THE LATEST:

- ★ The Blue Jays were beaten, 3-1, by the Dodgers in Game 6 of the 121st World Series at Rogers Centre last night, evening up their best-of-seven series at three games apiece...The Blue Jays outhit their opponents by an 8-4 margin, and had the tying run either at the plate or on base in each inning from the 3rd to the 9th frame.
- ★ Saturday marks the third Game 7 in Blue Jays postseason history, winning Game 7 of the ALCS against the Mariners last round (4-3W) after losing the final game of the ALCS in 1985 against the Royals (6-2L)...Will be the fifth winner-take-all game in franchise postseason history (3-1 record)...Marks the 45th Game 7 in World Series history and the 41st winner-take-all game in the Fall Classic (last: WSH vs. HOU in 2019)...The Blue Jays are playing a game in the month of November for the first time in franchise history.

THROWING GAUS:

- ★ Kevin Gausman allowed three runs over 6.0 innings of work last night, giving up three hits and two walks with eight strikeouts...All five baserunners ocured in the 3rd inning...Joined Corey Kluber (Game 1 of 2016 World Series) as the only pitchers in World Series history to punch out eight batters in the first 3.0 innings of a game...Was his fifth start of at least 5.2 innings this postseason, surpassing Dave Stewart (4x in 1993) for the most such starts in a single postseason in franchise history...Over his six postseason appearances (five starts) this year, Gausman has posted a 2.93 ERA (10 ER/30.2 IP) and a 0.91 WHIP with 17 hits, 11 walks, and 26 strikeouts, while holding hitters to a .159 batting average...His 30.2 innings pitched are the most in a single postseason in franchise history (2nd: Dave Stewart 25.1 in 1993).

PLAY THE HITS:

- ★ Vladimir Guerrero Jr. went 1-for-3 in Game 6, lacing a 2-out double to left in the bottom of the 6th inning, his 28th hit of the postseason, before drawing a walk in the 8th...His 28 knocks are the most in a single postseason in Blue Jays history, and are the second most in MLB history...Enters Saturday night one hit behind Randy Arozarena (29H in 2020) for the most ever...His 56 total bases are also second-most in a single postseason, behind only Arozarena's 64 from 2020...Over his 17 postseason games this year, has slashed .412/.506/.824 with four doubles, eight homers, 15 RBI, and 13 walks (1.330 OPS)...His 1.330 OPS is the second-highest for a single postseason in MLB history (min. 60 PA), trailing only Barry Bonds (1.559 in 2002).

IN BARGE:

- ★ Addison Barger doubled in each of the 3rd and 9th innings last night, finishing the game 2-for-4 while scoring the team's lone run, his fourth straight multi-hit effort and his seventh of the postseason...Has hit safely in 10 of his last 11 postseason games, and has reached base safely in 13 of 16 postseason games, slashing .357/.419/.589 with seven extra-base hits, nine RBI, six walks, and a 1.009 OPS.
- ★ In the six World Series games, Barger has hit .476 (10-for-21) with two doubles, a homer, five RBI, and five multi-hit efforts (.714 SLG, 1.214 OPS).

SPRINGING UP:

- ★ George Springer went 2-for-4 last night, driving in a run with a single in the 3rd before singling again in the 8th, his fourth multi-hit effort of the postseason...Was his 10th RBI of the postseason, reaching the mark for the second time in his career (10 RBI in 2020)...Has reached base safely in 13 of 15 postseason games this year (.891 OPS)...In 82 career postseason games, is slashing .267/.344/.534 with 21 doubles, 23 homers, and 48 RBI (.878 OPS)...His 48 career postseason RBI's rank T-10th in MLB history alongside Corey Seager and Reggie Jackson (9th: Pujols - 54 RBI).

DOMESTIC ADVANTAGE:

- ★ The Blue Jays finished the 2025 campaign with a home record of 54-27 (.667%), the best home winning percentage in the American League... Matched the 1985 Blue Jays for the most home wins in a single season in franchise history.
- ★ Blue Jays hitters led all American League clubs in home AVG (.271), home OBP (.340), home OPS (.788), and runs per home game (5.32), while ranking 2nd in home SLG (.448)...On the pitching side, Toronto hurlers sat 3rd in the AL in home strikeout rate (24.2%), 5th in home opponent avg (.231), 6th in home WHIP (1.21), and 10th in home walk rate (8.4%).

WE'RE GOING STREAKING!:

- ★ Ernie Clement extended his postseason hitting streak to 12 games on Friday night with a 5th-inning single... Matched Pat Borders (12G in 1992) for the longest hitting streak in a single postseason in franchise history...Became 13th player in postseason history to record a hitting streak of at least 12 games in a single postseason (only six reached 13G).
- ★ Clement later doubled in the 7th inning last night, finishing the game 2-for-4, his ninth multi-hit effort of the postseason...In his 17 postseason games, is batting .397 (27-for-68) with five doubles, a triple, a home run, nine RBI, and a .947 OPS...His 27 hits trail only Vladimir Guerrero Jr. (28 in 2025) and Randy Arozarena (29 in 2020) for the most in a single postseason in MLB history.

GETTING OFFENSIVE:

- ★ The Blue Jays offence has scored at least five runs in 11 of their 17 games this postseason, notching double-digit hits on 10 occasions...Collectively, the team has slashed .282/.348/.471 this postseason with 33 doubles, two triples, 27 homers, and 95 RBI (.819 OPS)...Their 101 runs scored are tied for the most in a single postseason in MLB history alongside the 2002 Angels (101) and the 2020 Dodgers (101)...Their 176 hits are second all-time, trailing only the 2002 Angels (181), while their 62 extra-base hits are T-2nd and their 33 doubles are T-3rd.

- ★ The Blue Jays went 1-2 against the Dodgers this season in Chavez Ravine, dropping the first two contests before winning the finale on Aug. 10 by a 5-4 score...Have gone 4-5 over their last nine regular season meetings with the Dodgers, dating back to the start of 2023...Are facing Los Angeles in the postseason for the first time ever...Have met the Dodgers more than three times in a season only once, going 3-3 vs. LAD in 2007.
- ★ Vladimir Guerrero Jr. went 3-for-11 (.273) over the three-game series in LA this season, notching two doubles, a homer, and two RBI for a 1.061 OPS... Over 17 career contests vs. LAD (reg+post), has hit .348 (23-for-66) with seven extra-base hits, eight RBI, and 12 walks (.576 SLG, 1.024 OPS).
- ★ George Springer met the Dodgers in the 2017 World Series as a member of the Astros, coming out on top in the seven-game affair...Was named World Series MVP, batting .379 (11-for-29) with three doubles, five homers, seven RBI, and five walks for a 1.000 SLG and a 1.471 OPS...Is one of three players all-time to record five home runs in a single World Series (Chase Utley in 2009 vs. NYY & Reggie Jackson in 1977 vs. LAD).
- ★ Mason Fluharty entered the game on Aug. 10 at LAD with one out and the bases loaded in the bottom of the 9th inning, striking out Shohei Ohtani and inducing a game-ending groundball from Mookie Betts to earn his first career MLB save...Became the first player since Trevor Hoffman on Sept. 15, 2002 to pick up a save by retiring two former MVP's with the bases loaded (Barry Bonds & Jeff Kent).

STARTING PITCHER

Max Scherzer, RHP #31

Born: St. Louis, MO AGE: 41

TODAY'S GAME:

- ★ Making his 33rd career postseason appearance (28th start) and his 3rd in a Blue Jays uniform...Is set to become the 4th pitcher in MLB history to start multiple winner-take-all Game 7's, joining Bob Gibson (3), Lew Burdette and Don Larsen...Started the last Game 7 of the World Series on 10/22/19 as a member of the Nationals, earning the win after tossing 5.0 innings of 2-run ball on 5 hits and 3 walks with 7 strikeouts...At 41 years and 97 days, will become the oldest player to start Game 7 of the World Series in MLB history.
 - ★ Took the no-decision on 10/27 in Game 3 of the World Series, pitching 4.1 innings allowing 3 runs on 5 hits and a walk with 3 strikeouts...Became the 1st player in MLB history to pitch in the World Series with 4 different teams (DET - 2012, WSH - 2019, TEX - 2023, TOR - 2025).
 - ★ Made his 500th career MLB start (reg+post), giving up 2 runs on 3 hits and 4 walks over 5.2 innings with 5 strikeouts. on 10/16 at SEA in Game 4 of the ALCS...Touched 96.5 MPH on a fourseamer to Cal Raleigh in the 1st inning, his fastest pitch since 6/24/23 (96.6 MPH)...Earned his 1st postseason win since Game 1 of the 2019 World Series on 10/22 at HOU...Became the 4th starting pitcher in postseason history to earn a win at the age of 41 or older, joining Roger Clemens (5x), Kenny Rogers (3x), and Dennis Martinez...With his 5 punchouts, reached 176 career postseason strikeouts, surpassing Roger Clemens (173K) for 5th-most in MLB history...Picked off Leo Rivas at first base in the 3rd inning, his first successful pickoff attempt in his postseason
 - ★ Owns an 8-8 postseason record over 27 starts (32 appearances) while posting a 3.82 ERA (65 ER/153.0 IP) with 179 strikeouts and a 1.16 WHIP...Among all active pitchers ranks 3rd in playoff innings (153.0), games started, and strikeouts, trailing only Justin Verlander and Clayton Kershaw in each category...Among MLB's all-time postseason leaders (min. 100 IP), ranks 2nd in strikeout rate (28.2%), 5th in strikeouts, T-7th in opponent average (.209), T-7th in games started, and 9th in innings pitched.
 - ★ Ranks 2nd among active pitchers in the regular season in strikeouts (3,489), innings pitched (2,963.0), starts (474), while also ranking 3rd in wins (221).
- 2025 HIGHLIGHTS:**
- ★ Tossed 6.0 innings of one-run ball on 4 hits and 3 walks with 4 strikeouts on 8/19 at PIT...Threw a season-high 104 pitches, his most in a start since 8/3/24 vs. CWS (105)...Marked his 6th quality start of the season.
 - ★ Threw a season-high 7.0+ innings on 8.14 vs. CHC, surrendering 1 run on 5 hits and 1 walk with 3 strikeouts...Marked his 5th quality start of the season and 4th in a row...Threw 57 strikes on 78 pitches (73%), his fewest pitches thrown in a start of at least 7.0 innings pitched in his career, surpassing an 82-pitch outing across 7.0 innings on 4/23/15 vs. STL...Became the 3rd pitcher in franchise history to win multiple games at age-41 or older, joining R.A. Dickey (10) and Darren Oliver (6).
 - ★ Threw 7.0 frames of 3-run ball on 7/27 at DET, giving up 3 hits with no walks and a season-high 11 strikeouts...Marked his most punchouts in a start since striking out 11 on 8/14/23 vs. LAA
 - ★ Earned his first win as Blue Jay on 7/11 at ATH, throwing a season-high 6.0 innings while allowing 3 runs on 5 hits and 1 walk with a season-high 8 strikeouts...Became the 3rd starting pitcher in franchise history to win a game at age 40 or older, joining R.A. Dickey (21 wins from 5/4/15-9/16/16) and Dave Stieb (8/29/98 vs. MIN).

OTHER HIGHLIGHTS:

- ★ In his MLB career, has been named an All-Star 8 times (2013-2019, 2021), 3-time Cy Young Award winner (2013, 2016-2017), and 2-time World Series Champion (2019 & 2023).
- ★ Selected by the Arizona Diamondbacks in the 1st round (11th overall) of the 2006 First-Year Player Draft.

VS. THE DODGERS:

- ★ Making his 22nd career start and 5th in the postseason against the Dodgers...In his 11 career appearances (9 starts) at home against LAD, has gone 2-3 with a 2.18 ERA (15 ER/62.0 IP), a 0.95 WHIP, a .195 opponent AVG, and a 27.0% strikeout rate.

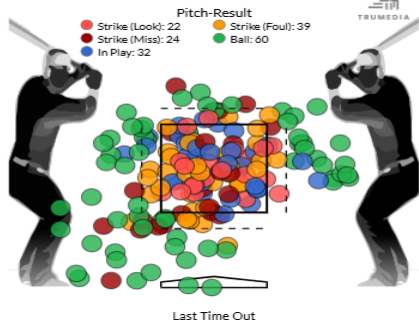

- In his 20 appearances (16 starts) at Rogers Centre this season, has gone 8-0 while posting a 2.58 ERA (28ER/97.2IP) with a 1.13 WHIP, a .227 OPP AVG, and a 26.8% strikeout rate.
- Made 31 starts (32 appearances) this season, posting a 3.96 ERA (75ER/170.1 IP) with a 1.33 WHIP and a 22.6% strikeout rate.
- Held opponents to an 87.7 MPH average exit velocity this season, the 7th-lowest mark among qualified pitchers in the AL, while also posting a 36.8% hard-hit rate.
- Became the first pitcher in franchise history to go undefeated at home in a single season (min. 10 GS).
- Won 11 games this season, joining Kevin Gausman, Zack Wheeler, Framber Valdez, and Logan Webb as the only other pitchers to record 10+ wins in each of the last 5 seasons (2021-2025).

- Has made 28 career appearances in the postseason, recording a 1.93 ERA (6ER/28.0 IP) with a 2.95 FIP, a 1.07 WHIP, and a 32.2% strikeout rate.
