tied for MLB's 4th-longest active on-base streak and matching Nolan Arenado for the Cardinals mark for this season ... Goldy's career-long is 46 games (April 22-June 10, 2022), while his active 25-gamer is currently the 6th-longest of his career ... Among Cardinals age 36-240 and older, Goldy's on-base streak ties 37 -year-old Enos Slaughter (1953) and is two shy of 37 -year-old Patsy Donovan's record (27 in 1902).
THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (June 9, 1980): Hand-picked by club president August Busch Jr., Whitey Herzog pilots his first game as Cardinals manager as George Hendrick hits a three-run homer in the 10th inning of an $8-5$ win over the Braves at Atlanta-Fulton County Stadium ... The Hall of Famer ranks third in franchise history with 822 victories - trailing only Tony La Russa $(1,408)$ and Red Schoendienst $(1,041)$, while his teams won three National League pennants and the 1982 World Series.

John Mozeliak began his baseball career with the Rockies...initially served as a left-handed batting practice pitcher in 1993 and worked in a variety of positions in the home clubhouse and in baseball operations...joined St. Louis as an assistant in scouting operations following the 1995 season... graduated from Fairview High School in Boulder, Colo., where he was a first baseman and pitcher... graduated from University of Colorado at Boulder. Rockies MLB.com Thomas Harding covered the Memphis Redbirds (AAA) for two seasons for the Commercial Appeal (1998-99)...mentored recent Cardinals MLB.com writer Anne Rogers. Cardinals Hall of Famer Matt Holliday was originally selected by Colorado in the 7th round of the 1998 MLB Draft...played parts of six seasons for the Rockies (2004-08, '18) where he was a three-time All-Star and appeared in the 2007 World Series.

St. Louis Post-Dispatch columnist Benjamin Hochman previously worked as a sports writer Hochman previously worked as a sports write and columnist for the Denver Post (2007-15). St. Louis Post-Dispatch reporter Derrick Goold is originally from Boulder, Colo...attended Centaurus High School in Lafayette, Colo... worked as a staff writer for the Rocky Mountain News (2000-01). Rockies Communications Coordinator Kevin Collins previously served as the 2015 Media Rela tions Intern for the Memphis Redbirds (AAA). Rockies Digital Comm. Manager Nora Farrell previously worked in communications and social media for St. Louis for part of seven seasons (2016-22).
